METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have won four of their last seven games...New York is 5-5 in its last 10 games...New York is 12-11 in July...The 12 wins this month are tied for the second-most among NL East teams with Miami, behind the Phillies, who have 14 victories in July...The Mets are 19-20 vs. the NL East...New York is 19-38 in its last 57 games.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 2-2 on their six-game road trip and 23-26 on the road this year...New York is 10-18 in its last 28 road games and 5-4 in its last nine.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Mets have won six games vs. Washington this year with nine games remaining...New York won six games all of last year vs. the Nats and seven games in 2016...The Mets are 16-14 at Nationals Park since 2015, including a three-game sweep, April 5-8, earlier this year...The Mets have hit 37 home runs in their last 24 games at Nationals Park.

ROAD O: New York has a .748 OPS on the road this year, the seventh-highest mark in the majors...The Mets are fifth in the NL with a .416 slugging percentage and fifth with a .332 OBP on the road.

1-0 WINS: The Mets beat the Pirates, 1-0, at Pittsburgh on Sunday...It was the first 1-0 win since June 25, 2016 at Atlanta (11 innings) and the 132nd 1-0 victory in franchise history...Zack Wheeler drove home the only run of the game with an RBI double in the fifth-inning...It was the sixth game in team history where the Mets won 1-0 with the lone RBI coming from a pitcher...See the list below.

SECOND-HALF CONFORTO: Michael Conforto is tied for ninth in the NL with nine RBI since the All-Star break...He is sixth in the NL with a .367 second-half batting average, sixth with .733 slugging percentage and ninth with a .444 on-base percentage...Conforto is also tied for 10th in the NL with three homers.

MORE MIKE: Conforto is 11-for-30 (.367) with three homers, two doubles and nine RBI in nine games since the All-Star break...Over his last 13 games, Conforto is hitting .333 (14-42) with four home runs, two doubles, 12 RBI, 11 runs scored and a .442 OBP...Conforto has a 14.9 percent walk-rate, the eighth-best in the majors.

AMED ROSARIO: Has scored six runs and driven in four runs in his last eight games...Rosario is hitting .271 (16-59) with 10 runs scored, two doubles, four triples, six RBI, five stolen bases and a .306 OBP in his last 15 games...Overall, is tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

IN A PINCH: Phillip Evans is hitting .333 (3-9) as a pinch-hitter this year and is 7-21 (.333) during his career as a pinch-hitter.

METS-NATIONALS NOTES: The Mets have six wins already this year vs. Washington after winning six games all of last year.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



STEVEN MATZ: Has posted a 3.48 ERA (33 earned runs/85.1 innings) in 15 starts since May 1...His 3.48 ERA in that span is the 15th-best in the NL (min. 80 innings)...All eight of his quality starts this season have come in that span.

MATZ ON THE ROAD: Will make his 11th road start of the season... Matz is 4-3 with a 3.35 ERA (19 earned runs/51.0 innings) on the road this year...His 3.35 ERA is the 12th-lowest in the NL (min. 50.0 innings)...Matz has allowed one run or less in six of his 10 road starts.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo has a .450 on-base percentage in the second half, the seventh-highest mark in the NL...He has walked five times in the last four games...Nimmo has a career-high 13 homers, but has one home run in his last 33 games... Overall, he is 11th in the NL with a .382 on-base percentage, 18th with a .858 OPS and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

WELCOME TO THE BIGS: Jeff McNeil became the second player in team history to reach safely in six of his first seven career plate appearances according to Elias...He is hitting .250 with a .500 OBP after his first six games in the majors...McNeil, 26, was batting .342 (116-339) with 26 doubles, five triples, 19 home runs, 71 RBI, 72 runs scored, a .411 OBP, a .617 slugging percentage and a 1.028 OPS in 88 combined games between Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League and Las Vegas...His 1.028 OPS was fifth-highest among all full-season minor league players while his .617 slugging percentage was third-best among full-season minor leaguers...His 71 RBI were 15th-most in the minors.

TODD FRAZIER: Is expected to play for Brooklyn (A) of the New York-Penn League today...Frazier was 1-4 with a double, walk and two RBI in two minor league rehabilitation games with St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League...Frazier has been on the DL since July 9 with a left rib cage muscle strain.

LAST START: Matz tonight makes his 21st start of the season...Snapped a three-game losing streak in his last start, July 26 at Pittsburgh...The lefty pitched 6.0 innings, giving up four runs, earned, on three hits with two walks and a career-high-tying nine strikeouts...Was his 10th consecutive start throwing at least 5.0 innings, the third-longest streak of his career...Retired the final 10 batters he faced...Has allowed three or fewer hits in seven starts this season, tied for the third-most such starts in the NL.

CAPITAL ZERO: In three-career starts at Nationals Park, Matz is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 earned runs/20.0 innings)...Opponents are batting .162 against Matz at Nationals Park in his career...Matz has not allowed a single earned run in 20.0 innings in the Nats' ballpark, spanning three starts there...Matz is one of three active pitchers in the majors with at least 20.0 innings pitched at a single ballpark with no earned runs allowed there (others are Pat Neshek, 0 ER/26.0 IP at Citizens Bank Park and Cole Hamels, 0 ER/20.0 IP at Kauffman Stadium)

VS. WASHINGTON: Matz tonight will make his eighth-career start against the Washington Nationals and his third this season...In his seven previous starts against the Nationals, Matz is 1-3 with a 2.64 ERA (13 earned runs/44.1 innings)... Last started at Nationals Park on April 18 of this season...Pitched 5.0 innings in the start, giving up one run, unearned, on three hits with two walks and eight strikeouts...Adam Eaton, Bryce Harper, Trea Turner and Ryan Zimmerman are hitting a combined .106 (5-47) against Matz with one home run and seven strikeouts.

ROAD WARRIOR: Will make his 11th road start of the season tonight at Washington...In 10 road starts this season, Matz is 4-3 with a 3.35 ERA (19 earned runs/51.0 innings)...His 3.35 ERA on the road this season is good for 12th in the National League (min. 50.0 innings)...Has allowed one or no earned runs in six of his 10 road starts this season...In 32 career starts on the road, Matz is 13-10 with a 3.60 ERA (71 earned runs/177.2 innings)...Has finished 10 of his 32 career starts on the road without allowing an earned run...Is the only Mets starter since 2015 with 10 road starts allowing no earned runs...Has held his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in 19 of his 32 starts away from home.

MATZ SINCE MAY: Is 4-6 with a 3.48 ERA (33 earned runs/85.1 innings) in 15 starts since the beginning of May...His 3.48 ERA in that span is 14th-best in the NL (min. 82.0 innings)...All eight of his quality starts this season have come in that span... Has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 11 of those 15 starts in that stretch, including seven starts allowing one or no earned runs.

STRANDED: Since May 5, opponents are hitting .189 (27-143) with men on base and .160 (12-75) with RISP off Matz in 15 starts...Overall this season, hitters are 36-169 (.213) with runners on and 21-97 (.216) with RISP off Matz...His 76.3 left on base percentage is good for 11th-best among qualifying National League pitchers.

BALLS IN PLAY: Only 14.9 percent of balls put in play against Steven Matz this season have been line drives, the lowest against any qualifying pitcher in the majors this year...49.7 percent of the balls in play against Matz have been grounders, the 11th-highest percentage in the majors (eighth in NL).

A TALE OF TWO HALVES: In 42-career starts before the All-Star Break, Matz is 15-14 with a 3.21 ERA (87 earned runs/244.0 innings)...His 3.21 first-half ERA is the 11th-best mark in the NL (14th in majors) since 2015 among all pitchers with at least 220.0 first-half innings in the last four seasons...In 19-career starts after the All-Star break, Matz is 5-9 with a 5.71 ERA (62 earned runs/97.2 innings)...Snapped a streak of six-straight losses after the break dating to last season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP NOAH SYNDERGAARD (6-1, 2.89)

HE'S BACK: Syndergaard tomorrow is expected to be activated from the 10-Day Disabled list to make his 14th start of the season...Went on the DL July 23 with hand, foot and mouth disease...Earned the win in his last start, July 20 against the Yankees...Syndergaard tossed 5.0 innings, giving up one run, earned on eight hits with no walks and four strikeouts...Was his second-straight win since returning from his first DL stint this season (strained muscle in right index finger).

THUNDERSTRUCK: Has won four-straight games, the second-longest streak of his career...Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 12 starts since surrendering four runs in his Opening Day win...Jacob deGrom (18) is the only NL pitcher with a longer active streak of starts with no more than three runs allowed... Is 5-1 with a 2.51 ERA (18 earned runs/64.2 innings) in his last 11 starts.
