## Spring Training Game Notes

Arizona Diamondbacks (7-7) @ Kansas City Royals-SS (7-4-1)

Friday, March 9, 2018

**ABLOWOUT IN GLENDALE**--The Royals scored early and often, while the pitching staff spun a 5-hitter as Kansas City recorded a 12-0 win over the White Sox yesterday at Camelback Ranch...it started innocently enough with a first inning run on a perfectly executed double steal that saw Whit Merrifield cross the plate on the back end...KC then scored two in the second, four in the third, two in the fourth and then three in the fifth to have a dozen at the game's midway point...Jorge Soler (#4), Cody Asche (#1) and Samir Duenez (#1) each went deep to lead the 13-hit attack, while "two-hit Whit" had a double and triple in his first two at bats... Danny Duffy tossed 3.0 innings allowing just two hits and a walk with four K's, followed by shutout work from Miguel Almonte (2.0 innings) and one inning each from Blaine Boyer, Trevor Oaks, Richard Lovelady and Sam Gaviglio.

**EXTRA-BASE WHIT**--Whit Merrifield doubled and tripled in yesterday's win over the White Sox, upping his spring extra-base hit total to seven out his 11 total knocks...he leads all Major Leaguers with a 1.045 slugging pct to this point, with three doubles, three triples and a homer.

**ATOP THE TEAM BATTING CHART**--Yes, it's only spring training, but clubs would much rather see progress offensively during camp than the alternative...the Royals enter today's split-squad action with a Major League leading team batting average of .312, the only club with a team mark over .300...KC is also first in team OPS with an .897 mark and second in on-base pct. at .372.

**VS. D'BACKS**--Today is the first of three meetings with the Diamondbacks, as the Royals will travel a full squad to Scottsdale tomorrow for a 1:10 first pitch at Salt River Fields...the D'Backs will also host Kansas City on Saturday, March 24 for the final get together of '18.

**EXTRA TROOPS**--With split-squad action today the Royals have brought a handful of reserves from minor league camp to assist with each game...here in Surprise, KC has added infielders Angelo Castellano (#85) and Emmanuel Rivera (#89) and outfielders Brandon Downes (#86), Alfredo Escalera (#28) and Nick Heath (#88).

**DENNYBACK FOR #50**--The one common thread between the start of the Royals' franchise in 1969 and the start of 2018 is the voice of Denny Matthews...the 2007 Ford Frick Award winner will be at the mic for his 50th season this year, the same anniversary the organization is celebrating, with only the Dodgers' Vin Scully (67 years) and Jaime Jarrin (59 years) having longer stretches in the baseball broadcast booth.

**ROYALS "FRIENDED" BY FACEBOOK**--Major League Baseball and Facebook today announced a joint agreement that the global audience of Facebook will exclusively televise 25 games this season...the Royals are among the early selections with the Wednesday, April 18 game in Toronto now a Facebook telecast, thus it will be scratched from the FSKC schedule.

**TUBE TIME**--The Royals will have plenty of television exposure starting tomorrow in Scottsdale as the contest with Arizona will be shown on FSKC...also on the slate is Sunday's tilt in Surprise vs. the Tribe and then the second game of Monday's split-squad with Texas, an 8:05 start (Kansas City time).

**50TH SEASON OF ROYALS BASEBALL**--The 2018 campaign is the Golden Anniversary season of the Royals who began play in 1969 in Ft. Myers, FL...this 33-game exhibition slate will feature 32 games here in Arizona and then will be capped with a stop in Omaha against KC's AAA affiliate for all 50 seasons of the franchise's existence... KC has 11 games remaining in Surprise, 10 of which will be as the home club...the 2018 spring slate also features four split-squad days, including two (today and March 23) with 1:05 starts (Arizona time) and a pair of day/night doubleheaders (next Monday and March 19) with starts at noon and 6:05 (Arizona time)...the 2018 exhibition slate is a strange one in that the Royals will not play the Los Angeles Angels or the Colorado Rockies...there are a pair of off days in the spring slate on March 5 and 19...the 2018 regular season starts on Thursday, March 29 in Kauffman Stadium against the White Sox in the first of a 3-game series.

**SURPRISE STADIUM RATED NUMERO UNO**--At USA TODAY's request, ReviewTrackers conducted a study of more than 36,000 online reviews of the 23 spring training ballparks and analyzed 130,000 key words used in the reviews...the study provided a look at how baseball fans feel about the ballparks used for exhibition games...to create a score for each spring training stadium, ReviewTrackers examined how fans felt about four aspects of their visits: the facility; family friendliness; food; and the fan experience...to no surprise (pun intended), the Surprise Stadium, spring home of the Royals and Rangers, generated the highest overall score of the 10 Cactus League venues, finishing first in family friendliness...the park also topped all 23 spring parks (Arizona and Florida combined) in the facility and fan-experience categories.

**ROSTER BREAKDOWN**--With the addition of Ricky Nolasco to the non-roster invites, the Royals have 67 players in camp, though pitcher Jesse Hahn has been placed on the 60-day D.L....the breakdown includes 33 pitchers (10 non-roster), 7 catchers (5 non-roster), 16 infielders (8 non-roster) and 11 outfielders (5 non-roster)...among the 32 active pitchers in camp, 7 are left-handed...of the 28 non-roster players in camp with Kansas City, 10 have previous Major League experience, including eight who had time in "The Show" in 2017...of the 37 roster players in camp, nine have yet to accrue any big league service time.

**COMING OFF SUB .500 CAMPAIGN**--The Royals had their first sub-.500 season since 2012 with last year's 80-82 ledger, finishing in third place in the A.L. Central, 22 games behind the division winning Indians...Kansas City has gone 431-379 in its last five seasons, tying the New York Yankees for the third best record in the American League in that span, trailing Cleveland (454-354) and Boston (432-378).

**SPRING WORK**--After yesterday's win over the White Sox, the Royals have an all-time exhibition record of 688-629 with 41 ties for a .522 winning pct...the 2018 exhibition season is the 16th here in the Valley of the Sun where the club has posted a 257-205 mark with 19 ties for a .556 mark...the Royals spent their first 34 seasons training in Florida, beginning with Fort Myers (1969-87), followed by a 15-year stint in Baseball City (1988-2002).

**WORKING TOWARD THE START OF A NEW YEAR**--The 2018 campaign will see the earliest start for the Royals, with the lid-lifter scheduled for Thursday, March 29 against the Chicago White Sox...that 3:15 contest will be the first of a 3-game series, that will see a "weather" off day on Friday, March 30, then resumption with games on Saturday (6:15 p.m.) and Sunday (1:15 p.m.)...KC will then depart on its first road swing of the year with a 6-game journey through Detroit (3) and Cleveland (3)...the first two trips of the campaign will include 3-game stops in the Motor City to battle the Tigers, then the Royals will not travel to Detroit again until the final trip of the year in late September...Kansas City will take on the National League Central in Interleague action, playing home & home 2-game sets with Milwaukee and Cincinnati, a home & home 3-game series with St. Louis and then a 3-game series in Kauffman Stadium against the Chicago Cubs (August 6-8) and 3-game road trip to Pittsburgh (September 17-19).

**AT THE HELM**--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost begins his eighth full season with the club, taking the reins on May 13, 2010...he has a 629-632 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, surpassing Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and enters this year sixth among active managers in games (2,220) and wins (1,086)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

**THE WEEK AHEAD**--The Royals and D-backs will get together with full squads again tomorrow as KC pays its first of two spring visits to Salt River Field in Scottsdale...the week wraps up with an afternoon affair in Surprise vs. Cleveland on Sunday...next week will begin with a split-squad doubleheader in Surprise with San Diego playing a noon game vs. the Royals and then KC hosting the Rangers in a 6:00 p.m. affair.

**ON THE AIRWAVES**--Today's home game against Arizona and then tomorrow's visit to the Diamondbacks at Salt River Field will also be web-only games...the next over-the-air broadcast will be Sunday against Cleveland, with Denny Matthews, Steve Physioc and Steve Stewart providing the call on 610 Sports and the Royals Radio Network...Monday's split-squad will see the noon game against San Diego on the web and the night game vs. the Rangers on 610 Sports.

## TODAY'S KANSAS CITY PITCHERS

**#31 IAN KENNEDY**, 33, will make his second start of the spring today...allowed two runs on three hits and a walk in 2.0 innings, with five strikeouts in his spring debut on Saturday vs. the White Sox...made 30 starts in 2017 for the eighth consecutive year, the third-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Jon Lester (10 straight) and Max Scherzer (nine straight)...he's recorded at least one strikeout in each of his 269 Major League appearances, matching David Price for the longest active streak to start a career...placed on the 10-day DL from May 5-21 with a strained right hamstring...had a 3.03 ERA (12 ER in 35.2 IP) in six starts before the injury and a 6.08 ERA (80 ER in 118.1 IP) in 24 starts after.

**#56 BRAD KELLER**, 22, is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring...has three scoreless outings (3.1 IP) to date, including 1.1 frames on Tuesday vs. San Diego...in his first camp with the Royals after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati after they selected him from Arizona in the Rule 5 Draft...spent all of 2017 with Jackson (AA) in the Diamondbacks' organization, going 10-9 with a 4.68 ERA in 26 starts...entered 2017 rated as the No. 7 prospect in Arizona's system, according to *Baseball America*...originally selected by Arizona in the eighth round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft.

**#61 KEVIN McCARTHY**, 26, is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the spring...he last pitched on Tuesday vs. San Diego and allowed his first run of the spring...spent time with the Royals in each of the last two seasons...made 58 appearances between Omaha (AAA) and Kansas City in 2017...had a 1.59 ERA (5 ER in 28.1 IP) over his first 22 outings, including a streak of 10 straight outings (July 19-Aug. 25) without allowing an earned run...made his Major League debut on Sept. 9, 2016, becoming the first player from Marist University (N.Y.) to reach the big leagues.

**#43 WILY PERALTA**, 28, is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring...last pitched on Sunday in Goodyear vs. Cincinnati and tossed a scoreless frame...signed as a Major League free agent on Dec. 5, after spending the last five seasons with the Milwaukee Brewers...made 19 appearances (eight starts) with the Brewers in 2017...opened the year 3-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER in 17.0 IP) in his first three starts, before going 1-2 with 8.61 ERA over his last five starts and was used out of the bullpen the rest of the season...designated for assignment on July 29 and sent outright to Colorado Springs on Aug. 3...pitched for the Dominican Republic in the 2017 World Baseball Classic and allowed one run on two hits in 4.0 innings in his only outing, a 10-3 win over Colombia.
