SEATTLE MARINERS:

- **Nelson Cruz** (2x5, 2 R, HR, RBI) has homered in four consecutive games, a season-high...marks the 4th time in his career to homer in at least 4 straight games (last: 5, 7/31-8/4/15)
 - Recorded his 115th RBI of the season, extending his career-high (previous: 108, 2014 w/BAL)...Cruz is the 9th Mariner (done 17x) to collect at least 115 RBI in a single season (last: Raul Ibanez, 123 RBI, 2006).
 - Has reached base safely via hit or walk in 18 of his last 19 games, batting .338 (23x68) with 16 runs, 2 doubles, 6 home runs, 12 RBI and 12 walks.
- **Andrew Moore** pitched four innings allowing five hits, three runs, two earned runs and striking out three.
 - Has not issued a walk in back-to-back starts and in 5 starts overall this season.
 - Has allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs in 6 of his 9 starts this year.
- **Mitch Haniger** (1x4, BB) is batting .341 (30x88) in the month of September with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, and 10 RBI in 21 games...has hit safely in 17 out of those 21 games, including 9 multi-hit games.
- **Robinson Cano** (1x5, RBI) has hit safely in 8 consecutive games, batting .364 (12x33) with 4 runs, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 2 walks.
 - Has recorded a hit in 16 of 21 games this month, batting .361 (30x83) with 11 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 16 RBI, 2 HBP and 6 walks.
- **Ben Gamel** (1x2, 2B) recorded his 25th double of the season, becoming the 8th Mariners rookie with at least 25 doubles in a single season (last: Kenji Johjima, 25 2B, 2006).
- **Marco Gonzales** made his 3rd relief appearance this season, pitching 2.0 scoreless innings while allowing 3 hits and striking out 2.
 - Has not allowed a run in relief this season, pitching 7.0 innings while recording 8 strikeouts and 1 walk.
- Seattle committed five errors today, equaling their season-high (also: 8/27 at NYY).

CLEVELAND INDIANS:

- Cleveland reached double-digits in runs for the 22nd time this season...is 21-1 in those games.
- **Francisco Lindor** (2x5, 3 R, 2B, HR, RBI) hit his 33rd home run of the season to lead off the game.
 - Marked Cleveland's 6th leadoff home run on the season and Lindor's third (last 9/12 vs. DET).
 - Set a club record for home runs in a season by a middle infielder, surpassing Hall of Fame second baseman Joe Gordon who hit 32 home runs in 1948.
 - Has 3 home runs in his last 4 games and 8 in the month of September.
- **Jose Ramirez** (3x3, R, HR, 4 RBI) hit his 28th home run of the season in the 9th inning, his 8th homer in 16 games this month.
 - Is batting .426 (26x61) with 14 runs, eight doubles, a triple, eight home runs and 18 RBI this month.
 - Set a career-high for RBI in a season today (previous: 76 RBI, 2016).
- **Yan Gomes** (3x5, 2 R, 2 HR, 4 RBI) recorded his 4th career multi-home run game (last: 9/1/15 at TOR).
- **Austin Jackson** (3x4, 3 R, 2B, RBI, BB) extended his hitting streak to 7 games...during the streak, he is batting (14x28) with 10 runs, 4 doubles, 3 RBI and 3 walks.
- **Carlos Carrasco** threw 5.2 innings, allowing six hits, one run, one earned run, two walks and struck out six.
 - Marked his 13th start this season allowing 1-or-fewer earned runs.
 - Has struck out 6-or-more batters in 24-of-32 starts this season.
 - In 17 road starts this season, is 11-2 record with a 2.65 ERA (31 ER in 105.1 IP) with 119 strikeouts.

CLEVELAND MANAGER TERRY FRANCONA:

On Carlos Carrasco coming out in the 6th:

"He's been great, they got a pretty good lineup. He got up around a hundred and they were starting to look like he left a couple balls up, and we were trying to get Andrew for the inning plus, so that seemed like a good time to do it."

On Jay Bruce:

"His heel has bothered him a little bit, it's been bothering him. He'll probably DH tomorrow, so I don't think it's anything that's – it's been bothering him on and off."

"I think it's his shoulder, and we won't play him tomorrow but I think he's going to get an x-ray, precautionary, but he was – you could see the way he was swinging, he was letting it go pretty good."
