LEADING OFF: Halos play the fourth contest of a six-game trip (0-3) to Tampa Bay (0-3) & Cleveland (8/3-5)...Angels are 15-10 vs. A.L. Central foes...LAA has dropped four straight to fall a season-high two games under .500 (2nd time; 50-52)...Club has not been three under the mark since a 79-82 record on Sept. 30, 2017...After starting 18-8 on the road (tops in MLB), Angels are 7-20 since...LAA is 5-8 since the break, 11-15 since July 1st & 13-16 across last 29 games...Angels are in fourth place, -15.0 in A.L. West (-10.0 for 2nd wild card)...Halos have spent last 36 days in 4th place...LAA is 10-21 when a lefty starts (44-35 vs. RHS)...Following the trip, Halos host Detroit (8/6-8) & Oakland (8/10-12).

FAST FACTS: Angels held to four runs last two games after plating 49 runs previous six affairs...Yesterday marked first time Mike Trout (right wrist contusion; day-to-day) did not appear in a game since Sept. 28, 2017 at White Sox.

DAILY DISH OF TROUT: With his next walk, Trout will reach 100 BB, 25 HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016)...No other American League has ever accomplished the feat more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).

BATS SINCE THE BREAK: Since All-Star break, Halos rank second in A.L. with 31 doubles, third in circuit in extra-base hits (51) & fourth in runs (73)...In last 11 contests, LAA batting .310 (31/100) with RISP.

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has four HRs his last seven games & nine HRs last 18 affairs...In those 18 games, hitting .338 (23/68) with 17 runs, six doubles, nine HR & 21 RBI...In 37 games since returning from D.L., batting .288 (38/132) with 27 runs, nine doubles, 13 HR & 30 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .208 (1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G)...His 13 HR since June 18th lead A.L.

AWAY WITH YOU! Andrelton Simmons (.349; 61/175, 2nd in A.L.) & Mike Trout (.326; 63/193, 5th in A.L.) are LAA's top road hitters this season...Justin Anderson (2.25 ERA in 19 G), Jose Alvarez (2.42 ERA in 27 G) & Felix Pena (0.96 ERA; 9.1 IP - 1 ER) are Halos' top pitching performers in away games this season.

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 51 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against Oakland (6 at home, 3 on road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month on road...LAA plays seven interleague games in August (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL).

THERE GO JQ: Angels' top prospect OF Jo Adell was promoted to Double-A Mobile Monday (HR, 3 R, 2 RBI in debut Tuesday)...In 82 combined single-A games, he batted .300 (100/333) with 69 runs, 26 doubles, four triples, 18 HR, 71 RBI & 13 SB...The 2017 first round pick is rated the 11th overall prospect in minors by Baseball America.

MIKE MASHES #30: On Tuesday, Trout connected for his 30th HR to join Willie Mays as only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history).

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turns 27 on Tuesday (8/7/91)...He is one of four players with 1,100 hits & 600 walks before turning 27, joining Jimmie Foxx, Mel Ott, & Mickey Mantle...Also joins Mantle, Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...His 231 HRs are ninth all-time before age 27, trailing A. Rodriguez (273), Foxx (266), Mathews (253), A. Pujols (250), Mantle (249), Ott (242), Griffey Jr. (238) & F. Robinson (235).

WORTH THE WAIT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, Catcher Francisco Arcia made his MLB debut July 26th (2-4, R, HR, 4 RBI), first Angel with four RBI in big league debut (13th in A.L. history)...On Saturday (7/28), he posted two doubles, HR & six RBI...His 10 RBI thru first two career games are an MLB record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis)...Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games.

SHELVED: 22 players were placed on the disabled list in the first half (most in MLB)...Angels have 11 players currently on DL...Average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 33 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...52 players used for LAA this season, most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played (12 starters), most in team history thru 110 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 5 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HR (3rd; 30), runs (3rd; 82), runs created (1st; 119), total bases (5th; 232), times on base (1st; 221), walks (1st; 99), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; .459), SLG (4th; .624), OPS (2nd; 1.083), OPS+ (1st; 196.0) and offensive WAR (7.2; 1st).

WALK TALK: Trout's 99 walks are most in club history through 110 games (club record is 116 walks in 2016 by Trout)...First MLB player with at least 99 walks thru 109 games since Barry Bonds (145) in 2004...First Angel with three 4+ walk games in a season...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...Since 2012, he leads A.L. in multi-walk games (143) and has 25 such games in 2018...On pace for 146 walks which would be the most since Bonds' 232 BB in 2004 and most in A.L. since Eddie Yost's 151 in 1956.

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 119 double plays...Catchers own a 38.8 caught stealing pct. (19 of 49), tops in A.L. (3rd in MLB)...A. Simmons leads A.L. shortstops with 150 putouts and is T3rd for fewest errors (7; min. 90 GS)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 21.2 % to score (40 of 189)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 110 affairs (5th in A.L. with 968 K)...Bullpen has logged 409 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Halos have allowed 144 HRs, second-most in A.L...Since 2017, Jose Alvarez and Blake Parker have each pitched in 119 games, each tied for second-most in A.L. in span.

THIS N' THAT: Trout has matched Tim Salmon for most 30+ HR seasons (5) in team history...Since 2016, Trout holds a .326 average (58/178) in August with 24 XBH (14 HR) and 34 RBI in 53 games...A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 18.41 (405 PA/22 K)...He also leads MLB batting .299 (38/127) with two strikes...Angels' 149 HRs hit are fourth-most in MLB...Trout's 7.8 WAR leads MLB...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Mike Scioscia (1,624 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Shohei Ohtani is first Angel with first nine career HRs hit at home (all against RHP)...Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (Bill Akers, 1930 w/ Det)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Albert Pujols is batting .333 (19/57) his last 14 games (9 R, 5 2B, 5 HR, 9 RBI) to raise average from .243 to .256...Justin Upton has hit in 13 of 17 games batting .355 (22/62; 11 R, 3 2B, 4 HR, 13 RBI)...David Fletcher has hit in nine of 12 (five multi-hit games) batting .340 (16/47) with 10 runs, four doubles & four RBI...Mike Trout has four HR his last seven games & five HR his last 10 affairs...Andrew Heaney is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP - 11 ER) across last nine home starts (1.60 home ERA since April 27 leads A.L.)...Cam Bedrosian has a 1.85 ERA (24.1 IP - 5 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,068 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...He is five hits shy of becoming 1 of 9 players all-time with 1,000 hit is each league...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 631 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,973 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,285 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/1,323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 27 RBI shy).

@ CLEVELAND: Angels have dropped last 10 games at Progressive Field (2-12 last 14 games here)...Longest road losing streak in club history vs. any opponent is 12 at CWS (1964-66)...Halos lead 2018 season series 2-1 (April 2-4 at Angel Stadium)...Angels' 13-2 win on April 3rd snapped a 12-game losing streak to Cleveland (matched longest in Club history vs. one team)...LAA has dropped 16 of last 19 overall to the Tribe.

TIGERS ON DECK: Detroit leads 2018 season series 3-1 (clubs met May 28-31 at Comerica Park)...Angels are 19-5 in last 24 home games vs. Tigers (26-9 in last 35 overall meetings at Big A)...Albert Pujols owns a .333 (67/205) career clip against the Tigers with 13 home runs & 38 RBI in 56 games...His .327 average is second highest (Toronto, .337) against any A.L. opponent...Justin Upton hit .260 (268/1029) with 59 HR & 181 RBI in 278 games as a Tiger (2016-17).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 3

(1982) Doug DeCinces homered three times to tie club record in 5-4 loss vs. Minnesota...He accomplished the same feat five days later (8/8)...No other player in A.L. history had connected for three HR in a game twice in the same week.

August 4

(1967) Angels won their club-record 12th consecutive home game, beating Washington, 5-4; (1985) Rod Carew became the 16th player in Major League history to record 3,000 hits with his third-inning single against Minnesota's Frank Viola.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

6-7, 3.74 ERA

Has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of last nine starts

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Is making 16th start of the season for Angels and seventh on the road...Recalled from Adv.-A Inland Empire on July 23 for sixth stint of season with Angels (did not pitch for 66ers during stint with the team).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Saturday vs. Seattle after working six innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with no walks and two strikeouts; the victory was his first since June 1 and snapped a six-decision losing streak...Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in seven of last nine starts.
- **WALKS UP:** Has walked 13 batters across last seven starts after walking nine in previous eight starts to begin the year.
- **ROUGH STRETCH:** Prior to win in last start, was 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) in his seven previous starts; however, has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of the seven games...In his first seven starts, Angels were 5-2 and he went 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP – 10 ER).
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Ranks fourth among American League rookies with six wins, fifth in ERA (min. 50 IP) and third in batting average against (.243).
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Made 13 first half starts for the Angels and pitched to a 5-6 record and 3.55 ERA (66 IP – 26 ER) with 52 strikeouts.
- **STREAKING:** Won four straight decisions between May 3 – June 1, which is the longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **VS. CLEVELAND:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Indians.
- **AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Progressive Field...Is 3-3 with 3.19 ERA (31 IP – 11 ER) on the road this season.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **GENERATION GAP:** When they faced off on June 1, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 85 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP – 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and was the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** was ranked #1)...He was also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.
