RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers earned a series split against the Yankees with an 11-7 win on Sunday afternoon at Yankee Stadium. Victor Reyes had a career-high four hits, including his first Major League home run, and tied a career high with three RBI, while Nicholas Castellanos added three hits, including a two-run homer, his 20th of the season. Ronny Rodriguez contributed three hits and two RBI, and Dawel Lugo also had three hits with a RBI. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and earned his ninth win of the season, allowing three runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers begin the final leg of their three-city, nine-game road trip today as they open a three-game series at Chicago (AL). Following the series against the White Sox, Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (September 7-9) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

TO THE VICTOR GOES THE SPOILS: Victor Reyes had a career day at the plate on Sunday, hitting his first Major League home run and finishing the game 4x5 with two doubles and a career-high-tying three RBI. Reyes, who entered yesterday's game with five extra-base hits in 81 career games, established a career high with three extra-base hits.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Four Tigers rookies combined for 11 hits and seven RBI in yesterday's game as Niko Goodrum had a hit and a RBI, Dawel Lugo had three hits and a RBI, Victor Reyes had four hits and three RBI and Ronny Rodriguez added three hits and two RBI. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 11 hits were the second-most by Tigers rookies in a single game in franchise history, trailing only August 6, 1939 when Fred Hutchinson (4), Frank Croucher (3), Benny McCoy (3) and Barney McCosky (2) combined for 12 hits in the first game of a doubleheader vs. Boston. The 11 hits by rookies were the most in a game for a Major League team this season, and the most since September 14, 2017 when the White Sox had 12 hits by rookies in a game at Detroit.

DANDY DAWEL: Dawel Lugo posted the second three-hit game of his Major League career and recorded his first big league RBI in Sunday's game. Lugo, who was playing in the fourth game of his Major League career yesterday, is the fourth Tigers player since 1908 to have multiple three-hit games in the first four games of his big league career and the first since Tim Corcoran in 1977.

NICK THE STICK: Nicholas Castellanos recorded his 16th three-hit game of the season yesterday, going 3x5 with a double, a home run and two RBI. Castellanos' 16 three-hit performances are the third most in the Majors, trailing only Seattle's Jean Segura (19) and Cincinnati's Scooter Gennett (17). His home run on Sunday was his 20th of the season, marking his second consecutive 20-homer season. Castellanos has hit safely in eight of his last 11 games, batting .356/.408/.556 with seven runs scored, three doubles, two home runs and five RBI during that stretch.

MCCANN, CASTELLANOS VS. LÓPEZ: James McCann and Nicholas Castellanos have had success against today's White Sox starter, Reynaldo López. McCann enters today's game hitting .538/.538/.769 with one double, one triple and two RBI in his career vs. López, while Castellanos is hitting .444/.444/.667 with four doubles and two RBI.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 64th day game of the season (out of 138 games, 46.4%). Detroit has posted a 29-34 (.460) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 26-48 (.351) at night.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 2-4 on their current nine-game road trip, which includes two games at Kansas City (0-2), four games at New York (AL) (2-2) and three games at Chicago (AL) (September 3-5). Detroit is 21-48 (.304) on the road this season and has lost 28 of its last 36 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .233 (552x2371) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.05 ERA (584.1IP/328ER).

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers and White Sox renew acquaintances for the final time this season as they begin a three-game series this afternoon. Detroit is 10-6 against Chicago (AL) this season, clinching the season series for the eighth time in the last nine seasons. The Tigers are 6-0 at Guaranteed Rate Field this season, and their six-game winning streak in Chicago is the longest for the club since July 15, 1979-August 26, 1980, when they also won six in a row.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 26-34 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 10-6 vs. Chicago (AL), 4-12 vs. Cleveland, 6-7 vs. Minnesota and 6-9 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 55-82 (.401) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,123-1,121 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

MUD HENS WIN DIVISION TITLE: For the first time since 2007, Triple A Toledo has clinched a spot in the International League playoffs as they won the West Division title on Sunday. The Mud Hens will face Durham in the best-of-five semifinal series, which begins Wednesday at Fifth Third Field in Toledo.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 22nd start of 2018 this afternoon in the series opener at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer suffered his 10th loss of the season on Wednesday at Kansas City, allowing seven runs on eight hits with three strikeouts in 3.2 innings.

VS. CHICAGO (AL): Fulmer has faced the White Sox seven times in his career, posting a 2-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (42.2IP/16ER) and 28 strikeouts. In two starts vs. Chicago (AL) this season, Fulmer is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0IP/0ER) and eight strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Fulmer has made 38 road starts in his career, compiling a 14-17 record with a 4.12 ERA (227.0IP/104ER) and 192 strikeouts. In 10 road starts this season, Fulmer is 2-4 with a 6.06 ERA (52.0IP/35ER) and 53 strikeouts.

AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Fulmer will make his fourth career start at Guaranteed Rate Field today. In his three previous starts, Fulmer has posted a 1-1 record with a 3.44 ERA (18.1IP/7ER) and 12 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fulmer has started 28 games in his career against teams from the American League Central and has an 11-9 record with a 4.08 ERA (165.1IP/75ER) and 124 strikeouts. In eight starts vs. divisional opponents this season, Fulmer is 3-2 with a 3.74 ERA (43.1IP/18ER) and 33 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Fulmer has started five games in his career during the month of September, compiling a 1-2 record with a 4.76 ERA (28.1IP/15ER) and 24 strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT FULMER'S AUGUST: Fulmer was limited to two starts in August due to injury, and went 0-1 with a 7.56 ERA (8.1IP/7ER) and seven strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .243 (201x827) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .244 (205x841) against him. In 21 starts this season, righties are hitting .276 (58x210), while lefthanded batters are hitting .247 (62x251).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.
