BALTIMORE ORIOLES (25-66) vs. NEW YORK YANKEES (59-30)
RHP Andrew Cashner (2-9, 4.39) vs. RHP Masahiro Tanaka (7-2, 4.58)

SCHOOP-ING IT OUT: 2B Jonathan Schoop extended his hitting streak to a season-high eight games (since July 3), after going 4-for-8 in yesterday's doubleheader...He is hitting .438 (14-for-32) during this stretch, with four doubles, two home runs, four runs scored, and two RBI...It's his longest hitting streak since he also strung together eight-straight games from April 12-20, 2017; his career-long hit-streak is 12 games, September 7-19, 2015...He has recorded five multi-hit games during the streak and has seen his season batting average rise from .197 to .224...He's a career .283 hitter in the month of July, his second-highest monthly average for his career (August - .287).

SCORING CHANGE: Major League Baseball has made a scoring change to the Orioles game on July 8 at Minnesota...In the bottom of the sixth inning RHP Alex Cobb was originally charged with allowing three runs, two earned, while LHP Paul Fry was charged with allowing four runs, two earned...This has now been changed to Cobb allowing three runs, all earned, and Fry allowing four runs, one earned, in the sixth inning...Cobb's final line should read 5.0 innings, five earned runs, seven hits, one walk and five strikeouts, while Fry's final line is 0.2 innings, four runs, one earned, three hits, and one strikeout.

MAKING HIS MARK: OF/DH Mark Trumbo homered in game one of yesterday's doubleheader, his 12th home run of the season...It was his ninth homer since June 17 (22 games), which is tied for the most in the American League during this span (Hicks, NYY - 9) and tied for the second-most in the majors, trailing only Milwaukee's Jesus Aguilar (11 home runs)...Trumbo led the majors with 47 home runs in 2016...Trumbo made his season debut on May 1 at Los Angeles-AL after beginning the season on the disabled list with a right quad strain.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: SS Manny Machado was named the American League starting shortstop for the All-Star Game on Sunday...He will make his fourth career All-Star appearance and second start...Machado was a reserve third baseman in 2013 and 2015 and started in 2016...The 89th Major League Baseball All-Star Game will be played on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington...According to ESPN Stats and Info, Machado will join Alex Rodriguez, Arky Vaughan, and Cal Ripken, Jr. as the only players to start an All-Star Game at third base and shortstop.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER: The Orioles have had 22 All-Stars over the last seven seasons (since 2012)...According to STATS, LLC., the 22 Baltimore All-Stars since 2012 are tied for second-most in the American League and are tied for fifth in the majors...The St. Louis Cardinals lead the majors with 28 All-Stars since 2012...The Orioles are one of 10 Major League teams with at least 20 All-Stars over the last seven seasons.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 2001, INF Cal Ripken, Jr. played in his final Mid-Season Classic and won his second All-Star Game MVP award...Ripken homered off of Dodgers' RHP Chan Ho Park on the first pitch of the third inning, breaking a scoreless tie and helping the American League to a 4-1 victory at Seattle's Safeco Field...At 40 years, 10 months, and 16 days old, Ripken is the oldest player to ever homer in the All-Star Game.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 69-of-90 games played this season...He currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...His .379 on-base percentage ranks 10th in the AL...His .555 slugging percentage ranks seventh in the AL and 11th in the majors...His 31 multi-hit games rank tied for eighth in the AL...His 192 total bases rank fifth in the AL and rank sixth in the majors...His 11 intentional walks rank second in the AL and rank third in the majors.

THE RACE TO 1,000: SS Manny Machado sits at 969 career hits, 31 away from 1,000...He is looking to become the youngest Oriole to record 1,000 hits in their Baltimore career (since 1954)...Cal Ripken, Jr. holds the current mark, reaching 1,000 career hits at 26 years and 296 days old...Machado is also looking to become the fastest Oriole to 1,000 hits in terms of games played...Machado has played in 854 career games as an Oriole and the current record holder is Nick Markakis, who reached the 1,000 hit mark in his 875th career game; second is Eddie Murray who reached 1,000 hits in his 892nd game...OF/DH Mark Trumbo is also closing in on 1,000 career hits, currently sitting at 982, he has collected 343 hits as an Oriole.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Andrew Cashner tossed the Orioles 41st Quality Start of the season on Thursday...The O's 41 Quality Starts this season rank tied for fifth in the AL and are tied for seventh in the majors...RHP Dylan Bundy and RHP Kevin Gausman are tied for 18th in the AL with 10 Quality Starts each...Orioles starters have received 203 runs of support this season, which is the fewest in the majors...Overall, O's pitchers have received 324 runs of support this season, which is second-fewest in the majors and the AL (Kansas City, 311).

VS. NEW YORK YANKEES: The Orioles and Yankees play the ninth game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The season series is tied, 4-4...The Yankees won the 2017 season series, 12-7...The Orioles trail the Yankees in the all-time series, 486-582, with the O's trailing 254-276 at home and trailing 232-306 at New York.

THE FUTURE IS NOW: LHP Alex Wells and 3B Ryan Mountcastle have been chosen to participate in the 2018 Sirius/XM All-Star Futures Game in Washington D.C. on July 15...Wells, a native of Newcastle, Australia, will represent the O's as a member of the World Roster, while Mountcastle will compete as a member of the U.S. Roster...Wells signed with the Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in August of 2015, and is currently with Class A-Advanced Frederick...He was named the Jim Palmer Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2017, and entered the season ranked as the No. 13 prospect in the Orioles organization by *Baseball America*...Mountcastle was selected by the Orioles with the No. 36 overall pick of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft, and has spent the season with Double-A Bowie...He entered 2018 as the second-best Orioles prospect by *Baseball America*, and ranked No. 71 on the publication's Top 100 Prospects List.

MARYLAND, MY MARYLAND: RHP Ryan Meisinger made his Major League debut on June 29 against the Los Angeles Angels by entering the game in the sixth inning and retiring the first batter he faced, Justin Upton, on a flyout...Meisinger, born in Prince Frederick, MD, became the 24th Maryland-born player to appear in a game for the Orioles...He is the first since 2015 when C Steve Clevenger (Baltimore) and RHP Steve Johnson (Baltimore) appeared in games for the O's.

BROTHERS GOTTA HUG: According to STATS, LLC., on June 19, C Caleb Joseph and INF Corban Joseph became the first set of brothers as teammates since Melvin Upton, Jr. and Justin Upton appeared on the roster together for the 2015 San Diego Padres...Cal Ripken, Jr. and Billy Ripken are the only other set of brothers as teammates in Orioles history (since 1954)...Brothers Dick Brown and Larry Brown also played for the Orioles, but did not appear on the O's roster at the same time.

RED, WHITE, & BLUE: In celebration of Independence Day, the Orioles wore "Stars & Stripes" jerseys and caps on Tuesday, July 3, and Wednesday, July 4...The gray road jerseys featured a star pattern within the twill and an American flag patch located on the right sleeve...The blue road caps included a star design and the O's logo...Game-worn jerseys and caps will be autographed, authenticated, and auctioned at www.orioles.com/auction ending on July 10 at 10:00 p.m. ET to benefit the USO of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore (USO-Metro).

DISABLED LIST: Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...RHP Chris Tillman (lower back strain, since 5/11), RHP Pedro Araujo (right elbow strain, since 6/11), OF Craig Gentry (left rib fracture, retroactive to 6/24), and INF Steve Wilkerson (left oblique strain, retroactive to 7/2) are on the 10-day disabled list...RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), LHP Richard Bleier (left shoulder latissimus strain, retroactive to 6/14), and RHP Darren O'Day (left hamstring strain, since 6/27) are on the 60-day disabled list.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (647-635, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,529 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 647 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).
