AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 2-2 on their six-game homestand after sweeping 2G from Tampa Bay and dropping the first two games of a four-game series with the Orioles...following an off day on Mon., will begin a six-game road trip: 3G at Boston (Tue.-Thurs.) and 3G at Detroit (4/13-15).
▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.
▶ Are 2-2 thus far on a stretch of 16 of 22G at home (4/3-26).
▶ Seven of the Yankees' first 10G are day games (3-2).
▶ Have two scheduled off days (4/9, 18) before starting a season-long stretch of games on 18 straight days (4/19-5/6).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost their second straight game, falling 7-3 in 14 innings to Baltimore at Yankee Stadium...**LHP CC Sabathia** (4.0IP, 4H, 3ER, OBB, 3K, 3HR, 1HP) started and was removed from the game with right hip soreness...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-6) had a run-scoring, first-inning single, marking his 2,000th career total base...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1BB, 1HP) had an RBI single in the third...**SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-5, solo HR, 1BB) reached base safely three times and hit a game-tying solo HR in the eighth...**RHP Tommy Kahnle** (2.0IP, 2BB, 2K, 2WP) tossed 48 pitches, the second-most in a single game in his career (threw 53 pitches on 6/20/14 w/ Colorado vs. Milwaukee)...**Yankees relievers** (10.0IP, 5H, 8BB, 13K, 3WP) put up nine straight scoreless frames from the fifth through the 13th inning before allowing 4R/3ER in the 14th...**3B Brandon Drury** (0-for-2, migraine), **2B Tyler Wade** (0-for-3, flu-like symptoms) and **C Gary Sánchez** (0-for-6, right calf cramp) each left the game early due to injury.

🇳🇱🇺🇸: SS Didi Gregorius leads the Majors with a .964 slugging percentage and a 1.479 OPS... is tied for second in MLB with 10RBI and five doubles...ranks fourth in MLB with a .514 OBP.

- ▶ Has 11 hits in 2018, including nine for extra-bases (5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR), **marking the most XBH in MLB.**
- ▶ Is the fifth Yankee since 1908 to tally at least 9XBH through the team's first 8G of a season, joining Alex Rodriguez (10XBH in 2007), Derek Jeter (9XBH in 1999), Nick Swisher (9XBH in 2009) and Joe DiMaggio (9XBH in 1941).
- ▶ Has 6BB in 35PA this season (17.1%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PA's over his first three years with the Yankees.
- ▶ Has hit safely in 18 consecutive games vs. Baltimore (since 10/2/16), **the longest Yankees hitting streak against the O's since Robinson Canó hit in 19 straight from 6/1/10-7/29/11...** is hitting .405 (30-for-74) with 17R, 8 doubles, 6HR and 21RBI during the streak.
- ▶ Through 4G on this homestand, is batting .500/.632/1.285 (7-for-14) with 5R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 4BB.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters rank fourth in the Majors in opp. BA (.209) and fifth in the Majors with a 2.49 ERA (43.1IP, 12ER)...the 12ER are the rotation's fewest allowed over the first eight starts of a season since 1999, when the Yankees starters permitted just 9ER in their first eight starts.
▶ **Have held opponents to a .100 BA (3-for-30) with RISP.**
▶ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of their first six starts, the second Yankees rotation since at least 1908 to accomplish the feat (also 1911).

POWER AND PATIENCE: Yankees hitters are tied for second in the Majors with 13HR this season (CWS-14, LAA-13)...marks the ninth time in club history that they have hit at least 13HR through eight team games.
▶ Have homered in 7-of-8 games this season, with multiple HRs four times.
▶ Have collected 29XBH (15 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR), tied for third in the Majors (LAA-33, TOR-31, ATL-29).
▶ Lead the AL with 36BB, tied for second in the Majors (WAS-39, ARI-36).
▶ Are seeing an average of 4.07 pitches per plate appearance, third-highest in MLB (PHI-4.41, STL-4.21).

TODAY, WE EAT LIKE KINGS: Throughout the remainder of the homestand, the Sheppard's Place press dining area will serve a sampling of offerings from **King's Hawaiian Grill**, new at Yankee Stadium in 2018...King's Hawaiian Grill can be found on the concourse behind sections 115 and 334.

ALL RISE: After going homerless in his first 5G of 2018, **RF Aaron Judge** has homered in two of the last 3G.

▶ His 58 career home runs are tied for the most by any player through 190 career games in Major League history...the all-time record for HRs through 200 career games is 59 by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is

the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.
▶ Since the start of 2017, is hitting .406 (28-for-69) with 32R, 5 doubles, 12HR, 26RBI and 25BB in 21G vs. Baltimore...in 12 home games in that span, is hitting .439 (18-for-41) with 23R, 3 doubles, 9HR, 19RBI and 15BB.

GOING, GOING, GIAN: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his third home run of the season in the first inning on Wed. vs. Tampa Bay, his first HR as a Yankee at Yankee Stadium.

▶ Hit 3HR through the team's first six games, the first Yankee to do it since 2011, when Mark Teixeira hit 4HR and Jorge Posada hit 3HR...was the first player ever to hit at least 3HR in the first six team games in his first season as a Yankee.

▶ Has 270 home runs in 994 career games...mark the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

▶ Reached 2,000 career total bases with a first-inning single in Friday's loss vs. Baltimore.
▶ Has homered against all but five of the 30 MLB clubs: Baltimore, Cleveland, Kansas City, Miami, Minnesota...is 5-for-34 (.147) with 0XBH in his career vs. Baltimore.

DOWN ON THEIR LUCK: Yankees hitters have a .234 batting average on balls in play (BABIP), the third-lowest mark in the Majors (CLE-.175, KC-.226)...in 2017, their .304 BABIP ranked 13th.

▶ **Yankees relievers** have a 5.40 ERA (31.2IP, 19ER) this season but have recorded 46K and just 14BB...opponents are hitting .393 (11-for-28) with RISP against the bullpen.

'O' NO...: Dating back to 9/17/17, the Yankees have lost three straight home games to the Orioles...is their longest such losing streak since a four-game losing streak from 5/1-7/31/12...prior to this streak, had won eight of their previous 9G.

...'O' YES: In two starts vs. the Yankees in 2017, Baltimore's Chris Tillman was 0-2 with a 31.50 ERA (4.0IP, 14H, 14ER, 5BB, 2K), as Yankees hitters batted .538/.613/1.308 (14-for-26) with 2 doubles and 6HR...on 6/10/17 at Yankee Stadium, he allowed a career-high 9ER in just 1.1IP...also allowed 1ER in 3.0IP in a relief appearance.

▶ Has a 4-5 record and 7.63 ERA (48.1IP, 41ER) in 11 career games (10 starts) at Yankee Stadium, allowing a .361/.418/.558 slash line.
▶ Didi Gregorius is 11-for-20 (.550) with 5 doubles, 1 triple and 1HR lifetime vs. Tillman.

BABY BOMBERS: Despite having no rookies, **the Yankees Opening Day active roster's average age was 28 years, 150 days, the club's youngest since at least 1993...** marks the third consecutive year that the Yankees' average age on Opening Day was under 30 years old (28.334 in 2017, 29.099 in 2016)...every Yankees Opening Day roster from 1997-2015 averaged over 30 years old.

▶ Both players recalled since O.D. are rookies (OF Billy McKinney, INF Miguel Andújar).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 7, 2007: Down 7-6 with two out and bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth, Alex Rodriguez hits a "walk-off" grand slam off Chris Ray in a 10-7 win vs. Baltimore.

April 7, 1994: In an 18-6 win vs. Texas, Don Mattingly notches his 1,000th career RBI to become the ninth Yankee to reach the milestone and first since Mickey Mantle in 1961.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 8, 2003: Hideki Matsui hits a grand slam in his Yankee Stadium debut, leading the Yankees to a 7-3 win over Minnesota.

April 8, 1985: At 46 years, 7 days old, Phil Niekro becomes the second-oldest Opening Day starter of all-time. Niekro makes the start at Boston, allowing 5R in 4.0IP while picking up the loss in a 9-2 Yankees defeat.

April 8, 1974: Hank Aaron breaks Babe Ruth's all-time HR record, hitting No. 715 off former Yankee and then-Dodger Al Downing.

YANKEES vs. BALTIMORE ORIOLES

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees are 0-2 vs. the Orioles in 2018...will meet 19 times in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G in Baltimore), beginning with their current four-game series in the Bronx through Sunday...have won three straight series between the clubs since 6/9/17...is their longest streak of series won against the O's since winning three in a row from 7/5-9/12/13...last won four straight series from 9/17/10-7/31/11...are 215-139-2 vs. Baltimore since 1998, the club's most wins over any opponent in that span (next: 210-143 vs. Tampa Bay)...**IN 2017:** Went 12-7 vs. Baltimore, including 8-2 at home and 4-5 in Baltimore...marked their first season series win over the O's since going 10-9 in 2013 and their most wins since they were 13-5 in 2011...Yankees batters scored 154R vs. Baltimore in 2017, the highest run total by any team vs. any opponent in the Expansion Era (since 1961) and the club's highest single-season total vs. any opponent since 1956 (158R vs. the Kansas City A's and 152R vs. the Washington Senators)...**IN SEASON SERIES:** With a 12-7 mark in 2017, snapped a streak of three consecutive season series losses (2014-16), which marked their first time losing consecutive season series to the O's since 1980-82...are 15-3-2 in 20 season series since 1998...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 0-2 at Yankee Stadium in 2018...went 8-2 vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium in 2017, their most home wins vs. the Orioles since 1960 (10-1 at the original Yankee Stadium) and tied for the second-highest single-season win total against any opponent at the current Stadium (10-0 vs. Toronto in 2013, 8-2 vs. Tampa Bay in 2017)...the Yankees' 102R in 10 home games vs. Baltimore in 2017 were their most against an opponent at Yankee Stadium in a single season (previously 64R in 9G vs. Baltimore in 2011)...scored 8R-or-more in six straight home games vs. the O's from 6/9-9/16/17, their longest such streak vs. an opponent since at least 1908...are 55-31 (.640) vs. the O's at the current Yankee Stadium, their most wins vs. any opponent here (next-most: 54-30 vs. Toronto)...have won the opener in 14 of their last 16 home series vs. Baltimore since the start of 2013...have gone 18-2-0 in home season series vs. Baltimore the last 20 years (1998-2017), with the only sub-.500 marks coming in 2014 (4-6) and 2012 (3-6).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (0-0, 2.25 ERA)

RHP Sonny Gray will make his second start of the season today vs. Baltimore...the 28-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...went 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2IP, 3ER) in four official spring starts...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...was on the 10-day disabled list and missed the start of the 2017 season...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 90-of-124 career starts...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

LAST START: Did not record a decision in his first start of the season on Sunday at Toronto (4.0IP, 7H, 1ER, 3BB, 8K, 0HR)...marked his first career game in which he recorded at least 8K and did not throw at least 5.0IP...is only the second such game by a Yankees pitcher in the last five seasons since 2014 (also Masahiro Tanaka, 10K in 4.0IP on 6/17 at Oakland).

SPRING TRAINING: Made four spring training starts, going 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2IP, 8H, 4R/3ER, 1HR, 5BB, 16K)...also threw 6.0IP in a minor league intrasquad game on 3/20...started the final exhibition game of the spring at Atlanta on 3/26, earning the win after 5.0IP and giving up 1ER with 7K and 0BB.

VS. BALTIMORE: Is 2-4 with a 5.28 ERA (30.2IP, 18ER) in six career starts against Baltimore...has made two starts vs. Baltimore as a Yankee, going 1-1 with a 4.66 ERA (9.2IP, 5ER)...has made only two career home starts vs. the Orioles, going 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2IP, 6ER).

✦ Went 4-7 with a 3.79 ERA (76.0IP, 32ER) in 13 starts vs. the AL East in 2017...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of those starts.
