2B Ozzie Albies hit a grand slam last night for his 11th home run this season.

Last night was the Braves' 36th game of the season and in MLB history only six players 21 years old or younger have reached 11 home runs in a season quicker than Albies.

Three of those players are Hall of Famers: Orlando Cepeda in 1958, Eddie Mathews in 1953 and Mel Ott in 1929.

The other three have 1,547 career home runs between them: Miguel Cabrera in 2004, José Canseco in 1986, and Albert Pujols in 2001.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Marlins continue a four-game set tonight with the fourth game of the Braves' third road trip of the season...This is the first meeting between the clubs this season...The teams will play again next weekend in Atlanta, May 18-May 20.

A The Braves went 11-8 against the Marlins last season, including 4-5 at Marlins Park...The four wins tied for the fewest the Braves ever recorded at the park in a single season since its opening in 2012 (also went 4-5 in 2014)...With last night's win, the Braves improved to 36-19 at Marlins Park and have the best winning percentage (.655) at the park by a N.L. team.

WINS: The Braves improved to 22-14 with last night's win and have the second best record in the N.L. behind only Arizona's 24-13 mark.

A The Braves also lead the N.L. in run differential at +53...Chicago is second with a +43 mark.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves won their eighth consecutive road game last night, and have outscored the opposition 50-8 over this stretch...Their eight-game road winning streak is the club's longest single-season road run since 2009, when they took a franchise record-tying 10 consecutive away from Turner Field September 10-September 27...They also took 10 straight road games in 1992 and 1994..

A Across multiple seasons, the franchise record for consecutive road wins is 12, September 25, 1993-April 17, 1994.

A The Braves have gone 14-7 (.667) away from SunTrust Park this season, the best road winning percentage in the N.L...The staff has also compiled the fifth-best road ERA in the majors at 3.04 (64 ER/189.2 IP).

A Only Colorado (23), Boston (23) and Pittsburgh (22) have played more road games in the majors than the Braves.

GRAND SLAM: 2B Ozzie Albies hit the Braves' first grand slam of the season last night, driving a 1-1 pitch out to right field...The drive marked Albies' first career slam and he became the youngest Braves player (21 years, 123 days) to hit a grand slam since fellow Curaçao native Andruw Jones on August 31, 1997 at Boston... Jones was 20 years, 130 days at the time of his slam.

A Albies became just the 10th Braves player since the franchise moved to Atlanta in 1966 to hit a grand slam from the leadoff spot and the first since Jace Peterson did it on May 16, 2015 also at Marlins Park.

A Albies' drive was the Braves' 10th home run this season with at least two runners on base...That total is tied for the second most in the majors and one off the lead off Philadelphia.

5-FOR-5: 1B Freddie Freeman finished 5-for-5 last night, his first career five-hit game...He became the first Braves player to collect five hits in a game since OF Ender Inciarte also went 5-for-5 on August 30 at Philadelphia in game one of a doubleheader.

A Freeman has gone 26-for-71 (.366) over his last 17 games to raise his season average to .326...That mark is fifth highest in the N.L.

A Freeman saw 10 total pitches on his way to his five-hit night, including hitting the first pitch of his sixth-inning at-bat over the fence in right field... Freeman is hitting .462 (12-for-26) on the first pitch of at-bats this season...In the N.L., only José Peraza (32), teammate Ozzie Albies (29) and Joey Votto (28) have more plate appearances ending after the first pitch than Freeman (27).

STARTERS SCORELESS: RHP Mike Foltynewicz tossed 5.0 innings and allowed one unearned run last night, earning his third win of the season.

A Braves starters have not allowed an earned run on the road over their last five starts, totaling 31.0 innings.

A Over the eight-game road winning streak, the Braves starting staff owns a 0.56 ERA (3 ER/48.1 IP).

THE OFFENSE: The Braves offense leads all of the majors in batting average (.271) and on-base percentage (.338), while leading the N.L. in slugging percentage (.442), runs (196), hits (351), doubles (79) and extra-base hits (128).

A With four runs tonight, this Braves team would become the third quickest club to 200 runs in a season in modern franchise history...Tonight is the Braves' 37th game of the season...The 1900 Boston Beaneaters hold the record, reaching the mark in the 34th game, while the 1998 team crossed 200 runs in game No. 36...The 1999 also reached 200 runs in game No. 37.

STOLEN BASES: OF Ender Inciarte swiped another base last night and now leads the majors with 16 steals... The Braves are third in the majors with 28 steals this season.

A Inciarte has been successful on his last nine steal attempts and 12 of 13...His single-season career-high total is 22, set last year.

WITH TWO OUTS: The Braves scored eight of their nine runs with two outs last night, and now have a MLB-most 96 two-outs runs this season...They also lead the majors with 138 hits, a .305 batting average, a .506 slugging percentage and a .387 on-base percentage in these situations.

A The top three two-out averages among N.L. qualifiers belong to Braves: Nick Markakis (.429), Freddie Freeman (.426) and Dansby Swanson (.372).

Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his eighth start of the season and the 190th (248th appearance) of his career.
- A* Is a perfect 2-0 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER/19.2 IP) over three career appearances, all starts, against Miami...Allowed Marlins batters to hit just .186 (13-for-70) against him.
- A* Made a pair of starts against Miami last season and allowed five runs over 10.2 innings (4.22 ERA)...Started at Marlins Park on 7/14 and allowed seven hits and four runs 4.2 innings.
- A* Tossed the third shutout of his career, 5/18/13 at Marlins Park while with Arizona...D-backs outfielder Gerardo Parra homered on the first pitch of the first inning to account for the game's only run.
- A* Received 29 runs of support in his seven starts, and ranks third in the National League with a run support average of 7.39 per 9.0 innings.
- A* Opponents are batting .375 (12-for-32) with a .474 on-base percentage leading off an inning...Five of the last 10 batters leading off an inning against him have reached.
- A* McCarthy's .375 average against him leading off an inning is highest in the National League and second highest in the majors...Only NYY's Sonny Gray (.433) is allowing a higher average at the outset of an inning.

2018 Recap

- A* Allowed a career-high eight runs over just 3.1 innings in his last start, 5/5 vs. SF, to take his first loss of the season...Surrendered 12 hits and one walk while fanning two.
- A* Started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...Previously opened the season 3-0 in 2009, 2015 and 2017 before dropping his next decision...Became the first Braves starter to open a season 4-0 since Williams Perez, who did so to start his 2015 campaign.
- A* Went 5.1 innings and allowed five hits and one run over 5.1 innings, 4/29 at PHI, to earn the win...Three of his four wins this season have come against Philadelphia.
- A* Is one of two pitchers in the majors this season to defeat a single opponent three times...KC's Jakob Junis is also 3-0 against Detroit.
- A* Allowed a season-high five runs (three earned) over 5.0 innings, 4/24 at CIN... Surrendered a pair of solo home runs.
- A* Moved to 1-2 with a 7.85 ERA (16 ER/18.1 IP) in his career against the Reds, his highest ERA against any one team.
- A* Earned his second win over Philadelphia after holding the Phillies to five hits and one run over 5.1 innings, 4/18...Fanned a season best six batters.
- A* Atlanta won the game 7-3, and moved to 4-0 in McCarthy's starts this season... That is the longest run of wins for the Braves to open the season in starts by one pitcher since the club also won each of Shelby Miller's first four starts in 2015.
- A* Limited Washington to four hits and one run, 4/11 at Nationals Park, but did not earn the win...Is winless in four career starts against the Nationals.
- A* Went 6.0 innings and allowed five hits and three runs, 4/6 at COL...Walked two and fanned four to earn his second win of the season.
- A* Tossed the first "quality start" by a Braves pitcher and was the first Braves starter to complete 6.0 innings with the outing, Atlanta's seventh game of the season.
- A* Earned the win in his Braves debut, 3/31 vs. PHI...Allowed six hits and two runs over 5.1 innings in a 15-2 Atlanta win...Only one Braves starter last season earned the win his team debut; Max Fried on 9/3 at CHI.
- A* The win was the first of his career against the Phillies, and he is now winless against just four major league franchises...Has never defeated Milwaukee (0-0), St. Louis (0-1) or Washington (0-2), and is also winless in two career starts against Atlanta.
- A* Acquired by Atlanta along with LHP Scott Kazmir, INF Charlie Culberson, INF Adrián González and cash considerations from the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for OF Matt Kemp on 12/16/17.

2017 Recap

- A* Appeared in 19 games, 16 starts, in his third season with the Dodgers, while also missing 73 games over three different disabled list stints...Missed time from 5/5-6/26 (dislocated left shoulder), 6/26-7/8 (right knee tendonitis) and 7/21-9/22 (blister on right third finger).

Career Recap

- A* Is in his 13th major league season with his seventh organization...Started with the Chicago White Sox (2005-06), before joining the Texas Rangers (2007-09), the Oakland Athletics (2011-12), the Arizona Diamondbacks (2013-14), the New York Yankees (2014) and the Los Angeles Dodgers (2015-16).
- A* Made four regular season starts (3-0, 5.87 ERA) in 2015 before being placed on the DL with a torn UCL in his right elbow.... Underwent "Tommy John" surgery performed by Dr. Neal ElAttrache on 4/30.
- A* Struck on the right side of his head by an Erick Aybar line drive in the fourth inning on 9/5/12 vs. LAA, suffering an epidural hemorrhage, brain contusion and a skull fracture...Did not pitch again for the remainder of the season.

Jesse Biddle • LHP • 6-5 • 220 • 26 yrs • #63

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 7/5 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 3/3

- Right-handed batters have just two hits, both singles, in 22 at-bats (.091) against him...Lefties are hitting .455/.538/.909 with five hits, two walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI.
- Allowed the first two runs of his major league career, 5/4 vs. SF...Surrendered a two-run home run to Brandon Crawford in the top of the seventh.
- Went 2.0 innings and fanned a career-most five batters, 4/29 at PHI...Became the first Atlanta reliever to strike out at least five batters in 2.0 or fewer innings since Dario Álvarez did so on 6/15/16...Just four Atlanta relievers have had an outing of five strikeouts in 2.0 or fewer innings since 2000.
- Made his major league debut, 4/21 vs. NYM, and tossed 1.0 scoreless inning...Earned the win when Atlanta walked off in the bottom of the ninth...Became the first Atlanta reliever to earn the win in his debut since Jed Bradley on 9/3/16 at PHI.
- Recalled from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/17, for his first appearance on an active roster.

Shane Carle • RHP • 6-4 • 210 • 26 yrs • #51

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 6 **1st Batter/Retired:** 16/12 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 10/3

- Converted his sixth hold of the season, 5/8 at TB...Six holds pace the club (tied) and are tied for second most in the majors among rookie pitchers (with A.J. Minter)...No rookie has paced the Atlanta staff in holds since Jonny Venters in 2010 (24).
- Holding right-handed batters to a .143 (6-for-42) average...Lefties are hitting .273 (9-for-33).
- Returned to action 5/5 vs. SF and tossed 1.0 scoreless inning...Threw two pitches and left with numbness in his right index finger and thumb in his last outing, 5/1 at NYM.
- Holding batters to a .171 (6-for-35) average with men on base and has allowed just three hits (3-for-25, .120) with runners in scoring position...Batters are hitting .257 (9-for-35) with no one on base.
- Tallied his first career win, 4/3 vs. WSH...Tossed 3.1 scoreless innings, while also stranding the bases loaded after entering the game in the third.
- Took the loss in his Braves debut, 3/30 vs. PHI...The loss was his first major league decision.

Sam Freeman • LHP • 5-11 • 180 • 30 yrs • #39

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 2 **1st Batter/Retired:** 20/15 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 18/3

- Has not allowed a hit to a left-handed batter this season (0-for-21).
- Allowed just two hits and two walks over his last six appearances, totaling 6.2 scoreless innings...Prior to his current run, allowed two hits, eight walks and eight runs (six earned) over four games (2.1 IP) from 4/14-23.
- Ranks tied for third in the majors with 20 appearances this season...Has pitched in 56% of Atlanta's games...Made a career-most 58 appearances last year.
- Tossed 1.1 scoreless innings to earn his first win of the season, 4/26 at CIN.
- Inherited the bases loaded, 4/19 vs. NYM, and allowed a sacrifice fly before stranding the remaining two runners...Has inherited an N.L.-most (tied) 18 runners, and has stranded 15 (83%)...Inherited just 19 runners last season.
- Took the loss, 4/23 at CIN...The loss snapped a streak of 190 consecutive games without a loss, the longest such active streak in the majors at the time...Freeman's run, which was the second-longest in MLB history, dated to 10/3/12...Only Trevor Miller (240 games, 2006-09) had a longer streak in MLB history.

Luiz Gohara • LHP • 6-3 • 265 • 21 yrs • #53

Saves/Opp: 1/1 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 1/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Made his season debut and tossed 3.0 innings of one-run relief, 5/10 at MIA, to earn his first professional save...The 3.0-inning save was the first for Atlanta since Kris Medlen on 4/27/14 vs. PIT.
- Recalled from Triple-A Gwinnett, 5/8, for his first appearance on the active roster this season...Opened the season on Atlanta's disabled list (left ankle sprain), before being returned from his rehab and optioned to Gwinnett on 4/27.
- Made four starts between Mississippi (AA) and Gwinnett (AAA), combining to go 0-3 with a 6.89 ERA (12 ER/15.2 IP) and 15 strikeouts...Went 4.1 innings in his last start, 5/2 at Charlotte, and allowed eight hits and six runs.
- Made five starts with Atlanta last season, going 1-3 with a 4.91 ERA...Spent time at three different levels of the Braves farm system before making his major league debut last September...Became the first Braves starter since 2004 to begin the year in Single-A and make his MLB debut later that season.
- Ranked by Baseball America as Atlanta's No. 2 prospect, and by MLB.com as the Braves' No. 4 farmhand.

A.J. Minter • LHP • 6-0 • 215 • 24 yrs • #33

Saves/Opp: 1/1 **Holds:** 6 **1st Batter/Retired:** 17/11 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 6/2

- Is a perfect 6-for-6 in hold chances and has converted his only save opportunity...Six holds are tied for the team lead (with S. Carle) and are tied for second among rookie pitchers in the majors (also with Carle)...No rookie has paced the Atlanta staff in holds since Jonny Venters in 2010 (24).
- Inherited the bases loaded, 5/9 at TB, and allowed two runs to score...The runs were the first inherited runners he has allowed to score in his career...Has stranded four of six runners this season and eight of 10 in his career.
- Earned the first save of his major league career with a scoreless ninth inning, 4/25 at CIN...Became the first left-handed pitcher to record a save for Atlanta since Jonny Venters logged five in 2011.
- Allowed a career high-tying three hits and two runs, 4/24 at CIN...Had surrendered just four hits total entering play...Had not allowed three hits or two runs since 8/27/17 vs. COL, his second career appearance.
- Appeared on consecutive dates times this season...His back-to-back outings on 4/3 and 4/4 vs. WSH marked the first time doing so in his career...Did so just once in the minors (7/23 and 7/24/17 with GWN)...Underwent "Tommy John" surgery in 2015.

Peter Moylan • RHP • 6-3 • 220 • 39 yrs • #30

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 17/8 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 10/5

- Allowed the first batter he has faced to reach base 53% percent of the time...Nine of 17 first batters have reached.
- Allowed at least one baserunner in 15 of his 17 outings this season, with his only two clean appearances lasting just 0.1 innings each...Opponents have 19 hits and nine walks over 12.0 innings of work (2.33 WHIP).
