**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost consecutive games, are 2-4 in their last 6 games and 3-5 in their last 8 games on the heels of an 8-game winning streak...they need a win tonight to avoid their first 3-game losing streak since April 11-15 at CWS, vs. PHI (4)...the Rays have had 23 base-runners over their last 2 games but have scored 1 run...yesterday vs. ATL, the Rays were shut out for the second time this season (also March 30 vs. BOS)...it was the 31st time in franchise history the Rays lost 1-0, and the 12th time they lost 1-0 on a solo home run (last Sep 28, 2016 at CWS).

- + The Rays have scored 1 run or fewer in consecutive games for the second time this season (also April 11-13 at CWS, vs. PHI)...they haven't done this in 3 straight games since April 13-15, 2016.
- + This is also the second time this season the Rays have lost consecutive games when allowing 2 runs or fewer (April 11-13)...prior to this season, they hadn't done this since Aug 30-31, 2012 at TOR...never in club history have they lost 3 straight in this fashion.
- + A win tonight would clinch a second consecutive winning home stand, as the Rays went 5-4 from April 13-22 vs. PHI/TEX/MIN...the Rays are 5-1-0 over their last 6 series and would improve to 5-1-1 over their last 7 series with a win tonight.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—With yesterday's loss vs. ATL, the Rays dropped to 5-12 (.294) in 1-run games this season...six of their last 8 games have been decided by a 1-run margin, and they are 1-5 in the 1-run games over that span...the Rays have played a majors-most 17 games decided by 1 run, the most by any team within their first 33 games of the season since the 2014 Pirates (17) and most by an AL team since the 2005 White Sox (17).

- + 51.5 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 29.2 pct. of games in the majors (308 of 1,054).
- + The Rays are the first team in the majors with at least 12 one-run losses within the first 33 games of the season since the 1994 Phillies (12) and the first AL team since the 1953 St. Louis Browns (12).
- + The .294 winning pct. in 1-run games is 5th-lowest in the majors.
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 39-63 (.382) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors over that span to the Twins (.381).

**DOES NOT COMPUTE**—Strangely, the Rays are 4-7 (.364) when allowing 2 runs or fewer and 6-10 (.375) when allowing 3 runs or fewer...they have allowed 3 runs or fewer in their last 4 losses, since May 1 at DET...excluding the Rays, the rest of the majors is 283-48 (.855) when yielding 2 runs or fewer and 357-99 (.783) when yielding 3 runs or fewer.

**BOX SCORE ODDITY**—In the 7th inning last night, **Blake Snell** and **Ryne Stanek** combined for 4 SO...it was the third time the Rays recorded 4 SO in an inning, following **Alex Cobb** in the 3rd inning on May 10, 2013 vs. SD and **Jeremy Hellickson** in the 3rd inning on Aug 25, 2011 vs. DET.

**RAYS vs. BRAVES**—This series marks the first meeting between the clubs since Aug 11-12, 2015 at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 10-19 (.345) all-time against the Braves, their 2nd-worst winning pct. against any opponent (Reds, .333)...they are 6-12 at home, and are 1-5-0 in the previous 6 series here...the Rays will go to Atlanta for a 2-game series from Aug 28-29, which will be their first time ever playing at SunTrust Park.

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE**—Tonight is the Rays fifth of 20 interleague games this season...they are 0-4 so far, their first 4-game losing streak in interleague play since June 17-July 18, 2016 (4)...the Rays went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-11 in 2010)...they are 110-84 (.567) since 2008—5th-best in the majors—and 184-188 all-time...the NL is 28-15 (.651) in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

**SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN**—This is the third of six consecutive series against teams that finished last season below .500...the Rays don't face another postseason team from last year until May 22-24 vs. BOS...so far this season, the Rays are 6-9 (.400) against teams that made last year's playoffs and 9-9 (.500) against teams that missed the postseason.

- + Tomorrow is the Rays last of three off-days in a stretch of 8 days... following tomorrow's off-day, the Rays will play 40 games in 41 days (two off-days plus a doubleheader on Sat at BAL).

**FROM THE OTHER SIDE**—Last night, **Ronald Acuña Jr.**—at 20 years, 141 days old—hit a solo homer for the only run of a 1-0 game...it was the third time since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) that a player homered at 20.141 or younger in a 1-0 game, following CHC **Phil Cavarretta** (twice) on Sep 25, 1935 at STL (19.068) and Sep 25, 1934 vs. CIN (18.068).

**POWER OUTAGE**—The Rays have hit 1 HR in their last 3 games and 3 HR in their last 6 games...this comes on the heels of home runs in eight consecutive games from April 21-30, totaling 19 HR over that span, including multiple homers in 6 games and 3 HR or more in 4 games.

- + Only 29.3 pct. of the Rays runs this season have scored via the home run, compared to a club-record 48.0 pct. last year.

**ROAMING BUFFALO**—Last night vs. ATL, **Wilson Ramos** singled in the 9th inning to extend his hitting streak to 15 games, the longest active in the majors...it is the 2nd-longest streak of his career, behind April 24-May 19, 2015 (19, with WAS)...it's the longest by a Ray since **James Loney** (16) from June 19-July 5, 2013 and 4 games shy of tying the club record, held by **Jason Bartlett** (19) in 2009...the streak is the longest in franchise history among catchers...last night was the third time he kept his streak alive with a hit in his final at-bat of the game.

**MEDICAL MATTERS**—RH **Nathan Eovaldi** (loose bodies in right elbow) is scheduled for 2 IP or 35 pitches in a rehab start tonight for Class-A Charlotte at Fort Myers (Twins).

**LET'S PLAY TWO**—The traditional, single-admission doubleheader on Sat at BAL will be the 27th doubleheader in franchise history and eighth traditional doubleheader...the Rays are 4-12-10 in their previous 26 doubleheaders and 1-2-4 in their previous seven traditional doubleheaders...most recently, the Rays hosted the Athletics in a scheduled traditional doubleheader last June 10...they haven't played a doubleheader on the road since a split doubleheader on June 25, 2016 at BAL.

**THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY**—On May 9, 2010, Athletics lefty **Dallas Braden** pitches a perfect game on Mother's Day in a 4-0 win over the Rays...his grandmother, **Peggy Lindsey**—who raised him after his mother died of cancer when he was in high school—was in attendance...it was the second perfect game against the Rays in less than a calendar year, coming only 96 games after White Sox lefty **Mark Buehrle** was perfect at U.S. Cellular Field on July 23, 2009.

**LAST APP**—Last pitched on May 4 vs. TOR, replacing “bullpen day” starter **Andrew Kittredge** to begin the 3rd inning...allowed a single to **Dalton Pompey** leading off the inning, but after that retired his last 15 BF...his 5 IP matched **Austin Pruitt** on April 14 vs. PHI for the most by a Rays reliever this season...became the second reliever in franchise history to go at least 5 IP and allow 1 hit or fewer, joining **Esteban Yan** on April 13, 1998 vs. MIN...recorded the second win of his career, coming in back-to-back apps...his line: W, 5 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 SO, 58 pit, 40 str.

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—Has totaled 19.2 IP in his 7 apps out of the bullpen, averaging just under 3 IP per relief appearance...he has made 4 relief apps of at least 4 IP, the only reliever in the majors who can make that claim this season...he joined **Carlos Reyes** in 2003 as the only Rays to do that in a single season...also became the first pitcher to make 4 apps of this type within his team's first 30 games of the season since **SEA Bryan Clark** (4) in 1983...has made 2 relief apps ending at 73 pitches—prior to this year, no Rays reliever threw that many pitches since **Chris Archer** in 2012.

- + He also became the first player since pitch count data is available (1999) to throw at least 70 pitches in relief twice within his team's first 9 games.

**LEFT ON LEFT**—Has held lefties to a .130 avg. (3-for-23), but all 3 hits by lefties have gone for extra bases (**Max Kepler** homer, **Max Kepler** double and **Rafael Devers** homer)...has yielded 5 BB in 29 PA vs. LHB (17.2 pct.), 3rd-highest rate among lefties in the majors (min. 20 IP) behind **CWS Hector Santiago** (27.5) and **LAD Hyun-Jin Ryu** (22.2)...issued 4 BB vs. LHB within his first 2 apps of the season spanning 4 IP and 8 BF, but since then has allowed 1 BB vs. LHB in 6 apps, 20.1 IP and 21 BF.

**OVERVIEW**—Will be making the second start of his career (also April 15 vs. PHI)...with that start, he became the 33rd different starting pitcher used by the Rays since 2008, which remains the fewest in the majors over that span.

- + Is in his second stint with the Rays (Opening Day–April 28, May 1–current)...recorded his first career win on April 28 at BOS (4-IP, 2-ER), replacing **Yonny Chirinos** with the bases loaded and no outs in the 3rd inning without allowing a run to score...yielded an RBI single to **Hanley Ramirez** in the 4th inning and solo homer to **Rafael Devers** in the 5th, but left with a 7-5 lead...optioned postgame and recalled following the injury to Chirinos (right forearm strain).
- + Tonight's start will extend the Rays streak of games started by a pitcher under the age of 30 to 594 straight, the longest current streak in the majors.
- + Made his first career app on March 31 vs. BOS, and his 73 pitches were the 2nd-most in club history for a reliever making his major league debut, behind **David Price** (87) on Sep 14, 2008 at NYY...his app of 4 IP is tied for the 2nd-longest in club history for a reliever in his debut (Price, 5.1).

**ROTATION TRANSLATION**—Prior to the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, the Rays planned to open the season with four regular members of the starting rotation and a “bullpen day” as needed in place of a fifth starter...the Rays pitching staff currently has three starters and a 9-man bullpen, which includes Yarbrough and two other long relievers.

**LAST SEASON**—Spent his first season in the Rays organization with Triple-A Durham after being acquired from the Mariners in a trade involving **Drew Smyly**...his 13 wins, 26 starts, 157.1 IP and 159 SO were all career highs...ranked 2nd among Rays minor leaguers in strikeouts, behind **Brent Honeywell** (172)...tied for 2nd in wins, one shy of **José Mujica** (14)...ranked 3rd in innings and 8th with a 3.43 ERA.

- + Increased his strikeout total from 99 SO (6.94 SO/9 IP) with Double-A Jackson in 2016 to 159 SO (9.10 SO/9 IP) with the Bulls...according to FanGraphs, generated swings-and-misses on 14.0 pct. of his pitches, 2nd-highest in the International League behind teammate **Brent Honeywell** (14.3).
- + Led the IL in strikeouts, the second consecutive year and fifth time in seven seasons a Bulls pitcher was the league leader...tied for the IL lead in starts, ranked 2nd in wins, 3rd in innings, 4th in SO/9 IP, 5th in BB/9 IP and 8th in ERA.

**LOCAL PRODUCT**—Ryan grew up a Rays fan and kept some 2008 World Series gear in his bedroom of his Lakeland home, which he found after he was acquired in a four-player trade from the Mariners...he would often watch games in his bedroom, and his dad followed along as he worked in the garage...the two would sometimes meet in the middle of the house after the game's most pivotal moments.

- + His high school baseball coach encouraged him to find professionals to look up to...he admired **David Price**, **James Shields** and **Scott Kazmir** and still has a Kazmir jersey he received as a 15-year-old hanging in his closet.

## FRIDAY'S STARTER: RH JAKE FARIA (3-1, 4.15 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Sat vs. TOR, won a third consecutive decision for the first time since June 7–July 6, 2017 (4)...his only run allowed came on a solo homer by **Teoscar Hernández** in the 4th inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 11 IP...was the second time this season his only run allowed came via solo home run (April 18 vs. TEX, **Shin-Soo Choo**)...only allowed 1 hit in his first 5 IP, then allowed 2 hits to 3 BF in the 6th inning and was replaced...his line: W, 5.1 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 73 pit, 46 str.

- + Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 5 of his 7 starts this year...is 3-0 with a 2.17 ERA (29-IP, 7-ER) and 28 SO in his last 5 starts, dating back

to April 13, after allowing a career-high 7 runs on April 7 at BOS.

**vs. BALTIMORE**—Is 1-0 with a 4.78 ERA (26.1-IP, 14-ER) in 5 apps (4 starts) in his career against the Orioles...is 0-0 with a 5.54 ERA (13-IP, 8-ER) in 3 apps (2 starts) at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...on April 25 at BAL, got no decision but yielded an RBI double to **Adam Jones** in the 1st inning, 2-run double to **Jace Peterson** in the 2nd inning and solo homer to **Chance Sisco**, his last batter faced, in the 5th inning.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
