The Mariners and Twins meet in the 2nd of 7 games this season...Seattle will also welcome the Twins to Safeco Field, May 25-27...Seattle is 15-16 all-time in Target Field:

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue on their first road trip of the season, a 5,200-mile, 10-day, 8-game odyssey with the 2nd of 3 games vs. Minnesota (0-1)...opened the trip splitting a 2-game series with San Francisco (1-1) and will face Kansas City (3 games) before returning home to Seattle...opened the season at Safeco Field taking 2-of-3 game vs. the Cleveland Indians...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...have lost 2 straight after winning 3 of the first 4 games...team is 2-3 during the day and 1-0 at night...10 of the Mariners first 18 games will be played at Safeco Field.

- **Milestone Tracker** - **Mike Leake** (989) is 11 strikeouts away from recording his 1,000th career strikeout.
- **OBP** - **Robinson Canó** and **Mitch Haniger** are currently T3rd in the AL in OBP (.480).
- **AL Central** - the Mariners face an AL Central opponent in 12 of their first 24 game of the season (2-2)... Seattle went 18-16 vs. the Central in 2017, their first winning season since going 19-14 in 2014.
- **Streaking** - **Robinson Canó** and **Dee Gordon** have each hit safely in 6 straight games to open the season... their 6-game hitting streaks are currently T4th-longest active hitting streak in the American League, trailing only Matt Chapman-OAK (8 G), Andrelton Simmons-LAA (8 G) and Jose Altuve-HOU (7 G).
- **Seeing Double** - **Robinson Canó** is tied for 2nd with Rogers Hornsby for most home runs by a second baseman in Major League history, trailing only Jeff Kent's 377 career home runs.
- **MISPing** - the Mariners are batting .182 (10x55) with RISP in the first 6 games of the season, including going 3-for-29 (.103) over the last 2 games...have also left 45 batters on base this season, 21 in the last 2 games.

BBBBBBBB...Thursday's game time temperature was 38° and the first pitch today is forecasted to be in the low 30's here in Minneapolis...according to available data from Baseball-Reference.com, the Mariners have played only 12 games, including Thursday, since 1988 where the first pitch temp was below 40°...prior to this season the last time with a temperature below 40° was in Chicago-AL on April 5, 2013 with first-pitch temperature for the game registering 34°...the 34° game time temp is tied for the coldest first pitch dating back to 1988 (also: April 9, 1996 at Detroit).

ICE ICE BABY...two of the most productive second baseman over the last couple of years are sharing the field this series: **Robinson Canó** and Twins 2B **Brian Dozier**...since 2013, Canó and Dozier rank among the top 5 Major League second baseman in games, at-bats, runs, doubles, home runs, RBI, walks and slugging percentage...here's a look at some comparative numbers since 2013:

DO YOU WANT TO BUILD A SNOWMAN...8 of the Mariners 21 runs scored this season have been scored in the first inning...the Mariners are batting .400 (12x30) with 8 run scored, 1 double, 1 home run and 2 walks in the first...the team is batting .249 (42x169) with 9 doubles, 4 home runs in innings 2-9...the Mariners .400 average in the 1st inning is the 2nd-highest in the first inning, trailing only the Royals (.450/9x20), while also ranking T1st in hits (12), 5th in OBP (.438) and T5th in runs scored (8).

SOME LIKE IT HOT...**Robinson Canó** (.435/10x23, 6 R, 3 2B, 2 RBI, 2 BB) and **Dee Gordon** (.400/10x25, 4 R, HR, RBI, 2 BB, 3 SB) have each hit safely in each of the first 6 games this season...marks the 3rd time in Canó's career to hit safely at least 6 straight games to open a season (10 G: 4/4-16/10, 6 G: 3/31-4/6/14)...Gordon's 6-game hitting streak to open the season is a career-high.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE...**Robinson Canó** and **Dee Gordon** have each recorded 10 hits in the first 6 Mariners games this season...the 10 hits rank T8th-most in club history for hits through the first 6 games of the season (done 12x), trailing only the club record of 11 hits in the first 6 games (done 7x, last: Ichiro Suzuki in 2005)...the Mariners franchise record for most hits through 7 games is 13 (done 4x, last: Ichiro in 2005)...Gordon's 10 hits are the 2nd-most in his career through 6 games, trailing his 11 hits in 2016...Canó's 10 hits are a career-high (previous: 9 in 2009, 2010 & 2014).

HEAT WAVE...after going 0-for-4 in the first game of the season, **Jean Segura** has recorded a hit in each of the last 5 games, batting .450 (9x20) with 4 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base...overall this season he is batting .375 (9x24) with 4 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base.

TWINNING...since 2013, **Robinson Canó** has hit safely in 28 of his last 33 games vs. the Twins, including 15 multi-hit contests...during this stretch he is batting .375 (51x136) with 20 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 24 RBI and 11 walks...his .375 average vs. Minnesota is the 5th-highest in the Majors during this stretch (min. 90 PA), trailing only Jose Altuve (.422/54x128), Josh Donaldson (.399/55x38), Xander Bogaerts (.389/44x113) and Dustin Pedroia (.385/55x143).

YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE...the Mariners 1-4 batters in the lineup have combined to hit .362 (34x94) with 18 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI and 10 walks over the first 6 games of the season...the rest of the lineup is batting a combined .190 (20x105) average with 3 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 7 RBI and 9 walks.

THE HEAT IS ON...**Edwin Diaz** has struck out 8 of the 11 batters he has faced this season (0 H, 2 HB), averaging 24.00 strikeouts per 9.0 innings over his first 3 appearances this season...in his career, **Diaz** has recorded strikeout rate of 13.80 per 9.0 innings, the 4th-highest since making his debut in 2016...trails only Craig Kimbrel-BOS (15.36), Dellin Betances-NYY (15.30) and Andrew Miller-CLE (14.43).

AS YOU KNOW...**Dee Gordon** is batting .500 (3x6) with 2 runs scored when leading off the first inning...**AND AS YOU MIGHT KNOW**...since 2017, Gordon has a .353 (49x139) average with 39 runs scored, 5 doubles, 3 triples, 1 home run, 1 RBI and 7 walks from the lead off spot in the first...**BUT, DID YOU KNOW?**...that since 2017, Gordon's .353 average batting leadoff in the first inning is the highest in the Majors?...he ranks ahead of leadoff hitters Brett Gardner-NYY (.323/41x127), **Jean Segura**-SEA (.315/35x111), Billy Hamilton-CIN (.302/39x129) and Brian Dozier-MIN (.301/44x146).

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
30-year-old right-hander is making his 7th Mariners start, 2nd start of the season, 240th career appearance, 235th career start and 3rd career start vs. the Twins today.
A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft...did not sign.
Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
Is 13-11 with a 3.89 ERA (108 ER, 249.2 IP) in 39 career GS in April.

LAST OUTING...earned his first win of the season in his 2018 debut, a 5-4 Mariners win over Cleveland on April 1, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing 2 runs on 5 hits and 3 walks while striking out 4.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 6 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (14 ER, 23.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 1 walk...threw 6.0 innings in his final spring start on 3/21 vs. MIL, allowing 4 runs on 10 hits while walking 1 and striking out 4.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayer Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

NO APRIL FOOLS...Leake went 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (5 ER, 33.1 IP) in 5 April starts in 2017...his 1.35 ERA in April was the 4th-lowest in the Majors in 2017, ranking just ahead of Mariners starter James Paxton (1.39)...overall he is 13-11 with a 3.89 ERA (108 ER, 249.2 IP) in 39 career starts in the month of April.

FOUR SCORE...is 6-1 with a 3.22 ERA (24 ER, 67.0 IP) in his last 10 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to May 6, 2017...his clubs are a combined 8-2 in those 10 games (6-2 w/STL, 2-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 63-4 with a 3.39 ERA (230 ER, 610.0 IP) in 94 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 75-19 in those 94 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 234 starts, 16th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 17th in innings pitched (1453.1).

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in the Majors made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber-CLE, 8, Chris Sale-BOS, 4, Carlos Martinez-STL, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom-NYM, 4 and Carlos Carrasco-CLE, 4).

QUICK RISE...became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

BACK TO THE MINORS...started for the Cardinals opposite Pittsburgh in the Little League Classic at BB&T Ballpark in Williamsport, Pa. on Aug. 20, 2017...excluding Spring Training and Arizona Fall League, marked only his 3rd career appearance in a minor league ballpark...made 2 appearances (1 start) with AAA Louisville (Cincinnati) in 2011...took the loss in the Little League Classic, allowing 6 runs on 8 hits (1 home run) while striking out 3 in 3.0 innings.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 84-77 with a 3.98 ERA (642 ER, 1453.1 IP) with 989 strikeouts and 345 walks in 239 career games (234 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
