TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 5, 1953: With a 4-3 "walk-off" victory over the Brooklyn Dodgers, the Yankees secure their fifth consecutive World Series title, winning the series in six games. Billy Martin provides the winning hit, scoring Hank Bauer with a one-out single.

Oct. 5, 1921: In their first-ever World Series game, the Yankees defeat the New York Giants, 3-0, at the Polo Grounds. Carl Mays allows only five hits (0BB, 1K) in his complete-game shutout.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 6, 1947: Joe Page allows only one hit in 5.0 innings of relief as the Yankees earn a 5-2 win over the Dodgers in Game 7 of the World Series, marking the 11th championship in franchise history.

Oct. 6, 1926: Babe Ruth goes 3-for-3 with 3HR, 4R, 4RBI and 2BB during the Yankees' 10-5 win over the Cardinals in Game 4 of the World Series. Ruth remains one of only four players in MLB history to hit 3HR in a World Series game.

ON TO THE NEXT ONE: The Yankees begin their best-of-five ALDS with Game 1 against the Red Sox tonight in Boston...are 1-0 in their 54th postseason in club history.

- ▶ Marks their 20th appearance in the ALDS, their 19th in 24 postseasons since the playoffs were expanded to eight teams in 1995 (for full list, see p. 145 of Yankees' 2018 Postseason Media Guide or p. 326 of 2018 Media Guide)...are 12-7 in 19 series in the ALDS.
- ▶ Are 12-7 in ALDS Game 1's, including 6-2 in their last eight...had won four straight before a 4-0 loss in 2017 at Cleveland.

WILD NIGHT: The Yankees won the AL Wild Card Game for the second straight year, defeating Oakland, 7-2...became the first team to win consecutive Wild Card Games...**RHP Luis Severino** (4.0IP, 2H, 0R, 4BB, 7K) took a no-decision in his fifth career postseason start...did not allow a hit until the fifth...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) hit a two-run HR in the first...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB, 1SB) homered to lead off the eighth...Stanton (117.4 mph) and Judge (116.1 mph) each broke the Statcast record for exit velocity on a postseason HR...**1B Luke Voit** (1-for-4, 1R) hit a two-run triple in the sixth inning of his postseason debut...**RHP Dellin Betances** (2.0IP, 3K) retired all 6BF to earn the win.

- ▶ Only five of the Yankees' 10 starters also started the 2017 AL Wild Card Game (Judge, Hicks, Gregorius, Sánchez, Severino).

SEEING RED: The ALDS marks only the fourth time that the Yankees will face the Red Sox in a postseason series (won 1999 ALCS, won 2003 ALCS, lost 2004 ALCS)...are 11-8 in 19 postseason games (6-4 at home, 5-4 in Boston).

- ▶ Is the first postseason meeting of 100-win teams prior to the World Series since 1977, when the Yankees defeated Kansas City in the ALCS...is the second consecutive postseason with a matchup of 100-win teams, following the 2017 World Series between Houston and Los Angeles-NL.
- ▶ According to YES Network research, their regular season finale at Fenway Park on Sunday was just the second time in Major League history that two 100-win teams met in the regular season, also the 1909 Pirates and Cubs from 10/3-4/1909 at Chicago's West Side Grounds.

HOT HAND LUKE: **1B Luke Voit** hit a two-run triple in the AL Wild Card Game, his first career triple (regular or postseason).

- ▶ In his last 12G (regular and postseason), is batting .404 (19-for-47) with 13R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 18RBI and 4BB...has at least 1RBI in six straight games and 10-of-12, with multiple RBI in four of his last 5G.
- ▶ Made his Yankees debut on 8/2 and hit .333/.405/.689 (44-for-132) with 28R, 5 doubles, 14HR, 33RBI and 15BB in 39 regular season games...his 1.095 OPS was the third-highest by Yankee in a single season since 1962 (min. 100AB), trailing Oscar Gamble (1.187 in 1979) and Glenallen Hill (1.112 in 2000).

THE HUNDREDS: With a 100-62 (.617) mark, the Yankees recorded the 20th 100-win season in franchise history...are responsible for 20 of the 104 seasons in which a Major League team reached 100 wins...marked their highest win total since going 103-59 in 2009.

- ▶ With Boston (108-54, .667) and Houston (103-59, .636), marked the first time in Major League history that one league had three 100-win teams.

ROOKIE MOVES: **3B Miguel Andújar** went 1-for-1 with 1BB in his postseason debut on Wednesday...tyied the AL rookie single-season record with 47 doubles (also Boston's Fred Lynn in 1975)...tied for second-most by any rookie, trailing only Brooklyn's Johnny Frederick (52 in 1929)...surpassed Joe DiMaggio (45 in 1936) for the Yankees rookie record...tied for the seventh-highest doubles total in Yankees history.

- ▶ At age 21y, 294d on Wednesday, **INF Gleyber Torres** was just the third Yankee since 1958 to appear in a postseason game at age 21-or-younger (Jesús Montero at age 21y, 310d in ALDS Game 4 on 10/4/11; Phil Hughes at age 21y, 102d in ALDS Game 1 on 10/4/07)...was the youngest position player to appear in a postseason game for the Yankees since INF Tom Carroll (age 19y, 15d) in World Series Game 5 on 10/2/55.

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** hit a two-run HR in the first inning of the AL Wild Card Game, his fifth career postseason HR (most among current Yankees)...is the first player to homer in multiple Wild Card Games (also 2017 ALWCG vs. Minnesota)...had hit just 1HR in his final 17 regular season games (since 7/23)...added a double in the sixth.

- ▶ Nine of his 11 career postseason hits are extra-base hits (including each of his last seven)...is batting .216/.344/.588 (11-for-51) with 11R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 13RBI and 10BB in 14G...is the fourth Yankee to have at least 9XBH in his first 14 postseason games (Bernie Williams-12, Lou Gehrig-10, Charlie Keller-9).

STANTON ISLAND: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit a solo HR in his postseason debut in the AL Wild Card Game vs. Oakland...went 1-for-3 with an eighth-inning solo HR, 2R, 1BB and 1SB...the HR had an exit velocity of 117.4 mph, the hardest-hit postseason HR of the Statcast era (since 2015)...was the first Yankee and eighth player ever to record both a HR and SB in his postseason debut.

- ▶ In his first season as a Yankee, tied for sixth in the Majors with 38HR, ranked seventh in the AL with 100RBI and tied for seventh in the AL with 102R...was the 12th player in franchise history to reach 38HR, 100RBI and 100R in a single season...was just the fourth to reach those totals in his first season with the club, joining Mark Teixeira in 2009 (39HR, 122RBI, 103R), Jason Giambi in 2002 (41HR, 122RBI, 120R) and Babe Ruth in 1920 (54HR, 136RBI, 158R)...his 38HR were the fifth-most by a player in his first season as a Yankee, behind Ruth, Giambi, Teixeira and Roger Maris (39HR in 1960).
- ▶ His 1,144 career regular season games were second-most among active players who had never reached the postseason prior to 2018, behind Seattle's Kyle Seager (1,155G)...his 305HR were the most in that group, 112 more than Oakland's Khris Davis (193HR), who also debuted in the Wild Card Game.
- ▶ Hit .371/.423/.700 (26-for-70) with 13R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR and 17RBI in 18G vs. Boston in 2018...had eight multi-hit efforts in 9G at Fenway Park, hitting .486 (18-for-37) with 7R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR and 9RBI.
- ▶ Is the Yankees' nominee for the 2018 Hank Aaron Award...won the award in both 2014 and '17 with Miami...fans can vote for Stanton at MLB.com through Mon., 10/8.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** hit 2HR in the AL Wild Card Game, the two hardest-hit postseason HRs in the Statcast era (since 2015): Stanton in the eighth (117.4 mph) and Judge in the first (116.1 mph)...broke the single-season Major League home run record with 267HR in 2018, surpassing the 1997 Mariners (264HR)...also broke the Yankees' previous club record of 245HR in 2012.

- ▶ Hit 15HR over their final six regular season road games...hit 123 road HRs, second-most in the Majors to Oakland (136HR), and the third-highest total in club history (128HR in 1961, 124HR in 2003).
- ▶ Were the first team in Major League history to have 12 players hit at least 10HR in the same season...five teams have had 11 players reach double-digit home runs: Detroit in 2004, Houston in 2015 and '17, Minnesota in 2016 and Toronto in 2018.

HEAVYWEIGHT MATCHUPS: Among the AL's five postseason qualifiers, the Yankees had the best record against the other four teams, going 22-17 (5-2 vs. Cleveland, 5-2 vs. Houston, 3-3 vs. Oakland, 9-10 vs. Boston).

- ▶ Went a Major League-best 41-30 (.577) against teams that finished with records of .500-or-better...was their best such mark since 2009 (52-35, .598).

THERE'S A HAPP FOR THAT: **LHP J.A. Happ** is 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA (117.2IP, 39ER) in 21 career regular season games (20 starts) vs. Boston...was 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA (22.2IP, 5ER) in 4GS in 2018.

- ▶ Is 4-1 with a 2.43 ERA (40.2IP, 11ER) in seven starts at Fenway Park since 2016, the lowest ERA at Fenway in the last three seasons (min. 5GS), just ahead of Chris Sale (2.65).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP J.A. HAPP (17-6, 3.65 ERA)

LHP J.A. Happ will make his fourth career postseason start and 11th career playoff appearance in tonight's ALDS Game 1 at Boston...the 35-year-old will start on extended six days' rest...earned his 17th win of the season on 9/28 at Fenway Park (6.0IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...posted a 1.86 ERA (29.0IP, 7R/6ER) in his final five regular season starts...went 7-0 with a 2.69 ERA (63.2IP, 19ER) in 11 starts with the Yankees, with the club going 9-2 in those starts...missed nine team games on 10-day D.L. from 8/2 (retro to 7/30)-8/9 with hand, foot and mouth disease...tied for eighth in the Majors with 17 wins, the second-highest total of his career (20-4 in 2016)...was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for INF Brandon Drury and OF Billy McKinney on 7/26/18...his first name is pronounced "JAY"...according to STATS, LLC, is the fourth pitcher to make starts for both the Yankees and Blue Jays in the same season, and the first since David Cone in 1995...is one of nine pitchers to record double digit wins in each of the past five seasons...finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4 with Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in the Majors...the Yankees are his sixth Major League team, also the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015) and Pirates (2015)...was originally selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern (Ill.) University.

LAST START: Earned the win in his final regular season start on 9/28 at Boston (6.0IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...allowed all 4R on a grand slam to Steve Pearce in the sixth inning...retired his first 9BF and 16 of his first 18.

OCTOBER BASEBALL: Is making his fourth trip to the postseason (also 2008-09 w/ Philadelphia and 2016 w/ Toronto)...in 10 games (three starts) in the postseason, is 1-1 with a 3.72 ERA (19.1IP, 8ER)...in the Blue Jays' 2016 ALCS run, went 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA (10.0IP, 3ER) in two starts.

- ✦ Is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (13.0IP, 6ER) in three career postseason starts.
- ✦ In seven postseason appearances (three starts) on the road, is 1-1 with a 3.63 ERA (17.1IP, 7ER) with 18K.
- ✦ Has made three appearances (two starts) in the LDS, going 1-0 with a 4.50 (8.0IP, 4ER).

WINNING WAYS: Finished the season on a 12-start unbeaten streak (since 7/22, including his final start with Toronto)...was tied for the Majors' fourth-longest active streak of unbeaten starts as of the end of the 2018 season...went 7-0 with a 2.62 ERA (68.2IP, 20ER) over that span...was tied for the second-longest unbeaten streak of his career (15 straight starts from 7/4/08-7/19/09).

IN PINSTRIPES: Made 11 starts with the Yankees, going 7-0 with a 2.69 ERA (63.2IP, 51H, 20R/19ER, 16BB, 63K, 10HR, 5HP, 3WP, 1BK)...was the third pitcher in Yankees history to go 7-0 or better in a season, joining Tom Zachary (12-0 in 1929) and Aaron Small (10-0 in 2005)...the Yankees were 9-2 in his starts...tied for sixth in the Majors in wins from the day of his Yankees debut on 7/29 through the end of the season, one of two pitchers at 7-0 or better in that span (Tampa Bay's Blake Snell, 9-0)...held opponents to a .143 BA (6-for-42) with RISP as a Yankee.

- ✦ Won his first five starts as a Yankee (7/29-8/25), the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee according to the Elias Sports Bureau...was the first Yankee to win his first five starts with the club since Rob Gardner, who had relief appearances mixed in among his first five Yankees starts stretching from 1970-72...was the first Yankee to go undefeated in his first 10 starts with the club since Joe Cowley (8-0 in 12 starts from 7/16/84-4/23/85).
- ✦ Was the first pitcher to win his first six decisions as a Yankee since Dellin Betances started his career 9-0 from 2011-15.

VS. BOSTON: Is 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA (117.2IP, 39ER) in 21 career games (20 starts) vs. the Red Sox...is the third-lowest ERA vs. Boston among active starting pitchers (min. 50.0IP) behind Drew Smyly (2.18) and Justin Verlander (2.89)...in his final regular season start, snapped his 11-start streak of allowing only 2ER-or-fewer vs. Boston (5/15/15-9/18/18)...**was just the third pitcher since earned runs became an official statistic in the AL in 1913 to allow 2ER-or-fewer in 11 consecutive starts vs. Boston,** joining the Yankees' Bob Shawkey (14 starts from 6/29/21-4/15/24) and Cleveland's Gaylord Perry (11 starts from 9/9/72-9/11/74)...was 4-1 with a 1.62 ERA (66.2IP, 12ER) during the stretch...has not faced the Red Sox in the postseason.

- ✦ Is 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA (52.1IP, 19ER) in 10 career games (nine starts) at Fenway Park...is 4-1 with a 2.43 ERA (40.2IP, 11ER) in seven starts at Fenway Park since 2016, the lowest ERA at Fenway in the last three seasons (min. 5GS), just ahead of Chris Sale (2.65).
- ✦ Made four starts against Boston during the regular season, going 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA (22.2IP, 5ER)...did not record a decision on 4/24 at Rogers Centre despite allowing only 1ER in 7.0IP (4H, 10K)...took the loss on 7/12 at Fenway after allowing 5R/OER in 3.2IP (5H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP)...did not record a decision in 3-2 win vs. Boston on 9/18 (6.0IP, 4H, 1R/OER, 3BB, 6K, 1BK)...earned the win in his final regular season start at Fenway on 9/28 (6.0IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR).

HIT THE ROAD: Was 7-2 with a 2.61 ERA (69.0IP, 20ER) in 12 road starts overall...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA (24.0IP, 7ER) in four road starts with the Yankees...was 11-2 with a 2.65 ERA (108.2IP, 32ER) in 19 starts outside of Rogers Centre.

BEAST OF THE EAST: Over the last two seasons (2017-18), is 10-7 with a 2.40 ERA (135.0IP, 36ER) in 24 starts vs. AL East clubs...is the second-lowest ERA vs. the AL East in that span (min. 10 starts), trailing only Chris Sale (2.17)...has held opponents to a .205 BA (103-for-502) in that span.

HIRED HAND: Has been traded at four of the last nine July non-waiver trading deadlines (2018, '15, '12, '10)...in 45 post-trade games (41 starts) with his new clubs, has compiled a 22-8 record with one complete game and a 3.12 ERA (239.1IP, 198R, 87R/83ER, 81BB, 239K).

THERE'S A HAPP FOR THAT: His 17 wins in 2018 were the second-highest total of his career (20-4 in 2016)...his .171 opponents' BA vs. left-handed batters was the Majors' fourth-lowest mark by a starting pitcher...opponents batted .160 (15-for-94) in at-bats ending in a slider and .203 (71-for-350) in at-bats ending with a four-seam fastball (Brooks Baseball).

- ✦ Went 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA (72.1IP, 26R/20ER) in his final 13 starts.
- ✦ Is one of nine pitchers to earn at least 10 wins in each of the last five seasons (2014-18), also Jake Arrieta, Gio Gonzalez, Zack Greinke, Jon Lester, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Stephen Strasburg and Masahiro Tanaka.
- ✦ Set career highs in strikeouts (193), K/9.0IP ratio (9.78) and strikeout rate (26.3%)...finished eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP ratio...had a season-high 10K twice, on 4/24 vs. Boston and 5/16 at the Mets.

#68 DELLIN BETANCES—RHP

- Is making his third career postseason (2015, '17-18)...retired all 6BF to earn the win in Wednesday's Wild Card Game vs. Oakland (2.0IP, 3K)...threw 2.0 innings-or-more only three times during the 2018 regular season.
- Struck out 115-of-272 batters faced in 2018 (42.3%)...ranked third among all Major League relievers (second in AL) with 115K and a 15.53K/9.0IP ratio.
- Is the first reliever in Major League history to record five straight 100K seasons...is the first reliever in Yankees history to post 100K in relief in five different seasons.
- Made 44 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K from 5/29-9/24...was the longest by a reliever in AL history and was the third-longest in Baseball history behind Aroldis Chapman (49) and Corey Knebel (46)...had at least 1K in 63-of-66 appearances this season.
- Was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

#53 ZACH BRITTON—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the third time in his career (2014, '16 and '18).
- His 91.6% save percentage (142-for-155) is the highest among active pitchers (min. 100 saves)...since the start of 2014, leads all Major League pitchers (min. 200.0IP) with a 1.82 ERA (287.0IP, 58ER).
- Combined to go 2-0 with seven saves (in 10 chances), a 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 14ER) and 34K in 41 relief appearances with Baltimore and the Yankees...was acquired by the Yankees from Baltimore for RHP Dillon Tate, RHP Cody Carroll and LHP Josh Rogers on 7/24.
- Began the season on the 60-day disabled list recovering from right Achilles surgery...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the D.L. on 6/11.

#54 AROLDIS CHAPMAN—LHP

- Has made the postseason for the sixth time in his career (2010, '12 and '13 w/ the Reds, '16 w/ the Cubs, '17-18 w/ the Yankees)...won the 2016 World Series with the Cubs...has a 1.00 ERA (9.0IP, 1ER) with 18K in seven postseason games as a Yankee.
- Had 23K over his final 10.1IP in the regular season (25K in last 11.1IP)...led all relievers with a 16.31 K/9.0IP ratio (93K, 51.1IP).
- Was named to his fifth career All-Star team and first in the AL (NL: 2012-15, AL: '18).
- Joins Craig Kimbrel and Kenley Jansen as the only pitchers to reach the 20-saves plateau each season since 2012...is one of two pitchers to record 30 saves at least six times in the last seven years (since 2012), joining Kimbrel, who has at least 30 saves in each of the last eight seasons (since 2011).
- Has averaged 15.00 K/9.0IP in his career (478.2IP, 798K), the best ratio in the Major Leagues since at least 1900 (min. 300.0IP).

#57 CHAD GREEN—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the second time in his career (also 2017)...made his playoff debut in 2017 AL Wild Card Game win (2.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 2BB, 4K)...became the first Yankee to strike out his first four playoff batters faced and first Major League pitcher to do so since Colorado's Jeff Francis in 2007 NLDS Game 1 at Philadelphia.
- Posted a career-long 17.1-inning scoreless streak (over 13G) from 5/25-7/8/18.
- With his 1.95 ERA (152.0IP, 33ER) as a reliever, is one of four active pitchers with at least 100 relief appearances have a career relief ERA under 2.00: Zach Britton (1.79), Craig Kimbrel (1.91) and Richard Bleier (1.97).

#56 JONATHAN HOLDER—RHP

- Will be making his postseason debut.
- Had 60 apps. (1GS) w/ the Yankees, spending nearly the entire season in the Majors.
- Did not allow an earned run over 23 relief apps. from 4/21-6/27 (27.2IP), the AL's second-longest such streak of the season, and tied for third-longest in the Majors.
- In his first 35 appearances after being recalled (from 4/21-8/1), posted a 0.88 ERA (41.0IP, 7R/4ER), holding opponents without an earned run 31 times.
- In 4G/1GS with Scranton/WB, was 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (6.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR).

#36 LANCE LYNN—LHP

- Has made his sixth trip to the postseason (also 2011-15 w/ St. Louis).
- In 24 postseason appearances (seven starts), is 5-4 with a 4.50 ERA (52.0IP, 56H, 30R/26ER, 26BB, 50K, 6HR)...pitched in the inaugural NL Wild Card Game in 2012...earned the win in relief in 2011 World Series Game 3 (2.1IP, 1ER).
- Earned 10 wins between the Twins (20GS) and Yankees (11G/9GS)...went 3-2 w/ a 4.14 ERA (54.1IP, 25ER) for the Yankees...was 1-0 w/ a 1.23 ERA (7.1IP, 1ER) in relief.
- Allowed just 14HR in 156.2IP...his 0.80 HR/9.0IP ratio was fifth-lowest in the AL (min. 150.0IP)...had a 0.33 HR/9.0IP ratio (2HR/54.1IP) after joining the Yankees on 8/1, the lowest mark among Major Leaguers over that span (min. 50.0IP).
- Has reached 10 wins and 150K in each of his six full MLB seasons (2012-15, '17-18).
- Was acquired from the Minnesota Twins with cash considerations in exchange for INF Tyler Austin and RHP Luis Rijo on July 30, 2018.

#30 DAVID ROBERTSON—RHP

- Has made the postseason for the sixth time in his career, all with the Yankees (2009-12, '17-18)...has held opponents scoreless in 22-of-28 career playoff relief apps.
- Is the only pitcher in Baseball history to record at least 10.00 K/9.0IP in each of his first 11 Major League seasons (2008-18)...the previous record was held by four pitchers, who each accomplished the feat in their first three Major League seasons—Dick Radatz, Troy Percival, Mark Prior and Takashi Saito.
- His 11.97 K/9.0IP (874K, 657.0IP) career mark is best in MLB history (min. 600.0IP).
- Ranks third on the Yankees' all-time games pitched list (501) behind Mariano Rivera (1,115) and Dave Righetti (522)...surpassed Andy Pettitte (447), Mike Stanton (456) and Whitey Ford (498) in 2018...has the second-most strikeouts by a reliever in Yankees history (666), trailing only Mariano Rivera (1,135).
- Was originally selected by the Yankees in the 17th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...is one of two current Yankees to appear with the club in both the current and original Yankee Stadiums (also Brett Gardner).

#71 STEPHEN TARPLEY—LHP

- Is making a postseason roster for the first time in his career.
- Made his Major League debut in 2018, holding opponents scoreless over his final nine appearances (8.0IP, 12K) following his MLB debut...did not allow a hit over his last six appearances in the regular season (5.0IP, 10K).
- Also pitched in 2018 for Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.
- Was acquired by the Yankees on 8/30/16 as a player to be named later along with OF Tito Polo in 8/1/16 trade that sent RHP Iván Nova to Pittsburgh.
