TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 4, 1997: In a 13-5 win at Kansas City, Jorge Posada hits his first Major League homer (off Jim Converse).

May 4, 1981: Yankees reliever Ron Davis strikes out eight consecutive Angels to record the save in a 4-2 Yankees win at California. Davis remains the all-time Major League leader in consecutive strikeouts in a relief appearance.

May 4, 1929: Lou Gehrig hits three home runs, going 4-for-4 with 13 total bases and 4 RBI in an 11-9 win over the Chicago White Sox.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 5, 1955: The musical *Damn Yankees* opens on Broadway.

May 5, 1922: The construction contract for Yankee Stadium is awarded to New York's White Construction Company with the edict that the job be completed "at a definite price" of \$2.5 million by Opening Day 1923. In just 284 working days, the Stadium hosts its inaugural game on April 18, 1923, as the Yankees defeat the Red Sox, 4-1 in front of an estimated crowd of 74,200.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees open a nine-game homestand, including 3G vs. Cleveland (tonight-Sun.), 3G vs. Boston (5/8-10) and 3G vs. Oakland (5/11-13)...yesterday completed a 6-1 road trip, sweeping three of four (including the last three) at Houston (Mon.-Thurs.)...following this homestand, have an off day on Mon., 5/14 then begin a eight-game road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Are a season-high 11G over .500...trail Boston in the AL East by 1.0G, their smallest deficit since the close of play on 4/4...are 12-1 in their last 13G, reducing their division deficit from a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston is 5-7 in this span).
- ▶ At 21-10 (.677), are tied for the second-best record in the Majors (Boston 22-9, .710; Arizona 21-10, .677).
- ▶ Have a +55 run differential, fourth-best in the Majors (Houston, +58; Atlanta and Boston, +57).
- ▶ Are an MLB-best 18-1 (.947) when allowing 4R-or-fewer.
- ▶ Their 21-10 (.677) start matches their best 31-game start in the last 15 seasons since 2004 (also 21-10 in 2017/2010).
- ▶ Are 15G into a season-long stretch of 18 consecutive game days (4/19-5/6)...are 13-2 so far.
- ▶ Are 12-2 outside the AL East this season (5-0 vs. AL Central, 6-1 vs. AL West, 1-1 vs. NL East).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Astros, 6-5, on Thursday, scoring three runs in the ninth to overcome a 5-3 deficit...previously surrendered a 3-0 lead after six innings...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (6.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 0BB, 5K, 1WP, 1HP) started and received a no-decision...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3) had a career-high 3RBI, with a sac-fly in the second inning and a game-tying two-run single in the ninth...**3B Ronald Torreyes** (1-for-3) and **1B Neil Walker** (1-for-2, 1BB, 1HP) each had run-scoring singles, in the second and third innings, respectively...**RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-5) drove in the winning run on a force out in the ninth...**LHP Chasen Shreve** (0.2IP) retired two batters faced to end the eighth and earn his first win of the season...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 3K), notched his seventh save of the year, striking out reigning AL MVP Jose Altuve on three pitches for the final out two batters after Evan Gattis reached base safely on a dropped third strike.

LATE IN THE GAME: With their three-run ninth inning propelling them to a 6-5 victory on Thursday at Houston, the Yankees became the first team in MLB to have three wins this season when trailing after eight innings (also 4/26 vs. Minnesota: down 3-1 after eight, won 4-3 on a three-run HR in the ninth by Gary Sánchez; and 4/27 at Los Angeles-AL: down 3-2 after eight, Gardner SF made it 3-3 in the ninth, won 4-3 with a Gregorius solo HR in the 10th)...the Yankees had just five such wins in all of 2017.

FIRST BLOOD: The Yankees are 16-3 (.842) this season when scoring first, including 12-1 in such games since 4/11...their 19 games scoring first are tied for the second most in the Majors this season (Washington-23 and Milwaukee-19).

LUCKY 13: The Yankees are 12-1 in their last 13G (since 4/21) matching the best 13G stretch in the Majors this season (Boston had six such 13G stretches topping out with a 17-1 run from 3/30-4/20)...is the best 13G stretch by the Yankees since 6/5-18/12 (also 12-1) and the best one-loss stretch by the Yankees since going 13-1 from 6/3-18/12.

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have allowed just 25R over the stretch (1.92 per game), including 22ER for a 1.69 ERA (117.0IP, 81H, 35BB, 120K, 7HR, .190 opp. BA, .536 opp. OPS)...had a 28.0-inning scoreless stretch at Houston from the fifth inning on Monday through the sixth inning on Thursday, the longest by the Yankees staff since a 31.0-inning stretch spanning 8/7-9/09 vs. Boston.
- ▶ **Yankees relievers** have 5-0 record and a 0.91 ERA, allowing just 6R/4ER in 39.2IP over the stretch (33H, 11BB, 50K).
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 6.08R over the stretch (79R, 31 doubles, 1 triple, 18HR, 50XBH, .251/.325/.451).

VERDICT OVERTURNED: The Yankees have come back from a deficit to win seven games this season, including five come-from-behind wins in their last nine victories since 4/24.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs (178) and R/G (5.74)...rank second in XBH (117)...are third in HR (44) and HR per game (1.42) SLG (.448), OBP (.336) OPS (.784)...tied for third in total bases (478).

PROOF OF AGE: With his game-tying, two-run, ninth-inn. single in Thursday's 6-5 win at Houston, **2B Gleyber Torres** (21y-141d) became the youngest Yankee with a game-tying or go-ahead hit in the ninth inning-or-later since Bobby Murcer (20y-134d) on 10/1/66 at Chicago-AL (RBI single in the ninth in a 5-3 win).

- ▶ In that same game, became the youngest Yankee with at least 3RBI in a game since Derek Jeter (20y-343d) on 6/4/95 vs. California...is the fifth youngest Yankee all time w/ a 3RBI game, joining Jeter, Bobby Richardson, Mickey Mantle (16 times) and Lou Gehrig.
- ▶ Made his Major League debut in the Yankees' 5-1 win on 4/22 vs. Toronto at age 21y-130d, becoming the youngest Yankees position player since Melky Cabrera made his MLB debut on 7/7/05 vs. Cleveland at age 20y-330d.

STARTING FIVE: The Yankees are one of four Major league teams that have used just five starting pitchers this season (also Chicago-NL, Colorado, Houston).

CCENSATIONAL: LHP CC Sabathia is undefeated in his last 13 regular season starts since 8/19/17, posting a 7-0 record with a 2.48 ERA (72.2IP, 20ER).

- ▶ Among pitchers with at least 25.0IP, his 1.71 ERA (26.1IP, 5ER) this season ranks sixth in the Majors (third in the AL).

SEVING ALL MY LOVE FOR YOU: RHP Luis Severino tossed his first career shutout on Wed. at Houston (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 10K), also marking his first career complete game...was the second CG-SHO by a Yankees pitcher over the last four seasons (also Masahiro Tanaka on 4/27/17 at Boston, 3H in a 3-0 win).

- ▶ Marked the most strikeouts by a Yankees pitcher in a shutout since Mike Mussina on 9/24/02 vs. Tampa Bay (12K, 2H).
- ▶ At 24 years, 71 days old, Severino was the second-youngest Yankee in the last 47 seasons (since 1972) to toss a shutout, behind Sterling Hitchcock (24 years, 22 days) on 5/21/95 vs. Baltimore (4H).
- ▶ Is 5-1 with a 2.11 ERA (47.0IP, 28H, 11ER, 12BB, 52K) this season...is tied with Corey Kluber (5-1) for the AL lead in wins and tied for second in the Majors (Max Scherzer, 6-1).
- ▶ Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 20-of-38 starts since the start of 2017, most in the Majors in that span.
- ▶ The Yankees are 6-1 in his starts this season and 26-12 since the start of 2017.

STANTON ISLAND: On Wednesday at Houston, **OF Giancarlo Stanton** had 2HR and 1 double, driving in all four runs in a 4-0 win...his two-run first-inning HR snapped a 34AB/37PA stretch w/o a homer...marked his second multi-HR game as a Yankee (had 2HR in his Yankees debut on 3/29 at Toronto).

- ▶ Became just the second Yankee since 2011 to have at least 4RBI and drive in all the Yankees' runs in a win (also Greg Bird on 8/19/15 in a 4-3 win vs. Minnesota)...is the first Yankee to accomplish the feat in a shutout win since Mark Teixeira on 6/20/10 in a 4-0 win vs. the Mets.
- ▶ In three of the Yankees last four wins, one hitter has collected all of the Yankees' RBI: **Gary Sánchez** on Sun. at Los Angeles-AL (two-run HR in 2-1 win), **Sánchez** on Tue. at Houston (three-run HR in 4-0 win; team's other run scored on a wild pitch), and **Stanton** on Wed. at Houston.
- ▶ Has 30 career multi-HR games, tied for the second-highest total through 1,017 career games in MLB history (Ralph Kiner-35, Juan González-30).

HEAVY ROTATION: Yankees starters have a 3.58 ERA in 2018, fourth in the AL (Houston-2.44, Boston-3.51, Cleve.-3.52)...their 14-5 (.737) record leads the AL and is third in MLB...the Yankees are 14-2 when their starter goes at least 6.0IP

YANKEES vs. CLEVELAND INDIANS

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees and Indians will meet seven times in 2018: a three-game series in the Bronx this weekend and a four-game set in Cleveland leading into the All-Star break (7/12-15)...are 23-18 since the start of 2012 and 47-30 since 2007...have won 10 of their last 19 series since 2009 (10-5-4)...**IN 2017:** Went 2-5 against the Tribe in 2017, splitting a four-game set in Cleveland and getting swept in 3G at home...was their first time being swept at home by the Indians (min. 2G) since a three-game sweep from 4/7-9/89...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost three of the last four season series vs. Cleveland but have won six of the last nine...are 19-4-2 over the last 25 season series against the Indians since 1993 (losses in 2017, '15, '14, '08)...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 3-9 in the last 12 home games vs. Cleveland (since 8/9/14) but are still 18-13 against the Indians at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 5-of-9 series at the venue, going 5-3-1...faced Cleveland in the first regular season game ever played at the current venue, a 10-2 loss on 4/16/09...**AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD:** Are 6-3 at Progressive Field since 8/13/15...are 27-15 in their last 42G (since 7/5/06)...are 61-37 (.622) all-time at Progressive Field, the highest winning percentage by any AL team...**IN POSTSEASON:** Rallied from a 2-0 deficit to eliminate the Indians, 3-2, in last year's ALDS...are 2-2 all-time in postseason series (2017 ALDS, 3-2; 2007 ALDS, 1-3; 1998 ALCS, 4-2; 1997 ALDS, 2-3)...are 10-10 all-time vs. Cleveland in the postseason.

LHP CC Sabathia will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. the Indians...the 37-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last started on Sunday at Los Angeles-AL, allowing just 1ER in 7.0IP (5H, 1BB, 4K, 1WP) to earn his second win of the season...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...has allowed only one earned run in 17.1IP since returning from the D.L. (11H, 4R/1ER, 3BB, 9K)...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,862), complete games (38) and quality starts (304)...ranks second in wins (239), innings pitched (3,343.1) and starts (514) to Bartolo Colón (241 wins, 3,346.2IP, 532 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,862K), third all-time among left-handers...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins).

LAST START: Yielded just 1ER in 7.0IP (5H, 1BB, 4K, 1WP) to earn his second win of the season on Sunday at Los Angeles-AL...extended his unbeaten streak to 13 regular season starts (since 8/19/17)...allowed his only run on a wild pitch in the sixth inning...with his seventh-inning strikeout of Jefry Marte, surpassed Lefty Gomez for fifth-place on the franchise's all-time strikeout list...marked his 239th career win, tying Mordecai Brown and David Wells for 56th place on the all-time win list and David Wells for 15th place on the all-time wins list among left-handed pitchers...had his 15.1-inning streak without an earned run snapped in the sixth inning Sunday.

2018: Among pitchers with at least 25.0IP, his 1.71 ERA (26.1IP, 5ER) this season ranks sixth in the Majors (third in the AL)...has held opponents to a .198 (20-for-101) BA.

VS.
