NEW YORK YANKEES NOTES

- The Yankees won on a “walk-off” double in the 11th inning by Aaron Hicks...marked their eighth “walk-off” win of the season, their first since 8/28 vs. Chicago-AL (Neil Walk solo HR in ninth)...improved to 5-3 on their final regular season homestand...are 4-1 in their last 5G, 20-13 in their last 33G and 27-17 in 44G since 8/6.
- Coupled with the Rays’ loss at Toronto, **clinched their 54th postseason berth in franchise history** (116 seasons, 46.6%)...have qualified for the postseason in 20 of the last 24 seasons since 1995 (missed in 2008, ‘13-14, ‘16)...have gone to consecutive postseasons for the first time since 2009-12...marks their seventh AL Wild Card berth (1995, ‘97, 2007, ‘10, ‘15, ‘17-18) and their third appearance in the AL Wild Card Game (2015, ‘17-18).
- Are 36G above .500, tying their season-high watermark (sixth time, first since 90-54 at the end of play on 9/10).
- Earned their 95th win, matching the 2012 Yankees (95-67) for their highest win total since going 97-65 in 2011.
- Are 53-27 (.663) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the second-best home record in the Majors (Boston, 54-21, .720)...marks their second-most wins in a single season at the current Yankee Stadium (57-24 in 2009)...have won consecutive home series after going 1-4-1 in their previous six.
- **CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) **recorded his first “walk-off” hit as a Yankee** and third of his career (singles on 9/16/14 vs. Detroit and 5/15/14 vs. Boston, both with Minnesota)...hit his 26th HR of the season with a second-inning solo HR...has homered in two straight games...has an extra-base hit in four straight games after going 10 games without an XBH...is batting .375/.464/.792 (9-for-24) with 7R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 7RBI, 4BB and 1SB during his six-game hitting streak.
- **1B Luke Voit** (1-for-4) hit a solo HR in the second inning, his 11th HR as a Yankee and 12th overall this season...has 4HR and 8RBI in his last 4G...has 11HR in 25G since 8/24.
 - Is hitting .314/.385/.648 (33-for-105) with 22R, 2 doubles, 11HR, 25RBI and 11BB in 32G since joining the Yankees on 8/2.
- **3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4, 1 double) recorded his 50th multi-hit game of the season...**is the seventh Yankees rookie since 1913 to reach the mark**, joining Joe DiMaggio (66 in 1936), Earle Combs (65 in 1925), Tom Tresh (54 in 1962), Ben Chapman (52 in 1930), Derek Jeter (50 in 1996) and Phil Rizzuto (50 in 1941).
 - Hit his 42nd double of the season, tied for the second-most by a Yankees rookie (Joe DiMaggio-44 in 1936, Hideki Matsui-42 in 2003)...are second-most by a Major League rookie in the last 12 seasons since 2007 (Houston’s Yuli Gurriel-43 in 2017).
 - Has 69XBH this season (42 doubles, 2 triples, 25HR)...are third-most by a Yankees rookie (DiMaggio-88 in 1936, Aaron Judge-79 in 2017)...are tied for fourth-most by an MLB rookie in the last 12 seasons since 2007: Judge (79 in 2017), José Abreu (73 in 2014), Corey Seager (71 in 2016), Cody Bellinger (69 in 2017).
- **RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-3, 2BB) had his 12-game hitting streak vs. Baltimore snapped.
 - Extended his on-base streak vs. Baltimore to 32 games (since 9/3/16), tied for the fifth-longest vs. the O’s over the last 25 seasons (since 1994).
- **Yankees batters** have hit a franchise-record 251HR this season...**are the sixth team in Major League history to reach 250HR in a season**, joining the 1997 Mariners (264HR), 2005 Rangers (260HR), 2010 Blue Jays (257HR), 1996 Orioles (257HR) and 2016 Orioles (253HR).
- **Yankees relievers** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (5H, 2BB/1BB, 9K)...marked their longest scoreless outing since 8/21 at Miami (6.0IP)...struck out six consecutive batters from the final out of the seventh to the second out of the ninth.
- **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 2K) tossed a perfect seventh inning...was his second appearance since returning from the D.L. on 9/19.
- **RHP Dellin Betances** struck out all 3BF in a perfect eighth inning...was his first hitless outing since 9/9 at Seattle (hits in four straight coming in).
 - Has recorded at least 1K in 44 consecutive games (since 5/29), the longest such streak by a reliever in AL history and the third-longest in Baseball history behind Aroldis Chapman (49) and Corey Knebel (46)...has at least 1K in 62-of-64 appearances this season.
- **RHP Jonathan Holder** (1.0IP, 2H, 1BB) tossed a scoreless 10th, escaping a jam with runners on second and third and no outs.
- **RHP Lance Lynn** (5.0IP, 7H, 2R/1ER, 2BB, 4K) started and took a no-decision...has allowed 5R/4ER in 16.0IP (2.25 ERA) in his last three starts...has a 1.17 ERA (15.1IP, 2ER) in three games (two starts) vs. Baltimore this season.
- **Yankees starting pitchers** have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 12 of their last 14 starts, going 5-3 with a 2.64 ERA (75.0IP, 72H, 25R/22ER, 16BB, 67K, 5HR) over the span.

BALTIMORE ORIOLES NOTES

- The Orioles recorded their ninth “walk-off” loss of the season...are 0-2 on their six-game road trip, their final road trip of the year...have lost six straight *road* games (since 9/5).
 - Are 3-8 in their last 11 games and 7-16 in their last 23 games...fell to 21-51 vs. AL East foes this season.
 - Fell to 4-9 in extra-inning games this season.
- **RHP David Hess** (5.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 4BB, 5K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts, posting a 3.38 ERA (37.1IP, 14ER) in that span.
 - Is 3-4 with a 3.51 ERA (56.1IP, 22ER) in 11 starts vs. the AL East.
- **Baltimore batters** went 3-for-15 with RISP.
- **RF Adam Jones** (0-for-5) threw out Miguel Andújar at second base in the second inning to record his 100th career assist.
- **3B Steve Wilkerson** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1BB) has recorded multiple hits in two of his last three games.
- **LF DJ Stewart** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the fifth...is 6-for-11 with 4R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 1BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 4G.
- **CF Cedric Mullins** (2-for-6, 1RBI) has recorded multiple hits in back-to-back games for the first time since 8/18-19...has reached base safely in each of his last nine games, batting .378/.439/.514 (14-for-37) with 6R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 2SB over that span.
- **RHP Miguel Castro** (2.0IP, 1H, 1K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief...has posted a 1.84 ERA (14.2IP, 3ER) over his last 11 games (since 8/27).
- **C Caleb Joseph** (2-for-4, 1R) recorded only his second multi-hit game in his last 28 games since 8/1 (also 3H on 9/9 at Tampa Bay).
- **2B Breyvic Valera** (1-for-5, 1R) is 6-for-19 (.316) with 3R, 3RBI, 3BB and 1SB in his last seven games.
- **LHP Paul Fry** (0.1IP, 2H, 1ER, 1K) took his second loss of the season after allowing a “walk-off” double to Aaron Hicks in the 11th inning.
- **RHP Mychal Givens** (2.0IP, 2K) tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief.
