AT HOME: The Brewers are 49-30 at home, going 15-7-3 in series play.....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22 and a season-high 3-game home losing streak from 4/7-4/16.....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 44-37 on the road, going 14-8-4 in series play.....the team won its last 5 road series.....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11 and a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15.....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (313-308) and third full season.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 33 replay challenges, going 7-26.....their last challenge (lost) came on 9/24 at St. Louis as a Matt Carpenter hit by pitch stood.....went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #20 - LHP WADE MILEY (15gs, 5-2, 2.32)

MILEY AT A GLANCE: Wade Miley, 31, will be making his 16th start of the season....Miley last started last Sunday at Pittsburgh and received no decision in the Brewers' 13-6 victory (4ip, 4r, 4r, 3er, 1bb, 1k)....the team is 11-4 in his starts, including 6 straight wins....he has made 6 quality starts....opponents are batting .230 (66-for-287, 3hr)....Miley was placed on the 10-day disabled list on 5/9 with a right oblique strain and transferred to the 60-day DL on 5/12....he was reinstated on 7/12....he was signed to a minor-league contract on 2/16 and invited to Major League camp....he suffered a groin strain while fielding a bunt on 3/21 vs. Oakland and was reassigned to minor-league camp on 3/28....Miley began a rehab assignment on 4/17 at Double-A Biloxi and joined the Brewers on 5/2....he returned to Biloxi for a second rehab stint on 6/22....bio is available in the press box.

LAST SEASON: Miley went 8-15 with a 5.61 ERA in 32 starts with Baltimore....he made 30+ starts for the fifth consecutive season....the team went 15-17 in his starts....he made 8 quality starts....opponents batted .287 (179-for-624, 25hr).

CAREER: Is 71-76 with a 4.25 ERA in 215 games / 211 starts (1233.1ip, 582er)....he has pitched for Arizona (2011-14), Boston (2015), Seattle (2016), Baltimore (2016-17) and Milwaukee (2018)....Miley was a 2012 National League All-Star while pitching for the D-backs.

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 3-2 with a 5.12 ERA in 9 starts (38.2ip, 22er)....is 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA in 6 starts this season (27.1ip, 6er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 36-41 with a 4.12 ERA in 116 games / 115 starts (662.1ip, 303er)....is 3-2 with a 2.50 ERA in 9 starts this season (50.1ip, 14er).

CAREER vs. TIGERS: Is 0-0 with a 6.19 ERA in 3 starts (16ip, 11er), including 0-0 with a 5.40 ERA in 2 starts last season with Baltimore (10ip, 6er).

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is batting .155 (37-for-239) with 1 HR....has 9 walks and 66 strikeouts....his home run came on 4/22/13 at San Francisco (solo off Ryan Vogelsong).

THIS SEASON: Is batting .185 (5-for-27)....has 1 walk and 11 strikeouts....does not have a sacrifice bunt.
