## 2018 NATIONAL LEAGUE DIVISION SERIES, GAME 2 COLORADO ROCKIES (0-1) at MILWAUKEE BREWERS (1-0)

### YOU ALREADY KNOW IT'S ROCKTOBER

- The Colorado Rockies continue the 2018 Postseason with the second game of the National League Division Series against the Milwaukee Brewers.
- Lost Game One yesterday 3-2 in 10 innings, their second-straight extra-innings game of the postseason ... were held to no runs on one hit through eight innings before tying the game 2-2 on three hits in the top of the ninth inning ... the four hits were the fewest in a postseason game in franchise history.
- The Colorado Rockies are playing in the National League Division Series for the fourth time in franchise history, the first time since 2009 when they fell to Philadelphia in four games ... it is their first postseason series against the Brewers and their second postseason series against a NL Central opponent, with their first having come in Tuesday's 2-1 NL Wild Card Game victory over the Cubs.
- Colorado is in the postseason for the second consecutive season for the first time in franchise history ... have advanced to the postseason as a Wild Card in 1995, 2007, 2009 and 2017.
- Colorado entered the postseason via the second Wild Card with a record of 91-72 in 163 games, the third season in franchise history in which they reached 90 wins ... their .562 winning percentage was the second-best in franchise history (92-70, .568 in 2009).

### WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE

- The Rockies advanced to their first NLDS since 2009 by winning the NL Wild Card Game at Chicago-NL in 13 innings by a score of 2-1 on Tuesday night ... Tony Wolters recorded the game-winning RBI on a single in the 13th inning.
- It was the longest postseason elimination game by time and innings in Major League history.
- Kyle Freeland pitched 6.2 shutout innings, tied for the second-most innings pitched in Rockies postseason history (most: Ubaldo Jimenez, Oct. 12, 2009 Game Four of the NLDS) and the most scoreless innings pitched in Rockies postseason history.
- Per Elias, Scott Oberg became the first pitcher in Major League history to win a postseason game in which he faced at least four batters and struck out each batter he faced.

postseason win in Tuesday's Wild Card game ... is the first manager to lead the Rockies to the postseason in multiple seasons.

- As a player, Black appeared in two postseasons with Kansas City, in 1984 and 1985 ... was a World Champion in 1985.
- Bench Coach Mike Redmond was a World Champion with the 2003 Florida Marlins.

### SEEN IT ALL

- 12 players on the Rockies' Division Series roster have appeared in postseason play in their career prior to 2018: Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon, DJ LeMahieu, Scott Oberg, Chris Rusin and Trevor Story all made their postseason debuts with Colorado in the 2017 Wild Card Game ... players who have appeared in other postseasons include Wade Davis (2010-11 with Tampa Bay; 2014-15 with Kansas City; 2017 with Chicago-NL), Ian Desmond (2012, 2014 with Washington; 2016 with Texas; 2017 with Colorado), Carlos González (2009, 2017 with Colorado), Matt Holliday (2007 with Colorado; 2009, 2011-15 with St. Louis; 2017 with New York-AL), Chris Iannetta (2014 with Los Angeles-AL; 2017 with Arizona) and Gerardo Parra (2011 with Arizona; 2017 with Colorado).
- David Dahl, Kyle Freeland, Garrett Hampson, DJ Johnson, Ryan McMahon, Harrison Musgrave, Seungwan Oh, Adam Ottavino, Antonio Senzatela and Tony Wolters are all on their first postseason roster.

### ALGONQUIN FOR "THE GOOD LAND"

- Colorado went 2-5 against the Brewers in the regular season, 1-3 at home and 1-2 at Miller Park.
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.
- Brewers pitcher Jhoulys Chacin spent the first six years of his career with Colorado after signing with the Rockies as a non-drafted international free agent in 2004 ... he ranks eighth in franchise history in starts (109) and wins (38) and eighth with 514 strikeouts.
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.

### HI, AGAIN...

- In the Rockies' three-game series at Miller Park Aug. 3-5, Trevor Story hit a home run in each game, including a two-home run game on Aug. 4 ... per Elias, he is the only Rockies player to ever hit home runs in each of three consecutive games in one series at Miller Park.
- Story's 1.222 slugging percentage against Milwaukee was the highest by any NL player against one team (min. 20 at-bats).

### THE HEAVENLY BED

- The Rockies finished their 2018 road slate with a record of 44-38, the most road wins in franchise history ... only two other Colorado teams had won 40 on the road, the 2009 and 2017 clubs, which were both 41-40.

### THE BEST OF YOU

- Colorado's 57 wins this season against teams at or above .500 was the Majors.

### BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 46 come-from-behind wins were second in the NL (third in the Majors) and the third-most in franchise history.

**MR. DUCK**

- The 28-year-old left-hander was a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product was selected as the Colorado Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

**FALL BALL**

- Will be making his first career Postseason start, his second career Postseason appearance.
- Appeared in relief in the Rockies 11-8 loss at Arizona in last year's Wild Card game ... pitched one inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.

**THE ANDY MAN CAN**

- Pitched 7.2 shutout innings in Game 162 vs. Washington on Sept. 30 ... allowed four hits with three walks, one hit batter and five strikeouts.
- It was his third start of the season in which he tossed at least 7.2 shutout innings, the most such starts since Ubaldo Jiménez had four starts in 2010.
- It was his first win since July 4 vs. San Francisco, snapping a career-high six-game losing streak ... had been 0-6 with a 6.08 ERA (66.2 IP, 45 ER) with the Rockies 2-11 over his previous 13 starts.

**HE'S BACK**

- Has tossed three straight quality starts since Sept. 14, going 1-1 with a 1.83 ERA (19.2 IP, 4 ER), five walks and 15 strikeouts.
- Prior to this stretch had been 0-5 with a 10.13 ERA (29.1 IP, 33 ER) with 46 hits allowed over his previous seven starts.

**CREW**

- Has made three career starts vs. the Brewers, all at Miller Park, going 1-2 with an 8.59 ERA (14.2 IP, 14 ER), 18 hits, six walks and 22 strikeouts.
- Took the loss at Milwaukee on Aug. 4, allowing seven runs on seven hits, including three home runs, with three walks and four strikeouts ... allowed six runs in the first inning, including a grand slam to Travis Shaw.

**TAKE A FLIER**

- Finished with the second-lowest ground ball percentage in the National League at 37.3 ... his 184 fly balls were the third-most in the NL ... induced 188 ground balls with a grounder-to-flies ratio of 1.02 which was also the third-lowest mark in the NL.
- Allowed 30 home runs, tied for the most in the league (also: Chase Anderson, Milwaukee) ... surrendered 14 on the road, tied for third-most in the NL.

**80205**

- His 3.73 (214.2 IP, 89 ER) career ERA at Coors Field is the fifth-lowest mark in Rockies history (min. 100 IP) ... third-lowest all-time among Rockies starting pitchers with at least 25 starts (lowest: Kyle Freeland, 3.04).
- In 17 starts at Coors Field this season, went 3-6 with a 4.15 ERA (95.1 IP, 44 ER).

**OOO**

- Went 4-3 on the road in 15 starts this season, with the Rockies going 7-8 ... has a 5.02 road ERA (80.2 IP, 45 ER) with 27 walks and 72 strikeouts.
- During his three-game road losing streak, over five starts, the Rockies have scored a combined nine runs.
- Was 4-0 with the Rockies 7-3 over 10 road starts from April 5-July 30 (4-0, 2.79, 58.0 IP, 18 ER).

**SOLID**

- Recorded consecutive outings of eight scoreless innings June 29 at Los Angeles-NL and July 4 vs. San Francisco ... was the third pitcher in franchise history to record consecutive outings of at least eight scoreless innings (also: Ubaldo Jimenez, May 26-31, 2010 and Jason Marquis, June 30-July 6, 2009) ... was the first pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that feat while allowing four or fewer hits in each start ... first pitcher in MLB to accomplish the feat since Jake Arrieta, Aug. 30-Sept. 5, 2015.

**THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST**

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.
