TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 6, 2002: During a pre-game ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque in Monument Park in honor of "Mr. October" Reggie Jackson.

July 6, 1933: In the very first MLB All-Star Game, Babe Ruth hits the first home run—a two-run shot off the Cardinals' Bill Hallahan—leading the AL to a 4-2 victory at Comiskey Park. Lefty Gomez starts for the AL, tossing 3.0 scoreless IP to earn the win.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 7, 1991: Bernie Williams makes his Major League debut, going 1-for-3 with an RBI single and a sac fly in a 5-3 loss vs. Baltimore.

July 7, 1937: With President Franklin D. Roosevelt in attendance, Joe McCarthy manages five Yankees starting All-Stars (C Bill Dickey, 1B Lou Gehrig, 3B Red Rolfe, RF Joe DiMaggio, P Lefty Gomez) in the AL's 8-3 victory at Washington's Griffith Stadium. Gehrig homers and drives in four runs, Rolfe hits a two-run triple, and Gomez is named the winning pitcher.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees begin an 11-game road trip to finish the "first half": 3G at Toronto (through Sun.), 4G at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and 4G at Cleveland (7/12-15)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ At 56-28 (.667), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (59-29, .670)...have held sole possession of the Majors' best record for 14 of the last 21 days (since 6/16)...was the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ Are 28G over .500, matching their season high (also 28G over at the end of play on 6/21, 50-22).
- ▶ Are 1.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East...the AL East division lead has remained the same over the last three days...the lead alternated on five straight days from 6/28-7/2 and has changed hands 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (*at least a share of*) the two best records in the Majors on 63 of the last 64 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 42-27, the Yankees are 47-19).
- ▶ Are 19-3-2 over their last 24 series (since 4/19), winning three straight and six of their last seven...are 47-19 in their last 66G...are 40-5 (.889) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 36-5 (.878) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 20-14 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Braves, 6-2, in the rubber game of their series on Wednesday...**LHP CC Sabathia** (6.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 3BB, 5K, 1HR, 2HP) earned his sixth win of the season...allowed a solo HR to Camargo in the sixth inning, snapping a four-start homerless stretch (25.2IP from 6/12-29)...marked his 243rd career win, tying Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list...tossed 103 pitches, his most in a game since 9/29/16 vs. Boston (105)...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4) hit a three-run HR in the third, his second HR in as many days...**C Kyle Higashioka** (1-for-3, 1HR) hit a solo HR in the fourth and has homered for each of his first three career hits...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4) hit a solo HR in the seventh...**2B Gleyber Torres** (0-for-2) left the game in the top of the fourth with right hip tightness and was placed on the 10-day D.L. with a right hip strain following the game.

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 34,032 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

- ▶ Through 46 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

NORTH OF THE BORDER: This series marks the Yankees final of three trips to Toronto this season...have gone 4-2 at Rogers Centre in 2018, matching their highest single-season win total in Toronto over the last eight seasons (2010-17)...last had more than four wins at Rogers Centre in 2009 (6-3).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 20-11 in their last 31 road games...are 23-15 (.605) away from home in 2018, the Majors' third-best road mark (Houston-.696, Boston-.646).

- ▶ Have dropped four of their last six games outside of the Bronx...have lost five of their last eight road games after winning seven of their previous eight.
- ▶ Are 9-4-2 in 15 road series this year, matching their series win total from all of 2017 (9-12-5)...are 13-5-2 in 20 road series since 8/22/17.

IN THE ROAD GRAYS: In eight road starts this year, **RHP Sonny Gray** is 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA (46.2IP, 17ER)...is 3-2 with a 2.27 ERA (39.2IP, 10ER) in his last six road starts, with opponents hitting .187 (26-for-139) over the stretch.

- ★ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his last six road starts (since 4/30 at Houston).

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton has hit .267 (87-for-326) with 51R, 16 doubles, 1 triple, 21HR, 51RBI and 31BB in 83G this season...through his first 83G in 2017 season, hit .270 (84-for-311) with 54R, 16 doubles, 23HR, 54RBI and 37BB.

- ▶ Is the first Yankee to hit at least 20HR before the All-Star break during his first season with the club since **Mark Teixeira** in 2009 (21HR before the break)...is the first Yankee to do so after being traded to the team since Alex Rodriguez in 2004 (22HR)...is the only active player with at least 20HR before the break in each of the last five seasons.
- ▶ Is the 11th player ever to hit at least 20HR in at least each of his first nine Major League seasons...only **Mark Teixeira** (first 13 seasons, 2003-15) and **Albert Pujols** (first 12 seasons, 2001-12) have accomplished the feat since 2000.
- ▶ Is one of two players with at least 20HR in each of the last nine seasons (since 2010), joining **Nelson Cruz**.
- ▶ Has hit .378 (17-for-45) with 7R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 4BB in 11G since 6/23...in 18G since 6/16, has hit .361/.418/.681 (26-for-72) with 10R, 5 doubles, 6HR and 15RBI, raising his season slash line from .240/.316/.469 to .267/.338/.515.
- ▶ Has a .314/.384/.595 slash line in 38 road games, the fifth-highest road OPS (.978) in the AL.

HIGGY, HIGGY, HIGGY: On Wednesday, **C Kyle Higashioka** became the second Yankee in franchise history to have his first three Major League hits go for HRs, joining **Alfonso Soriano** (first 3H were HRs from 9/24/99-4/9/00)...is the first Major Leaguer whose first three MLB hits were HRs since Colorado's **Trevor Story** in April 2016 (first 4H were HRs).

- ▶ **Yankees catchers** lead the Majors with 20HR and 61RBI at the position this season, while ranking second in slugging pct. (.481) and tying for second in runs scored (48).

JUST FOR HICKS: **CF Aaron Hicks** as hit a career-high-tying 15HR (also 2017)...has 4HR in his last 4G, 5HR in his last 8G and 8HR in his last 15G...has 9HR in his last 18G (since 6/14) after hitting 6HR in his first 50G of the season (3/29-6/13).

- ▶ Has batted leadoff 18 times this season (Yankees: 14-4), hitting .288/.349/.712 with 9HR in those games...has homered in 6-of-9 starts in the leadoff spot since 6/14 (8HR).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** has homered in three of his last 4G, 4-of-6 and 5-of-8...is hitting .316/.415/.608 (25-for-79) with 17R, 5 doubles, 6HR, 12RBI and 14BB in 21G since 6/12.

- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 24HR...along with his 30HR before the break in 2017, is the second Yankee to hit at least 24HR before the All-Star break in consecutive seasons, joining **Roger Maris** (27HR in 1960, 33HR in 1961).

FIRST HALF FRENZY: The Yankees have five players with at least 15HR prior to the All-Star break for the first time in franchise history (**Judge**-24HR, **Stanton**-21HR, **Gregorius**-15HR, **Hicks**-15HR and **Torres**-15HR).

- ▶ The Yankees are the Majors' only club to have five players each with at least 15HR and the first club to do so since the 2008 Florida Marlins...join Boston and Houston as the only three teams to have six players each with at least 40RBI (**Gregorius**, **Hicks**, **Judge**, **Sánchez**, **Stanton** and **Torres**).

K/9 UNIT: **Yankees relievers** own a Major League-best 11.96 K/9.0IP ratio (395K, 297.1IP)...have led the Majors in bullpen K/9.0IP in each of the last four seasons (2014-17), setting a Major League record in 2017 (10.92).

- ▶ Lead the Majors in strikeouts (395)...are on pace to strike out a Major League-record 762 batters this season (current: 662K by Houston in 2017).
- ▶ At 47-0, are one of four teams this season to be undefeated when leading after eight innings (also Seattle: 49-0, Oakland: 40-0, Texas: 32-0).
- ▶ Over his last 12G (since 5/25), RHP Chad Green has posted a career-best 15.1-inning scoreless stretch (11H, 3BB, 17K).

DELLIN DONUTS: **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed a hit in consecutive appearances for the first time since 5/1-10 (four straight)...has still allowed just 3H with 28K in 16.2 scoreless innings (11BB, 2HP) over his last 17 appearances (since 5/27)...is his second-longest streak of scoreless appearances, behind an 18-game scoreless stretch from 7/8-8/19/15 (20.1IP).

YANKEE DOODLES

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 56-28

- Was ejected in the sixth inning of 5/22 loss at Texas (balls and strikes)...was his first career managerial ejection.
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner... Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 3G/7G (2x)

- Leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (38) and ranks second in multi-hit games (25), hits (79) and BA (.282)...is third in HR (12) and fourth in RBI (38).
- Did not play in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta...has 8H in last 34AB...**on homestand** was 7-for-19 (.368) with 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI and 2BB in 5GS at 3B.
- Was named AL "Rookie of the Month" for June, his first career monthly award...in 25G, hit .264 (24-for-91) with 10R, 6 doubles, 7HR and 20RBI...led all Major League rookies in HR and XBH (13) and tied for first in RBI...is the sixth Yankee (9x) to win AL "Rookie of the Month" and fourth current Yankee to do so—Gary Sánchez (Aug. 2016), Aaron Judge (four times in 2017), Gleyber Torres (May 2018).
- With 12HR, is the fifth Yankees rookie to hit at least 10HR before the All-Star break, joining Aaron Judge (30HR in 2017), Gleyber Torres (15HR in 2018), Joe DiMaggio (11HR in 1936) and Nick Johnson (11HR in 2002)—credit: *Elias*... joins Torres as the first Yankees rookies with at least 10HR before the All-Star break in the same season (first team to do so since the 2016 Dodgers: Corey Seager-17, Trayce Thompson-13).
- Had 40XBH through his first 78 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 78G (Joe DiMaggio-57XBH and Bob Meusel-47XBH).
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

#33 GREG BIRD—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/7G

- Of his 21H this season, 12 have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR).
- Was 1-for-4 with 1RBI in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta...has 5H in last 33AB...**on homestand** was 4-for-16 (.250) with 2R, 2HR, 3RBI and 1BB in 4GS at 1B...hit solo HRs (#4/5) and was 2-for-4 in 6/29 win vs. Boston...was his second career multi-HR game (also 8/19/15 vs. Minnesota).
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/29 (retro. to 3/26) - 5/25 recovering from right ankle surgery (missed the Yankees' first 47G of the season)...surgery was performed by Dr. Martin O'Malley at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan on 3/27 to remove a small broken spur on the outside aspect of his right ankle.
- Was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

#29 BRANDON DRURY—INF/OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/2G

- Was 0-for-2 in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta, entering defensively in the fifth at 3B...**on homestand** was 1-for-9 with 1RBI and 1BB in 4G/3GS at 1B.
- Is his second stint with the Yankees this season (3/29-5/14, 6/29-present).
- In 48 games with Scranton/WB (including rehab), hit .314 (54-for-172) with 28R, 13 doubles, 5HR and 29RBI...was named to the International League All-Star team.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-5/14 with severe migraines.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Arizona as part of a three-team trade on 2/20/18, in which the Yankees sent INF N. Solak to Tampa Bay and RHP T. Widener to Arizona... additionally, OF S. Souza, Jr. was traded from Tampa Bay to Arizona, and LHP A. Banda was traded from Arizona to Tampa Bay along with two PTBNL.
- Was selected by Atlanta in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft... has started games at 1B, 2B, SS, 3B, LF, RF and DH in his career.

2018 Multi-Hit Games: 2; 2-hit (2), 3-hit (0), 4-hit (0)

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G (2x)

- Four of his 5HR this season and 10-of-13HR since 6/23/17 have tied the game or given the Yankees the lead...since 2017, the Yankees are 19-3 when he homers.
- Was 0-for-3 with 1BB in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta...has 6H in last 29AB...**on homestand** was 3-for-20 (.150) with 2R, 1 double and 5BB in 6GS in LF.
- Missed five games from 6/17-21 with right knee soreness.
- Hit leadoff HR and game-tying two-run HR in the ninth and was 4-for-5 in 5/29 win vs. Houston...was his sixth career multi-HR game (first since 5/30/17 at Baltimore).
- Has 13 career leadoff HR, seventh-most in Yankees history (Frank Crosetti-14)... has two leadoff HR this season (5/26 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 5/29 vs. Houston).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player... was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#18 DIDI GREGORIUS—SS Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/9G

- Was 2-for-4 with 1R and 1 double in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta...has 8H in last 34AB...**on homestand** was 5-for-23 (.217) with 3R, 3 doubles, 2RBI and 2SF in 6GS at SS.
- Has 6SB in his last 32 games (since 5/28)...had 6SB total over his prior 198 games from 9/16/16-5/27/18.
- Played in his 700th career game on 6/19, surpassing Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven (699) for most games played by a Netherlands-born player in Baseball history.
- Has three multi-HR games as a *shortstop* this season (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay, 4/16 vs. Miami, 6/12 vs. Washington), marking a single-season franchise record (previous: two by Jeter-2004, Smalley-1982, Kubek-1960, Crosetti-1936)...is the first Yankees SS ever with consecutive 20HR seasons (25HR in 2017, 20HR in 2016).
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Arizona in a three-team trade on 12/5/14 in which Detroit acquired RHP Shane Greene from the Yankees and Arizona acquired LHP Robbie Ray and INF Domingo Leyba from Detroit.

#31 AARON HICKS—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/6G

- Has 9HR in 18G as a leadoff hitter and 6HR in 48G in all other spots this season... has 4HR in his last 3G, 5HR in his last 7G and 8HR in his last 14G...has 9HR in his last 17G (hit 6HR in his first 49G).
- Was 0-for-2 with 1R and 2BB in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta...has 11H in last 29AB and 6XBH in last 4G...**on homestand** was 7-for-21 (.333) with 7R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 6RBI, 5BB and 1HP in 6GS in CF...hit two-run HR (#12) in the second and solo HRs (#13/14) in the fourth and eighth and was 3-for-4 with 1BB in Sunday's win vs. Boston...was his first career 3HR game and the first by a Yankee since Alex Rodriguez on 7/25/15 at Minnesota...is the first Yankee with 3HR in a home game since Curtis Granderson on 4/19/12 vs. Minnesota...is the first Yankees leadoff hitter ever to hit 3HR in a game...homered from both sides of the plate for the second time in his career (also 4/13/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...was his fifth career multi-HR game and second this season (also 4/13 at Detroit-2HR).
- Hit leadoff HR (#11) and was 2-for-4 with 2R, 2RBI and 1SF in 6/26 win at Philadelphia...was his third career leadoff HR (first since 9/7/15 at Kansas City).
- Is the first Yankee with multiple ITPHRs in the same season (4/13 at Detroit and 5/19 at Kansas City) since Mickey Mantle (3 in 1958).
- Of his 38HR since joining the Yankees in 2016, 27 have been hit at Yankee Stadium.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Minnesota for C John Ryan Murphy on 11/11/15.

Career Bests: 4H (5x); 3HR (1x); 6RBI (1x); 4R (1x); 1SB (45x); 9G hitting streak (1x)
