RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered an 11-4 loss to the Twins on Wednesday night at Target Field. James McCann had two hits and drove in a run, while Dawel Lugo also added two hits. Christin Stewart went 1x3 with a pair of RBI. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing six runs on eight hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 3.2 innings. The Tigers and Twins conclude their three-game series tonight. Following tonight's game at Minnesota, the season concludes this weekend with three games at Milwaukee (September 28-30).

STUMPF-ING 'EM: Daniel Stumpf pitched a scoreless inning with one hit allowed and one strikeout in last night's game. Stumpf has not allowed an earned run in 14 consecutive appearances, spanning 12.1 innings. During that stretch, he has a 0.65 WHIP with a .163 (7x43) opponents batting average and 10 strikeouts.

GOODY TWO SHOES: Niko Goodrum went 1x5 with a RBI in last night's game. Goodrum has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games, and is batting .339/.400/.542 with 11 runs scored, three doubles, three home runs and eight RBI during that stretch. In 15 games vs. the Twins this season, Goodrum has driven in 13 runs.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Tonight's game marks the 41st time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 19-21 (.475) against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .259/.317/.403 as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank second in the American League with a .259 batting average vs. lefties. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .390 (55x141) batting average vs. lefties, while he is sixth with a .442 on-base percentage and ninth with a .589 slugging percentage vs. southpaws.

VMART CONCLUDES IMPRESSIVE CAREER: Victor Martinez wrapped up an impressive 16-year Major League career on Saturday, starting at first base and going 1x1 with an infield single. In 1,973 games in his big league career, Martinez hit .295/.360/.455 with 914 runs scored, 423 doubles, three triples, 246 home runs and 1,178 RBI. Among all switch-hitters in MLB history, Martinez ranks 15th in RBI, tied for 16th in home runs, 18th in doubles and 23rd in hits (2,153). Martinez will finish his career as the Tigers all-time leader in RBI among switch-hitters, with 540. He is a five-time All-Star selection, a two-time Silver Slugger Award winner and the 2014 Edgar Martinez Award winner.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 1-1 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Minnesota (1-1) and three games at Milwaukee (September 28-30). Detroit is 26-51 (.338) on the road this season, but has won seven of its last 12 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .235/.293/.372 on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.99 ERA (653.1IP/362ER).

TIGERS AND TWINS: Minnesota has an 11-7 lead in the season series, including a 6-3 edge at Target Field. Detroit is 19-10 against the Twins over the last 29 games played in Minneapolis. Minnesota has won the season series over the Tigers for the second straight year.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 33-42 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 12-7 vs. Chicago (AL), 6-13 vs. Cleveland, 7-11 vs. Minnesota and 8-11 vs. Kansas City. This season marks the second straight year that the Tigers have finished with a below .500 record vs. divisional opponents.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY ON DECK: The Tigers close the 2018 season this weekend with a three-game series at Milwaukee. Detroit has a 222-199 advantage in the all-time series vs. the Brewers. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Brewers won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. The Tigers have played just six games all time at Miller Park, going 3-3. Detroit took two-of-three games from Milwaukee in its last visit to Miller Park in 2006. The Tigers are 6-11 against National League opponents this season after going 1-3 vs. Chicago (NL), 2-2 vs. Cincinnati, 1-5 vs. Pittsburgh and 2-1 vs. St. Louis. The Tigers have an all-time record of 212-188 (.530) in Interleague play.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 64-94 (.405) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,132-1,133 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 52nd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

1999 - With each of the Tigers wearing the uniform numbers of all-time great Detroit players at their position, Detroit defeated Kansas City, 8-2, in the last game ever played at Tiger Stadium. Robert Fick belted a grand slam in the eighth inning.

2012 - Doug Fister struck out nine consecutive batters to establish a new American League record as the Tigers defeated the Royals, 5-4.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 27th appearance overall and 26th start of the season tonight in the series finale at Minnesota.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano recorded his third consecutive quality start on Friday vs. Kansas City, but took the loss, allowing four runs, only one earned, on six hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

MAKING HIS 300TH CAREER START: Liriano will be making the 300th start of his Major League career tonight. Liriano will become the eighth Dominican-born pitcher and the 16th active pitcher to make 300 starts in the Majors.

VS. MINNESOTA: Liriano, who played for the Twins from 2005-12, has made seven career starts against his former team, posting a 3-3 record with a 6.40 ERA (32.1IP/23ER) and 34 strikeouts. He has faced the Twins twice this season and is 0-2 with a 9.45 ERA (6.2IP/7ER) and four strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Liriano has made 178 career appearances, including 153 starts, on the road, posting a 54-63 record with one save, a 4.50 ERA (859.2IP/430ER) and 848 strikeouts. In 16 road starts this season, Liriano has a 3-6 record with a 4.48 ERA (80.1IP/40ER) and 60 strikeouts.

AT TARGET FIELD: Liriano is making his 46th career appearance and 43rd career start at Target Field tonight. In 45 previous outings in Minneapolis, Liriano has a 15-14 record with a 4.08 ERA (255.2IP/116ER) and 263 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Liriano has made 104 appearances, including 82 starts, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 30-33 record with a 4.67 ERA (478.0IP/248ER) and 467 strikeouts. In 14 appearances, including 13 starts, vs. AL Central foes this season, Liriano has a 3-6 record with a 4.13 ERA (69.2IP/32ER) and 59 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Liriano has made 66 appearances, including 45 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 17-16 record with a 4.01 ERA (267.0IP/119ER) and 289 strikeouts. In four September starts this season, Liriano is 2-2 with a 1.88 ERA (24.0IP/5ER) and 23 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded hitters to a .218 (316x1447) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .249 (1270x5093). In 26 appearances, including 25 starts, this season, lefties are hitting .165 (14x85), while righthanded batters are hitting .270 (110x407) against Liriano.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters tonight's game with 1,747 strikeouts in his Major League career, which are the fifth-most by a Dominican-born pitcher in MLB history.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL: Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

ABOUT JORDAN: Zimmermann will make his 25th start of the season tomorrow night in the series opener at Milwaukee.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann recorded his eighth quality start of the season, but did not factor into the decision on Saturday vs. Kansas City, allowing two runs on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

VS. MILWAUKEE/AT MILLER PARK: Zimmermann has faced the Brewers seven times in his career, posting a 5-1 record with a 4.08 ERA (39.2IP/18ER) and 43 strikeouts. His last start against Milwaukee came on August 23, 2015, as a member of the Washington Nationals, when he picked up the win, giving up four runs on eight hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings. In four career starts at Miller Park, Zimmermann has a 2-1 record with a 3.80 ERA (21.1IP/9ER) and 24 strikeouts.
