**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 1** of a 4-game series vs **Ted Leitner's Padres** and **Game 1** of a 7-game homestand that includes an upcoming series vs the **Dodgers** (3g)...the Reds are coming off a **2-4 road trip** at **StL** (2-1) and at **Pit** (0-3) and a **4-12 stretch** vs **National League Central** rivals that featured **13 games on the road** (1-2 at Mil, 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 vs Mil, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 at Pit)... following this homestand, the Redlegs head out for their final road trip (3g at Cubs, 3g at Mil, 4g at Mia) before finishing the 2018 championship season with a 5-game homestand (2g vs KC, 3g vs Pit).

**STATEMENT FROM THE REDS:** The thoughts and prayers of our entire organization go out to the victims of today's tragedy, as well as their families and friends. We also thank the first responders of our great city, who put themselves in harm's way each and every day for the safety of all. At tonight's game, prior to the singing of our National Anthem, the team and our fans will come together and hold a Moment of Silence in honor of the victims.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds went 1-2 in their only other meeting of the season vs the **Padres**, in **June at Petco Park**...haven't won a **season series vs SD** since **2012** (6-2) and since then are **13-22**, including **10-19** the last 5 years... **Reds vs Padres** information is on media guide **Page 329**.

**DODGERS UP NEXT:** The Reds and Dodgers begin a 3-game series on Monday...LAD's **.615 winning percentage** at **Great American Ball Park** (32-20) is the second-best by any National League team here (Mets, .667, 30-15)...the Reds swept the 4-game series in **May at Dodger Stadium**...in their **6 series** covering the **previous 3 seasons** (2015-2017), the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...entering this season, Cin had lost **17 of 19 games vs LAD**...in May, the Reds produced their **first series win** vs LAD since **September 2013**, their **first series win at Dodger Stadium** since **June 2011** and their **first 4-game sweep** of the Dodgers since **August 1976**...prior to that **May series win**, the Reds had gone **0-6-2** in the **previous 8 series vs LAD**...that winning **May series** snapped the Reds' **6-series losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

**POSTSEASON:** Last night at Radiology Associates Field at **Jackie Robinson Ballpark**, Class A **Daytona** evened its **Florida State League's** best-of-3 playoff series with a 6-5 home win vs **Clearwater**...the deciding game is tonight at Daytona...Class AA **Pensacola** last night began its **Southern League** title defense at **Biloxi** with a 12-inning, 5-3 loss in the best-of-5 series...Game 2 is tonight...tomorrow, rookie **Billings** will host **Great Falls** in Game 1 of the **Pioneer League's** best-of-3 series.

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are **56-66** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**... bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

**HURLING:** The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 Rockies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Tanner Rainey**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford**, **RHP Keury Mella**, **RHP Jesús Reyes**).

**QUERIES ABOUT SERIES:** The Reds went **16-26-2** in their **44 series**, including **11-10-1** in the **last 22 series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2** in their last 8 series **vs first-place teams** (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle**, **3-1 vs Phi**, **2-1 vs Ari**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

**ALL-STAR INFIELD:** The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.359)...All-Star **1B Joey Votto** leads the NL in on-base percentage... All-Star **2B Scooter Gennett** leads the league in hitting, hits, multi-hit games and 3-hit games...All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** ranks among the NL leaders in several statistical categories, including the leader in most plate apps per **strikeout** (9.5).

**SILVER SLUGGER:** RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award** and the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least **4 HR** in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including **2 HR** as a pitcher and **2 HR** as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...according to our friends **@EliasSports**, the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is **4** by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit **4 HR** in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit **4 HR** in **1894**, including **2** as pitcher, **1** as a left fielder and **1** as a second baseman...**as a pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen** is **3-for-11** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-18** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**6** times in his career, including **5** times this season, entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in the game to pitch...**5** times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just **2** such games.

## RED HOTS

**Luis Castillo** at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tonight is making his 28th start of the season and his **43rd Major League** appearance and start...will be his third career appearance vs the **Padres**, his second of the season...has **8 quality starts**, tied with **Sal Romano** for the staff lead...in Sat's 4-0 win at StL recorded a **career-high 11 strikeouts**, the second-highest total by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (**Tyler Mahle**, 12k, 6/30 vs Mil)...in the 4-0 win on **7/29 vs Phi** made the **longest scoreless start** of his career (7ip)...his **3-game winning streak** from **5/8-5/24** (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career...in his 7-2 win on **5/8 vs NYM**, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the **10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk.

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Anthony DeSclafani's** last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tomorrow will make his 17th start of the season...will be his third career appearance and start vs the **Padres**, his first since **2016**...in Sun's 10-inning, 6-4 win at StL threw 3.2 innings to snap a streak in which he had thrown at least 6.0 innings in 5 consecutive starts (3-1, 2.62), 1 start shy of his career high for consecutive 6.0-inning starts (6gs, 6/21-7/20, 2016)...has allowed **11 earned runs** in his last **36.0 innings** (2.75era)...began the **2018 season** on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his **6/5 start vs Col**, from **5/14-5/30** made **4 rehabilitation starts** for Class AA **Pensacola** and Class AAA **Louisville (0-3, 4.66)**...spent the entire **2017 season** on the disabled list with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his **right elbow**.

- On 12/6/17 was signed by the Astros to a minor league contract...on 6/8 was designated for assignment and then outrighted to Fresno...on 7/26 was designated for assignment a second time, refused the outright assignment and elected free agency...on 8/3 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract and was sent to Louisville.
- Hit .328 in 38 apps for Fresno (13 2b, 6hr, 22rbi), .244 in 23 apps for Louisville (6 2b, 1hr, 9rbi) and .206 in 10 apps for the Astros (3 2b, 2rbi).
- Has made 129 Major League apps for the Dodgers, Cubs, Giants and Astros.

## 3 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 12-26 (.462), 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi

- The first-time All-Star leads the National League in hitting (.320), hits (166), multi-hit games (50) and 3-hit games (17).
- Has a 6-game hitting streak, the longest active streak on the team and including 5 multi-hit games (12-26, .462, 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi)...homered Mon and Tue at Pit (3hr, 3rbi).
- In his last 20 apps beginning 8/15 is hitting .413 (33-80, 5 2b, 2 3b, 4hr, 15rbi, .675slg, .442obp), raising his BA from .304...in his last 9 apps produced five 2-hit games and two 3-hit games (17-37, .459, 2 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 9rbi), raising his season BA from .310.
- In the first half hit .326 to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...no Reds batter has finished a season leading the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Since All-Star break is hitting .309 (51-165, 8 2b, 2 3b, 6hr, 21rbi, .491slg, .354obp).

## 61 GABRIEL GUERRERO, OF Road Trip: 1g as PH/CF, 1g as PH, 0-2, 2k

- Tuesday was promoted from Louisville with C Tim Federowicz and RHP Tyler Mahle.

- His throwing arm was rated the best in the International League in a poll of managers.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, IF Blake Trahan).
- Is a nephew of 2018 Cooperstown Hall of Fame inductee Vladimir Guerrero and former Major Leaguer Wilton Guerrero and a cousin of Vladimir Guerrero Jr..

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 4-25, 2 2b, 1bb, 2r

- Hit .306 in August, raising his season BA from .225 to .244.
- In his last 24 apps beginning 8/8 is hitting .290 (27-93, 5 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13, leads all Major League players with 272 stolen bases and leads all Major League center fielders with 52 assists.
- With 29 stolen bases ranks third in the National League...in each of the last 4 seasons finished second in the league in stolen bases...was caught stealing on each of his last 4 attempts.
- His 272 stolen bases rank fifth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Bob Bescher is fourth with 320 steals and Joe Morgan the all-time leader with 406.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 12 outfield assists, 1 shy of last year's career high...LF Adam Duvall led the Major Leagues last season with 15 outfield assists...no Reds center fielder has produced more than 13 assists in a season since Vada Pinson had 19 assists in 1961.

## 15 DILSON HERRERA, inf Road Trip: 3g as PH, 1-3, RBI-double last night

- Last started in last Thu's 11-inning, 2-1 loss vs Mil, played 2B (1-4, RBI-double).
- Was promoted on 7/6...has made 4 starts at 2B (last, 8/30 vs Mil), 2 starts at 3B (8/21 at Mi, 8/22 at Mil) and 5 starts in LF (last, 8/25 at Chi).
- This season made his first Major League apps in LF (9g, 5gs), at 1B (1g on 8/8 at NYM) and at 3B (4g, 2gs).
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss Road Trip: 4-20, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3r

- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.5)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).
- In his last 84 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .310 (105-339, 18 2b, 4 3b, 8hr, 34rbi, 12sb, .457slg, .352obp), raising his season BA from .243.
- Leads the team in starts at 2 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (48gs) and second (53gs), and ranks second batting seventh (22gs, Barnhart 27gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...from 7/15-8/15 made a season-high 26 consecutive starts batting first and since then has made his last 17 starts batting second while Billy Hamilton has led off.

## 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Road Trip: 8-20 (.400), 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3bb, 2hbp

- In 11 apps since he came off the disabled list last Saturday is hitting .250 (10-40, 3 2b, 1hr, 3rbi)...had been on the DL since 7/18 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder suffered on 7/14 at StL when he hit the outfield walk while making a catch.
- In his last 7 apps is hitting .391 with 3 multi-hit games (9-23, 3 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, .652slg, .517obp).
- Has made a team-high 60 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- Has made 31 career starts batting leadoff, including 26 times this year (33-111, .297)...in his 31 career starts batting leadoff hit .301 (40-133), including .302 (39-129) in his 30 starts batting leadoff for the Reds.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 5-23, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- His 31 HR, 100 RBI and .925 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- In his last 16 apps produced 5 HR and 12 RBI...has an RBI in 4 of his last 7 apps (7rbi).
- Is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with three 10-game hitting streaks (13g, 13g, 10g), joining Atl's Nick Markakis (12g, 11g, 11g) and Freddie Freeman (16g, 10g, 14g), Hou's Yuli Gurriel (11g, 12g, 13g) and Alex Bregman (12g, 10g, 11g) and KC's Whit Merrifield (12g, 12g, 12g)...Suárez' career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10) are the longest by any Reds batter this season
- From 7/23-7/27 homered in 5 straight apps to tie the club record for consecutive games with a HR.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf Road Trip: 1gs at SS, 1g as PR, 1-3, 1r

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In Mon's 5-1 loss at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- In the ninth inning of last night's 3-2 loss at Pit pinch ran for Casali and scored.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- Was promoted on Saturday from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 7-21 (.333), 1 2b, 2rbi, 5bb, 4r

- Has a 3-game hitting streak (4-12, .333, 1bb).
- Is 7-for-26 (.269, 1 2b, 2rbi, 5bb, 4r, .375obp) in 7 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Thursday...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks...is the only batter in the NL and 1 of only 5 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

## 46 MASON WILLIAMS, of Road Trip: 6g, 2gs in LF, 3-10, 2bb

- In his last 15 apps is hitting .344 (11-32, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1rbi, .400obp), raising his season BA from .267.
- Has made 16 starts in RF (last, 8/24 at Cubs), 3 starts in CF (last, 8/30 vs Mil) and 2 starts in LF (Sun at StL, Wed at Pit).
- During Scott Schebler's most recent stint on the disabled list started 18 of the Reds' 26 games (17gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 13 of those 18 starts (19-68, .279, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, 6r).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYM vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYM.
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
