



# Tonight's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his third start of 2018, the seventh appearance and start of his career...will be his **second career appearance** vs the **Cardinals**...his third-inning single in Sun's 5-0 loss at Pit was the **only Reds hit** in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Dodgers**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster (RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin, OF Jesse Winker)** and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory...in 2017 was a *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star, MLB Pipeline.com's Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year, the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the year and a mid-season Southern League All-Star...in his Major League debut, from 8/27-9/13 made all his 4 starts for the Reds...spent most of the season at Pensacola and Louisville, where he combined to finish **10-7, 2.06 in 24 starts** (144.1ip, 109h, 30bb, 138k, 9hr)...led the organization in ERA while ranking T3rd in wins and fourth in strikeouts...among all minor league pitchers ranked eighth in ERA and sixth in WHIP (0.96)...when promoted to Louisville on 6/22 led the Southern League in innings pitched and WHIP (0.87) while ranking among the leaders in ERA (2nd), strikeouts (2nd), opponents' BA (.190, 2nd) and wins (3rd)...in a 1-0 win at Mobile on 4/22 threw the **first perfect game** Blue Wahoos history and the **second 9-inning perfect game** in Southern League history (8/14/1970, Montgomery's Charles Swanson vs Savannah).

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #29 Brandon Finnegan, LHP

## RED HOTS

**Brandon Finnegan tomorrow** will turn **25 years old** but already is in his fifth Major League season...tomorrow vs StL is expected to come off the 10-day disabled list to make his season debut...will be his **ninth career appearance** and **seventh career start vs StL**...in a **simulated game** on 4/4 at Class AAA Louisville threw 86 pitches without issue (5.2ip, 4h, 2r, 1er, 2bb, 9k), then threw 98 pitches **Mon vs Columbus** in a rehab start for the Bats (5ip, 8h, 4r, 3er, 5bb, 2k, 1hr)...began the season on the 10-day DL with a **left biceps strain** suffered during spring training...in 2017, made 4 starts for the Reds around a pair of stints on the disabled list, from **4/16-6/25** with a **strained left lat/trapezius** and from **6/28** through the remainder of the season with a **strained teres major**...both stints included time on the 60-day DL (5/16-6/25, 7/2-10/1)...on 7/7 had season-ending surgery to repair a **dislocated right shoulder**, an injury suffered away from the field...prior to his first disabling made starts of 7.0, 2.+ and 1.0 inning...after 3 rehabilitation starts for Pensacola and Louisville came off the disabled list for a start 6/26 at Wsh...was injured in the fourth inning and 2 days later was disabled for the rest of the year.

# REDS BATTERS

## REDS BATTERS

- With 9 steals in 10 attempts, the Reds are tied with the Giants for the best stolen base percentage (.900) in the National League...Cin was successful on its first 8 stolen base attempts until Phillip Ervin was thrown out at second base in the 11th inning Wed at Phi.
- Reds catchers have thrown out 1 of 7 baserunners attempting to steal (14%, Barnhart 1-3, Mesoraco 0-4), while Reds pitchers picked off 3 other baserunners who were charged with caught stealings (Brice, Iglesias, Peralta).

### 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c Road Trip: 6g, 5gs, 4-16, 1 2b, 2-run HR, 5bb

- In his last 8 apps is hitting .318 (7-22, 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 7bb) with an on-base percentage of .483 and a slugging percentage of .545.
- In 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).
- Established a new single-season franchise record for highest fielding percentage by a catcher (.999) and tied Brayan Pena's 2015 club mark for fewest errors in a season by a catcher (1e, 953tc).
- In 2017, led Major League catchers in fielding percentage (.999, 1e, 953tc), caught stealings (28) and assists (89)...led NL catchers in blocked pitches (661).
- With a 2.8 Defensive WAR as calculated by Baseball Reference, led all NL position players and ranked second among all Major League players (SS Andrelton Simmons 4.2)...as calculated by Fangraphs, led all Major League catchers in defensive value and in defensive runs saved.
- Is approaching 100 career runs (89) and 300 hits (276).

### 2 ALEX BLANDINO, c Road Trip: 2g, 1gs, 0-4

- Along with RHP Zack Weiss was recalled from Class AAA Louisville on Mon, when OF Scott Schebler and 3B Eugenio Suárez went on the 10-day disabled list.
- Tue at Phi made his Major League debut with a start at 3B (0-3, 2k).
- Made his second start last night, also at 3B (0-3, 1k).
- Prior to Mon's promotion made 3 starts at 3B for Louisville (0-8, 3r, 2bb, 2hbp, 1sb).
- His .834 OPS in 237 plate apps with Louisville in 2017 was the highest OPS for a Bats player in his first Class AAA season (min. 100 PA) since Denis Phipps' 1.004 OPS in 173 plate apps in 2011.
- In March 2016 played for Team Nicaragua in the World Baseball Classic qualifier in Mexicali, Mexico...his father was born in Nicaragua.

### 23 ADAM DUVALL, lf Road Trip: 7g, 6gs, 2-24, 1hr, 2rbi

- In his last 17 apps vs StL beginning 4/9/17 is hitting .345 (20-58, 6 2b, 1 3b, 8rbi, .534slg, .379obp).
- Has 1 hit in his last 22 at bats, including an 0-for-14 skid snapped Mon at Phi by a single in the ninth inning.
- Last night started at 1B, his 35th career appearance at that position and 23rd start... was his second appearance of the season at 1B (4/6 at Pit, played last 2 innings).
- Over the past 3 seasons, including 2018, is 1 of only 2 players in the Major Leagues to produce at least 69 doubles, 66 HR and 209 RBI (Nolan Arenado 82-79-269).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- In 2017, led all Major League outfielders with 15 assists, the most by a Reds outfielder since Pete Rose had 15 assists in 1973.
- Is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 extra-base hits in 3 straight seasons (courtesy TheAthletic.com).
- Is approaching 400 career apps (374), 200 runs (179) and 100 walks (92).

### 27 PHILLIP ERVIN, of Road Trip: 5g, 3gs, 3-15, 3rbi, 1sb

- Made his 4 starts Sat at Pit (CF), Mon at Phi (RF), Wed at Phi (RF) and last night (RF).
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (3-12, .250, 2rbi, 1sb)...last year, in his rookie season, produced a career-high 7-game hitting streak (8/30-9/9).
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Jesse Winker).

### 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 7gs, 6-29, 2 2b, 1rbi

- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including a pair of 2-hit games (6-17, .353, 2 2b, 3rbi).
- Hit safely in 9 of his 12 apps overall and reached base safely in 10 games.
- Beginning 9/16/17 has a 13-game hitting streak at Great American Ball Park (19-53, .358, 4 2b, 3hr, 12rbi, .604slg, .370obp).
- On 4/1 vs Wsh made his 600th career appearance and reached 2,000 at bats.
- On 3/30 vs Wsh became the first Reds batter with 4 hits on Opening Day since Ramon Hernandez went 4-for-5 (3rbi) on 3/31/11 vs Mil.
- By 7/23 of last season already had established new career highs in HR and RBI... also established career highs in games, runs, hits, total bases, slugging and OPS.
- In his 108 starts in 2017 hit .301 (22 2b, 2 3b, 25hr, 90rbi).
- His 97 RBI ranked T13th in the National League and were the most by any player in the Major Leagues with as few as 461 at bats...his AB-per-RBI ratio was 4.8, the best on the team, but needed 5 more plate apps to qualify among the leaders.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.
- Is approaching 600 career hits (577).

### 46 PHIL GOSSELIN, inf Road Trip: 7g, 1gs, 1-9, 1bb

- Last night played both first base and third base.
- Wed at Phi made his only start of the season, played 3B...was the last Reds position player to start a game this season.
- His 8 apps as a pinch hitter rank T3rd in the Major Leagues, just 2 pinch-hit apps behind leaders Tommy La Stella of the Cubs and Lane Adams of the Braves.
- Has played 1B (1g), 2B (1g) and 3B (4g, 1gs).
- In the ninth inning on 4/1 vs Wsh hit a 2-run HR off Sean Doolittle.
- Was 1 of 3 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF Cliff Pennington, RHP Kevin Quackenbush)...on 12/21 was signed to a minor league contract.
- One of baseball's most versatile players, in his Major League career has played 1B (8g, 4gs), 2B (97g, 61gs), 3B (33g, 20gs), SS (11g, 5gs), LF (6g, 3gs) and RF (1g).

### 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 7g, 6gs, 4-20, 1rbi, 4bb, 4sb

- Twice walked 2 times in a game (Fri at Pit, Tue at Phi), tying his single-game career high...has 20 career 2-walk games, including 6 last season.
- Tue at Phi recorded at least 2 stolen bases in a game for the 50th time in his career.
- Recorded all 4 stolen bases over his last 6 apps.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 247, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- If he reaches 60 stolen bases in 2018 will become the first player in Major League history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first 6 seasons while establishing a career high in each of those 6 years...is tied with Jose Reyes, Cesar Cedeño and Bert Campaneris as the only players to do it in 5 straight years (courtesy TheAthletic.com).
- Is approaching 300 career runs (299), 500 hits (498) and 250 steals (247).

### 39 DEVIN MESORACO, c

Road Trip: 3g, 1gs, 1gs, 1-9

- Pinch hit in the eighth inning of last night's 13-4 loss then in the top of the ninth made his first Major League appearance at 1B (1 putout).
- Made his 3 starts on 4/1 vs Wsh, last Fri at Pit and Wed at Phi.
- Made his other 2 pinch-hit apps on 3/30 vs Wsh and Sun at Pit.
- Spring Training: 18g, .308, 1hr, 7rbi...in his last 14 spring apps hit .344 (11-32, 3 2b, 1hr, 6rbi)...made 17 starts (14gs at C, 3gs at DH).
- In 2017, made 56 apps and 39 starts around 3 stints on the disabled list (left shoulder/right hip, left shoulder, left foot).
- Is approaching 400 career apps (390) and 300 hits (273).

### 4 CLIFF PENNINGTON, inf

Road Trip: 5g, 1gs, 2-8, 2bb

- In the ninth inning of last night's 13-4 loss vs, made the first regular season pitching appearance of his career (1ip, 1h, 1er, 2bb, Paul DeJong K, 29 pitches)...was his second Major League appearance on the mound...while playing for the Blue Jays, in Game 4 of the 2015 American League Championship Series recorded 1 out in the ninth inning of the 14-2 loss to the Royals...he still is the only position player ever to pitch in a Major League Postseason game.
- Made his 2 starts on 4/2 vs Chi (SS) and Mon at Phi (3B).
- Was 1 of 3 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF Phil Gosselin, RHP Kevin Quackenbush).
- In 2017 for LAA played 2B (47g, 35gs), 3B (18g, 11gs) and SS (18g, 18g, 4gs).
- Following the 2017 season became a free agent and on 2/15/18 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invite to Major League spring training camp.

### 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Road Trip: 7gs, 9-25 (.360), 1 2b, 2sb, 3r

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Has a season-high 4-game hitting streak (7-17, .412, 3 2b, 2sb), including 5 hits in his last 2 apps (5-8, 3 2b, 3r)...last night's game was the 13th of his career in which he produced at least 3 hits (career high is 4 hits, 3 times).
- Since an 0-for-12 start to the season is hitting .400 (12-30), including last night's 3-hit game and three 2-hit games, with at least 1 hit in 7 of his last 8 apps.
- Has made all 11 of his appearances and starts at SS.
- In the batting order has hit second (4gs), seventh (5gs) and eighth (2gs)...made each of his last 4 starts batting second and hit safely in each (7-17, .412, 3 2b, 2sb).

### 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Disabled since Mon, 4/9

- Has not played since 4/1 vs Wsh, when in the third game of the season he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- Monday went on the 10-day disabled list, retroactive to 4/6, with a right ulnar nerve contusion...is eligible to be reinstated Tuesday.
- The injury interrupted a 3-game hitting streak to begin the season.
- Spring Training: 19g, .413, 3hr, 16rbi, 2sb...ranked among the Cactus League leaders in RBI (16), total bases (33) and hits (19)...led the team in those 3 categories and tied for the team lead in doubles (5)...hit safely in 11 of his 19 apps...produced at least 1 RBI in 9 of his last 14 apps (15rbi), including at least 1 RBI in 6 of his last 9 apps (11rbi)...from 3/4-3/7 produced base hits in 8 consecutive at bats (3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi)
- Made his third straight Opening Day roster.
- In 2017, in his first full season in the Major Leagues became just the seventh right fielder in Reds history to produce at least 30 HR (Jay Bruce 3 times, Frank Robinson 3, Dave Parker 2, Wally Post 2, Ival Goodman, Ken Griffey Jr.).
- Among National League leaders ranked eighth in HBP (14) and HR ratio (15.8ab).

### 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Disabled since Mon, 4/9

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Hasn't played since 4/8 at Pit, when in the fourth inning he was hit on the right thumb by a Jameson Taillon pitch...the next day was disabled with a fractured right thumb... is eligible to be reinstated on Thursday, the off day in St. Louis.
- The injury prevented him from extending a 4-game hitting streak (6-15, .400, 1 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.
- In 2017 received the Joe Nuxhall Good Guy Award in voting of the local chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 7gs, 9-29 (.310), 3rbi, 11bb

- Did not play last night, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976...was the second-longest games started streak in the Major Leagues behind KC's Alices Escobar (342g).
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,441), 1,600 hits (1,598) and 1,000 walks (998).
- Has 2 walks this season and 998 in his career...will join Pete Rose (1,210) as the only players in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks.
- Produced at least 2 hits in 4 of his last 6 apps (9-25, .360, 3rbi, 3r), including a season-high 3 hits on Wed at Phi.
- Last Fri at Pit went 2-for-4 to snap an 0-for-10 skid and to end a streak of 8 plate apps without reaching base safely...was his longest hitless drought since an 0-for-14 skid last season (7/20-7/24) and his most consecutive plate apps without reaching base since 4/18-4/21, 2016 (12pa)...never in his career has appeared in more than 3 consecutive games without reaching base safely.
- In the 2017 NL MVP Award voting finished second by 2 points to Mia's Giancarlo Stanton in the fourth-closest vote ever.
- Joined Babe Ruth (1921, 1924, 1926, 1930) and Ted Williams (1941, 1942, 1949) as the only players in Major League history to produce in a season at least 179 hits, 36 HR and 134 walks with 83 strikeouts or fewer.
- Joined Babe Ruth (35 in 1930) and Lou Gehrig (33 in 1936) as the only players in their age-33 seasons or older to produce at least 175 hits, 130 walks and a .450 on-base percentage...Votto turned 34 in September.
- Was the only player in the Major Leagues to produce at least 26 HR and 100 RBI while hitting .300 with an on-base percentage of .400 and a slugging percentage of .500.

- Has made 7 starts in RF and 3 starts in LF...leads the team with 8 starts batting leadoff...last night made his first career start batting third in the order.
- Last Fri at Pit collected 3 hits, while Colin Moran of the Pirates had 4 hits...they are 2 of just 7 Major League rookies to collect 3 or more hits in a game this season.
- Ranks among National League rookie leaders in most offensive categories, including on-base percentage (.400, 3rd)...leads NL rookies with 2 outfield assists, both on 4/6 at Pit.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Started in LF on Opening Day, batting leadoff.
