MEDICAL MATTERS—Today the Rays placed INF **Brad Miller** (left groin strain) on the 10-day DL on selected RH **Ryan Weber** from Triple-A Durham...this is the Rays first roster move of the regular season...Weber, who will wear No. 47, will become the third player born in St. Petersburg to play for the Rays, joining RH **Doug Waechter** (2003-06) and 1B **Casey Kotchman** (2011)...he did not make an appearance for Durham, but did not allow a run in 5 apps (1 start) spanning 8.1 IP in spring training.

CRUSHING LOSS—Yesterday at BOS, the Rays blew a 5-run lead in the 8th inning, turning a 7-2 advantage into an 8-7 loss...it was the Rays largest blown lead in a loss since June 30, 2016 vs. DET, when they led 7-2 in the 9th and lost 10-7...it was the sixth time in club history they held at least a 5-run lead in the 8th inning or later and lost...the Rays allowed 6 runs on 7 hits in the 8th inning...they yielded 6 runs (or more) once in a single frame last season: Sep 15 vs. BOS (7-run 15th)...it was their most allowed in an inning of a road game since Aug 23, 2015 at OAK (7-run 7th).

THAT'S OFFENSIVE—The Rays lost yesterday despite season highs with 7 runs, 11 hits and 4 XBH...last season, they were 29-2 (.935) when scoring 7 runs or more, with an 8-7 loss on May 15 at CLE and a 14-7 loss on July 31 at HOU...furthermore, the Rays scored in six consecutive innings from the 2nd through the 7th, one shy of matching the club record of consecutive innings with a run (2nd through 8th innings on July 29, 2006 at NYY spanning two games from May 19-20, 2017 vs. NYY).

RAY MATTER—The Rays have not won since Opening Day vs. BOS...the 8-game losing streak is their longest since July 5-16, 2016 vs. LAA, at BOS, vs. BAL (8) and the longest in the majors this season...they haven't had a longer losing streak since June 16-26, 2016 vs. SEA/SF, at CLE/BAL, an 11-game losing streak which tied for 3rd-longest in franchise history...the 1-8 record matches 2011 for the worst 9-game start in club history...the 2011 team then won 5 straight and eventually the AL Wild Card.

- + The Rays are 0-5 on the road, matching 2001 for the longest road losing streak to start a season in franchise history...with yesterday's loss, the Rays were swept by the Yankees and Red Sox in consecutive series for the third time in club history.

WE'VE BEEN HERE BEFORE—Only two teams have ever advanced to the postseason after a 1-8 start to the season: the 2011 Rays and 1995 Reds...the 2011 Rays were 9 games out of playoff contention through Sep 3 and came back to clinch a postseason berth on the final day of the season...that team actually started the season 0-6 and recorded their first win in Chicago, a 9-7 win over the White Sox on April 8.

GUT CHECK—The Rays are the sixth team and second AL team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) to win on Opening Day and lose their next 8 games...they are the first team to do this since the 2005 Rockies (won 12-10 on Opening Day, then lost 8 straight)...the only other AL team to do so was the 1961 Angels (won 7-2 on Opening Day, then lost 8 straight)...three of these other five teams saw their losing streaks end at 8 games...the full list: 2018 Rays (8, active losing streak), 2005 Rockies (8), 1998 Marlins (11), 1961 Angels (8), 1944 Cubs (13) and 1939 Pirates (8).

RAYS vs. WHITE SOX—This is the first of 6 games with the White Sox this season...the White Sox visit St. Petersburg for a 3-game series from Aug 3-5...the clubs split the season series last year, with the Rays going 2-1 at Tropicana Field and 1-2 on the road...the Rays are 67-82 (.450) all-time, 38-38 at home and 29-44 on the road...they are 37-36 in the Rays era (since 2008) and 11-8 (.579) under Manager **Kevin Cash** (since 2015).

- + This is the sixth game of an 8-game, 10-day trip to New York (0-2), Boston (0-3) and Chicago...for the record, only once before have the Rays gone winless on a 3-city road trip: May 26-June 3, 2014.

DAY IN, DAY OUT—Due to anticipated cold weather, today's game was moved from 8:10 p.m. ET to 2:10 p.m. ET, making every game on this road trip a day game...this is the first time in club history that every game of

a multi-city trip is a day game...three times previously, every game on a Rays road trip was a day game, but all of these instances were 1 game:

- + **Aug 26, 2013 at KC** (makeup game in the middle of a 6-game homestand after a May 2 rain/snowout, described as a "wintry mix")
- + **April 14, 2004 at NYY** (only game played on a 2-game trip after an originally scheduled night game on April 13 was rained out and rescheduled as a traditional doubleheader on Labor Day, Sep 6)
- + **Sep 23, 2004 at NYY** (makeup game in the middle of a 9-game homestand after the Rays arrived, due to Hurricane Frances, three hours after the scheduled start of a Sep 6 doubleheader)

ALL IN A DAY'S WORK—Including the final game of the first homestand, the Rays will play nine consecutive day games from April 1-11...according to Rays PR research, this will be the longest streak of consecutive day games in franchise history...the previous club record was eight straight from April 8-16, 2012 vs. NYY, at DET, at BOS...in fact, aside from these instances, the longest such streak is four straight: Aug 6-10, 2014 at OAK/CHC, April 10-15, 2013 at TEX/BOS and April 4-7, 2002 vs. DET, at NYY.

COLD SNAP—According to weather.com, the highs forecasted for this series in Chicago are 37°, 46° and 59°...the Rays have seen snow in all three cities of this road trip...first-pitch temperature was 38° in yesterday's game at Fenway Park, the third time in franchise history that first pitch was 38° or lower, following April 5, 2007 at NYY (38°) and April 17, 2003 at BOS (34°)...the Rays are 24-37 all-time in games with a first pitch at 50°F or colder and 6-6 at 40°F or colder.

STACKED DECK—The Rays began the season with 9 games against the Red Sox (7) and Yankees (2), the AL East's two postseason teams last season...this series is the first of three consecutive series against teams that finished last season below .500: White Sox, Phillies, Rangers...from today through June 13, only four of the next 19 series are against teams that finished last season at .500 or better.

SEEKING LENGTH—Only once this season has a Rays starter gone at least 6 IP, when **Chris Archer** did it on Opening Day vs. BOS (6 IP plus 2 BF in the 7th inning)...last season, Rays starters went 6 IP or more in 88 of 162 starts (54.3 pct.), tied for the 3rd-highest rate in the AL...the Rays are the only team in the majors without a "quality start" this season (6 IP or more, 3 ER or fewer)...they are on the verge of tying the single-season club record for consecutive games without a "quality start" (10, 3x-last April 10-20, 2005), while the overall club record is 12 spanning 1998-99.

REDEFINING RELIEF—Through 9 games, a Rays reliever has thrown at least 50 pitches six times...the other 29 teams have combined to do it 11 times, and only the Marlins (2) have done it more than once...Rays relievers combined to make 6 apps of 50-plus pitches all of last season...Rays relievers have totaled a 4 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors, and 9 apps of at least 2 IP, tied for most in the majors.

STATISTICAL ANOMALIES—The Rays are 0-4 when scoring first, the only winless team in the majors when doing so...they have scored first in three of their last 4 games...last season, they went 52-30 (.634) when scoring first.

- + The Rays are the only team in the majors with five 1-run losses...in fact, they are the first team with five 1-run losses within their first 9 games of the season since the 2008 Braves (5), and the first AL team since the 1996 White Sox (5)...since 2016, the Rays are 34-56 (.378) in 1-run games, the worst winning pct. in the majors.
- + The Rays are 0-4 when yielding 3 runs or fewer this season...last season, they went 53-16 (.768) when doing that.

CASH YOUNGEST AGAIN—For the fourth consecutive season, Manager **Kevin Cash** (40 years, 124 days) is the majors' youngest manager...he edges out Padres skipper **Andy Green** by almost five months...there were nine major leaguers older than Cash in 2017, and two of them—**Carlos Beltrán** and **Bronson Arroyo**—retired following the season.

MLB ON TWITTER—Select MLB games will be streamed via Twitter as a result of a renewed partnership...Twitter will feature weekly day game live streams of out-of-market games...this will include tomorrow's Rays-White Sox game...fans may watch online or on connected devices at live.twitter.com/mlb and do not require a Twitter account to watch.

LAST START—On Tues at NYY, pitched in the Yankees home opener and allowed a 2nd-inning RBI single to **Tyler Wade** and 3rd-inning, 3-run homer to **Didi Gregorius**...has yielded 4 ER in both starts this season, something he only did in consecutive starts once last season: April 19-24 vs. DET, at BAL...all 6 hits allowed came in the 2nd and 3rd innings...his line: ND, 5 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 3 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 96 pit, 59 str.

+ Was the fourth time in club history that the same pitcher started both the first home game and the first road game of the season...the others: Archer in 2016, **David Price** in 2011 and **Joe Kennedy** in 2003...has avoided the loss in both starts after clutch hits from **Denard Span**—a go-ahead, 3-run triple on Opening Day and game-tying, 2-run double on Tuesday.

vs. WHITE SOX—Is 3-2 with a 4.29 ERA (42-IP, 20-ER) in 8 apps (7 starts) against the White Sox...faced them twice last season, going 0-2 with a 5.14 ERA (7-IP, 4-ER) and solo homers accounted for all 4 runs allowed...last Sep 2 at CWS, yielded back-to-back homers to **Alen Hanson** and **Yolmer Sánchez** and threw one pitch to **Avisail García** before exiting with right lateral forearm tightness...is 2-1 with a 6.23 ERA (21.2-IP, 15-ER) in 5 apps (4 starts) at Guaranteed Rate Field.

KING OF THE K—Has 1,058 SO in his career, which is 7 SO shy of **David Price** (1,065) for 2nd in club history...his 249 SO last season ranked 4th in the majors behind **BOS Chris Sale** (308), **WAS Max Scherzer** (268) and **CLE Corey Kluber** (268), and ranked 2nd in club history, behind his own record of 252 (2015)...led the majors for a third straight year in strikeouts on the slider (179), after recording 152 in 2016 and 179 in 2015...last season he made 9 starts with at least 10 SO, tying the club record...he has done that 27 times in his career, most in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** (23)...has not allowed a walk in 8 of those 27 career starts, tying Price for most in club history and as many as Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** compiled in his 27-year career.

MR. DURABLE—Made 34 starts last season, tying **BAL Kevin Gausman** for the major league lead and tying the club record (Archer in 2015, **David Price** in 2011, **Scott Kazmir** in 2007)...has made at least 30 starts in four straight seasons, one of two Rays pitchers all-time to do that (also **James Shields**, six, 2007-12)...is the third Rays pitcher with three straight years of 200 IP, joining Shields (six, 2007-12) and Price (three, 2010-12)...is one of five pitchers to throw at least 200 IP in each of the last three seasons, along with **Max Scherzer**, **Jeff Samardzija**, **Chris Sale** and **Corey Kluber**...since June 1, 2013—the date he was recalled to the majors for good—he leads the majors with 158 starts...DET/**WAS Max Scherzer** ranks 2nd with 154 starts.

K'S FOR KIDS—Every strikeout he records will benefit the local nonprofit Starting Right, Now...its mission is to combat youth homelessness through a variety of personal development programs...for every strikeout, Archer, the Rays Baseball Foundation and Crown Automotive Group will each donate \$25...this is the fourth consecutive year Archer has conducted the strikeout campaign...any Rays fan or local business can join the strikeout challenge by making a pledge at raysbaseball.com/archer.

ELIAS SAYS—Went 1-5 with a 7.48 ERA (21.2-IP, 18-ER) over his last 6 starts last year, from Sep 2-30, increasing his season ERA from 3.66 to 4.07...this stretch also dropped him from 9-7 to a season-ending 10-12...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in major league history with three straight losing seasons despite recording at least 200 SO each year...in fact, he has posted at least 225 SO in all three of those seasons...the only other pitcher with multiple seasons of at least 225 SO and a losing record was Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan** (1976, 1978, 1987).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (0-1, 5.00 ERA)

LAST START—On Wed at NYY, yielded home runs to **Giancarlo Stanton** (1st inning) and **Gary Sánchez** (3rd inning), tying a career high with 2 HR allowed (3rd time, last Sep 6, 2017 vs. MIN) and snapping his scoreless streak at 12.2 IP...threw 90 pitches in 3.1 IP, and his pitch count by inning was 27-23-27-13...fell to 2-3 in 9 starts against the Yankees and 0-3 in 6 starts at Yankee Stadium...since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), is one of two pitchers with 6 starts at Yankee Stadium in the first 45 games of his career, joining **PHA/BOS Biff Schlitler** (7)...his line: L, 3.1 IP, 4 H, 5 R, 3 BB, 5 SO, 2 HR, 90 pit, 54 str.

LIGHTS OUT—Since his Aug 8 recall last season, he has made 12 starts and hasn't allowed an earned run in five of them...is 5-2 with a 3.14 ERA (66-IP, 23-ER) and .199 opp avg. (47-for-236) over that stretch.

+ Has made 3 starts against the Yankees over this stretch, going 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (9.1-IP, 10-ER) and .263 opp avg. (10-for-38)...his starts against the Yankees have been 5 IP, 1 IP and 3.1 IP...against all other opponents, is 5-0 with a 2.06 ERA (56.2-IP, 13-ER) and .187 opp avg. (37-for-198) and has averaged 6.1 IP per start.

vs. WHITE SOX—Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.1-IP, 0-ER) in 2 starts against the White Sox, both at Guaranteed Rate Field...in his last start of 2016, allowed 1 hit in a rain-shortened start of 2.2 IP...last Sep 1, his only run allowed was unearned in the 2nd inning, a single by **Leury Garcia** (E3, throwing; no RBI)...his line: 6.2 IP, 6 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 1 SO.

+ Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
 + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
 + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
 + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Yesterday at BOS, recorded his second multi-hit game of the season (also March 31 vs. BOS)...hit a go-ahead double in the 3rd inning.
- + Has 2 outfield assists, tied for the major league lead...also robbed a homer from Tyler Wade in the 6th inning on Tues at NYY...it marked the 13th home run robbery of his career, most in the majors since Sports Info Solutions started tracking them in 2004, ahead of Torii Hunter (12).
- + Has appeared in 8 games, all starts (7-RF, 1-CF)...entered the season having made 1,027 starts in center, 44 in left, 20 in right and 7 at DH.
- + Since the start of 2013, no other player can match his combination of 90 HR and 122 SB...is one of seven actives with at least 100 HR and 200 SB in his career, according to Baseball Reference, joining Jacoby Ellsbury, Ian Kinsler, Brandon Phillips, Hanley Ramírez, José Reyes and Ichiro Suzuki.
