ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets placed RHP Jeurys Familia on the 10-Day Disabled List, retroactive to June 7, with a sore right shoulder and recalled RHP Jacob Rhame from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...Rhame will wear #35 and will be available for tonight's game...He was 0-1 with five saves and a 5.02 ERA (eight earned runs/14.1 innings) in 11 games with the 51s...Rhame is 0-1 with one save and a 6.35 ERA (eight earned runs/11.1 innings) in 11 games with the Mets this year.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES: Will play in a minor league rehabilitation game tonight for Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League at Trenton...Cespedes has been on the DL since May 14 with a strain of the right hip flexor.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost 11 of their last 13 games, including six straight...The six-game losing streak is tied for the Mets longest this season (also May 1-6)...New York has lost eight straight home games and is 12-19 at Citi Field this season...The last time the Mets dropped eight consecutive games at home was May 10-25, 2013...The Mets are 7-13 in one-run games (3-6 in such games at home).

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets went 0-4 vs. the Yankees last year (0-2 at Citi Field and 0-2 at Yankee Stadium)...It was second time the Mets had been swept by the Yanks in a season series (also: 2003, 0-6)...The Mets are 46-66 vs. the Bronx Bombers all-time during the regular season, including 8-15 at Citi Field and 24-32 in Queens combined (Shea/Citi Field).

INTERLEAGUE: New York is 1-3 in Interleague action this year, after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...The Mets will travel to Yankee Stadium on July 20-22...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 186-180...The .508 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs.

METS OFFENSE: The Mets have scored two runs in their last 42.0 innings...New York has been held to one run or fewer in four consecutive game and 15 times this season...The 15 games of one or fewer runs is tied for the third-most in the major leagues.

INNINGS: New York has allowed 40 first-inning runs, tied for the seventh-most in the majors...New York has scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 41 eighth-inning runs are tied for the third-most in the majors.

BULLPEN: In its last 13 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-9 with a 7.19 ERA (41 earned runs/51.1 innings)...The pen has 13 wins, tied for the sixth-most in the majors and 17 losses, the most in the majors.

STARTERS: Over its last 18 games, New York starters have a 2.36 ERA (26 earned runs/99.0 innings)...Overall, the Mets are 10th in the majors with a 3.82 ERA from their starters.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has a career-high seven homers this season...He hit six homers combined in his first two seasons...Nimmo is sixth in the majors with a .407 on-base percentage (min. 150 PA).

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom extended his franchise record with his eighth straight start allowing one run or less on June 2...That streak is tied for the third-longest in the majors since 1908 (see the list below)...He has allowed one run or less in 55 of his 119 career starts (46 percent).

RANKINGS: DeGrom leads the National League and ranks second in the majors with a 1.49 ERA...Justin Verlander is first (1.24 ERA)...DeGrom is third in the NL and eighth in the majors with 98 strikeouts, fifth in the NL in WHIP (1.04) and fourth in the majors with a .535 OPS.

STREAK: DeGrom has started a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...The last Mets starter to begin a year 5-0 was Matt Harvey in 2015.

deCITI: Jacob deGrom has allowed two runs in his last 25.0 innings (0.72 ERA) with 40 strikeouts at home...During his career, deGrom has a 2.24 ERA (94 earned runs/377.0 innings) at home, the second-lowest home ERA among active pitchers with 300 or more innings at home...Clayton Kershaw is first (2.07 ERA).

DEVIN MESORACO: Has five homers, two doubles, 10 RBI and 12 runs scored with a .500 slugging percentage in 19 games with the Mets since he was acquired from Cincinnati on May 8.

JUSTIN DUNN: The Mets first round pick in 2016 has been promoted to Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League...He is scheduled to start on Sunday at Trenton...Dunn was 2-3 with a 2.36 ERA (12 earned runs/45.2 innings) in nine starts with St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League.

EMPIRE STATE BUILDING: The Empire State Building will sparkle in the winning teams colors for 10 minutes following the conclusion of tonight's game.

LAST START: DeGrom tonight makes his 13th start of the season...Took a no decision, his MLB-high-tying eighth of the season, vs. Chicago in his last start, June 2 at Citi Field... Pitched 7.0 innings and surrendered one run, earned, on seven hits while walking three and tallying a career-high-tying 13 strikeouts for the second time this season...Extended his franchise record with his eighth-straight start allowing one run or less dating back to April 21...His eight-straight starts allowing one or fewer runs is tied for the third-longest streak since at least 1908 and is tied for the longest in the last 50 seasons.

VS. THE YANKEES: DeGrom tonight makes his fifth-career appearance in the Subway Series...Last faced the Bronx Bombers on August 15, 2017 at Yankee Stadium, when he suffered the loss after tossing 7.1 innings, allowing five runs, earned, on nine hits while walking two and striking out four...Is 1-3 with a 4.10 ERA (12 earned runs/26.1 innings) in four-career starts against the Yankees, including a 0.64 ERA (one earned run/14.0 innings) in two starts vs. the Yankees at Citi Field...Made his major league debut in the Subway Series on May 15, 2014, becoming the second player in franchise history to make his MLB debut vs. the Yankees (Jaime Cerda, June 28, 2002 was the first).

deGROMINANT RUN: Since April 21, deGrom is 2-0 with an MLB-best 0.57 ERA (three earned runs/47.1 innings) in eight starts...During that time, has struck out 68 and walked 15...His 12.93 strikeouts per 9.0 innings rank second in the majors in that span and his 0.19 HR/9 rate during the run is the second-lowest in the majors.

HANG 10+: DeGrom's 13-strikeout effort in his last outing was the 25th double-digit strikeout game of his career (fourth this season), passing Jerry Koosman for fifth place on the franchise 10+ strikeout games list (Sid Fernandez is fourth with 31 double-digit strikeout games)...His four double-digit strikeout games this season are tied for third-most in the majors (t-second-most in NL)...Since his debut on May 15, 2014, deGrom's 25 double-digit strikeout games are tied for the sixth-most in the majors and third-most in the NL.

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the NL (second in majors) with a 1.49 ERA (12 earned runs/72.1 innings)...His 98 strikeouts this season are third-most in the NL and eighth-most in the majors...Has begun a season 4-0 for the first time in his career and is the only unbeaten starter with at least 10 starts this season...Also leads the league with a .535 opponent OPS and a 0.37 HR/9 rate...Ranks second in the NL in strikeout rate (33.9 percent) and FIP (1.91).

ESCAPE ARTIST: Has held opponents to a .120 (6-50) batting average with RISP this season, third-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the NL...That includes a 2-25 (.080) mark with RISP and two outs...Opponents are 2-36 (.056) with 21 strikeouts with RISP in his last eight starts overall...A non-run-scoring Anthony Rizzo single with RISP in his last outing snapped an 0-29 streak with RISP that was the third-longest in club history according to Elias...Opponents are 0-12 with nine strikeouts with the bases loaded vs. deGrom this year...He has struck out the last seven batters he's faced with the bases loaded.

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in nine of his 12 starts this season, tied with Justin Verlander for the most such starts in the majors...In his 119-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 55 times (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 119-career games...Has 18-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, fourth-most in the majors since his debut...Only Jake Arrieta (25), Clayton Kershaw (22) and Chris Sale (20) have more.

NOTHING EXTRA...: Nine of the 54 hits deGrom has allowed this season have gone for extra bases (six doubles, three homers)...His .263 opponent slugging percentage leads in the NL and is second in the majors...His nine extra-base hits allowed are the fewest among the 98 pitchers with at least 60.0 innings pitched this season.

ESPECIALLY TO RIGHTIES: Has allowed only two XBH to the 140 righthanded hitters he has faced this season, the fewest among all pitchers who have faced at least 100 RHB this season...Opposing righties are 24-127 (.189), with one double, one home run, 51 strikeouts and a league-best .220 slugging percentage against deGrom...In his last five starts, righthanded batters have gone 6-44 (.136) with a homer, five walks and 23 strikeouts.

TOMMOROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (2-4, 3.42)

LAST START: Tossed a season-high 7.0 innings, giving up two runs, earned, on five hits with two walks and seven strikeouts...Suffered the loss in the Mets' 2-0 setback vs. the Cubs on June 3...Was the first time he completed 7.0 innings since July 3 of last season at Washington.

ON TOP OF THE TOP: The top five batters in opposing lineups are hitting for a combined .217 average (25-115) with five homers and 28 strikeouts against Matz this season...The sixth-eighth spots in the order have gone 17-56 (.304) with four homers and 11 strikeouts against the southpaw.

- Drove in his first run as a Met with his pinch-hit, game-tying RBI single in the ninth inning on May 25 at Milwaukee...Was his first game-tying RBI in the ninth inning or later since September 21, 2016 at Seattle with Toronto (game-tying homer).
- Signed to a major league contract by the Mets on May 22 and made his debut that night, going 1-3 with a double and a run scored.
- Batted .143 (5-35) with one double, two home runs, five RBI and three runs scored in 12 games with the Braves...Played in 12 minor league games before having his contract selected by the Braves (.256, 1 HR, 5 RBI)...Signed by Atlanta on April 18 and released on May 20.

- Grabbed his 150th career RBI with his solo homer on May 25 at Milwaukee...Conforto reached 150 RBI in his 312th career game...Only five other Mets began their major league career with 150 or more RBI in their first 312 games...David Wright (212 RBI), Darryl Strawberry (199), Ike Davis (170), Butch Huskey (162) and Steve Henderson (153).
- Tied his career high with four hits on May 18 vs. Arizona...Homered off Patrick Corbin on May 19, his first homer of a lefty since August 5, 2017 (Rich Hill)...Was his seventh career homer off a lefthanded pitcher overall...Corbin is the only lefty Conforto has homered off of more than once.
- Hit his third home run of the season with his go-ahead, two-run homer on May 11 at Philadelphia with the Mets trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning...It was the third home run in Mets history that gave the Mets a lead when trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning or later...The other two were hit by Lucas Duda (September 27, 2014, two-run walk off homer vs. Houston) and Daniel Murphy (April 27, 2015, a three-run homer in the top of the ninth at Miami).
- Hit his seventh career leadoff homer with his solo shot to start the game on May 7 in Cincinnati.
