NEW YORK METS (19-17) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (22-16)

Sunday, May 13, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:35 EDT – Game 39; Home 22

RHP Jacob deGrom (3-0, 1.87) vs RHP Aaron Nola (5-1, 2.05)

- FRIDAY NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Mets, 3-1 in a pitcher's duel to open up a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta held New York scoreless for 7.1 innings, yielding only 5 hits and 2 walks while striking out 5 batters ... Odubel Herrera gave the Phillies the lead and extended his on-base streak to 40 straight games with a first-inning, solo home run, and that 1-0 score would hold until the ninth ... Hector Neris was touched up for two home runs as the Mets came from behind to win the opener.
 - MAY DAY:** Almost halfway through the month, Philadelphia ranks near the top of the National League in a number of categories on both sides of the ball in May ... On the mound, they are 2nd in OPP AVG (.206), ERA (2.65), WHIP (1.12) and T-4th in strikeouts (96) ... **Philadelphia's starting pitchers specifically are 1st in OPP AVG (.188), 2nd in ERA (2.04) and 3rd in SO % (28.8%) ... They have allowed one run or none in eight of 10 games during May, averaging 9.89 SO/9.0 IP.**
 - PICK SIX:** With four pitcher-to-first-baseman pickoffs in the last 10 games (all to Carlos Santana), the Phillies now rank T-3rd in baseball with five pitcher pickoffs and T-2nd in all pickoffs including catcher pickoffs with six, trailing only SD (7) ... **All six of Philadelphia's pickoffs have come at a time when the game was a two-run game or closer.**
 - RAGING BULL:** Odubel Herrera has now reached base safely in a career-best 40 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .362/.424/.559 slash line over 172 plate appearances during the streak ... Per *Elias*, he is tied for the 7th-longest on-base streak in Phillies history, and if he extends it today will move into a tie with Pete Rose (1982) and Don Hurst (1929) for 5th-longest ... Overall, Herrera's 40-game on-base streak is the longest of any major league player since 2016 when Freddie Freeman reached in 46 straight ... It is also one of just eight on-base streaks in MLB to reach 40 games over the last 5 seasons (since 2014)

- ATOP THE LEADERBOARD:** With two more hits on Friday night, Odubel Herrera raised his average to .360 (49-136) on the season ... **It is the highest batting average among any qualifying player in MLB, four points higher than the next-closest (Mookie Betts, .356) and 14 points higher than the next-best in the National League (Nick Markakis, .346) ... With multiple hits in five of his last six games, Herrera now has 16 multi-hit efforts in 2018, T-2nd among all ML players behind only Markakis' 18 ... He is T-6th in MLB in hits (49) and 8th in OBP (.429) ... This is the latest a Phillie has led MLB in batting average since 2012, when Carlos Ruiz led all of baseball with a .356 average on 7/2, per *Elias*.**
 - CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 26-11 in their last 37 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .703 win percentage over that stretch ranks 2nd in the majors behind the Yankees (.737) ... This season, the Phillies own the best home record in the NL (15-6, .714) and rank 2nd in the majors to the Red Sox (.733) ... Philadelphia's +47 run differential at home ranks 2nd in the majors to only the Yankees (+50).
 - SLAMTANA:** First baseman **Carlos Santana** collected 13 RBI in the four-game series against San Francisco, tying a Phillies franchise record for most RBI in a series of any length, per *Elias* (others: Mike Schmidt – 13 RBI, 7/6-9/79 vs SF and Cliff Lee – 13 RBI, 7/25-28/22 vs CIN) ... Santana has now recorded an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games which is the longest streak by a Phillies player since 2009 when **Ryan Howard** did so in seven straight (5/27-6/3) ... **Chase Utley** had an eight-game XBH streak from April 16-23, 2008 and a nine-game streak from May 25-June 3, 2008.
 - FORTUNE .500:** The Phillies enter play today with an all-time record of 500-471 against the Mets ... Since the New York's inaugural season in 1962, Philadelphia's 500 wins are their most versus any club (next: WSH/MTL franchise, 431 wins) ... Conversely, New York's 500 losses against the Phils are their most versus any opponent (next: Braves franchise, 449 losses) ... However, since 2014, the Phillies have a 25-54 record against the Mets (.316 win %) and have been outscored, 428-302 (-126 run differential) ... From 2007-2013, the Phillies were 68-59 against the Mets (.535) with a +35 run differential (589-554) ... Philadelphia is in danger of losing four straight to the Mets for the first time since 5/29-8/31/15, when they lost 10 straight.'
 - THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phillies have seen a total of 5,979 pitches over 1,456 plate appearances this season ... Philadelphia's 4.11 pitches per plate appearance lead the majors (next: LAD, 4.07) ... The Phils have four players who rank inside the top 13 in pitches per plate appearance in the National League: **Cesar Hernandez** (3rd, 4.47), **Rhys Hoskins** (4th, 4.47), **Aaron Altherr** (6th, 4.35), **Carlos Santana** (13th, 4.18) ... Additionally, the Phillies have drawn 160 walks over those 1,456 plate appearances and their 11.0 % walk rate ranks 3rd in the majors (best: NYY, 11.4 %).

LAST START: 5/8 vs SF: W, 7.0 IP, 5 H, R, ER, 0 BB, 12 SO ... Nola vs Holland ... Nola found himself in a bit of trouble in the 2nd inning as the Giants had runners on 2nd and 3rd with no outs ... Nola worked his way out of trouble allowing only one run to score, and from there, he was off to the races ... At one point he recorded nine consecutive outs via strikeout ... Aaron Altherr, Jorge Alfaro and Carlos Santana all homered for the Phils.

TODAY'S START:

- **Career-High:** Struck out a career-high 12 batters in his last start ... Was his 3rd career double-digit strikeout performance ... With 12 strikeouts and 25 batters faced, became the first Phillie to face 25 or fewer in a start and record 12+ strikeouts since 8/3/06 when Cole Hamels struck out 12 of 24 batters at STL ... Recorded 9 straight outs via strikeout from last out of 2nd to 2 outs in 5th
- **This Means WAR:** Per Baseball Reference, Nola's WAR of 2.5 is tied with BOS' Chris Sale for the highest among any ML pitcher this season ... When compared with Baseball Reference's WAR for position players, he and Sale rank T-4th, behind Mike Trout (3.3), Mookie Betts (3.0) and Francisco Lindor (2.6)
- **Make it a Dozen** In his last 12 starts (since 9/7/17), is 7-2 with a 2.19 ERA (19 ER, 78.0 IP), 0.97 WHIP and 83 SO ... He has allowed 3 runs or fewer in all of those starts and 2 or fewer in 10 of 12
- **2018 NL Starter Rankings:** T-2nd in wins (5, T-2nd in MLB), 3rd in IP (52.2, T-10th in MLB), WHIP (0.89, 8th in MLB) & pitches/IP (14.4, 7th in MLB), 4th in ERA (2.05, 7th in MLB) & HR/9.0 IP (0.34, 6th in MLB), T-5th in OPP AVG (.197), 6th in BB/9.0 IP (1.88)
- **Home Body:** Since 6/22/17, Nola is 12-3 with a 2.15 ERA (25 ER, 104.2 IP), 0.90 WHIP and has held opponents to a .191 AVG with 124 SO in 15 starts at home ... He has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 13 of those 15 starts In that same span (since 6/22/17), Nola ranks 1st among all ML pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) in wins (12) at home and is 2nd in ERA (best: Kluber, 1.27) ... Nola is the first Phillie to start his season 4-0 or better at home since 2010, when Roy Oswalt won his first 5 games at CBP
- **#Winning:** Nola's 4-game win streak is the longest by a Phillies starter since 2015 (Hamels, 4, 5/8-23)
- **A Dominant Stretch:** Has a 2.71 ERA (51 ER, 169.2 IP) and 184 SO since 6/22/17 (26 starts) ... His ERA is 4th among qualifying ML starters in that span, trailing only Corey Kluber (1.92), Justin Verlander (2.07) & Chris Sale (2.67)
- **vs NL East:** 12-10, 3.69 ERA (77 ER, 188.0 IP) in 32 career starts

HOME:

- **2018:** 4-0, 2.17 ERA (7 ER, 29.0 IP) in 4 starts
- **Career:** 18-12, 3.35 ERA (78 ER, 209.2 IP) in 33 starts

2018 SEASON:

- His start on 5/2 at MIA (7.1 IP) was the 2nd-longest scoreless start of his career (longest: 8.0 IP, 8/23/15 at MIA)
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established (had a PHI record 10 straight last season)
- Allowed 4 or fewer hits in each of his first 4 starts of the season, the first Phillie to do so in his first 4 starts since 2005 (Rob Tejada, 5)
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

2017 SEASON:

- Ranked 8th among NL starters in SO/9.0 IP (9.86), 9th in SO rate (26.6 %) & 1st pitch strike % (64.4 %) and 10th in SO/BB (3.71)
- Had the most SO (184) ever by a Phillies pitcher who made fewer than 30 starts in a season
- Averaged 9.86 SO/9.0 IP (184 SO/168.0 IP), becoming the 2nd qualifying Phillie with a SO/9.0 IP that high (other: Curt Schilling, 11.29 in 1997 and 10.05 in 1998)
- Had 10 straight starts with 2 or fewer runs allowed (6/22-8/12), the longest such streak by a Phillie since the current mound distance was established in 1893

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
