HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs 4-1 start matches the best 5-game start in franchise history (also: 2017, '13, '12 and '00)...they started 5-1 in each of those seasons.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 8 consecutive regular-season games vs. Dodgers, matching the team record vs. Dodgers (3x; last: July 6-Aug. 3, 2012).
- ♦ A win today would give the Arizona its third consecutive regular season sweep vs. Los Angeles...the only opponent the D-backs have recorded 3 or more consecutive sweeps against was the Reds from May 15, 2001-June 22, 2003 in 4 straight series [min. 3-game series].
- ♦ Arizona has won 4 consecutive series vs. Dodgers for the first time since Sept. 11, 2012-June 12, 2013.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** needs 2 strikeouts to tie Ian Kennedy (661) for fourth place on the D-backs' all-time list.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** has reached base safely in 30 consecutive games vs. Dodgers @ Chase Field since July 10, 2013, the longest such streak vs. Los Angeles in franchise history.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs earned their second series victory of the season, beating the Dodgers, 6-1.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** earned the win, tossing 7.0 innings of 1-run baseball...**Yoshihisa Hirano** and **T.J. McFarland** each posted a scoreless frame.
- ♦ **Dankel Descalso** and **David Peralta** each hit a home run, the first set of left-handed teammates to homer in the same game vs. Clayton Kershaw...**John Ryan Murphy** hit his first home run since Sept. 4, 2016 vs. White Sox as a member of the Twins.

- ♦ Prior to yesterday's game, the D-backs placed INF **Jake Lamb** (left AC joint sprain) on the 10-day disabled list and recalled RHP **Matt Koch** (pronounced: COOK) from Triple-A Reno.

- ♦ The D-backs' 8-game regular season winning streak vs. Dodgers is tied for the fifth-longest winning streak against a single opponent in franchise history:

FREQUENT FLYER MILES

- ♦ Following today's game, the D-backs kick off their road portion of the schedule with a 9-game, 11-day trip to St. Louis (April 5-8), San Francisco (April 9-1) and Los Angeles (April 13-15).
- ♦ The D-backs will travel 36,460 miles this season, the seventh most in the Majors behind the Mariners (40,783), A's (39,906), Angels (39,125), Astros (39,080), Padres (38,759) and Marlins (36,484)...the Reds fly the fewest (20,738) [source: MLB.com].

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 5 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017, as well as 16 of their last 19 since Aug. 12 of last year.

FROM THE TRAINING TABLE

- ♦ **Randall Delgado** threw 20 pitches in a simulated game yesterday against D-backs Minor Leaguers.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** played catch from 150 feet yesterday and hit in the batting cage.

WALK THIS WAY

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Majors with 31 walks, ahead of the Nationals (30), Marlins (29) and Astros (25).
- ♦ 31 walks are the most by a team in the first 5 games since the 2010 Phillies (32)...since 2000, only the 2005 Padres (35), 2003 Cubs (33), 2006 Reds (32) had more walks in the first 5 games.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** ranks second in the Majors with 9 walks (Freddie Freeman/ATL - 10).

CORBIN AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Sixth full season with Arizona (seventh overall).
- ◆ Makes his first career Opening Day start today.
- ◆ Selected to the 2013 NL All-Star Team, named D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA and was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- ◆ Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Is looking to start 2-0 for the second time in his career (9-0 in 2013).
- ◆ Needs 2 strikeouts to tie Ian Kennedy (661) for fourth place on the D-backs' all-time list.
- ◆ Aims for his first win vs. Dodgers since Sept. 11, 2013 @ Dodger Stadium and first @ Chase Field since April 12, 2013.

OPENING DAY NOD

- ◆ Won his first career Opening Day start on March 29 vs. Rockies (2 ER in 5.2 IP).
- ◆ Was announced as the D-backs' 2014 Opening Day starter vs. Dodgers in Sydney, Australia, before undergoing Tommy John Surgery...left his final Cactus League start on March 15 with elbow discomfort.

VS. DODGERS

- ◆ Was 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (6 ER in 10.2 IP) in 2 starts in 2017 and is 3-9 with 2 saves and a 4.42 ERA (39 ER in 79.1 IP) in 16 games (14 starts) in his career.
- ◆ Is 1-5 with 2 saves and a 5.05 ERA (20 ER in 35.2 IP) in 8 games (6 starts) @ Chase Field.

UNDER THE SUN

- ◆ Went 2-0 with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER in 22.1 IP) over his final 3 day starts in 2017 and is 5-2 with a 2.28 ERA (15 ER in 59.1 IP) in 9 day starts since Jun 8, 2017.

2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Tied his career highs in wins (14), starts (32) and strikeouts (178).
- ◆ Among all Major League pitchers, was seventh in ground ball percentage (51.5) and eighth in ground ball-to-fly ball ratio (2.01, 296:147).
- ◆ Posted a career-high 20.1-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 6-22, the seventh longest streak in the NL in 2017.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ 2007 graduate of Cisero North Syracuse (N.Y.) High School...did not play baseball until his junior year...went to tryouts wearing jeans and told coaches he wanted to be a pitcher.
- ◆ Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
- ◆ Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

TENURE

- ◆ Made his Major League debut for the D-backs on April 30, 2012 @ Marlins, the third-longest tenured player with the club currently on the roster, behind only Paul Goldschmidt (debut: Aug. 1, 2011) and A.J. Pollock (April 18, 2012).
- ◆ His 121 career starts for Arizona are the fourth most in club history, trailing only Randy Johnson (232), Brandon Webb (198) and Brian Anderson (129).

ON THE D-BACKS LEADERBOARD

- ◆ His 46 career wins are second most by a D-backs lefty behind Randy Johnson (118), and fifth-most in team history behind Johnson (118), Brandon Webb (87), Curt Schilling (58) and Ian Kennedy (48).
- ◆ His 659 strikeouts are second-most by a lefty behind Johnson (2,077) and fifth-most in club history behind Johnson (2,077), Webb (1,065), Schilling (875) and Kennedy (661).

HOME SWEET HOME

- ◆ Went 9-4 with a 3.15 ERA in 17 starts at home in 2017 (1-8 with a 5.57 ERA in 2016).
- ◆ The 9 home wins were tied for second in the NL with Jhoulys Chacin, Clayton Kershaw, Aaron Nola and Alex Wood, trailing only teammate Zack Greinke (13).
- ◆ Allowed 3 or fewer runs in 14 of his 17 starts @ Chase Field last season.

#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R

LAD Series: 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has a 9-game scoreless streak (9.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Save on March 30 vs. Rockies was his first since Oct. 1, 2015.
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R

LAD Series: 0 ER/2.0 IP, 2 K

- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever.
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in several categories, including holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA and ranked among the team's all-time single-season reliever leaders in holds (T-4th).
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

LAD Series: 1 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).
- ◆ Has lived in a RV during the season since 2016.

#29 • JORGE DE LA ROSA • L/L

LAD Series: 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has an 8-game scoreless streak (5.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 22, 2017.
- ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
- ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017, his first as primarily a reliever since 2006 with the Brewers and Royals...lefties hit .194/.253 OBP/.292 SLG.
- ◆ Led the Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR) in 2017, tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010)...stranded his first 24 inherited runners to start the season (allowed run on Aug. 18 @ Twins).
- ◆ 1 of 5 Mexican-born pitchers with 100+ wins (104), joining Fernando Valenzuela (173), Esteban Loaiza (126), Yovani Gallardo (113) and Ismael Valdez (104).

LAD Series: 1 ER/2.0 IP, K

- ◆ Made his Major League debut on March 29 vs. Rockies, the second player of Japanese descent to play for the D-backs. (also: Takashi Saito in 2012).
- ◆ Appeared in 58 games for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017, going 3-7 with 29 saves and 2.67 ERA.
- ◆ Led the NPBL in saves (40) in 2014 and earned the league's Most Valuable Middle Reliever honors in 2011...played 12 seasons (2006-17) with Orix, going 48-69 with 156 saves, a 3.10 ERA and 884 strikeouts in 549 appearances (68 starts).
- ◆ Pitched for Team Japan in the 2017 World Baseball Classic (1-0, 3.38 ERA).
