HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 21-10 (.677) since May 28, tied for the Majors' best record with the Astros, ahead of the Yankees (20-10, .667), Mariners (21-11, .656) and Red Sox (20-11, .645).
- ♦ The D-backs have won 7 of their last 10 games, 15 of their last 22 games and 19 of their last 28.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has a franchise-record 25-game scoreless streak (22.1 IP) [SEE NOTE].
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 23 games, is batting .387 (36-for-93)/.477 OBP/.785 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 9 homers, 22 RBI and 15 walks...in his last 9 home games, is hitting .314 (11-for-35) with 2 homers, 4 RBI and 5 walks.
- ♦ **Zack Godley's** 9 wins are 1 behind the NL leaders Jon Lester, Aaron Nola and Max Scherzer...Godley has a 4-game winning streak (3.09 ERA, 9 ER in 23.1 IP, .235 opponent average, 25 strikeouts) during which he's allowed 2 runs in each start...in 6 home starts (4 quality), is 4-1 with a 2.89 ERA (12 ER in 37.1 IP), .243 opponent average (33-for-136) and 37 strikeouts.

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .425 (17-for-40) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 11 games this season.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has 5 doubles, 1 homer, 5 RBI and 2 walks in 11 games this season.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has held the Giants scoreless in all 6 games this season (6.0 IP, H, 3 BB, 9 K) and 11 straight games since April 4, 2017 (14.1 IP, 7 H, 7 BB, 20 K).
- ♦ **Fernando Salas** has held the Giants scoreless in 13 straight games (12.1 IP) with a .179 average (7-for-39) and 10 strikeouts, and 14 of 15 career games with a 0.63 ERA (1 ER in 14.1 IP), a .208 opponent average (10-for-48) and 11 strikeouts.

PERALTA JOINS D-BACKS' 500-GAMES CLUB

- ♦ David Peralta played in his 500th career game on Friday, the 21st D-back to reach that mark, and ranked among the D-backs all-time leaders at 500 career games in average (2nd, .290), triples (2nd, 30), hits (2nd, 516), OPS (4th, .818), slugging pct. (4th, .473), on-base pct. (5th, .345) and homers (6th, 58).

- ♦ D-backs starters, in their last 10 starts (6 quality), are 6-2 with a 2.54 ERA (16 ER in 56.2 IP), .214 opponent average (45-for-210) and 61 strikeouts.
- ♦ This stretch included 3 straight scoreless outings (18.0 IP) June 22-24 and back-to-back scoreless outings (13.0 IP) June 27-28.
- ♦ D-backs starters have worked 6.0-plus innings 45 times, second most in the NL and sixth most in the Majors behind the Astros (66), Indians (57), Red Sox (50), Nationals (49), and Mariners (48).

THROUGH 81 GAMES

- ♦ The D-backs' 47 wins through 81 games tied for fourth most in team history with 2000 (50 in 2001, 48 in 2017, 48 in 2002).
- ♦ The D-backs 3.40 ERA is the lowest at the 81-game mark in club history, narrowly edging out the 3.41 ledger in 2017.
