RHP Jimmy Yacabonis (0-0, 8.53) vs. LHP CC Sabathia (6-3, 3.02)

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: SS Manny Machado was named the American League starting shortstop for the All-Star Game on Sunday...He will make his fourth career All-Star appearance and second start...Machado was a reserve third baseman in 2013 and 2015 and started in 2016...The 89th Major League Baseball All-Star Game will be played on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington... According to ESPN Stats and Info, Machado will join Alex Rodriguez, Arky Vaughan, and Cal Ripken, Jr. as the only players to start an All-Star Game at third base and shortstop.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER: The Orioles have had 22 All-Stars over the last seven seasons (since 2012)... According to STATS, LLC., the 22 Baltimore All-Stars since 2012 are tied for second-most in the American League and are tied for fifth in the majors...The St. Louis Cardinals lead the majors with 27 All-Stars since 2012... The Orioles are one of 10 Major League teams with at least 20 All-Stars over the last seven seasons.

ROOKIE STARTER TIMES TWO: The starting pitchers for today's doubleheader will be rookies RHP Jimmy Yacabonis (Game 1) and RHP Yefry Ramirez (Game 2)...According to STATS, LLC., today's twin bill marks the 18th time in Orioles history (since 1954) that two rookie pitchers started each game of a doubleheader and first since May 28, 2015 when RHP Tyler Wilson and RHP Mike Wright, Jr. each started against the Chicago White Sox...The Minnesota Twins were the last team in the majors to start two rookies in a doubleheader when RHP Fernando Romero and RHP Zack Littell each started on June 5, 2018 against the White Sox.

LET'S PLAY TWO: The scheduled game between the Orioles and Yankees on May 31 was postponed due to inclement weather...Today, the game will be made up as part of a traditional (single-admission) doubleheader...The first game will begin at 4:05 p.m. ET, followed by the regularly scheduled game approximately 30 minutes after the first game concludes...Today marks the second doubleheader of the season for Baltimore and first since May 12 vs. Tampa Bay...The split the May 12 doubleheader...Since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954, the Orioles are 170-141-289 (sweep-swept-split) in doubleheaders...At home, the O's are 103-65-168...The records do not include May 19, 1957 and April 22, 1961, in which there was one tie game in one of the games...The O's and Yankees play one of two doubleheaders today in the majors, the Phillies will play two today at Citi Field against the Mets.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1959, a pair of 20-year-olds, Milt Pappas and Jerry Walker, each tossed shutouts as the Orioles swept the Senators in a doubleheader, 8-0 and 5-0 at Washington's Griffith Stadium...Before the games, 22-year-old Brooks Robinson rejoined the club from the Triple-A Vancouver Mounties and never returned to the minors...Only Walker was a rookie that season.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 68-of-88 games played this season...He currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...His .382 on-base percentage ranks ninth in the AL...His .560 slugging percentage ranks seventh in the AL and 11th in the majors...His 31 multi-hit games rank eighth in the AL...His 190 total bases rank fifth in the AL and rank sixth in the majors...His 11 intentional walks rank second in the AL and rank third in the majors.

THE RACE TO 1,000: SS Manny Machado sits at 968 career hits, 32 away from 1,000...He is looking to become the youngest Oriole to record 1,000 hits in their Baltimore career (since 1954)...Cal Ripken, Jr. holds the current mark, reaching 1,000 career hits at 26 years and 296 days old...Machado is also looking to become the fastest Oriole to 1,000 hits in terms of games played...Machado has played in 852 career games as an Oriole and the current record holder is Nick Markakis, who reached the 1,000 hit mark in his 875th career game; second is Eddie Murray who reached 1,000 hits in his 892nd game...OF/DH Mark Trumbo is also closing in on 1,000 career hits, currently sitting at 980, he has collected 341 hits as an Oriole.

MAKING HIS MARK: OF/DH Mark Trumbo hit three home runs in two games from July 1-3...Since June 17, he is tied for second in the AL and is tied for third in the majors with eight home runs...Trumbo currently has 11 homers this season and led the majors with 47 home runs in 2016...Trumbo made his season debut on May 1 at Los Angeles-AL after beginning the season on the disabled list with a right quad strain.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Andrew Cashner tossed the Orioles 41st Quality Start of the season on Thursday...The O's 41 Quality Starts this season rank fifth in the AL and are tied for seventh in the majors...RHP Dylan Bundy and RHP Kevin Gausman are tied for 18th in the AL with 10 Quality Starts each...Orioles starters have received 201 runs of support this season, which ranks second-fewest in the majors...Overall, O's pitchers have received 317 runs of support this season, which is second-fewest in the majors and the AL (Kansas City, 310).

VS. NEW YORK YANKEES: The Orioles and Yankees play the seventh game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The season series is tied, 3-3...The Yankees won the 2017 season series, 12-7...The Orioles trail the Yankees in the all-time series, 485-581, with the O's trailing 253-275 at home and trailing 132-306 at New York.

THE FUTURE IS NOW: LHP Alex Wells and 3B Ryan Mountcastle have been chosen to participate in the 2018 Sirius/XM All-Star Futures Game in Washington D.C. on July 15...Wells, a native of Newcastle, Australia, will represent the O's as a member of the World Roster, while Mountcastle will compete as a member of the U.S. Roster...Wells signed with the Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in August of 2015, and is currently with Class A-Advanced Frederick...He was named the Jim Palmer Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2017, and entered the season ranked as the No. 13 prospect in the Orioles organization by Baseball America...Mountcastle was selected by the Orioles with the No. 36 overall pick of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft, and has spent the season with Double-A Bowie...He entered 2018 as the second-best Orioles prospect by Baseball America, and ranked No. 71 on the publication's Top 100 Prospects List.

MARYLAND, MY MARYLAND: RHP Ryan Meisinger made his Major League debut on June 29 against the Los Angeles Angels by entering the game in the sixth inning and retiring the first batter he faced, Justin Upton, on a flyout...Meisinger, born in Prince Frederick, MD, became the 24th Maryland-born player to appear in a game for the Orioles...He is the first since 2015 when C Steve Clevenger (Baltimore) and RHP Steve Johnson (Baltimore) appeared in games for the O's.

BROTHERS GOTTA HUG: According to STATS, LLC., on June 19, C Caleb Joseph and INF Corban Joseph became the first set of brothers as teammates since Melvin Upton, Jr. and Justin Upton appeared on the roster together for the 2015 San Diego Padres...Cal Ripken, Jr. and Billy Ripken are the only other set of brothers as teammates in Orioles history (since 1954)...Brothers Dick Brown and Larry Brown also played for the Orioles, but did not appear on the O's roster at the same time.

RED, WHITE, & BLUE: In celebration of Independence Day, the Orioles wore "Stars & Stripes" jerseys and caps on Tuesday, July 3, and Wednesday, July 4...The gray road jerseys featured a star pattern within the twill and an American flag patch located on the right sleeve...The blue road caps included a star design and the O's logo...Game-worn jerseys and caps will be autographed, authenticated, and auctioned at www.orioles.com/auction ending on July 10 at 10:00 p.m. ET to benefit the USO of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore (USO-Metro).

DISABLED LIST: Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...RHP Chris Tillman (lower back strain, since 5/11), RHP Pedro Araujo (right elbow strain, since 6/11), OF Craig Gentry (left rib fracture, retroactive to 6/24), and INF Steve Wilkerson (left oblique strain, retroactive to 7/2) are on the 10-day disabled list...RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), LHP Richard Bleier (left shoulder latissimus strain, retroactive to 6/14), and RHP Darren O'Day (left hamstring strain, since 6/27) are on the 60-day disabled list.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (646-634, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,528 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 646 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Making his second career Major League start after being recalled as today's 26th man...Made his Major League debut on June 11, 2017 at New York-AL, working 1.0 inning, allowing four runs on two hits with two walks and a strikeout...Originally selected by the Orioles in the 13th round of the 2013 First-Year Player draft.

LAST START (MAJORS): Made his first MLB start on June 28 vs. Seattle and tossed 4.0 innings, allowing two runs on six hits, one home run, with one walk and five strikeouts...Did not factor in the decision, as the Orioles fell 4-2 in 10 innings...Was relieved in the fifth inning by Yefry Ramirez after allowing back-to-back singles to start the inning...Both runs scored on a two-run home run by Nelson Cruz in the fourth inning...The five strikeouts were a career-high... Threw a career-high 67 pitches, 42 strikes.

LAST START (MINORS): Made the start for Triple-A Norfolk on July 3 vs. Charlotte, working 4.0 scoreless innings, allowing one hit with one walk and five strikeouts; did not factor in the decision, a 4-0 win by Norfolk...His first start since being optioned back to Triple-A...The one hit allowed tied a season-low, done two other times (5/28 at Toledo and 6/2 vs. Rochester)...Fourth time this season not allowing a run...Threw 67 pitches, 40 strikes.

AGAINST NEW YORK-AL: Will be making his first career start against New York-AL and his sixth career appearance...Made his 2018 season debut against the Yankees, tossing 1.0 inning allowing three runs on two hits with two walks on April 7 in New York...In his five career appearances against New York, he has gone 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA (7 ER/6.2 IP), seven walks and four strikeouts...His Major League debut came in New York on June 11, 2017 when he worked 1.0 inning allowing four runs on two hits, one home run, with two walks and one strikeout...OF Aaron Judge is a career 3-for-3 with one home run and three RBI against him.

NOTES FROM NORFOLK: Has made 14 starts for the Tides this season, going 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA (18 ER/55.2 IP)...Has appeared in 55 career games (14 starts) for the Tides, posting a 2.08 ERA (27 ER/113.0 IP); his 2.08 ERA ranks him tied for third among franchise leaders who have thrown 100.0 innings-or-more...Has limited opponents to a .151 (8-for-53) average when leading off an inning...Batters are hitting .118 (4-for-34) with runners in scoring position, and .100 (2-for-20) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

IN RELIEF: Prior to the 2018 season, all of Yacabonis' appearances had been as a reliever...Yacabonis made his first career professional start with the Tides on April 10 vs. Charlotte, snapping a stretch of 205 consecutive appearances out of the bullpen to begin his career...Has made 16 career Major League relief appearances, going 2-0 with a 5.48 ERA (14 ER/23.0 IP), 19 walks, and nine strikeouts...Made 41 appearances with Triple-A Norfolk last season, going 4-0 with a 1.32 ERA (9 ER/61.1 IP)...Has made a career 190 relief appearances in the Orioles' Minor League system, going 13-13 with a 3.01 ERA (91 ER/272.0 IP) in these 190 games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Yacabonis has held right-handers to a .161 (14-for-87) batting average with one home run with Triple-A Norfolk this season, while left-handers are hitting .225 (25-for-111) with three home runs against him...With the Orioles, righties are hitting .294 (5-for-17) and lefties .444 (4-for-9) this season...For his career with Baltimore, right-handers are hitting .262 (17-for-65) and left-handers .294 (10-for-34).

HOME VS. ROAD: This will be his second start (third appearance) at Oriole Park this season... He made the start on June 28 vs. Seattle, and he pitched 1.1 innings of relief, allowing one run on one hit with three walks and one strikeout, on May 12 vs. Tampa Bay (game 2)...In nine career games at Oriole Park, he is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA (4 ER/13.1 IP), eight walks and eight strikeouts...Yacabonis has made seven Triple-A starts at home this season, going 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA (6 ER/29.0 IP)...He has made one appearance on the road with the big league club in 2018; he tossed 1.0 inning allowing three runs on two hits with two walks, one intentional, on April 7 at New York-AL...Has made seven road starts for the Tides, going 2-2 with a 4.05 ERA (12 ER/26.2 IP).

DAY AND NIGHT: Each of Yacabonis' three Major League appearances this season have come during the day...He has made one day start with the Tides this season, not factoring in the decision after tossing 4.0-scoreless innings, allowing four hits with one walk and three strikeouts on May 17 vs. Indianapolis...Has made eight day appearances in his Major League career, going 1-0 with a 7.07 ERA (11 ER/14.0 IP)...Yacabonis has made 13 night starts with Triple-A Norfolk, going 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA (18 ER/51.2 IP)...For his Major League career, he has made nine night appearances, going 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP).
