FISH BITES

The Marlins conclude their only 10-game homestand with the rubber match of this three-game set against the Tampa Bay Rays today at 1:10 p.m. RHP **José Ureña**, reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today, is making his seventh career appearance against the Rays, only his first start, with no record and a 1.59 ERA (5.2 ip/1 er). Tampa Bay is starting RHP Matt Andriese, who is making his third career start and fifth appearance against Miami, going 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (16.0/3). Miami recently completed a 10-day, nine-game road trip to Baltimore (2-1), San Francisco (1-2), and Colorado (2-1). The current homestand began with Arizona (1-3) and the Mets (2-1). Miami will take a four-game leave from Marlins Park following this afternoon's tilt to visit the Washington Nationals, before returning home on July 9 with a six-game homestand against Milwaukee and Philadelphia to finish the schedule before the All-Star Break.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

For the second game in a row, the Marlins and Rays went into extras, with the Rays coming out on top of a 9-6 decision that took 5:31 to complete. Tampa Bay took a 4-0 lead going into the home half of the second before **Trevor Richards** cut the deficit to two with a two-run single. Miami evened the score in the fifth when **Brian Anderson** plated **JB Shuck** with an RBI-single to right and **J.T. Realmuto** tied the game with a sac fly to right. That would be all of the scoring until the top of the 16th, when Tampa Bay pushed five runs across the plate to take a 9-4 lead. Miami loaded the bases with no outs and eventually scored two before the game went final. **Justin Bour** led the offense with three hits, while **Starlin Castro**, **Miguel Rojas**, and **Derek Dietrich** added two hits apiece. Richards allowed four runs on nine hits while walking none and striking out five over 5.0 innings. **Brett Graves** took the loss, surrendering five runs on six hits with three walks and a strikeout over 4.0 relief outings.

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

The Marlins today reinstated RHP **José Ureña** from the 10-day disabled list, recalled LHP **Dillon Peters** from Triple-A New Orleans, placed RHP **Sandy Alcantara** on the 10-day DL with a right axillary infection and placed OF **Lewis Brinson** on the 10-day DL with left hip inflammation.

VS. THE RAYS

The season series will wrap up after the All-Star break, as the intra-state rivals open the post-break schedule with three games at Tropicana Field from July 20-22. The Marlins dropped the 2017 Citrus Series, 1-3, with the only win coming on May 3 at the Trop. Miami is 30-27 against Tampa Bay in South Florida, including a 5-11 mark at Marlins Park, and trail the all-time series 53-56.

UP NEXT

Miami will open a quick four-game series in the nation's capital against the Nationals tomorrow with game one starting at 7:10 p.m. This is just the second meeting of the season between the two rivals, and the first at Nationals Park. The Marlins dropped the 2017 series against the Nationals, 6-13, which included an eight-game losing streak to conclude the series. Miami was swept in the first series of the season, a three-game set at Marlins Park from May 25-27, and have dropped 11 straight to the Nationals. The 11-game slide is the longest against the Nationals in Club history, and is tied for the second-longest to any opponent in Club history: Atlanta from July 15, 1994 to August 15, 1995. The longest such streak to an opponent is 12 in a row to Milwaukee from April 3, 1998-May 5, 1999. Miami is 54-65 against the Nationals in DC, and 122-119 overall, since 2005.

BOOK IT

J.T. Realmuto hit his 11th home run of the season Monday night; Miami is 9-0 when he homers (two multi-homer games) this year. According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is tied for the longest winning streak to open a season when an individual homers in Club history. The Marlins also won the first nine games when Josh Willingham homered in 2007, and when Mike Lowell went deep in 2004.

HE'S DOING ONE STECK OF A JOB

Drew Steckenrider entered last night's game and provided a scoreless seventh inning, allowing just one hit while striking out two. He is on a career-best 17.2 inning scoreless streak over his last 20 appearances, a run that has seen him become the first pitcher in Club history to make 14-or-more appearances in a calendar month (June) without allowing a run; he last allowed a run (2) on May 20 at Atlanta. His scoreless streak is now the second-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Yoshihisa Hirano (22.1), and is the second-longest by a Marlins reliever this season (Barraclough 20.2).

#KEEPINITREALMUTO

J.T. Realmuto has risen to the top of the class since coming off the DL on April 17. He is currently the owner of a 11-game hitting streak, one that has seen him post a .327 average (16x49) with seven doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI. For the season, he leads all primary Major League catchers (min. 55 G) in average (.306), runs (40), doubles (20), and slugging percentage (.544). He is tied for second in hits (76) and triples (3), ranks third in on-base percentage (.359), fourth in RBI (38), and is tied for sixth in home runs (11).

INTERLEAGUE NOTABLES

The Marlins have the second-most wins (188) all-time in Interleague Play among National League clubs, behind Washington (195), and they have the fourth-best winning percentage (.496; 188-191), behind St. Louis (.507; 176-171), the Mets (.505; 187-183), and the Cubs (.503; 174-172). Miami's offense is the all-time leader among NL clubs in Interleague runs (1,746), hits (3,444), doubles (686), and RBI (1,657).

WHAT A RELIEF

Since May 28, Miami's bullpen has limited opponents to a National League-leading .214 average against, ahead of Washington (.215) and San Francisco (.219). The 'pen also leads the NL in innings pitched (147.2) and ranks third in ERA at 3.23 (147.2 ip/53 er), behind only Arizona (2.34) and the Giants (2.81).

INDEPENDENCE DAY ACTIVITIES

The Marlins today will host approximately 35 World War II, Vietnam, and Korean War veterans at Marlins Park for an Honor Flight reception. The veterans and their families will enjoy brunch in the DEX Diamond Club Lounge, during which Marlins pitcher **Brad Ziegler** and other Marlins players will stop by to show their appreciation and spend time with the veterans. The group will then be escorted out to the field for a pregame parade and ceremony. South Florida Honor Flight is an organization whose mission is to transport veterans to Washington, DC, to visit the memorials dedicated to honor their service and sacrifices. Also on Wednesday, the Marlins will donate \$10,000 to Honor Flight during an in-game check presentation, to help transport America's veterans to Washington, DC. The Marlins will also host the re-enlistment ceremony of Army Sergeant Ashley Mitchell prior to the game.

SERIES NOTES

- The Marlins and Rays are squaring off in the Citrus Series for the 21st time. Miami dropped three of four in 2017 after taking three of four in 2016. The Marlins are 53-56 (.486) in the intrastate Interleague traditional rivalry. The Marlins are looking to even the all-time series record between the teams, which is currently in the Rays favor at 10-9-1.
- The Miami-Tampa Bay rivalry is one of seven active intrastate Interleague traditional rivalries, and one of the most closely contested, as the .514 winning percentage for the Rays is the second-slimmest by a series leader, behind the White Sox .513 winning percentage (59-56) over the Cubs. The most dominant intrastate rivals are the Yankees with a 68-47 (.591) record against the Mets, followed by the Cardinals, who have a 56-41 (.577) advantage over Kansas City. The Angels are third with a 63-51 (.553) lead on the Dodgers. Cleveland is fourth, as they hold a 56-47 (.544) mark against Cincinnati, and Oakland owns a 59-55 (.518) margin over San Francisco to rank fifth.

THIS DAY IN MARLINS HISTORY

JULY 4

Fireworks shook up Coors Field in **2008**, as both teams combined to score 35 runs, hit eight home runs and use 14 pitchers. Hanley Ramirez led off the game with his 21st career leadoff home run, and the Marlins jumped out to a 13-4 lead after four innings. The final score was 18-17 in favor of the Rockies as the Marlins surrendered their largest lead ever (nine runs).

➤ José Ureña will return from the disabled list today to make Miami's Fourth of July start against the Rays, closing out a 10-day, 10-game homestand for the Marlins.

➤ Was placed on 10-day DL on June 21 with right shoulder impingement, following his start at San Francisco the previous day (L, 5.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1bb, 5 so).

➤ In his start prior to that outing in SF, he fired off 8.0 shutout innings on June 15 at Baltimore to pick up his second win of the season (3 h, bb, 4 so, hb). It was his fourth career game tossing at least 8.0 innings, and fell 0.2 inning shy of his career-long outing. Also threw a career-high 112 pitches.

➤ This will be his first career start against the Rays; has made six career relief appearances against them, posting a 1.59 ERA (5.2 ip/1 er). They are the last team he faced out of the 'pen (on May 4) before moving to the rotation full-time on May 7 last season.

➤ Is 5-2 with a 3.14 ERA (57.1/20) in 15 appearances (eight starts) in Interleague Play in his career. He is 5-2, 3.40 (47.2/18) in the starts.

➤ Has a five-decision winning streak over his last six IL starts. Only Clayton Kershaw (8), Rick Porcello (7), and Jhoulys Chacin (6) have longer runs (four others also have 5). - *Stats LLC*

➤ Picked up his first win of the season on June 5 at St. Louis. It snapped a skid of 14 consecutive team losses in his starts, dating back to September 26, 2017, the longest streak in Club history. Picked up the win despite allowing a season-high 10 hits, and surrendering four runs. Benefitted from seven runs of support while he was in the game, the most he has received this season and just the second game with five-or-more (five on April 21 at Milwaukee).

➤ Opened 2018 with 5.88 ERA (26.0 ip/17 er) over his first five starts. In his 11 starts since then, he has posted a 3.84 ERA (68.0/29), allowing three-or-fewer runs seven times.

➤ His average of 3.06 runs of support during his starts ranks as second-lowest among National League starters (min. 1.6 GS), better only than Junior Guerra (2.57).

➤ Left in line for win on April 21 vs. Milwaukee, but ended up with no decision after Brewers scored two late runs. Allowed four runs on four hits and two walks, while striking out three, over 5.0 innings.

➤ On April 3, held Boston to one run on four hits over 7.0 innings. Walked one while striking out a career high-tying seven. It was third career seven-strikeout game; added a fourth in his start on May 25 vs. Washington.

➤ Earned Opening Day start against Cubs on March 29 at Marlins Park. Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took loss, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in first inning, becoming only second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).

➤ Posted team-high 14 wins last season, to go with 3.82 ERA (169.2/72) and 113 strikeouts in 34 appearances (28 starts). Established career highs in wins, appearances, innings pitched, strikeouts, and ERA.

➤ Finished season 14-7, 3.97 (154.1/68) as starter. Did not factor in a decision and had a 2.35 ERA (15.1/4) in six relief appearances.

➤ Went 6-1 with 2.40 ERA (63.2/17) in 11 day-game starts. Owned fourth lowest ERA among NL starters (min. 50.0 IP), behind Max Scherzer (1.90), Stephen Strasburg (2.06) and Jimmy Nelson (2.32). - *Stats LLC*
