THE TWINS: After completing their 10-game, 11-day roadtrip with a record of 7-3 (3-1 at Chicago-AL, 2-0 at St. Louis and 2-2 at Los Angeles-AL), the Twins began their nine-game homestand with a loss to the Mariners last night in a makeup game from April 8...tonight they will begin a two game series with St. Louis...they will enjoy an off-day on Thursday, followed by three vs. Milwaukee this weekend and three vs. Detroit next week May 21-23...the Twins have won seven of their last 10 overall...additionally, they are 2-10 in series openers.

SOGGY NIGHT, SOGGY BATS: The Twins lost to the Mariners last night by a score of 1-0 in a makeup game from April 8 - it marked their first 1-0 loss since August 29, 2016 at Cleveland... Jake Odorizzi was the starter but did not factor into the decision, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and seven strikeouts...the Mariners scored in the eighth inning on a Logan Morrison throwing error on a Jean Segura sac-bunt...the Twins recorded four hits, did not draw a walk and put just two men in scoring position.

RIP, FRANK QUILICI: Former Twins manager/coach/player/broadcaster Frank Quilici passed away at age 78 from kidney disease yesterday at his home in Burnsville (MN)...Quilici spent his entire baseball career in the Twins organization after being signed by Minnesota as an amateur free agent prior to the 1961 season...a second baseman, Quilici made his major league debut in 1965 and appeared in 405 games for the Twins over five seasons (1965, 1967-70)...he was then hired by the Twins as a coach under manager Bill Rigney in 1971 and '72 before taking over the managerial duties for the final 84 games of 1972...Quilici went 280-287 in parts of four seasons as the Twins manager and joined the WCCO radio broadcast crew for the Twins from 1976-77 and 1980-82...Quilici is one of three people to ever manage, coach, play and broadcast for the Twins, the others being Tom Kelly and Paul Molitor. ☞ The service for Frank will be Friday at 11 am at St. Ambrose in Woodbury, MN.

IL PLAY, FOR THE RECORD: The Twins have gone 4-3 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-1 at Pittsburgh, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati and 2-0 vs. St. Louis...they have won 14 of their last 17 vs. the NL, dating back to August 2...the Twins play the NL Central this season, with 13 games remaining: St. Louis (2 home games), Milwaukee (6 games home and away), Chicago (3 games away), and Pittsburgh (2 home games)...the Twins are 207-182 all-time in Interleague Play, tied for fourth most wins in MLB since IL began in 1997...they are 93-103 all-time in road IL games and 114-79 at home.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .341 (28-for-82) with 10 doubles, seven home runs and 18 RBI in his last 20 games vs. NL opponents.

☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .306 (19-for-62) with seven home runs, 12 RBI, 15 runs scored and a .419 on-base percentage in his last 15 games vs. the NL...he has eight homers vs. the NL since the start of last season, tied for second most in baseball with José Abreu and Charlie Blackmon, and trailing Mike Trout (9).

☞ Joe Mauer is hitting .320 (272-for-851) with 57 doubles, five triples, 21 home runs, 114 RBI, 137 runs scored, 118 walks and a .402 on-base percentage in 232 games against the National League...he has reached safely in 10 straight IL games...his 118 walks rank second all-time among actives, trailing just Albert Pujols (125).

THE GATEWAY CITY: The Twins and Cardinals are playing for the 25th time during the regular season in their history tonight...they have gone 12-12 all-time, going 2-7 at old Busch Stadium (1997, '99 & '01), 4-3 at new Busch Stadium (2009 & '15), 4-2 at the Metrodome (1998 & '00) and 2-0 at Target Field (2015)...the Twins swept the Cardinals last week in two games at St. Louis.

HBD, BD! Brian Dozier is celebrating his 31st birthday today...he has played four career games in the majors on his birthday, going 5-for-10 (.500) with one double, one home run, three RBI and one walk...he shares a birthday with former Twin Justin Morneau (37), as well as Hall of Famers John Smoltz (51) and George Brett (65).

ON THIS DAY IN MINNESOTA BASEBALL HISTORY: In 1991, Milwaukee's Paul Molitor hit for the cycle in a 4-2 victory over Minnesota...Molitor tripled in the first, singled in the third, doubled in the fifth, and homered in the seventh...Molitor was the Brewers leadoff hitter and designated hitter, while Twins radio broadcaster Dan Gladden, led-off for the Twins...Gladden went 1-for-4, singling to center field off Chuck Crim in the eighth inning.

☞ Robbie Grossman is hitting .320 (16-for-50) with six doubles, one home run, eight RBI, five walks and a .368 on-base percentage in his last 16 games.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .357 (25-for-70) with seven doubles, seven home runs and 17 RBI over his last 17 games, since April 27... among all players in the AL in that span he ranks tied for second in home runs, fourth in slugging percentage (.757), tied for fifth in RBI, and sixth in OPS (1.132).

LAST START: Berríos suffered his fourth loss of 2018 at Los Angeles-AL on May 10, allowing five runs on seven hits and one walk with two strikeouts over 5.1 innings...allowed a two-run home run to Ian Kinsler in the second inning and then gave up a solo shot to Justin Upton the following inning...left the game in the sixth with a runner on first, but Ryan Pressly allowed the run to score.

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Berríos is making his first career start against the Cardinals and his second Interleague start of 2018...faced Cincinnati on April 29, suffered his third loss of the season after allowing four runs on five hits and three walks over 3.0 innings...didn't strike out an opposing batter in a start for the first time this season.

IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY: In seven career Interleague starts, Berríos is 3-4 with a 3.08 ERA (38.0, 13 ER) with 14 walks and 37 strikeouts...last Interleague start came against Cincinnati on April 29 and suffered the loss in his shortest start of the season...last win against an NL opponent was August 19, 2017 when he shut out Arizona over 7.0 innings, allowed two hits and one walk with seven strikeouts.

WIZARD OF WHIFF: With his outing on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, Berríos has now thrown the three most recent 10+ K, 0 run games in Twins history (August 30, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, May 18, 2017 vs. Colorado)...the last to do it before Berríos was Ervin Santana on August 30, 2015 vs. Houston...with three games of 10+ strikeouts and 0 walks, he follows Johan Santana (8) and Bert Blyleven (6) for most such performances in Twins history...Berríos is 12th in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio at 4.75.

KEEPING 'EM OFF THE BASES: Through eight starts in 2018, Berríos has walked nine batters, giving him a BB/9 rate of 1.76, which is seventh best in the AL and 12th in baseball... one of eight AL pitchers who have at least seven starts to have fewer than 10 walks in 2018...Berríos has also only allowed 39 hits and owns a 1.04 WHIP, which is 12th best in the AL and 22nd in baseball...through his first six starts, was one of only 11 qualifying pitchers in the AL with a WHIP below 1.00...entering his last start, opponents' exit velocity off of Berríos was 83.5 mph, second lowest in baseball.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Since the beginning of 2017, Berríos is 10-3 with a 2.73 ERA (89.0 IP, 27 ER) in 15 games (14 starts) in home games...his 2.73 ERA at home in that span is sixth best in the AL and 12th best in baseball since the beginning of last season... Berríos is 1-2 with a 3.74 ERA (21.1 IP, 9 ER) in four home starts in 2018...on the road, Berríos is 7-9 with a 5.17 ERA (102.2 IP, 59 ER) in 19 starts since the beginning of 2017.

SOUVENIRS FROM THE ISLAND: Berríos made the start in his native Puerto Rico on April 18 vs. Cleveland...he became the just the second different Puerto Rican pitcher to start a major league game at Hiram Bithorn Stadium, the other being Javier Vazquez (4 starts)...two other pitchers appeared in relief: Pedro Feliciano (1 game) and Roberto Hernandez (3 game)...he and teammate Eddie Rosario became the first Twins Puerto Rico natives to play in Hiram Bithorn.

THE ROCKET AND LA MAQUINA: By shutting out Cleveland over 7.0 innings in his start on April 18, Berríos became the first pitcher since Roger Clemens in 1991 to throw 7.0+ shutout innings three times in their teams' first 13 games of a season...Clemens went on to lead the AL in ERA (2.62) and win the Cy Young Award.

ROUGH PATCH: Berríos' has lost four of his last five starts going 1-3 since April 24, allowing 18 earned runs over 18.1 innings (8.84 ERA) and has given up six home runs, tied for sixth most in the AL over that stretch...he has allowed four earned runs or more in each of his last four starts, the most he's allowed over a four start stretch allowing 18 earned runs from August 6-August 25, 2016...allowed only five earned runs through his first four starts this season.

2017 RECAP:

- Berríos started 25 games, a single-season career-high.
- In first full season, Berríos finished 14-8 with 139 strikeouts and 48 walks over 145.2 innings.
- Set career highs in wins (14), strikeouts (139), innings (145.2) and ERA (3.89)...he ranked second on Twins staff in wins, and strikeouts, and third in starts and innings pitched.
- Tied for ninth in the AL in wins.
- The youngest pitcher in baseball to record an 11-strikeout game last year against Colorado on May 18.
- Made first career postseason appearance against New York-AL in the Wild Card Game... allowed three runs in three innings and was credited with a loss.
