<u>TODAY'S TILT</u>...the Mariners embark on their first road trip of the season with a 5,200-mile, 10-day, 8-game odyssey that includes trips to San Francisco (2 games), Minnesota (3 games) and Kansas City (3 games) before returning home to Seattle...opened the season at Safeco Field taking 2-of-3 game vs. the Cleveland Indians...today's game will be televised on *ROOT SPORTS NW* and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 2-1 on the season, going 1-1 during the day and 1-0 at night...10 of the Mariners first 18 games will be played at Safeco Field.

- Young & Old Ichiro Suzuki was the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster at 44 years, 158 days...Edwin Díaz was the youngest at 24 years, 7 days...(ages on March 29).
- First Opening Day Marco Gonzales, Casey Lawrence, Mike Marjama and Daniel Vogelbach are on their first Opening Day rosters...this was the 17th Opening Day for Ichiro Suzuki and the 13th for Félix Hernández and Robinson Canó...Ichiro's 17 career appearances on an Opening Day roster are T2nd-most among active players (also: Albert Pujols), trailing Adrian Beltre (18)...Elias.
- Service Time the Mariners have four players with at least 10 years of Major League service time, led by Ichiro Suzuki (17.000), Robinson Canó (12.153), Félix Hernández (12.060) and Nelson Cruz (10.082).
- International Game the Mariners Opening Day roster is represented by 7 different countries or territories: Canada (James Paxton), Cuba (Guillermo Heredia), Dominican Republic (Robinson Canó, Nelson Cruz, Juan Nicasio and Jean Segura), Japan (Ichiro Suzuki), Puerto Rico (Edwin Díaz), United States (16 players) and Venezuela (Félix Hernández).
- 2017 in Review Completed the 2017 season 78-84 (.481), finishing in a tie for 3rd place in the American League West along with Texas (23.0 games behind division winner Houston)...finished 7.0 games back of the American League Wild Card...went 40-41 (.494) at home and 38-43 (.469) on the road.

ROAD LID LIFTER...the Mariners take to the road for the first time in 2018...went 38-43 on the road in 2017, but went 30-23 over last 53 road games of the season (5/28-10/1)...are just 14-27 (.341) in the first road game of a season, but have won 6 of the last 9 (2009-c).

<u>LET'S GO STREAKING</u>...Robinson Canó (.600/6x10, 3 R, 2 2B, RBI, BB), **Dee Gordon** (.333/4x12, 2 R, HR, RBI, BB) and **Mitch Haniger** (.625/5x8, 2B, 2 HR, 3 RBI, HBP, 2 BB) have each hit safely in each of the first 3 games this season.

LEFT IS RIGHT...since 2012, **Kyle Seager** leads all active left-handed batters in home runs vs. left-handed pitchers with 53...during that span, he ranks ahead of Chris Davis (51), Jay Bruce (46), Anthony Rizzo (43), Joey Votto (40) and teammate **Robinson Canó** (39)...since 2012, **Nelson Cruz** leads all players in home runs off lefties with 60, ranking ahead of Giancarlo Stanton (58), Mark Trumbo (57), Josh Donaldson (55), Todd Frazier (55) and **Seager** (53).

BRING ON THE NATIONAL LEAGUE...today is the 1st game of 20 in Interleague match-ups for the Mariners this season...the Mariners are 203-181 all-time in Interleague play (95-94 on the road)... posted a .500 or better record vs. the National League in 14 of last 18 seasons (since 2000)...after this 2-game series vs. the Giants, the Mariners will not play another National League opponent until the Colorado Rockies visit Safeco Field, July 6-8.

NL SUCCESS....Seattle is 25-15 (.625) in its last 40 Interleague games since the start of the 2016... in that span, the .625 winning percentage is 6th-best in the Majors behind Boston (30-10/.750), Chicago-NL (27-13/.675), Texas (27-13/.675), Houston (26-14/.650) and Los Angeles-NL (26-14/650).

INTERLEAGUE PITCHING.... the Mariners boast the best ERA in Interleague history...Seattle's chuckers have compiled a 3.77 ERA in 384 games (1431 ER, 3417.0 IP) since the start of Interleague play in 1997...New York-AL is 2nd at 3.80, followed by Boston (3.88), Los Angeles-AL (3.89), Oakland (3.94) and Cleveland (3.99)...no other MLB team has an ERA under 4.00...the Mariners have 38 shutouts during Interleague play, which is the most by any team, ranking ahead of the Braves (29), Mets (29), the Yankees (29) and the Blue Jays (29).

FAST START...Mitch Haniger is 5-for-8 (.625) with 2 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 3 RBI 1 HBP and 2 walks in his first three games of the season...last season, Haniger hit .342 (27x79) with 20 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 13 walks, a .447 on-base percentage and a .608 slugging percentage (1.054 OPS) in 21 games in the month of April...between last April and the first three games of this season, Mitch is batting .368 (32x87), the 2nd-highest average in the American League during March/April, trailing only Christian Vazquez-BOS (.383/18x47).

BULLPEN BULLY...RHP **Nick Vincent** has not allowed an earned run in 22 of his 23 career relief appearances vs. the Giants...overall he is 1-1 with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) in 23 games...he has limited opponents to a .213 (17x80) average, while walking 3 and striking out 19.

HOMER HAPPY...8 of the Mariners 12 runs scored this season have come via home run (**Nelson Cruz** - 2 2-run HR; **Mitch Haniger** - solo HR & 2-run HR; **Dee Gordon** - solo HR)...the Mariners have homered in each of the first 3 games, marking the 10th time in club history to open a season with at least 1 home run in each of the first 3 games (also: 2016 - 5G, 2014 - 3 G, 1999 - 4 G, 1998 - 8 G, 1995 - 3 G, 1982 - 3 G, 1981 - 5 G, 1980 - 3 G & 1978 - 3 G).

AS YOU KNOW...in 2017, RHP Edwin Díaz went 0-2 with 25 saves and a 1.24 ERA (5 ER, 36.1 IP) in 35 relief appearances on the road, compared to going 4-4 with 9 saves and a 5.76 ERA (23 ER, 29.2 IP) in 31 games at Safeco Field...AND AS YOU MIGHT KNOW...among all pitchers with at least 35.0 innings on the road last season, Díaz's 1.24 ERA was the lowest in the Majors...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?... Díaz's 1.24 ERA was also the lowest in club history on the road in a single season, ranking ahead of Danny Farquhar's 1.47 ERA in 2014 (min. 35.0 IP).

- ABOUT GONZALES...

 25-year-old left-hander is making his 11th Mariners appearance, 8th start, 1st start of season...tonight is his 23rd career appearance, 15th career start and his 2nd career start vs. San Francisco. Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league
- outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21. Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 seasons (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga
- baseball program.

 Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado.

 Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 7 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 ER, 26.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts and 9 walks...threw 4.2 innings in his final spring start on 3/27 at COL, allowing 2 runs on 7 hits while walking 2 and striking out 3.

SPRING BREAKOUT...compiled a 2.08 ERA, the seventh best mark in the Majors (4th among AL pitchers) this spring...he trailed only Clayton Kershaw-LAD (0.00 ERA, 0 ER, 21.1 IP), Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (1.29 ERA, 3 ER, 21.0 IP), Noah Syndergaard-NYM (1.35 ERA, 3 ER, 20.0 IP), Julio Teheran-ATL (1.40 ERA, 4 ER, 25.2 IP), José Berríos-MIN (1.42 ERA, 3 ER, 19.0 IP) and Justin Verlander-HOU (1.64, 4 ER, 22.0 IP)...led Mariners starters in Spring Training innings pitched (26.0), strikeouts (21) and WHIP (1.19).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 8 starts...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 7 starts with Seattle

AAA RECAP...combined for 13 AAA starts last season, 11 with AAA Memphis in the Cardinals organization and 2 with AAA Tacoma after being acquired by the Mariners...was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 22 walks in 13 combined starts...went 6-4 with a 2.90 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 17 walks in 11 starts with Memphis...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts and 5 walks in 2 starts with Tacoma.

NATIONAL HISTORY...13 of his 22 career appearances have come against National League opponents (8 starts), compiling a 5.36 ERA (27 ER, 45.1 IP) with 39 strikeouts...has gone 2-3 as a starter against NL opponents with a 5.94 ERA (24 ER, 36.1 IP) while striking out 32 batters.

BATTER UP...has hit .333 (4x12) with 2 doubles, 3 sacrifices and 3 strikeouts in his career...went 0x2 in his previous start vs. SF on July 1, 2014.

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, complling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball progam when he was se-

lected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, went 7-3 with a 2.80 ERA and 2 shutouts on the mound while batting .311 with 2 home runs and 26 RBI, earning John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

POSTSEASON GLORY...added to the Cardinals roster for the 2014 National League Division Series vs. Los Angeles-NL...made 3 appearances in the NLDS, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk...picked up the wins in Game 1 and Game 4 vs. the Dodgers...became the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002)...in the 2014 NLCS vs. San Francisco, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (3 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk in 3 appearances.

ML CAREER...in parts of 3 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, '17) and Seattle (17-c), is 5-3 with a 5.47 ERA (47 ER, 77.1 IP) with 64 strikeouts and 33 walks in 22 games (14 starts)...originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University
