HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs have won 4 straight games and are 8-2 in their last 10 and 10-3 in their last 13.
- ♦ Arizona has won 6 of its last 7 home games.
- ♦ The D-backs are 23-0 when scoring 5+ runs.
- ♦ Arizona has scored 8+ runs in 4 consecutive games, tied for its second-longest streak in team history (4x, last: May 19-22, 2010), behind only a 7-game stretch from May 29-June 5, 1999.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** has allowed 2 or fewer runs in all 4 starts... was the first pitcher in D-backs history to give up no more than 1 run in his first 3 starts with the club.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is batting .593 (16-for-27) with 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.967 OPS.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is batting .349 (15-for-43)/1.192 OPS with 7 doubles, 2 triples, 3 homers and 11 RBI in his last 13 games.
- ♦ **Jon Jay** is hitting .392 (20-for-51) with 1 double, 5 RBI and 6 walks in his last 17 games vs. Pittsburgh.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs erased a 5-run deficit with their largest comeback since Aug. 22, 2016 to defeat the Pirates, 9-5.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** went 2-for-5 with a triple and 3 RBI...**Jake Lamb** was 1-for-4 with a game-tying, 3-run homer in the seventh inning...**Nick Ahmed** went 1-for-4 with a RBI, extending his hitting streak to 8 games.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** allowed 5 runs (4 ER) in 5.1 innings.

PROJECT 34

- ♦ Tonight's Pirates starter, Trevor Williams, switched his number from No. 57 to 34 in the offseason in honor of his former roommate and teammate at Arizona State University, Cory Hahn.
- ♦ Hahn, who serves as the D-backs' coordinator of professional scouting, suffered a fractured C-5 vertebrae sliding into second base in his third game with the Sun Devils in 2011.
- ♦ Williams started Project 34 in March, whose mission is to "positively impact the lives of those living with a spinal cord injury by providing necessary medical equipment, assistive devices, and aiding in the cost for physical therapy for those living with a spinal cord injury."
- ♦ A portion of proceeds from the Project 34 t-shirts go back to the charitable foundation... t-shirts: pghclothing.com/project34.

D-BACKS OFFENSE SINCE MAY 28

- ♦ Since May 28, the D-backs are batting .272/.352/.519 with 26 doubles, 6 triples, 24 home runs and 90 runs scored (6.9/G), raising their average from a season-low .211 to .224.
- ♦ The D-backs rank among Major League leaders in several offensive categories during that span:

GOLDSCHMIDT IS HAPPENING

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is batting .593 (16-for-27) with 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.967 OPS.
- ♦ Since May 23, Goldschmidt is hitting .400/.473/.892 with 7 doubles, 7 homers, 18 RBI and a 1.365 OPS in 16 games...he ranks among MLB leaders during that span in slugging pct. (1st), OPS (1st), home runs (T-2nd), RBI (T-2nd) and average (T-4th).
- ♦ Goldschmidt in his first 48 games, compared to his last 16:

- ♦ Additional Goldschmidt notes:
 - Tied a Major League record with 2+ extra-base hits and 2+ RBI in 4 straight games from June 6-10 (also: Frank Howard from May 12-16, 1968, Frank Robinson from Sept. 19-22, 1966, Vic Wertz from July 28-Aug. 1, 1950 and Chet Laabs from July 15-17, 1942).
 - Since 1920, joined Lou Gehrig (June 16-19, 1936) as the only 2 players with 11+ extra-base hits and 15+ hits in a 5-game span (June 5-10) [source: STATS LLC].
 - Boasted 4 straight games with 2+ RBI from June 6-10, tied for second-longest streak in franchise history (seventh time; last: Wellington Castillo in 2016).
 - Tied a career high with 5 multi-hit games in a row (third time) from June 5-10.
 - Set a club record with 4 consecutive 3+ hit efforts from June 5-9.

OUR OWN MARTE-PARTAY

- ♦ 11 of **Ketel Marte's** last 13 hits have gone for extra bases (2 triples, 3 home runs and 6 doubles).
- ♦ On Sunday, Marte tied the club record with 10 extra-base hits in a row, joining Chris Iannetta (May 12-June 8, 2017), Paul Goldschmidt (May 7-21, 2014), Luis Gonzalez (April 7-20, 2006) and Steve Finley (September 4-9, 1999) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- ♦ **Jon Jay** is a career .325 hitter (100-for-308) vs. Pirates, the fourth-best average against Pittsburgh among active players (min. 250 PA):

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 13.2 inning scoreless streak (16 G) since May 6 is the third-longest active streak in the NL behind Jared Hughes (18.1) and Jon Lester (15.0).

- ♦ Yesterday, **Paul Goldschmidt** was named NL Player of the Week for June 4-10, hitting .640/.690/1.440 with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 2.130 OPS.
- ♦ The weekly honor was Goldschmidt's second of his career (also: April 27-May 3, 2015), and third by the D-backs this season (also: Patrick Corbin and A.J. Pollock).

BUCHHOLZ AT A GLANCE

- ◆ In his 12th Major League season...signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.
- ◆ Is a 2-time AL All-Star (2010, '13).
- ◆ Member of 2 Red Sox World Championship clubs (2007, '13).
- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Finished sixth in the 2010 AL Cy Young voting, going 17-7 with a 2.33 ERA.
- ◆ Selected by Boston in the supplemental first round (42nd overall) in 2005 as compensation for Pedro Martinez leaving as a free agent.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Will be making his fifth start with the D-backs... has allowed 2 runs or fewer in each of his first 4 starts, and is 1 of 4 pitchers in team history to allow 2 or fewer runs in his first 4 starts with the team, joining Matt Koch (2016-18), Robbie Ray (2015) and Archie Bradley (2015).

VS. PIRATES

- ◆ Has made 1 career start and appearance vs. Pirates, allowing 5 runs (4 earned) on 6 hits with 3 strikeouts and 1 walk in 4.0 innings on Sept. 17, 2014.

GETTING THE JOB DONE

- ◆ Is 1 of 4 pitchers in team history to allow 2 or fewer runs in each of his first 4 starts with the team, joining Matt Koch (2016-18), Robbie Ray (2015) and Archie Bradley (2015).
- ◆ Was the first pitcher in D-backs history to allow 1 or fewer runs in each of his first 3 starts with the team.
- ◆ This marks the 10th time in his career he's thrown 5.0+ IP and allowed 2 or fewer runs in 4 consecutive starts, and the first time since June 18-July 4, 2015.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Wore No. 11 in Boston because he was given the nickname "Sticks" as a kid for being skinny.
- ◆ Married to Lindsay, who was a former model on the TV show "Deal or No Deal" and featured in *People* magazine's "100 Most Beautiful People."
- ◆ Was introduced to his wife by Donald Trump at a 2008 UFC event in Anaheim, Calif...they were married at Trump National Golf Club in Palos Verdes, Calif. in 2009.
- ◆ Is a distant relative of former Major League pitcher, Taylor Buchholz...he pitched for the Astros (2006), Rockies (2007-08, '10), Blue Jays (2010) and Mets (2011).

STILL NEW TO THIS CHASE THING

- ◆ Made his first career start and appearance at Chase Field on June 1 vs. Marlins, earning the win (1 ER in 7.0 IP).

LIMITING LEFTIES

- ◆ Holding left-handed hitters to a .171 (7-for-41)/.209 OBP/.317 SLG this season.

2018 MINOR LEAGUE REVIEW

- ◆ Was 1-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 ER in 27.2 IP) in 5 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, Triple-A Omaha and Triple-A Reno.
- ◆ Limited opponents to a .216 average.

2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Made just 2 starts with the Phillies before suffering a straight right forearm.
- ◆ Underwent surgery to repair a torn flexor tendon on April 18.

NO-HITTER NOTES

- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Then-GM Theo Epstein spoke by phone with Terry Francona during the no-hitter, concerned about Buchholz's pitch count, who had not exceeded 98 in a game all season...Epstein said Buchholz would have been pulled if he reached 120, no-hitter or not, and finished with 115.
