CARDINALS NOTES

- Miles Mikolas made his 21st start of the season, third against the Cubs in 2018 (2-0) and third career start (5th app.) vs. the Cubs (2-0)...surrendered his first home run since June 19 at PHI (0. Herrera), a span of 41 innings...has held his opposition to three runs or less in each of his last seven starts (2 runs or less in 6 of the starts).
- Matt Carpenter raced out his 4th bunt hit of the season (Cardinals 10th), tied with Kolten Wong for the Cardinals team lead.
- Marcell Ozuna hit his 2nd grand slam of the season (6/3 vs. PIT) and 5th of his career...previous grand slam vs. PIT (6/3/18) was also hit in the 1st inning and has hit his last three grand slams in the 1st inning...snapped a career-high streak of 35 games without a home run (152 plate appearances)...tallied his 30th multi-hit game of the season (6 vs. CHI) and his first three-hit game since June 5 vs. MIA.
- 4 Yairo Muñoz tallied his 27th two-strike hit of the season (52 total hits)...has an RBI in 7 of his last 8 starts.
- 😉 Yadier Molina has hit safely in six straight games (11-27, .408)...has scored in three straight games.
- **5** Paul DeJong drew his 22nd walk of the season, a new single-season high.
- Dakota Hudson made his Major League debut becoming the sixth Cardinals player to make his MLB debut this season and 26th different Cardinals pitcher to appear in a game this season tying the team record (2002)...struck out his first batter faced (Kyle Schwarber) and retired the side in three batters faced (2 strikeouts).
- Jordan Hicks induced his 10th ground into double play of the season.
- The **Cardinals** scored six runs in the 1st inning today, establishing a new season-high for the inning...the last time the Cardinals scored six or more runs on the Cubs in the 1st inning was 8/7/1998 when they scored 11 (9 off Steve Trachsel in one-third of an inning) in a 16-3 win at Busch Stadium III...have sold out their last eight straight games and all six in July...lead the Cubs in the season-series 9-6 with four games to play...have won consecutive games for the first time since July 4-5 at ARI & at SF...won their first series at home since June 25-27 vs. CLE and against an N.L. team since 5/31-6/3 vs. PIT (3-1).

CUBS NOTES

José Quintana made his 20th start of the season, fourth of 2018 against the Cardinals (1-3) and eight career start vs. the Cardinals (4-3)...had won his last three straight starts in July...6 of his last 8 starts have come on the road (3-3)...is coming off a start of his most pitches in his career (121 vs. STL, 7/22)...had allowed four runs total in the 1st inning this season and six runs in the 1st inning today...matched his career-high with six runs in an inning (last: 5/24/17 at ARI, bottom 5th, 6 runs)...last Cubs pitcher to allow six or more runs in the 1st inning was Jon Lester vs. PIT (7/9/17 - 10 runs)...was his 2nd-shortest start of the season (4/14 vs. ATL, 2.1 IP)...(From Stats Inc.) threw 51 pitches in the 1st inning (most vs. STL in pitch count era since 1988), and most by a Cubs pitcher vs. STL since Kerry Wood threw 48 in 2000.

- Sosé Quintana snapped an 0-for-34 to begin the 2018 season with a single to right field in the 3rd inning. Last hit was 9/12/17 vs. NYM (RBI single).
- Jason Heyward recorded his 6th outfield assist of the season (60th career).
- Javier Báez homered in consecutive games for the 5th time this season and first since May 26-27 vs. SF...has hit 5 HR vs. the Cardinals this season, his most against any opponent and 4 at Busch Stadium III, his 2nd-most at any stadium (Wrigley Field 9).
- Anthony Rizzo has 10 hits in his last five games vs. STL (10-17, .588) and entered today ranking 2nd in the N.L. in hits Post All-Star Break (15).
- Sesse Chavez threw his 8th consecutive scoreless appearance (10.2 IP) and his 6th appearance of 3.0 or more innings in relief this season (3rd-most in MLB; Ryan Yarborough 14 & Austin Pruitt 8).
- The Cubs challenged the out call at second base on David Bote in the 8th inning. Call stands (Time: 1:30).
- The Cubs had each pitcher today strike out exactly two batters...have been held to two runs or less in 5 of their last 6 games.
