**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the sixth contest (1-4) of a four-city, 10-game road trip to **Kansas City** (makeup; 0-1), **Boston** (0-3), **Baltimore** (June 29-July 1; 1-0) and **Seattle** (July 3-5)...**Last night's win snapped a season-high six-game losing streak... Halos have dropped eight of 12 and 13 of last 18 games...Club is in fourth place, 12.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (10.0 games behind Seattle for second Wild Card spot)...Angels are 29-38 since a club-record 13-3 start...Club is 12-14 this month, will finish with a sub-.500 month for second straight month and four of last six months spanning to 2017...LAA is 6-14 when a left-hander starts (36-27 vs. RHS)...LAA is 11-19 on road since a club-record 11-1 start...16 of 24 G in July at home.**

**SCIOSCIA 3000:** Today marks the 3,000<sup>th</sup> career game for **Mike Scioscia** as manager for the Angels...He's the 21<sup>st</sup> manager all-time to reach the plateau in games managed and the sixth to have at least 3,000 games with one team (**Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston and Tommy Lasorda**).

**SKAGGS TODAY:** Tyler Skaggs is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP – 2 ER) this month (4 GS)...**The 0.67 ERA is currently a club record for June (min. 4 GS)**...He has allowed two earned runs or less in 12 of his 15 starts...His 2.69 ERA ranks ninth in A.L...In nine road starts, he is 5-2 with a 2.14 ERA (54.2 IP – 13 ER)...Only previous start of career vs. **Baltimore** came July 31, 2014 at Camden Yards; tossed 4.2 scoreless, no-hit innings allowing two walks with seven strikeouts but left game with left forearm tightness which would lead to Tommy John surgery (missed nearly two full seasons).

**SIMBA SIZZLIN' Andrelton Simmons** matched a career high with four hits last night (5<sup>th</sup> time, 2<sup>nd</sup> in '18) to **extend his hit streak to seven games (.448; 13/39)**...Has raised season average from .306 to .322 during stretch...**368 (50/136) road clip, fourth best in MLB.**

**WE LIKE IT HERE:** Following players have strong career numbers at **Camden Yards: Ian Kinsler (.346; 66/191, 9 HR 28 RBI in 46 games), Chris Young (.313; 21/67, 5 HR, 6 RBI in 25 games), Mike Trout (8 HR and 15 RBI in 23 games; 1<sup>st</sup> MLB HR on 7/24/11) and Albert Pujols (.280; 21/75, 4 HR, 12 RBI in 18 games).**

**OHTANI UPDATE:** Shohei Ohtani (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7<sup>th</sup>. **On Thursday an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. He will begin a hitting progression immediately. Depending on day-to-day progress, Ohtani could see live pitching as early as this weekend.** He will not partake on a minor league rehab assignment but rather hit in a controlled environment. **In approximately three weeks, he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.**

**JEWELL UPDATE:** Jake Jewell had right ankle surgery yesterday (fractured right fibula) with **Dr. Kenneth Jung** of Kerlan-Jobe in Los Angeles. Updates will be provided when appropriate.

**THEY KNOW O's:** Justin Upton has four home runs and 15 RBI in his last eight games vs. Orioles...**Ian Kinsler** is batting .340 (124/365) with 13 HRs & 52 RBI in career vs. Baltimore...**Andrelton Simmons** has a **.379 career clip vs. O's (25/66; 2 HRs) and is hitting .563 (26/88) in four games vs. Orioles this season**

**ALWAYS ON:** Since his call-up in 2012, **Mike Trout** has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His **72 walks are most in Angels' history through 83 games.**

**FROM THE START:** Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 44 of last 55 games...**LAA starters have fashioned a 3.23 ERA (301.1 IP – 108 ER) since May 1, second in MLB in span.**

**TRIPLE THREATS at 1K:** June 21<sup>st</sup> marked the 1,000<sup>th</sup> career game for **Mike Trout**...He joins **Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a **.300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases** at the 1K milestone.

**A BIT ON ALBERT:** Albert Pujols is 39 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two other players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.**

**MAKE WAR:** Trout's 7.0 WAR this season (**Wins Above Replacement**) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **J. Ramirez (CLE)** at 5.4...**On pace for a 13.6 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)**...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his **61.1 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,008 games.**

**JUNE BUG:** Trout's .351 (207/589) career average in June is highest among active players in any month (min. 400 PA)...This month, he boasts a slash line of .364/.500/.614 with 18 runs, six HRs & 13 RBI (22 BB/ 7 IBB).

**SHELVED:** Angels currently have 14 players on the D.L...**On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...48 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (Club record is 55 in 2017)...27 pitchers have played for LAA, most in team history thru 83 games (STATS).**

**MVP x 3?** Two-time A.L. MVP **Mike Trout** ranks in **Top 3 in MLB in several offensive categories**, including HRs (2<sup>nd</sup>; 24), runs (T1<sup>st</sup>; 65), times on base (1<sup>st</sup>; 169), total bases (2<sup>nd</sup>; 186), walks (1<sup>st</sup>; 72), OBP (1<sup>st</sup>; .462), OPS (1<sup>st</sup>; 1.110) & OPS+ (1<sup>st</sup>; 207.0)...**Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (11).**

**GLOVE STORY:** LAA has gone errorless in 54 of 83 games...**Club has 35 errors thru 83 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct...Catchers own a 47.1 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB)...Trout is one of four MLB CFs with a 1.000 fielding pct.**

**BATS ARE BETTER:** Despite being held to two runs or less in five of last eight games, LAA has posted 4+ runs in 10 of last 15 and in 15 of 26 games in June...**Club's 39 HRs this month rank third in A.L.**

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 38 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 83 affairs...**LAA ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in A.L. with 747Ks)...288 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 309.2 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L... Halos have allowed 109 HRs, second-most in A.L.**

**HOT HALOS:** **Chris Young** has connected for four HRs and six RBI over his last nine starts (2 HR & 6 RBI first 22 starts)...**David Fletcher** has hit safely in five of his first eight MLB starts (3 multi-hit games)...Over his last 29 contests, **Ian Kinsler** has 18 runs, seven doubles, nine HRs and 16 RBI...**Jose Briceño** has opened his big league career batting .333 (9/27) in nine games with an AB...**Luis Valbuena** has three home runs and seven RBI his last seven starts...In his return from D.L., **Kole Calhoun** has hit safely in six of nine starts with an AB hitting .290 (9/31), with six runs, a double, two HRs & six RBI...**Martin Maldonado** has 11 RBI his last 10 games.

**NOT A FAN:** **Andrelton Simmons** has struck out just six times since May 1 (192 PA)...He went 90 PA without a K (May 18-June 22)...He Leads MLB in PA per SO with 21.21 (297 PA/14 K) while teammate **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.10).

**ALBERT ALERT:** Albert Pujols is 27<sup>th</sup> all-time with 3,043 hits...**Rod Carew** is 26<sup>th</sup> at 3,053...His 3,000<sup>th</sup> hit came May 4<sup>th</sup> at **Seattle** to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (**Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez**)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,961 RBI (BBREF)**...**Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

**AT BALTIMORE:** Angels lead 2018 season series 4-0 (have outscored O's 32-13) and have won eight of last 10 overall...Halos swept Baltimore in three-game series May 1-3 at Angel Stadium...Halos took 2017 series 4-2, winning two of three at home and on road...LAA holds slight lead in last 28 matchups (16-12).

**SEATTLE ON DECK:** Mariners lead 2018 series 4-2, sweeping Angels in last trip to SAFECO (June 11-13)...Halos took two of three at Seattle in first meeting (May 4-6)...**LAA is 10-8 in last 18 games at SAFECO... Angels are 100-77 over M's since 2009...Trout's 20 HRs at SAFECO are his most in career at any road ballpark, and most ever by a visiting player at SAFECO.**

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP TYLER SKAGGS**

**6-5, 2.69 ERA**

*In last four starts, is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP - 2 ER)*

- Making 16<sup>th</sup> start of the season and 10<sup>th</sup> on the road...Second start for Angels since being scratched from last Thursday's scheduled start with right hamstring tightness...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 12 of 15 starts this season...His 12 starts with two-or-fewer runs are tied for second most in the Majors this season among left-handers.
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has not allowed a home run across last four starts (27 IP), after yielding six HR in previous four starts (22 IP).
- **LEFT OUT:** Is holding lefties to a .178 (16/90) batting average this season, which ranks tied for 10<sup>th</sup> best in the A.L.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Monday at Kansas City after tossing seven innings and allowing one earned run on seven hits with two walks and eight strikeouts...Has pitched exactly seven innings and recorded exactly eight strikeouts in each of last three starts.
- **STRIKEOUT STREAKS:** Has recorded 5+ strikeouts in a career high 10 straight games...Last Angels lefty with a longer streak was **Chuck Finley** (16 consecutive games) in 1997...Has recorded eight strikeouts in each of last three starts; last Angels pitcher with 8+ strikeouts in four straight games was **Chuck Finley** (July 16-29, 1997).
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** Has pitched to a 5-2 record and 2.14 ERA (54.2 IP – 13 ER) on the road this season (ninth best road ERA in A.L.), compared with a 1-3 record and 3.62 ERA (32.1 IP – 13 ER) at home.
- **MONTH OF JUNE:** In four starts since the beginning of June, is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP – 2 ER)...Three straight starts with a win (June 3-15) was the longest streak of his career...Is the only Angles pitcher to win at least three consecutive starts this season...Is currently tied with Ken Forsch (0.67 ERA; 27 IP – 2 ER in 1981) for the lowest ERA in the month of June (min. 25 IP) in Angels history.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has allowed two home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (279 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 276 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. BALTIMORE:** Only previous start of career vs. Baltimore came on July 31, 2014 at Camden Yards; tossed 4.2 scoreless, no-hit innings allowing two walks with seven strikeouts but left game with left forearm tightness which would lead to Tommy John surgery (missed nearly two full seasons).
- **AT CAMDEN YARDS:** Tonight marks second career start at Camden Yards...Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (4.2 IP – 0 ER) after exiting only previous start on July 31, 2014 due to injury.
- **300 K's:** Recorded 300<sup>th</sup> career strikeout against **Aaron Hicks** in 4<sup>th</sup> inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- **NEW CAREER HIGH:** Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati).
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

**CAREER NOTES:**

- Owns a 19-26 career record with a 4.18 ERA (402.2 IP – 187 ER) and 355 strikeouts in 72 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.

Making seventh Major League appearance (first start of the season and third appearance since joining Angels...First career appearance vs. Baltimore...Has made two previous starts in the Majors (last was Oct. 1, 2017 for Reds at Cubs)...Last outing came in relief for Angels on Tuesday at Boston and worked four innings, marking longest relief appearance of career and longest relief outing for any Angels pitcher this season...Acquired by Angels from Texas on June 19 for cash considerations or a player to be named later...Appeared in four games for Blue Jays earlier this season, and went 0-0 with a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP – 6 ER) before being designated for assignment on June 9<sup>th</sup> and claimed off waivers by Rangers on June 15.
