WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won two consecutive games but lost 10 of the last 15 as they continue their final homestand of the season tonight vs. the Chicago Cubs.
- RHP Lucas Giolito, who leads the club with 10 wins this season, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- The White Sox went 4-5 on their last trip at Cleveland (1-2), Baltimore (2-1) and Kansas City (1-2) from 9/10-20.
- Following this weekend's series vs. the Cubs, the Sox will conclude the home portion of their schedule with three games vs. the Indians next Monday-Wednesday ... they will finish the 2018 season with four games at Minnesota (9/28-30; DH on 9/28).
- The White Sox went 3-7 on their last homestand vs. Boston (2-2), Detroit (1-2) and the Angels (0-3) from 8/30-9/9.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox need to win two of their final nine games to avoid the fourth 100-loss season in franchise history.
- Tonight and tomorrow afternoon mark the final two games of Ken "Hawk" Harrelson's iconic broadcasting career.
- The Sox have lost five of the last seven games vs. the Cubs, and have been outscored, 47-29, during that span.
- The White Sox have scored 15 runs on 30 hits over the last two games after scoring 10 runs on 29 hits in the previous four ... they have homered in eight consecutive games (15 HR total).
- Lucas Giolito is 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (17 ER/17.0 IP), .288 opp. average and 1.71 WHIP over his last four home starts.
- Daniel Palka has homered in four of his last five games, and has hit eight home runs with 10 RBI over his last 15.
- Tim Anderson needs one home run to become the first White Sox shortstop to record a 20-HR/20-SB season.

ROSTER MOVE

- Prior to tonight's game, the White Sox reinstated OF Leury Garcia from the 10-day disabled list ... he was placed on the DL on 8/21 with a strained left hamstring.
- The Sox active roster increases to 33.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- The White Sox recorded a season-high 19 hits, including three doubles and two home runs, in their 10-4 win over the Cubs.
- The Cubs took a 1-0 lead on Daniel Murphy's leadoff home run, but the Sox scored 10 unanswered runs, including three in the second, one in the fourth and three in the sixth and seventh.
- Kevan Smith hit a three-run homer in the second, part of five straight hits to open the frame ... Daniel Palka connected on a pinch-hit homer in the sixth, his fourth of the season (club record).
- Reynaldo López earned the win after allowing one run on five hits with eight strikeouts in 7.0 IP ... he held the Cubs to three hits over the final six innings.
- All 11 White Sox with an at-bat recorded a hit, including five multihit efforts ... the Sox went 7-14 with RISP.

6.0 (IP), 1 (R) AND DONE

- Reynaldo López yesterday allowed one run in 7.0 IP, marking his fifth straight start allowing one run or less over 6.0-plus IP.
- The streak is the longest by a White Sox starter since Eric King from 4/22-5/13/89 (also five).
- He is one of four pitchers in MLB this season to accomplish the feat, joining St. Louis' Carlos Martinez (six), Boston's Chris Sale (six) and Pittsburgh's Trevor Williams (five).

PINCH OF POWER

- Daniel Palka yesterday hit his fourth pinch-hit home run of the season, the most in a season in White Sox history ... his 10 pinch RBI in 2018 are tied for the third-most in franchise history.
- His four pinch-hit home runs lead MLB this season ... he is 5-15 (.333) with four homers, 11 RBI, a 1.133 slugging percentage and 1.357 OPS as a pinch hitter this season.

CROSTOWN SIGHTS AND SOUNDS

- Chicago Bulls forward and Simeon graduate Jabari Parker, and Sr. Mary Jo Sobieck of Marian Catholic High School, will throw out ceremonial first pitches prior to tonight's game.
- "Chicago P.D." actor LaRoyce Hawkins, a native of Harvey, Ill., and Barton Fitzpatrick from Showtime's "The Chi" will throw out ceremonial first pitches on Sunday.
- There are a limited number of Standing Room Only tickets available for tonight and tomorrow ... fans can purchase tickets at the GRF box office, whitesox.com or by calling 866-SOX-GAME.
- Tonight's Sox Split raffle will begin at a guaranteed jackpot of \$50,000, with 50 percent of net proceeds going to one lucky winner and the remainder supporting Chicago White Sox Charities.
- Fans can purchase tickets from sellers in the ballpark and at kiosks in left field and behind home plate (100 and 500 levels).

WHITE SOX VS. CHICAGO CUBS

- The season series is even at 2-2, with the White Sox winning the last two games ... the Sox are hitting .289/.347/.437 with four home runs, own a 5.82 ERA (22 ER/34.0 IP) with one quality start and have been outscored, 26-21.
- The Sox have lost five of the last seven, seven of 10 and 10 of 16 ... they are 6-9 in the last 15 at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The White Sox went 1-3 in 2017, including 0-2 at home.
- The White Sox are 1-2-2 in season series since 2013 after winning four straight from 2009-12.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 60-56, going 31-26 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 29-30 at Wrigley Field.

CROSTOWN CONNECTIONS

- Below is a breakdown of Crosstown Cup connections for members of the White Sox roster, coaches and broadcasters:
 - ◆ Rick Renteria managed the Cubs to a 73-89 record in 2014.
 - ◆ C Wellington Castillo played for the Cubs from 2010-15.
 - ◆ TV analyst Steve Stone and radio analyst Darrin Jackson played for both clubs ... Stone spent 20 years as a Cubs TV analyst.
- A breakdown of Crosstown Cup connections for members of the Cubs roster, coaches and broadcasters:
 - ◆ Pitching coach Jim Hickey is a Chicago native, graduate of Kennedy High School and was drafted by the White Sox in 1983.
 - ◆ LHP José Quintana pitched for the White Sox from 2012-17, and was named an American League All-Star in 2016.
 - ◆ Quintana was to the Cubs in exchange for four prospects, including OF Eloy Jiménez and RHP Dylan Cease on 7/13/17.
 - ◆ Radio analyst Ron Coomer is a graduate of Lockport high school.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 6-12 during interleague play ... they have been held to three runs or less eight times in 2018.
- The Sox will finish with a losing record vs. the National League for the fourth straight season (last winning mark in 2014; 11-9).
- Chicago is 6-4 over its last 10 games, but 6-9 in its last 15 IL games at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox went 6-14 in 2017.
- The Sox are 212-189 all-time during IL play (since 1997).

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit 94 home runs since 7/2, the fourth-highest total in the American League and seventh-most in MLB.
- The Sox feature six players with 17-plus home runs this season, tied for the second-most in MLB behind the Dodgers (eight).
- Chicago has hit 98 HRs on the road, compared to 80 at home.

PALKA POWER

- Daniel Palka is tied with Zeke Bonura (1934) for third place in White Sox single-season history among rookies with 27 home runs in 2018 ... he is eight shy of Ron Kittle (35 in 1983) for second ... the 27 homers are the most by a Sox left-handed rookie.
- He ranks among MLB rookie leaders in homers (1st, 27), RBI (4th, 64), extra-base hits (7th, 44) and total bases (7th, 195).
- Palka is trying to become the first White Sox rookie to lead all MLB rookies in home runs since José Abreu (36) in 2014.

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (19 HR/26 SB) is one of five players in the major leagues with at least 19 home runs and 26 stolen bases this season, joining Boston's Mookie Betts, Pittsburgh's Starling Marte, Cleveland's José Ramírez and Colorado's Trevor Story.
- Anderson needs one homer to become the first White Sox SS to record a 20-HR/20-SB season ... he is one homer and four steals shy of joining Alex Ríos (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966) as the only Sox to post 20 homers and 30 steals in one season.

YOUNG AND PRODUCTIVE

- Yoán Moncada needs two doubles to become the fifth player in White Sox history, age 23 or younger, to record 30-plus doubles, 15-plus home runs and 60-plus RBI in a single season.
- He would join Chet Lemon (1977), Frank Thomas (1991), Paul Konerko (1999) and Carlos Lee (1999) ... also would be the first Sox, 23 or younger, with a 30+ 2B/15+ HR/60+ RBI/10+ SB season.

GRAB SOME BENCH

- Chicago has struck out 1,494 times in 2018, the most in MLB and the most in a single season in franchise history.
- Yoán Moncada leads MLB with 207 strikeouts ... he is 15 shy of tying Adam Dunn (222 in 2012) for the club record.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 1,387 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, tied with the New York Mets (1,387) for the most in MLB during that span, and 57 more than Oakland (1,330), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox rank third in the AL with 72 quality starts in 2018 ... RHP James Shields is tied for sixth in the AL with 19 QS.

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old makes his 31st start of the season (15th at home) and second against the Cubs ... his 30 starts have nearly tripled his major-league total of 11 entering the season.
Leads the team with 10 wins (James Shields is second with seven).

LAST START

Suffered his 11th loss on 9/16 at Baltimore ... allowed six runs (four earned) on eight hits over 6.0 IP ... walked two and struck out one as his streak of seven straight quality starts on the road came to an end ...

2018 STARTS OF INTEREST

- Suffered his 10th loss on 9/5 vs. Detroit, allowing five runs (four earned) over 1.1 IP, matching the shortest start of his career.
Carried a two-hit shutout into the seventh inning on 8/30 vs. Boston ... earned his 10th victory on 8/25 at Detroit, allowing one run on three hits over 7.0 IP ...

BETTER WITH AGE

Owns a combined 8.43 ERA (55 ER/58.2 IP) in the first two innings this season and 3.70 (41 ER/99.2 IP) from innings 3-6 ... opponents are hitting .269 (60-223) the first time through the lineup, but that number drops to .232 (52-224) the second time and .223 (39-175) the third time.

DAY AND NIGHT

Has gone 7-5 with a 3.87 ERA (39 ER/90.2 IP) and .204 (67-328) opponents average over 15 starts during the day since 2017, compared to 6-9 with a 5.93 ERA (79 ER/120.0 IP) and .255 (118-463) opponents average in 22 starts at night.

2017 RECAP

- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts with the Sox ... five of the outings were quality.

- His parents, Rick Giolito and Lindsay Frost, are Hollywood actors ... Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks." ... grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with current major-leaguers RHPs Jack Flaherty (St. Louis) and Max Fried (Atlanta).

VS. CHICAGO CUBS

Makes his second career start against the Cubs and first at Guaranteed Rate Field ... won his first start on 5/13/18 at Wrigley Field, allowing three runs on two hits over 5.2 IP ... walked a career-high tying seven batters, hit a batter, threw three wild pitches and yielded five stolen bases ... became the third Sox pitcher since 2005 to earn the victory while issuing seven-plus walks, joining Derek Holland on 8/8/17 vs. Houston (seven over 5.2 IP) and Gavin Floyd on 4/13/09 at Detroit (seven over 5.0 IP) ... Sox won, 5-3.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- LHP Carlos Rodón (6-6, 3.22) is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season, ninth at home and first against the Cubs ... would rank third in the American League in opponents average (.197) and eighth in ERA with the required IP.
Is 5-3 with a 2.77 ERA (27 ER/87.2 IP) and a .185 (56-302) opponents average over his last 13 starts.
Has gone 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (4 ER/10.0 IP) in two career starts against the Cubs, both at Wrigley Field ... lost his last start on 7/25/17, allowing four runs on seven hits and three walks with a career-high tying 11 strikeouts over just 4.0 IP ... posted a no decision on 7/10/15, giving up two hits and six walks over 6.0 scoreless IP.

- Has joined Albert Pujols (2001-10) and Ted Williams (1939-42, '46-49) as the only MLB players to record 30+ doubles and 20+ home runs in each of his first five seasons ... he and Magglio Ordoñez are the only Sox to hit 30-plus doubles five straight years.
- Was selected to his second American League All-Star Team (also 2014).
- Is one of three players in MLB history to begin his career with at least four consecutive seasons of 25-plus homers and 100-plus RBI, joining Joe DiMaggio (1936-41) and Albert Pujols (2001-10) ... needs three homers and 22 RBI to record a fifth straight season.
- Ranks 10th in Sox history with 146 home runs (Carlos Lee is ninth with 152).
