AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will begin their four-game series (through Wednesday) at Baltimore today with their second doubleheader of the season...are 2-1 on their 11-game road trip to finish the "first half" after taking 2-of-3 at Toronto over the weekend...will finish the road trip with four games at Cleveland (Thurs.-Sun.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ **At 58-29 (.667), have the Majors' second-best record** behind Boston (62-29, .681).
- ▶ **Are a season-high 29G over .500**...marks the first time they are 29G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65)...in the last 61 seasons (since 1958), is the second-earliest they have reached the mark, going 42-13 to start the 1998 season.
- ▶ **Are 2.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East**...have been in second place for seven straight days...the lead has changed hands 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (*at least a share of*) the two best records in the Majors on 66 of the last 67 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 45-27, the Yankees are 49-20).
- ▶ **Are 20-3-2 over their last 25 series (since 4/19),** winning four straight and seven of their last eight...are 49-20 in their last 69G...are 42-5 (.894) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 37-5 (.881) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Are 22-15 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 2-1, in 10 innings on Sunday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Domingo Germán** started and did not record a decision despite allowing only 1ER in 6.0IP (4H, 2BB, 5K, 1HR)...**CF Brett Gardner** (1-for-5) hit an RBI single in the 10th inning to give the Yankees the lead...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1R, 1BB) and **RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5, 1 double) each picked up multi-hit games...**RHP Adam Warren** tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief (2H, 3K)...**RHP Chad Green** tossed a perfect ninth inning, earning his fifth win of the season and extending his career-long scoreless streak to 16.1 innings (1.0IP, 1K)...**RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 1K) earned his second save of the season with a perfect 10th inning.

LET'S PLAY TWO: Today is the Yankees' second doubleheader of the season...played three doubleheaders in 2017.

- ▶ **Are 1-4-4 over their last nine doubleheaders since 2014,** but are 6-4-12 in twin bills since the start of 2009...have not swept any of their last eight doubleheaders, their longest such streak since the start of 1980...their last sweep was on 4/16/14 vs. Chicago-NL.
- ▶ **The Yankees have gone 3-5-5 in 13 doubleheaders** against Baltimore since 1980...including today, each of their last four doubleheaders against the Orioles have come at Camden Yards...last played a DH vs. Baltimore on 10/3/15 (went 0-2).
- ▶ **Since the start of 2014, the Yankees have played nine doubleheaders**...over that same span, **LF Brett Gardner** has appeared in 15G that are part of DHs (all except G1 on 9/12/14 at Baltimore, G2 on 10/3/15 at Baltimore and G1 on 6/4/18 at Detroit), hitting .357 (20-for-56) with 9R, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR, 13RBI, 5BB, 1SB and 3HP...has reached safely in all 15G.

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge is hitting .375/.526/.898 (33-for-88) with 35R, 7 doubles, 13HR, 29RBI and 27BB in 25 games vs. the Orioles since the beginning of 2017...his 31R in 2017 vs. the O's were the most by any player vs. any opponent in one season since Ted Williams scored 31R in 1947 vs. St. Louis-AL...his 11HR in 2017 vs. Baltimore were the most by a Yankee vs. a single opponent since 1961, when Roger Maris hit 13HR vs. Chicago-AL and Mickey Mantle hit 11HR vs. Washington-AL.

- ▶ **Is hitting .318/.434/.727 (14-for-44)** with 13R, 6HR, 7RBI and 9BB in 11G since 6/25.
- ▶ **Is tied for second in the Majors with 25HR.**

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (fifth All-Star nod), **OF Aaron Judge** (second), **RHP Luis Severino** (second) and **INF Gleyber Torres** (first) were named to the AL All-Star team...Judge was elected by the fan vote, while Chapman, Torres and Severino were elected via the Player Ballot...the Yankees have at least four All-Stars for the second straight year (five in 2017).

- ▶ **Judge** was selected by fans to his second career All-Star team (also 2017)...is one of six position players drafted by the Yankees to make the All-Star team as a Yankee (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter, Jorge Posada and Brett Gardner)...received a fan-elected starting assignment for the second straight year and will become the *first Yankee to start at least two straight ASGs* since Robinson Canó (2010-13) and *first Yankees OF to start two straight* since Curtis Granderson (2011-12).
- ▶ **Chapman** was named via the Player Ballot to his fifth career All-Star team (also 2012-15) and first as a member of the AL.
- ▶ **Severino** has been named via the Player Ballot to his second career All-Star team (also 2017)...is the first Yankees starting pitcher to be named to consecutive All-Star teams since CC Sabathia made it to three straight from 2010-12.
- ▶ **Torres** was named via the Player Ballot to his first career All-Star team...is the fourth Yankee to make the AL All-Star team at age 21-or-younger, joining Joe DiMaggio (age 21 in 1936), Mickey Mantle (ages 20-21 from 1952-53) and Willie Randolph (age 21 in 1976)...the Yankees have had four players make the All-Star team as rookies since 2014 (Betances & Tanaka in 2014, Judge-2017 and Torres-2018)...had just one rookie All-Star from 1977-2013 (Matsui-2003).

#ASGIANCARLO: OF Giancarlo Stanton is one of five AL All-Star "Final Vote" candidates...fans can vote for him at yankees.com/vote or via text...Stanton is the 10th Yankee to appear on the Final Vote ballot and is looking to join **OF Nick Swisher** (2010) and **OF Hideki Matsui** (2004) as winners...the other nominees: **SS Didi Gregorius** (2017), **OF Brett Gardner** (2015), **RHP David Robertson** (2013), **1B Jason Giambi** (2008), **SS Derek Jeter** and **Matsui** (2005), **Giambi** (2003).

- ▶ **Is hitting .311/.387/.579 (51-for-164)** with 26R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 24RBI and 18BB in 41 road games...owns the sixth-highest road OPS (.966) in the AL.
- ▶ **Has hit .357 (20-for-56)** with 8R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 7BB in 14G since 6/23...in 21G since 6/16, has hit .349/.419/.639 (29-for-83) with 11R, 6 doubles, 6HR and 15RBI, raising his season slash line from .240/.316/.469 to .267/.341/.510.

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 34,504 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

- ▶ **Through 46 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774),** trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in Sunday's extra-innings win at Toronto (2H, 5K)...their 2.69 ERA is the the third-lowest bullpen ERA in the Majors (Arizona-2.47; Houston-2.62)...since 4/21, have posted a 2.17 ERA, the best in the Majors in that span (next: Arizona-2.57).

- ▶ **Yankees relievers** lead the Majors in strikeouts (405), opponent BA (.199), opponent SLG (.332) and rank second in opponent OBP (.273) and K/BB ratio (3.68).
- ▶ **Over his last 13G (since 5/25), RHP Chad Green** has posted a career-best 16.1-inning scoreless stretch (11H, 3BB, 18K).
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 3H with 30K in 17.2 scoreless innings (11BB, 2HP) over his last 18G (since 5/27)...is tied for his longest streak of scoreless appearances (also 18-game scoreless stretch from 7/8-8/19/15 - 20.1IP)...the last longer streak of scoreless appearances was David Robertson's 21-game streak from 6/19-8/9/13 (20.1IP).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 25-16 (.610) away from home in 2018, the Majors' third-best road mark (Houston-.696, Boston-.667)...are 10-4-2 in 16 road series this year, surpassing their series win total from all of 2017 (9-12-5).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 9, 2011: Derek Jeter becomes the 28th player all-time to record 3,000 hits, accomplishing the feat with a third-inning solo home run vs. Tampa Bay off David Price.

July 9, 1937: Joe DiMaggio goes 5-for-5 with 7RBI and hits his for the cycle w/ 2HR, helping the Yankees defeat the Senators, 16-2.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 10, 2004: In a pregame ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque to Charles Herbert "Red" Ruffing. A pitcher with the Yankees from 1930-46, Ruffing batted over .300 in eight seasons and still owns the club's most wins by a right-hander (231).

July 10, 2001: Derek Jeter hits his lone career All-Star HR, connecting off Jon Lieber in the AL's 4-1 win at Safeco Field.

July 10, 1999: In a 9-8 walkoff loss at the Mets, Derek Jeter bats cleanup for the only time in his career, going 0-for-4 with 1BB.

YANKEES at BALTIMORE ORIOLES

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 3-3 vs. the Orioles in 2018...will meet 19 times in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G in Baltimore)...won three straight series between the clubs from 6/9-9/17/17...was their longest streak of series won against the O's since winning three in a row from 7/5-9/12/13...are 218-140-2 vs. Baltimore since 1998, the club's most wins over any opponent in that span (next: 213-147 vs. Tampa Bay)...**IN SEASON SERIES:** With a 12-7 mark in 2017, snapped a streak of three consecutive season series losses (2014-16), which marked their first time losing consecutive season series to the O's since 1980-82...are 15-3-2 in 20 season series since 1998...**AT CAMDEN YARDS:** Are 2-0 at Camden Yards this year...were 4-5 at Baltimore in 2017, their fifth consecutive season with a losing record there (2013-17)...are 17-31 in 48 games there since the beginning of 2013...won 2-of-3 games at Camden Yards from 9/4-7/17 to end a streak of 11 consecutive series losses there, the second-longest series losing streak at a venue in franchise history, per Elias (lost 12 straight series at Oakland from 1985-91)...was their first series win at Baltimore since 9/9-12/13...last won consecutive series at Camden Yards from 4/23-24/11 (2-0) and 5/18-19/11 (2-0)...have won just 3-of-15 series openers there since 6/28/13...are 89-69-1 at Camden Yards since 2001 and 123-89-1 since the venue opened in 1992, marking the second-highest win total by any visitor in the ballpark's history (Boston, 127-88).

LHP CC Sabathia will make his 17th start of the season in Game 1 of today's doubleheader at Baltimore...the 37-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...would be his third straight season with a sub-4.00 ERA after recording at least a 4.50 ERA in all three seasons from 2013-15...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...earned his sixth win of the season with 6.0IP in Wednesday's 6-2 win vs. Atlanta (5H, 2ER, 3BB, 5K, 2HP, 1HR)...earned his 243rd career win, **tying Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list...next up is Jack Powell (244)**...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,917), complete games (38) and quality starts (309)...ranks second in wins (243), innings pitched (3,406.1) and starts (525) to Bartolo Colon (245 wins, 3,416.0IP, 544 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,917), third all-time among left-handers...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...is one of four players currently on a 40-man roster who were active in 2001 (Adrián Beltré, Bartolo Colon, Albert Pujols)...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins)...is in his 18th Major League season, second-most among active pitchers (Colon, 21).

LAST START: Earned his sixth win of the season in Wednesday's 6-2 win vs. Atlanta (6.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 3BB, 5K, 2HP, 1HR)...improved to 4-1 with a 2.59 ERA (55.2IP, 16ER) in his first 10 home starts of 2018...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in six of those 10 starts...earned his 243rd career win, tying Juan Marichal for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list...allowed 3R-or-fewer for the sixth consecutive start and has completed at least 5.0IP in seven straight...allowed a solo HR to Camargo in the sixth, snapping a four-start homerless stretch (25.2IP from 6/12-29)...tossed 103 pitches, his most in a game since 9/29/16 vs. Boston (105).
