NATIONALS NEWS

ON TO THE NEXT ONE

The Washington Nationals dropped game one of this two-game series against the Miami Marlins despite a strong offensive effort from third baseman **Anthony Rendon** and center fielder **Victor Robles**...Rendon went 3-for-4 with a two-run homer and two runs scored, while Robles finished the night 2-for-4, including a home run in third inning, the first of his career.

- Rendon extended his career-high on-base streak to 26 games...The 26-game streak is the sixth-longest in the National League (longest active streak).
- Trea Turner** has reached base safely in 18 straight games...It is the second-longest streak of his career, behind a 21-game on-base streak from Aug. 10, 2016 - Sept. 2, 2016.

TONY IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW

Anthony Rendon reached base three times on Monday night, including a two-run home run, his 21st of the season, extending his on-base streak to a career-high 26 games...The 26-game streak is the sixth-longest in the National League this season and it is the longest by a Nationals batter this season...During the streak he is batting .346 (36-for-104) with 11 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, 15 walks, two stolen bases and 24 runs scored.

- Rendon has been a doubles machine since Sept. 3...In 14 games since that date, his eight doubles rank first in the National League...All told, he is hitting .386 (22-for-57) with 11 RBI, three home runs, eight walks, one stolen base and 15 runs scored.
- Thanks to this hot streak, Rendon now ranks in the NL in doubles (T2nd, 40), average (7th, .304), slugging percentage (9th, .520), extra-base hits (T10, 62) and OPS (11th, .888).
- Rendon's 40 doubles are the second-most for him in a season and is one shy of his career-high 41 in 2017.
- Since 2016, his 119 doubles are tied for first in the National League with **Nick Markakis** and are tied for third in all of Major League Baseball behind **Jose Ramirez** (137) and **Mookie Betts** (130).

JUAN SOTO THINGS

Juan Soto has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games...During the 11-game stretch he is hitting 15-for-46 (.326) with two doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, six walks, three stolen bases and nine runs scored.

- Soto is on pace to have one of the best seasons for a teenager in Major League Baseball history...See boxes to the right and additional note sheets about Soto's 2018 season.

CHASING 100-100-100

On Sunday afternoon, **Bryce Harper** blasted his 34th home run of the season...He enters Tuesday with 97 runs scored, 97 RBI and 118 walks in 2018...He is looking to become the sixth player since 2014 to record at least 100 runs, RBI and walks in a season...He would join **Joey Votto** (2017), **Aaron Judge** (2017), **Mike Trout** (2016), **Paul Goldschmidt** (2015) and **Jose Bautista** (2015, 2014).

- Since the All-Star break, Harper ranks in the National League in RBI (3rd, 43), OBP (3rd, .432), runs (T4th, 40), OPS (5th, .992) and doubles (T11th, 14).
- On the season, he ranks in the NL in homers (T2nd, 34), OBP (5th, .389), RBI (6th, 97) and OPS (10th, .890)...His 118 walks lead MLB.

EVERYDAY TREA

Trea Turner has played in each of Washington's 151 games this season, making 147 starts and four appearances off the bench...The only player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to appear in all 162 games in a season was **Ryan Zimmerman**, who started all 162 games in 2007.

- If Turner starts each of the 11 games left on the schedule, he will tie **Alfonso Soriano** (158 in 2006) for second on the list behind Zimmerman's 162 starts in 2007.

NATIONALS HISTORY

September 18 (5-6 on this date)

2009 - **Ryan Zimmerman** hit his 30th home run, a first-inning two-run blast, to kick start the Nationals en route to a 6-5 win at Citi Field. Washington's win snapped a three-game slide, however, it did not come easily, as the Mets trailed, 6-2, entering their half of the ninth. The Mets plated three runs and had the potential tying and winning runs in scoring position as **Mike MacDougal** retired **Jeff Francoeur** for the 27th out on a dramatic 1-3 comebacker that knocked MacDougal's glove off.

In 2004, he was named the Florida Marlins Minor League Player of the Year...**Bryce Harper's** 24 home runs are tied for 11th-most all-time against the Florida/Miami Marlins...**Ryan Zimmeran** (35) ranks third on that same list.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#37 - STEPHEN STRASBURG - RHP

Tall, powerful right-handed pitcher is a three-time All-Star who is Washington's all-time (2005-present) leader in wins (92) and strikeouts (1,421)... On May 10, 2016, he inked a seven-year contract extension that will keep him with the Nationals through the 2023 season.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Has faced the Marlins once this season, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings while striking out eight and walking two on May 27... Is 4-0 with a 0.67 ERA in his last four starts against Miami dating back to April 3, 2017...His 16 wins against Miami are his most against any team.

LAST START: Earned the win after tossing 7.0 innings of one-run ball while striking out nine batters and walking none in Washington's 5-1 victory over the Philadelphia Phillies.

2018 NOTES

- Is 2-0 with a 3.77 ERA (12 ER/28.2 IP) and 32 strikeouts in five starts since returning from the disabled list...Allowed five earned runs in his first start back, but has allowed three earned runs or fewer in his last four starts.
- Prior to the start in which he suffered right shoulder inflammation, he ranked among National League pitchers in strikeouts (4th, 93), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 4.89), WHIP (7th, 1.06), opp. OBP (7th, .274), wins (7th, 6), opp. AVG (10th, .220), and hits allowed per 9.0 IP (11th, 7.32)... Also ranked seventh in the National League with a 2.33 road ERA (10 ER/38.0 IP).
- Along with teammates **Gio Gonzalez** and **Max Scherzer**, he ranked in the top 10 in the NL in opp. AVG with runners in scoring position (8th, .196) at the time of the injury with right shoulder inflammation.
- Since Aug. 19, 2017, he ranks fifth in the National League with a 2.90 ERA among pitchers with at least 25 starts...Among National League pitchers during this stretch, he ranks in opp. OBP (6th, .276) and opp. AVG (11th, .222).
- Continued his progression since returning from the disabled list...Allowed two earned runs on five hits with two walks and seven strikeouts in Washington's 5-4 win over Milwaukee...Earned his first win since May 27 at Miami.
- Fanned a season-high 11 batters on May 2 vs. Pittsburgh...Allowed two earned runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings of work.
- Allowed just three hits while striking out eight batters and walking two in 8.0 shutout innings on April 10 vs. ATL...It was his longest outing since Sept. 10, 2017 at PHI (8.0 IP)...Earned his second win as Washington topped Atlanta, 4-1
- Opened his 2018 season by tossing 6.1 innings while allowing one earned run as Washington topped Cincinnati, 13-7, on March 31...The lone earned run came via fourth inning home run by **Scott Schebler**.

2017 NOTES

- Put together a strong first half of the season en route to being named an All-Star for the third time in his career.
- Was a finalist for the National League Cy Young Award...Capped 2017 being named National League Pitcher of the Month in September.
- Also ranked in NL in HR/9.0 IP (1st, 0.67), opp. SLG (1st, .317), opp. OPS (2nd, .581), WHIP (3rd, 1.02), opp. OBP (3rd, .265), & opp. AVG (3rd, .204).
- On May 27 at San Diego, he struck out a career-high 15 batters in 7.0 shutout innings.
- On Aug. 19 at San Diego, he returned from a three-week stint on the disabled list...He went 5-1 with a 0.84 ERA (5 ER/53.2 IP) in his final eight starts of the regular season following reinstatement...He racked up 63 strikeouts, allowed just 10 walks and surrendered only one home run.

CAREER NOTES

- Is 87-49 with a 3.16 ERA in 191 starts since Sept. 6, 2011, his return from 2010 Tommy John Surgery.
- When starting, Washington is 127-76 (.639) since his debut...Since the start of 2016, the Nationals are 51-20 (.717) when he starts.
- Since 2012, he ranks in MLB in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 10.47), opp. SLG (7th, .357), opp. AVG (7th, .226), strikeouts (7th, 1,305), strikeout-to-walk ratio (9th, 4.44), opp. OBP (9th, .282), and ERA (11th, 3.19).

THE CAPTAIN: The Mets and David Wright announced that the captain will be activated for the Mets final homestand, September 25-30 and will start at third base on Saturday, September 29... Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87).

METSCCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 7-3 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 26-17 in their last 43 games and 38-32 since July 1...New York is 33-31 vs. the NL East.

SERIES STREAK: New York is 9-2-2 in its last 13 series.

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 11-5 this month, the best winning percentage (.688) in the NL and the fourth-best in the majors... The pitching staff has a 3.27 ERA this month, the third-best in the NL and the seventh-lowest in the majors...The Mets have 24 homers in September, the second-most in the majors, behind the Dodgers (26).

VS.
