### THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

**1911** - Ty Cobb extends his hitting streak to 40 games as the Tigers defeat Cleveland, 14-6.

**1970** - Joe Niekro carries a no hitter into the ninth inning against the Yankees before allowing a single to Horace Clarke. The Tigers won the game, 5-0.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers snapped their 11-game losing streak with a 9-1 win over the Blue Jays on Sunday afternoon at Rogers Centre. Niko Goodrum was a perfect 4x4 at the plate with three runs scored and a double, while Nicholas Castellanos added two hits, including a grand slam, and drove in four runs. José Iglesias and JaCoby Jones each had two hits and two RBI. Jordan Zimmermann started for the Tigers and improved his record to 3-0, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing one run on five hits with six strikeouts. The Tigers and Blue Jays play the finale of their four-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the road trip continues tomorrow with a two-game Interleague series against the Chicago Cubs (July 3-4).

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Tigers today announced the following roster moves:

\* Placed OF Leonys Martin on the 10-day disabled list with a left hamstring strain.

\* Placed RHP Shane Greene on the 10-day disabled list with a right shoulder strain.

\* Recalled OF Mikie Mahtook from Triple A Toledo.

\* Reinstated LHP Daniel Stumpf from the 10-day disabled list.

**IGLESIAS, FIERS EARN JUNE HONORS:** José Iglesias and Mike Fiers have been selected as the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for June. Iglesias played in 28 games during the month, hitting .304 (28x92) with six runs scored, six doubles, two triples and nine RBI. Iglesias ranked tied for second in the American League with two triples during the month. Fiers started five games in June, compiling a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA (30.0IP/11ER) and 27 strikeouts. He limited opponents to a .239 (28x117) batting average during the month.

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits, including his fourth career grand slam, and drove in four runs in yesterday's game to record his team-leading 33rd multi-hit game of the season, which ranks tied for second in the American League. Castellanos also ranks third in the AL with 103 hits, fifth with 26 doubles, seventh with 174 total bases, tied for eighth with three triples and 42 extra-base hits and 10th with a .310 (103x332) batting average. Over his last 14 games, Castellanos has a slash line of .340/.407/.811 with 10 runs scored, four doubles, seven home runs and 19 RBI.

**AIR JORDAN:** Jordan Zimmermann tied his longest outing of the season yesterday, tossing 7.0 innings and giving up just one run on five hits and six strikeouts. Over his last five starts, Zimmermann has posted a 2-0 record with a 1.24 ERA (29.0IP/4ER) and 23 strikeouts. With Zimmermann's outing, it marked the fifth straight game that a Tigers pitcher has thrown 6.0-or-more innings, the longest streak since July 28-August 2, 2017, when they had six consecutive starts of at least 6.0 innings.

**GOODY TWO SHOES:** Niko Goodrum recorded the first four-hit game of his Major League career yesterday, going 4x4 with three runs scored and a double. Prior to yesterday's four-hit performance, Goodrum had been just 2x30 in his previous nine games. Goodrum became the fourth Tigers player to have four hits in a game this season, joining Miguel Cabrera, Jeimer Candelario and Nicholas Castellanos.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** Today's game marks the 22nd time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 12-9 against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .278 (187x672) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers lead the American League with a .278 batting average vs. lefties, while they are second with a .446 slugging percentage and fourth with a .337 on-base percentage. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .434 (33x76) batting average vs. lefties, while José Iglesias ranks eighth in the American League with a .333 (17x51) batting average.

**TIGERS AND BLUE JAYS:** The Tigers and Blue Jays have split the first six games of the season series and will play the rubber game today. Detroit is looking to win its first season series against the Blue Jays since 2013. The Tigers lost two-of-three games at Rogers Centre last season, marking the fourth straight series they have dropped in Toronto.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers are 1-2 on their current six-game road trip, which includes four games at Toronto (1-2) and two games at Chicago (NL) (July 3-4). Detroit is currently in a stretch that will see them play 20-of-28 games away from Comerica Park leading up to the All-Star break. The Tigers are 14-27 on the road this season and have lost seven of their last eight road games. As a team, Detroit is hitting .236 (334x1414) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.73 ERA (346.1IP/182ER).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY ON DECK:** The Tigers continue their 20-game Interleague schedule tomorrow as they begin a two-game series at Chicago (NL). The Tigers and Cubs last met in 2015, when Detroit won three-of-four games. Detroit is 1-7 against National League opponents this season after going 0-2 vs. Cincinnati and 1-5 vs. Pittsburgh. The Tigers have an all-time record of 207-184 (.529) in Interleague play. Detroit is one of nine teams with 200-or-more wins in Interleague play, joining New York (AL), Boston, Los Angeles (AL), Texas, Oakland, Chicago (AL), Minnesota and Seattle.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\* Enters today's game with a 37-48 (.435) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,105-1,087 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\* Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\* Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\* Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\* Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\* Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**ABOUT MIKE:** Fiers will make his 16th start of the season this afternoon in the series finale at Toronto.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fiers threw 7.0 strong innings in his last start on Wednesday vs. Oakland, but took the loss after allowing one run on five hits with one walk and five strikeouts.

**VS. TORONTO:** Fiers has faced the Blue Jays six times in his career, including five as a starter, posting a 1-3 record with a 4.11 ERA (30.2IP/14ER) and 34 strikeouts. He made two starts against Toronto last season and went 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0IP/7ER) and 12 strikeouts.

**ON THE ROAD:** Fiers has made 74 career appearances, including 64 starts, on the road, and carries a 22-25 record with a 4.63 ERA (361.2IP/186ER) and 327 strikeouts. In seven road starts this season, Fiers is 2-3 with a 5.15 ERA (36.2IP/21ER) and 27 strikeouts.

**AT ROGERS CENTRE:** Fiers is making his third career start at Rogers Centre this afternoon. In his two previous starts in Toronto, Fiers is 0-2 with a 5.91 ERA (10.2IP/7ER) and 13 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Fiers has pitched in 21 games, including 19 as a starter, in his career against teams from the American League East, posting a 6-6 record with a 4.13 ERA (117.2IP/54ER) and 108 strikeouts. In three starts vs. AL East opponents this season, Fiers is 1-2 with a 5.19 ERA (17.1IP/10ER) and 15 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN JULY:** Fiers has started 19 games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 7-7 record with a 2.89 ERA (112.0IP/36ER) and 115 strikeouts. In five July starts last season, Fiers went 2-2 with a 2.89 ERA (28.0IP/9ER) and 40 strikeouts.

**TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR JUNE:** Fiers was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA (30.0IP/11ER) and 27 strikeouts. He limited opponents to a .239 batting average (28x117) during the month.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .251 (373x1484) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .259 (424x1639) against him. In 15 starts this season, lefties are hitting .256 (42x164), while righthanded batters are hitting .277 (48x173).

**IMPRESSIVE TIGERS DEBUT:** Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

**TOSSING A NO-NO:** Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.
