THE HEAT IS ON

- The Colorado Rockies return home for a six-game homestand to complete the first half of the season before the All-Star break ... will play three games against the Arizona Diamondbacks Tuesday-Thursday before hosting the Seattle Mariners Friday-Sunday.
- The Rockies took two of three from the Mariners over the weekend, the third time in franchise history that they took two of three in Seattle (2006, 2015).
- Had their five-game winning streak snapped on Sunday, falling to the Mariners 6-4 ... the Rockies allowed more than two runs for the first time since July 2, a five-game streak that was one short of tying the franchise record (2x, last: June 9-15, 2007).
- The Rockies have won five of their last six games, outscoring opponents 30-11 over that span ... have also won eight the past 10 and 12 of the past 18 ... are off to a 5-2 start in July after an 11-16 June.

SMASH MOUTH

- Major League Baseball announced Sunday that Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon and Trevor Story were each selected to represent the National League in the 2018 All-Star Game at Nationals Park in Washington D.C. ... it is the sixth consecutive season that the Rockies have had multiple All-Stars.
- Arenado was voted by the fans as the National League's starting third baseman for the second consecutive year ... it is his fourth consecutive All-Star selection, tied with Dante Bichette (1994-96, 1998) and Larry Walker (1997-99, 2001) for the second-most All-Star selections in franchise history ... Arenado joins Todd Helton (2000-04) as the only Rockies players to be selected to four consecutive All-Star games.
- This is Blackmon's third All-Star selection, his second in a row ... he is the ninth player in franchise history to earn three All-Star nods, the fifth Rockies outfielder (also: González, Holliday, Walker, Bichette).
- Story joins Troy Tulowitzki as the only shortstops in franchise history to be named to the All-Star team ... his 62 RBI prior to the All-Star break are the most in the first half by a shortstop in club history ... his next game played will be his 90th this season, which will also be the most by a shortstop prior to the break in franchise history.

NO OPHIDIOPHOBIA

- The Rockies have lost eight in a row vs. the Diamondbacks at Coors Field, tied for the losing streak at Coors Field against any single opponent (also: Pittsburgh, July 27, 2014-April 27, 2016 and Los Angeles-AL, July 6, 2001-July 8, 2015) ... the Rockies lost 11 straight to the Atlanta Braves at Mile High Stadium from May 6, 1993-Aug. 9, 1994).
- Were swept by Arizona at Coors Field June 8-19, allowing 29 runs while scoring 14 ... dropped two of three at Arizona to open the 2018 season.
- The Rockies are 18-26 overall against Arizona since the 2016 season, including 7-15 at Coors Field.
- Will travel to Chase Field for three games immediately after the All-Star break.

GO LOW

- Sunday's start by Antonio Senzatela snapped a streak of eight starts by Rockies starters allowing two or fewer runs ... the streak was tied for the longest in franchise history (also: Sept. 16-23, 2014).
- Over their last nine starts, Rockies starters have posted a 2.02 ERA (58.0 IP, 13 ER), 13 walks and 46 strikeouts ... have allowed nine extra-base hits over that span, including five home runs.
- The Rockies have nine outings of at least seven scoreless innings, including four such outings since June 27 ... that is tied for the third-most starts of that kind in franchise history (also: 2011) behind the 2008 (11) team and the 2010 club (16).
- Since the start of 2017, the Rockies have used eight starting pitchers, the fewest in the Major Leagues.

WORM IS TURNING

- Colorado's bullpen has not allowed a run over their past four games (10.0 IP) and have allowed just one run over their past six games (14.0 IP).
- Colorado's bullpen has a 3.06 ERA (50.0 IP, 17 ER) in the past 18 games, with seven saves in eight opportunities.

FUTURE

- Two Rockies players were chosen to play in the All-Star Futures Game, which will be played on Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park.
- Infielder Brendan Rodgers will represent the U.S. Team ... Rodgers is batting .273 with 21 doubles, two triples, 17 home runs, 58 RBI and 11 stolen bases with Double-A Hartford this season.
- Right-handed pitcher Jesus Tinoco was selected to represent the World Team ... Tinoco, acquired by the Rockies in 2015 from the Toronto Blue Jays, is 6-7 with a 5.21 ERA (93.1 IP, 54 ER), 27 walks and 85 strikeouts with Hartford.

BE IN YOUR SEATS

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (74) and is tied for first in runs allowed in the first frame, first in the NL (75).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 27 home runs in the first inning, and have allowed 22 (tied for the most in MLB) ... Nolan Arenado's 10 first-inning home runs and 25 RBI are the most in MLB.

NORMAL NOLAN

- Nolan Arenado is tied for second in the National League with 22 home runs and ranks fourth with 63 RBI ... also ranks third in slugging percentage (.583) and second in total bases (187).

A NOVEL STORY

- Trevor Story returned to the starting lineup on Sunday after missing Saturday's game with a right foot contusion, ending his consecutive games streak at 139 ... it was the third-longest active streak in the Majors.
- Story is fifth in the NL with 62 RBI, second with 44 extra-base hits, fourth with 182 total bases and tied for eighth with 17 home runs.
- Batting .351 (47-for-134) since June 1, the second-highest average in the National League that span ... also leads the NL since June 1 with 15 doubles.
- Has hit .343 (36-for-105) on the road since May 15.

QUACKS LIKE A DUCK

- The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his 19th start of the season, his ninth at Coors Field ... is a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
The University of Oregon product was selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

LAST TIME OUT

- Was the winning pitcher in the Rockies 1-0 win over the Giants at Coors Field on July 4 ... pitched eight scoreless innings for the second consecutive start, allowing two hits with two walks and a season-high tying nine strikeouts.
Became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to toss at least eight scoreless innings with two or fewer hits at Coors Field, joining Kyle Freeland (2017), Chad Bettis (2016), Jeff Francis (2006) and Shawn Chacon (2003).

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

- Also pitched eight scoreless innings in his start at Los Angeles-NL on June 29 ... is the third pitcher in franchise history to record consecutive outings of at least eight scoreless innings (also: Ubaldo Jimenez, May 26-31, 2010 and Jason Marquis, June 30-July 6, 2009).
Is the first pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that feat while allowing four or fewer hits in each start ... is the first pitcher in MLB to accomplish the feat since Jake Arrieta, Aug. 30-Sept. 5, 2015.

SNAKES

- Will be making his second start of the season vs. Arizona ... no decision in the Rockies 9-8 loss at Chase Field on March 30 ... allowed seven runs on five hits with four walks and three strikeouts in 2.1 innings pitched.
In seven career appearances, five starts, against the D-backs, is 2-0 with a 6.67 ERA (28.1 IP, 21 ER), 13 walks and 37 strikeouts ... 1-0 with a 8.10 ERA (23.1 IP, 21 ER) as a starter.
In three appearances, two starts, against Arizona at Coors Field has gone 1-0 with a 2.13 ERA (12.2 IP, 3 ER), four walks and 21 strikeouts ... one relief appearance June 22, 2017, a scoreless inning.

HOME SWEET HOME

- There are only two Rockies starters all-time with a lower Coors Field ERA than his 3.67 ... Kyle Freeland (3.44) and Ubaldo Jimenez (3.67) ... sixth-lowest ERA at Coors Field among all Rockies pitchers (min. 100 IP).
In 28 career appearances in Denver, has worked 166.2 innings, allowing 68 earned runs ... is 10-8 overall at home with the Rockies 13-14 over his 27 starts.
In seven starts at Coors Field this year, is 2-3 with a 4.37 ERA (47.1 IP, 23 ER).
His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

AWAY WE GO

- Rockies have won seven of his last nine road starts (4-0, 2.42, 52.0 IP, 14 ER) since April 5 ... has five quality starts ... overall, is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA (54.1 IP, 21 ER) in 10 road games this year.
Is 7-7 with a 4.46 ERA (135.1 IP, 67 ER) in 26 career games, 25 starts, away from Coors Field.

TAKE A FLIER

- Has the third-lowest ground-ball percentage in the National League at 36.6 ... his 106 fly balls rank tied for second in the NL ... induced 104 ground balls with a grounder-to-flies ratio of 0.98 which ranks third-lowest in the NL.

SAY HIT TO JULY

- Did not make a start in July in 2017 ... in five starts in July 2016, went 3-1 with a 3.86 ERA (30.1 IP, 13 ER), five walks and 22 strikeouts.

MAGIC NUMBER IS SIX

- Is 5-1 with a 2.15 ERA (67.0 IP, 16 ER) in 10 games when working six or more innings ... fashioned nine quality starts.
Worked six or more innings six times in his past eight games with five quality starts.

BACK STRONG

- The Rockies have won 12 of his 22 appearances (11 of 21 starts) after he missed much of June and all of July and August last year (knee surgery) ... 9-4 with a 3.40 ERA (124.1 IP, 47 ER) since Sept. 11, 2017.

THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

JUST A TASTE

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.

23-year-old right-hander makes his 19th start of the season, his 10th at Coors Field where he is 2-5 with a 7.93 ERA (42.0 IP, 37 ER) ... is 5-3 with a 2.62 ERA (55.0 IP, 16 ER) on the road, the fourth-lowest road ERA in the National League ... is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 IP, 2 ER), no walks and 14 strikeouts over his past two starts ... won at Seattle in his previous start, allowing one run, a solo home run, on five hits with no walks and five strikeouts ... is 0-1 with a 5.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 5 ER) in two starts against Arizona this season ... lost at Coors Field on June 8, allowing five runs on six hits, including three home runs, in four innings ... in nine career appearances, eight starts, against Arizona is 0-4 with a 4.47 ERA (44.1 IP, 22 ER).
