LEADING OFF: Tonight the Halos play the final contest of six-game home stand (4-1) vs. **Texas** (June 1-3; 2-1) and **Kansas City** (June 4-6; 2-0)...Club seeks fourth series sweep of season with a win tonight...Last night marked Angels' fifth shutout victory of season (second of home stand) and second one-hitter on season (also April 3rd vs. Cleveland)...**Halos have won four of last five games since dropping four of previous five...** Angels went 14-15 in May and are 21-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...**Angels are 11-7-2 in 20 series...** Following on off-day tomorrow, LAA opens a nine-game road trip to **Minnesota** (June 8-10), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17).

ROYAL PAIN: Mike Trout, Justin Upton and Albert Pujols (Angels' 2-4 hitters) have each hit safely in all games they have played this season vs. Royals...

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME! On his 27th birthday last night, **Andrew Heaney** tossed his first career complete game and shutout...First shutout by an Angel since **Ricky Nolasco** on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...First complete game one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...First player to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.

SHO-KKKK: Shohei Ohtani has 57 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first seven career starts...57 Ks are already a club record through nine starts as well...Angels are 6-2 in his starts...**Is 2-1 with a 2.35 ERA (23 IP – 6 ER) at Angel Stadium this season.**

QUICK HIT: Last night, Justin Upton logged his sixth 3+ hit game of season matching his total from 2017; three of those six games have come against **KC**...Is hitting .545 (12-for-22) with two home runs against the **Royals** this season.

YOUNG BLOODS: Angels selected outfielder **Jordyn Adams** (1st round, 17th overall) out of Green Hope HS (Cary, NC) and INF **Jeremiah Jackson** (2nd round, 57th overall) from St. Luke's Episcopal School (Mobile, AL) on the first day of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...LAA chose high school players with both of their first two picks in a draft for the first time since 2010 when **Kaleb Cowart** (18th overall) and **Cam Bedrosian** (29th overall) were selected.

JUNE BUG: Mike Trout's .353 (184-for-521) career batting average in the month of June is the highest average amongst active players (min. 400 PA) in any month of the season...Is hitting .450 (9-for-20) so far this June.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 29 of last 34 games...**LAA starting pitchers have pitched to an A.L. best 2.61 ERA (199.2 IP – 58 ER) since May 1...** Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? Andrelton Simmons has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...**He has struck out just twice since May 1 (139 PA)...** Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fifth in A.L. batting .330...** Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

YOU READ THAT RIGHT: Mike Trout is on pace for a 14.2 WAR season...He ranks second in MLB with 19 HRs...**On pace for a career-best 50 homers...** Leads MLB with 147 total bases.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: Mike Scioscia posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons **Tommy Lasorda** (1,599).

MUY BIEN! Martín Maldonado has hits in 10 of last 13 games...**11 RBI his last 13 games...** Hitting .314 (27/86) with six doubles and three home runs since May 1 after entering month with a .156 average.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (57) and ranks third in wins (4)...Quality starts in five of eight outings on the mound...Has a hit in 23-of-32 games with an at-bat...3rd in A.L. among rookies in extra base hits with 15...His six HRs are third-most in A.L. amongst rookies (all six hit at home) while his 20 RBI rank fifth...Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April.

PUJOLS POINTS: Pujols sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632)...**Pujols** has 3,025 career hits – good for 27th all-time...**Rod Carew** is next on the all-time hit list at 3,053...**Pujols** collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just 4th player to log 600 HR and 3,000 hits (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**).

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 28 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through first 62 games...**Halos have issued 223 free passes, second-most in A.L...** Angels' bullpen has tossed 228.2 IP to rank second in A.L.

THIS N' THAT: Halo outfielders lead MLB with 15 OF assists (**Calhoun** tied for MLB lead with 7)...**Halos' average home attendance (37,090) ranks second in A.L...** Club boasts nine sellouts thru 34 home games...**LAA has 25 errors thru 62 games (third-fewest in A.L.) and rank third in circuit with a .989 fielding pct.**

Vs. ROYALS: LAA leads 2018 season series 5-0...Teams will play make-up game for April 15th on Monday, June 25 in KC (3:15 PM CT)...Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1...**LAA leads all-time series 295-286...** Albert Pujols is a career .314 (117/373) hitter with 24 HR and 82 RBI in 97 career games vs. Royals...**Mike Trout** is batting .349 (51/146) with 11 HR and 29 RBI in 40 G (.616 SLG) vs. KC...His .616 SLG pct. is highest by any opponent with 100 AB.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 6
(1964) Dean Chance pitched a club-record 14 innings (no decision) allowing just three hits (one through nine innings) while striking out 12 Yankees...Angels lost the game, 2-0 in 15 innings...Chance went on to capture the Cy Young award that season, going 20-9 with 15 complete games, 11 shutouts and a 1.65 ERA; **(1961) Lee Thomas** hit the first grand slam in club history off Milt Pappas at Baltimore leading the Angels to a 7-3 victory; **(2000)** The Rally Monkey is born as a video clip is displayed on the Jumbotron featuring the monkey in the bottom of the 9th as the Angels trail the San Francisco Giants 5-4...The Halos rally for two runs to win.

June 7
(1983) In the third inning vs. Chicago, **Daryl Sconiers**, **Reggie Jackson** and **Fred Lynn** all hit home runs; **(2014)** Trailing 5-0 to the White Sox in the 8th inning, the Angels scored six runs in the bottom of the 8th, highlighted by a game-tying grand slam by **Mike Trout**.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

4-1, 3.18 ERA

Leads A.L. rookies with 57 strikeouts this season

- **WELCOME TO THE SHO:** Making ninth start as a pitcher and fifth at home...Made Major League debut with Angels on Opening Day (March 29 at Oakland) as the starting designated hitter and made pitching debut April 1 at OAK...Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017 and had contract selected by Angels on March 27.
- **ANGELS STRIKEOUT RECORD:** Has recorded 57 strikeouts this season, which is an Angels record through a pitcher's first eight career starts...The 57 strikeouts are already a club record through nine starts as well (previous was 51 by **Bo Belinsky** in 1962).
- **ON THE LINE TODAY:** With three strikeouts today, would become fourth Japanese-born pitcher with 60+ strikeouts through his first nine Major League games, joining **Hideo Nomo** (75), **Masahiro Tanaka** (73) and **Yu Darvish** (63).
- **LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Wednesday at Detroit after tossing five innings and allowing one earned run on three hits with three walks and five strikeouts.
- **DAY & NIGHT:** Is 4-0 with a 2.18 ERA (33 IP – 8 ER) and 44 strikeouts in day games this season (5 GS) compared with an 0-1 record and a 5.84 ERA (12.1 IP – 8 ER) and 13 strikeouts in night games (3 GS).
- **SWING AND A MISS:** 52 of 57 (91.2%) strikeouts this season have come on a swinging strike three...*Leads the Majors (min. 40 IP) with a 35.3% swing and a miss rate this season.*
- **THE SPLITTER:** This season, opponents are batting .039 (2/51) against Ohtani's splitter...Opponents have a swing and miss rate of 57% against his splitter.
- **ROOKIE LEADER:** Leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (57) and opponent batting average (min. 30 IP) (.196) and ranks tied for third in wins (4) ...As a hitter (min. 50 PA), ranks second among A.L. rookies in OPS (.907), is third with a .289 batting average, tied for fourth in HR (6) and is tied for fifth in RBI (20).
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** Ranks second in A.L. this season (min. 40 IP) with an average fastball velocity of 96.9 MPH, behind only Yankees' **Luis Severino** (97.6 MPH)...*On April 27, Ohtani homered on a 97.2 MPH fastball from Severino.*
- **VS. KANSAS CITY:** First career pitching appearance vs. Royals tonight...In three games as a hitter vs. Kansas City, is batting .444 (4/9) with one double, one triple, three RBI and two runs scored.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks fifth start as a pitcher at The Big A...Is 2-1 with a 2.35 ERA (23 IP – 6 ER) with six walks and 33 strikeouts across the four home outings.
- **11+ K's:** On May 13, became third pitcher since 1908 with multiple 11+ strikeouts in two of first six games pitched, joining Brooklyn's **Karl Spooner** (1954) and Cubs' **Kerry Wood** (1998).
- **ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:** Was named the American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 innings pitched and also batting .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...Became the fifth Angels player to win the award, joining **Robb Quinlan** (July 2004), **Mike Trout** (May, June, July & Aug. 2012), **Matt Shoemaker** (Aug. 2014) and **Andrew Heaney** (July 2015)...He also joined **Babe Ruth** (June 1919) and **Walter Johnson** (July 1918) as the only players in the last 100 years (min. 40 PA) with multiple wins and a batting average of at least .359 in a calendar month. (STATS LLC)
- **HISTORIC HOME DEBUT:** Earned the win on April 8 vs. A's at Angel Stadium after tossing seven scoreless innings and allowing one hit and one walk with 12 strikeouts...*Retired each of his first 19 batters faced...*Became third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (**Steve Woodard**, MIL in 1997 and **Juan Marichal**, SF in 1960)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since **Jim Shaw** for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).
- **PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** On April 9, was named by Major League Baseball as the American League Player of the Week...In addition to tossing seven shutout innings with one hit allowed and 12 strikeouts in his start, also slashed .462/.500/1.154 with four runs scored, six hits, three home runs and seven RBI as a hitter.
- **NEARLY PERFECT:** After allowing HR to Matt Chapman in first start of year (April 1 at OAK), retired 35 of 38 batters faced (one hit & two walks) from 2nd inning on April 1 through the end of his second start on April 8...**Had a stretch of 27 consecutive batters retired** between 4th inning of first start and 7th inning of second start.
- **PITCHING DEBUT:** Earned the win in first career start on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum after working six innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts; all three runs allowed came on three-run HR by **Matt Chapman** in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced...Became second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' **Masato Yoshii** (4/5/98 vs. PIT)...Yoshii was Ohtani's pitching coach the last two seasons with the Nippon-Ham Fighters.
- **THE BABE AND I:** With his start on April 1 in Oakland, become first player to *start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher* within his team's first 10 games since **Babe Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC)...Last week, Ohtani became the first A.L. player to homer in 3 straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Ruth**, who did it in five seasons (1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1930). (STATS LLC)
- **TWO WAY COMPANY:** Ohtani is the third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (**Ken Brett** in 1973 and **Babe Ruth** in 1916)...The last time any player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher at any point within the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).
- **TOPPING THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *MLB.com* as the #1 prospect in all of baseball...Was rated as top Angels prospect by *Baseball America* and #2 overall in baseball.
- **HALOS FROM JAPAN:** This season, joins **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only two Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.
- **AT THE PLATE:** For additional batting notes, please see Ohtani's section in the Angels hitters section of the game notes.
- **CAREER IN JAPAN:** In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
