NEW WORK WEEK

- The Rockies continue the first homestand of their 25th Anniversary Season with the first game of a three-game set against the San Diego Padres.
- The Rockies fell 4-0 yesterday, losing the first home series of the season 2-1 to the Atlanta Braves ... it was their first shutout loss since falling 5-0 to the Padres on Sept. 23, 2017, and the first at Coors Field since losing 3-0 to St. Louis on May 27, 2017.
- Atlanta starter Sean Newcomb pitched six scoreless innings with no walks while striking out nine, becoming the third pitcher in Coors Field history (second visting pitcher, alongside Randy Johnson) to pitch at least six scoreless innings with no walks and at least nine strikeouts ... the one Rockies pitcher to accomplish this is today's starter Jon Gray, who pitched a complete-game shutout against San Diego on Sept. 17, 2017 in which he allowed no walks and struck out 16 batters.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

- Today marks the 25th anniversary of the first home game, and first win, in franchise history, April 9, 1993 vs. the Montreal Expos at Mile High Stadium.
- The Rockies won the game 11-4 behind seven shutout innings by starting pitcher Bryn Smith ... second baseman Eric Young went 4-for-4 with a leadoff home run in the bottom of the first inning ... Andres Galarraga went 3-for-5 with two RBI and Charlie Hayes went 2-for-3 with a home run.
- Umpire Brian Gorman, the crew chief for this series against the Padres, was the second base umpire for the first home game in franchise history.

AMBULATORY

- The Rockies won Saturday night's game in 10 innings on a walk-off walk to Tony Wolters ... each of the Rockies' last three walk-off wins have come via a bases-loaded walk (also: Aug. 3, 2017 vs. New York-NL, Sept. 4, 2017 vs. San Francisco) ... it is the first time in franchise history that the Rockies have earned three consecutive walk-off wins via walk, and the first time it has happened in the Major Leagues since Toronto in 1997.

NO GASLAMPS HERE

- Colorado and San Diego meet 19 times this year, including 10 times this month ... played a four-game series last week (Colorado won 3-1), play three this week (April 9-11) and then three times at Coors Field April 23-25.
- Colorado is 25-15 vs. the Padres since April 10, 2016 ... the Rockies have also won 19 of the past 31 meetings since Sept. 11, 2016 ... Colorado was 12-7 vs. San Diego last season, including 6-4 at Petco Park ... prior to '17, the Rockies had not had a winning record at Petco Park since going 5-4 in 2013.
- At Coors Field, the Rockies went 6-3 against San Diego in 2017, including a three-game sweep July 17-19 ... outscored the Padres 67-35 at home last year.
- The Rockies have finished at or above .500 at home against San Diego each season since 2012, and have outscored the Padres 329-262 over that span with a record of 36-20.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (586), DJ LeMahieu (562) and Nolan Arenado (558) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .319 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Charlie Blackmon is 10-for-36 (.278) to begin the season with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI ... signed a six-year contract that includes two player options on April 3.
- He hit home runs in three consecutive games March 30-April 2 for the second time in his Major League career (April 20-23, 2014), including his first multi-home run game of the season on March 31 at Arizona.

MY COUSIN VINNY

- With two hits last Monday, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits.

PHOENIX RISING

- Bryan Shaw has worked five scoreless outings thus far in his first year with the Rockies ... he is one strikeout shy of 400 for his Major League career.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in four of his five games pitched, and currently leads all National League relievers (tied for the Major League lead) with 11 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his six innings or work across five appearances.

BACK IN BLACK

- Manager Bud Black led the Rockies to a postseason appearance in his first season in 2017 with the club going 87-75 and advancing to the National League Wild Card game ... it was the Rockies' first winning season since 2010.

HIT CHARITABLY

- New at Coors Field this season is a 18'x30' "Hit the Mitt" target beyond the wall in the left-field corner ... each time a Rockies hitter strikes the target with a home run, UHealth will make a donation in the amount of \$5,000 via the Colorado Rockies Foundation to Gold Crown Foundation, a Colorado nonprofit 501(c)(3) that offers youth sports and education programs to nearly 20,000 children throughout Colorado and the surrounding areas ... UHealth will be tracking the accumulating donation throughout the season and present a check to Gold Crown Foundation at the end of the 2018 season.

CANIS LUPUS

- Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his third start of the season, his first at Coors Field.
- Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De la Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years.
- Also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017.

NOT HIS PADRE

- Will be making his second consecutive start against the Padres, having faced them last Wednesday ... earned his first win of the season in that game after pitching seven scoreless innings with four hits and seven strikeouts.
- In 11 starts against the Padres, is 5-2 with a 2.15 ERA (67.0 IP, 16 ER), 11 walks and 89 strikeouts ... his 11 career starts against San Diego are the most vs. any opponent.
- Recorded a franchise-record 16 strikeouts vs. the Padres on Sept. 17, 2016 in his first career complete-game shutout.
- Was 2-0 with a 2.65 ERA (17.0 IP, 5 ER) in three starts vs. the Padres last season.
- At Coors Field, is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (32.0 IP, 6 ER) over five starts ... has a 11.81 strikeouts-per-nine-innings ratio over that span, and has allowed greater than one earned run in one of those games.

SPRING FORWARD

- Made six Cactus League starts and went 1-2 with a 5.82 ERA (21.2 IP, 14 ER), five walks and 22 strikeouts.
- Over his last two Spring starts, pitched 9.1 scoreless innings, allowing five hits with one walk and 11 strikeouts.

SOMETHING TO BUILD ON

- Went 10-4 with a 3.67 ERA (110.1 IP, 45 ER), 30 walks and 112 strikeouts over 20 starts in 2017.
- Made three starts to begin the season, allowing six runs across 12.1 innings (4.38 ERA), before being placed on the disabled list on April 14 with a broken bone in his left foot.
- Returned from the disabled list on June 30 and went 10-4 with a 3.58 ERA (98.0 IP, 39 ER), 23 walks and 103 strikeouts across 17 starts to finish the season.
- In 13 starts to end the season from July 25 through the end of the season, ranked tied for first in the National League in wins (seven), second in ERA (2.64), third in innings pitched (78.1), sixth in strikeouts (80) and second in strikeouts-to-walk ratio (5.00).
- Ended the season allowing three or fewer runs in 13 consecutive starts, the second-longest single-season streak by a Rockies starter in franchise history (longest: Ubaldo Jimenez, 14 games, 2010).

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- His 348 career strikeouts are 17th in franchise history, three fewer than Adam Ottavino, who ranks 16th with 351.
- In 2016, set a Rockies rookie record with 185 strikeouts, the sixth-most strikeouts by any Rockies pitcher in franchise history and the most since Ubaldo Jimenez recorded the franchise record 214 strikeouts in 2010 ... his 9.91 strikeouts-per-nine-innings was a Rockies franchise record.
- Set a Rockies and Coors Field record with 16 strikeouts in his first career complete-game shutout, Sept. 17, 2016 vs. San Diego.

#COORS

- Made eight starts at home in 2017 and went 5-1 with a 3.13 ERA (46.0 IP, 16 ER), 43 hits, four home runs, 13 walks and 41 strikeouts.
- In 22 starts at Coors Field since 2016, has gone 12-3 with a 3.89 ERA (129.2 IP, 56 ER), 31 walks and 135 strikeouts ... the Rockies have gone 15-7 in his home starts.
- In 27 career starts at Coors Field, has gone 12-4 with a 4.49 ERA (150.1 IP, 75 ER) ... his .750 winning percentage at home is the second-best percentage in franchise history (min. 20 starts), behind Joe Kennedy's .818 mark (9-2).

HOME IS WHERE YOU MAKE IT

- In 2017, Gray went 5-3 with a 4.06 ERA (64.1 IP, 29 ER) in 12 starts on the road.
- After allowing eight runs at New York-NL on July 14, went 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (49.1 IP, 14 ER), nine walks and 52 strikeouts over his final eight starts on the road ... logged six quality starts over that span.
- Over his final five road starts in 2017, went 4-1 with a 1.71 ERA (31.2 IP, 6 ER), six walks and 34 strikeouts.
- Overall, in 31 starts on the road, has gone 8-13 with a 4.38 ERA (172.2 IP, 84 ER), 169 hits, 69 walks and 191 strikeouts.
