THE TWINS: After going 1-5 on their six-game roadtrip, the Twins began their 11-game homestand with a loss to the Indians last night...tonight they will play the second of four vs. Cleveland...they will enjoy an off-day on Monday, followed by four vs. Chicago-AL (Tuesday doubleheader) June 5-7 and three vs. Los Angeles-AL June 8-10...11 of the Twins last 12 games have been decided by three runs-or-fewer with the Twins going 3-8 in those games.

TWINS ATTEMPT ANOTHER COMEBACK: The Twins lost to the Indians last night by a score of 9-8, scoring eight runs between the fifth and seventh inning, closing an 8-0 deficit only to allow a run in the eighth inning...Jake Odorizzi was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing eight runs (7 earned) on seven hits in 3.2 innings pitched...Addison Reed (1-4) was dealt the loss, allowing a Francisco Lindor home run in the eighth...the offense recorded 12 hits, three being home runs from Miguel Sanó, Logan Morrison and Eduardo Escobar.

TWINS-INDIANS: The Twins and Indians are playing each other for the fourth of 19 scheduled games this season...they are 1-2 vs. the Tribe this season, going 1-1 in Puerto Rico and 0-1 at Target Field.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (64-for-192) with eight doubles, three triples, nine home runs, 24 RBI and 29 runs scored in 51 career games against the Indians...the hits and home runs are his personal most vs. any opponent.

☞ Max Kepler enters tonight with a nine-game hitting streak vs. the Indians.

☞ Robbie Grossman was an invite to Indians spring training in 2016 and was reassigned from camp to Triple-A Columbus...he hit .256 (30-for-117) in 34 games before opting out of his contract on May 16.

☞ Twins Bench Coach Derek Shelton was Cleveland's hitting coach from 2005-09...prior to that, he was Cleveland's minor league hitting coordinator from 2003-05.

MILESTONE MOLITOR: Paul Molitor is one win away from earning his 250th career managerial win...he ranks seventh on the Twins all-time managerial wins list (full list on pg. 16 of Twins Media Guide)...below are some of his milestone wins:

GETTING OFFENSIVE: The Twins hit .196 (55-for-280) with 2.9 runs-per-game and a .270 on-base percentage in nine games from May 18-27...since May 28, the Twins have recorded 10-plus hits in three of four games and have averaged 6.3 runs-per-game with a .357 on-base percentage in those four.

ROSIE WRAPS UP MAY: Eddie Rosario finished May hitting .368 (43-for-117) with 11 doubles, six home runs, 21 RBI, 20 runs scored, a .388 on-base percentage, .615 slugging percentage and a 1.004 OPS in 28 games...among AL players in May, Rosario ranked tied for fourth in batting average, 10th in OPS and 11th in slugging percentage.

MIGGY MAKING MOVES: Miguel Sanó has hit safely in five straight entering today, including multiple hits in each of his last two...during the five-game hit-streak he has two doubles, two home runs and nine RBI.

WHAT'S UP IN THE TWINS COMMUNITY: Today Target Field will host Twins Summer Baseball Camp presented by Select Heartland Chevrolet, Dozier's Heroes - a batting practice group visit with Military members, and celebrate Puerto Rico Relief Efforts Appreciation Day.

LAST START: Berríos suffered his fifth loss of the year after allowing two runs over 7.1 innings on eight hits and one walk with eight strikeouts...this was the longest outing of his career that resulted in a loss...entered the eighth inning of the game tied but left with one out after walking Mitch Haniger...Ryan Pressley and Zach Duke came on in relief of Berríos, but Duke was unable to keep Haniger from scoring.

AGAINST THE INDIANS: Berríos is making his sixth career start and second of the year against Cleveland...faced Cleveland on April 18 in Puerto Rico, did not factor into the decision in the 2-1 16-inning win after shutting out the Indians over 7.0 innings, allowing three hits and striking out five...last win against the Indians was May 13, 2017, allowed one earned run on two hits and one walk with four strikeouts over 7.2 innings...last loss was September 11, 2016, gave up five runs (three earned) on three hits and four walks with one strikeout over 2.2 innings.

WIZARD OF WHIFF: With his outing on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, Berríos has now thrown the three most recent 10+ K, 0 run games in Twins history (August 30, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, May 18, 2017 vs. Colorado)...the last to do it before Berríos was Ervin Santana on August 30, 2015 vs. Houston...now with three games of 10+ strikeouts and 0 walks, he follows Johan Santana (8) and Bert Blyleven (6) for most such performances in Twins history...Berríos is seventh in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio at 5.15...two 10+ strikeout starts in 2018.

KEEPING 'EM OFF THE BASES: Through 11 starts in 2018, Berríos has walked 13 batters, which is fourth fewest in the AL and seventh fewest in baseball...his BB/9 rate is 1.76, which is sixth best in the AL and 10th in baseball...Berríos has also only allowed 52 hits and owns a 0.95 WHIP, which is sixth best in the AL and seventh in baseball...he is one of nine qualifying pitchers in the AL with a WHIP below 1.00...opponents are only hitting .205 off of Berríos this year, 11th best in the AL and 17th in baseball.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Since the beginning of 2017, Berríos is 12-3 with a 2.59 ERA (104.1 IP, 28 ER) in 17 games (16 starts) in home games...his 2.59 ERA at home in that span is fifth best in the AL and ninth best in baseball...Berríos is 3-2 with a 2.92 ERA (29.0 IP, 10 ER) in four home starts in 2018, which is 13th best in the AL...on the road, Berríos is 7-9 with a 5.17 ERA (102.2 IP, 59 ER) in 19 starts since the beginning of 2017.

SOUVENIRS FROM THE ISLAND: Berríos made the start in his native Puerto Rico on April 18 vs. Cleveland...he became the just the second different Puerto Rican pitcher to start a major league game at Hiram Bithorn Stadium, the other being Javier Vazquez (4 starts)...two other pitchers appeared in relief: Pedro Feliciano (1 game) and Roberto Hernandez (3 game)...he and teammate Eddie Rosario became the first Twins Puerto Rico natives to play in Hiram Bithorn.

THE ROCKET AND LA MAQUINA: By shutting out Cleveland over 7.0 innings in his start on April 18, Berríos became the first pitcher since Roger Clemens in 1991 to throw 7.0+ shutout innings three times in their teams' first 13 games of a season...Clemens went on to lead the AL in ERA (2.62) and win the Cy Young Award.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Berríos is leading the Twins in innings pitched (68.2), strikeouts (67), quality starts (6) and WHIP (0.95)...among starts with more than six starts, leads in opponent batting average (.205), has allowed the fewest walks (13) and is second in ERA (3.67)...leads the team in both wins and losses...among AL starters with 10-or-more starts, he is fifth in walks-per-nine inning (1.76), 11th in opponent batting average, 17th in strikeouts and tied for 18th in innings pitched.

2017 RECAP:

- Berríos started 25 games, a single-season career-high.
- In first full season, Berríos finished 14-8 with 139 strikeouts and 48 walks over 145.2 innings.
- Set career highs in wins (14), strikeouts (139), innings (145.2) and ERA (3.89)...he ranked second on Twins staff in wins, and strikeouts, and third in starts and innings pitched.
- Tied for ninth in the AL in wins.
- The youngest pitcher in baseball to record an 11-strikeout game last year against Colorado on May 18.
- Made first career postseason appearance against New York-AL in the Wild Card Game... allowed three runs in three innings and was credited with a loss.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - LANCE LYNN, RHP [SEASON: 3-4, 5.94 ERA // CAREER: 75-51, 3.50 ERA]

Lynn is 3-4 with a 5.94 ERA (50.0 IP, 33 ER) with 33 walks and 50 strikeouts in 10 starts...has won his last two starts, previously won at Kansas City on May 28 after allowing two runs on six hits and three walks with five strikeout over 6.0 innings...has faced Cleveland once in his career, earned the win against the Indians on May 12, 2015 by shutting them out over 6.0 innings on four hits and four walks with nine strikeouts.
