WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won six of their last nine games, 12 of 18 and 17 of 29 as they continue a 10-game, 11-day homestand this afternoon with the finale against the Boston Red Sox.
- RHP James Shields, who has worked at least 6.0 IP in 22 of his 28 starts this season, is scheduled to start for the White Sox.
- The White Sox are 1-2 on the homestand, splitting a pair of 6-1 decisions after losing Thursday's opener, 9-4, despite holding a 4-0 lead.
- Following today's game, the Sox continue the homestand with three games each vs. Detroit (9/3-5) and the Angels (9/7-9).
- The Sox went 5-2 on their last trip to Detroit (3-1) and New York-AL (2-1) from 8/23-29, including their first series win at Yankee Stadium since 2005.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have gone 12-6 since 8/14, tied with the Yankees for the second-best record in the American League behind Tampa Bay (12-5).
- The Sox are 17-12 since 8/2, moving from 9.0 games behind Detroit into a third-place tie with the Tigers in the AL Central.
- The White Sox own a 3.14 ERA (28 ER/80.1 IP) over the last nine games, including a 2.33 mark (14 ER/54.0 IP) and .176 (34-193) opponents average by the rotation.
- James Shields owns a 2.91 ERA (26 ER/80.1 IP) over his last 12 home starts this season.
- Yolmer Sánchez has reached base safely in a career-high 20 consecutive games (.422 on-base percentage), the longest streak by a Sox player since José Abreu (29) from 8/2-9/2/16.

WHITE SOX ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to today's game, the White Sox returned C Welington Castillo from his injury rehab assignment at Class AAA Charlotte and reinstated him from the 10-day disabled list.
- The White Sox active roster increases to 28.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The Red Sox scored three runs in the seventh inning to break open a 2-1 game and went on to defeat the White Sox, 6-1.
- Nicky Delmonico's RBI double off Eduardo Rodriguez in the sixth pulled the Sox within 2-1, but Boston answered with three runs in the seventh, aided by Carlos Rodón's throwing error.
- Rodón suffered the loss, allowing five runs (four earned) on six hits over 6.1 IP, as his career-high, five-game winning streak spanning nine starts came to an end ... his streak of nine straight quality starts while allowing five hits or less, the longest such by a Sox pitcher since at least 1908, also ended.
- The White Sox struck out 18 times, their most in a nine-inning game since 8/8/97 at Seattle when Randy Johnson fanned 19.

CELEBRATING HAWK

- The White Sox will celebrate the life and career of Ken "Hawk" Harrelson today during a pregame ceremony on Hawk Day ... the first 10,000 fans who enter the ballpark will receive a Hawk Harrelson Nesting Doll, which features Hawk as a player, front office executive and broadcaster.
- Harrelson, who is in his 33rd and final season in the White Sox TV booth, will work today's game alongside A.J. Pierzynski.

SOX PAIR FOR WORTHY CAUSE

- White Sox Charities are holding a special online charity auction in honor of Jerry Remy, the former Red Sox second baseman and current broadcaster who is on medical leave after recently being diagnosed again with lung cancer.
- Fans may bid on items through tonight at 7:00 p.m. CT at whitesox.com/auction, including autographed memorabilia from Carlton Fisk, A.J. Pierzynski and Chris Sale, who all played for both the Red Sox and White Sox.
- A portion of proceeds will be donated to the Jimmy Fund, an official charity of the Red Sox that raises funds for adult and pediatric cancer care and research.

KOPECH'S HISTORIC START

- Michael Kopech has become just the third pitcher since at least 1908 to allow one run or less and one walk or less in each of his first three major-league starts, joining St. Louis' Donovan Osborne (1992) and Cleveland's Cody Anderson (2015).
- Kopech threw 3.0 scoreless IP on Friday in a rain-shortened outing after allowing one run over 8.0 IP in his first two outings.
- He was 4-0 with a 1.84 ERA (9 ER/44.0 IP), four walks and 59 strikeouts over his last seven starts with Class AAA Charlotte.

WHITE SOX VS. BOSTON

- The season series is even at 3-3.
- The White Sox are batting .246/.307/.357 with a 3.06 ERA (18 ER/53.0 IP) and have been outscored by the Red Sox, 22-19.
- The Sox have held Boston to two earned runs or less in four of the six games.
- Chicago trails in the all-time series, 942-985, going 543-419 at home (55-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 399-566 on the road (352-498 at Fenway Park).

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 192-234 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 13-15 vs. the AL East this season (5-11 at home) and have won 12 of their last 24 games after a 1-4 start.

HISTORICALLY TOUGH STRETCH

- The White Sox are playing consecutive series at New York-AL (.630) and vs. Boston (.684), the best two teams in the majors.
- This marks the first time since 1939 that the Sox have played back-to-back series against teams who entered the matchup having played at least 50 games with winning percentages of .630 or better (STATS).

RODÓN CONTINUES HIS ROLL

- Carlos Rodón is 5-1 with a 2.11 ERA (15 ER/64.0 IP) and .151 (33-218) opponents average over his last nine starts ... his 2.11 ERA during that span ranks third in the American League.
- Rodón's streak of nine straight quality starts while allowing five hits or less from 7/5-8/27 was the longest such streak by a White Sox pitcher since at least 1908 (Baseball Reference).

YOUNG GUNS

- Lucas Giolito (24 years old), Michael Kopech (22), Reynaldo López (24) and Carlos Rodón (25) make up four-fifths of the White Sox starting rotation.
- Giolito leads the staff with 10 victories and is 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 ER/25.1 IP) over his last four starts.
- Kopech has allowed one run over 11.0 IP over his first three major-league starts, two of which have been rain-shortened.
- López is 1-0 with a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP) over his last two starts and has combined to go 2-0 with a 1.33 ERA (3 ER/20.1 IP) in three starts this season against Boston and the Yankees.
- Rodón is 5-1 with a 2.11 ERA (15 ER/64.0 IP) and .151 (33-218) opponents average over his last nine starts.

REVOLVING CLOSING DOOR

- A White Sox franchise-record nine different pitchers have recorded at least one save this season, breaking the mark of eight set five times (last 1988) ... STATS LLC.
- Only four of the nine pitchers currently are on the active roster, and only LHP Héctor Santiago has been with the club all season.

ON THE FARM

- Class AAA Charlotte OF Eloy Jiménez, the No. 3 Prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, is hitting .458 (22-48) over his last 12 games and .380/.412/.645 (63-166) average with 10 homers, 29 RBI and a 1.057 OPS in 42 games after the break.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 1,377 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, tied with the New York Mets for the highest total in the major leagues and 51 more than Oakland (1,326), the next-closest American League team.

PROSPECT PROWESS

- The White Sox farm system is ranked No. 3 in baseball according to MLB Pipeline, and includes seven of the Top 100 prospects: OF Eloy Jiménez (No. 3), RHP Michael Kopech (13), OF Luis Robert (25), INF Nick Madrigal (32), RHP Dylan Cease (44), RHP Dane Dunning (64) and OF Blake Rutherford (88).

ON DECK: DETROIT TIGERS

- The White Sox continue the homestand tomorrow afternoon vs. Detroit ... RHP Reynaldo López (5-9, 4.51) is scheduled to start the opener of the three-game series.
- The Tigers lead the season series, 10-6, but the White Sox have won five of the last six after losing nine of the first 10.

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 30th appearance (29th start), 17th start at Guaranteed Rate Field and first vs. Boston ... is looking to record his fifth win in Chicago, compared to just one on the road (Opening Day).
- Today marks the 401 start of his career ... is tied with Felix Hernandez (2005-18) and Will White (1877-1886) for 131st place in MLB history.
- Has worked 6.0-plus IP in 22 starts this season, the third-most in the American League and tied with Zack Greinke for fifth-most in MLB.
- His 15 losses are tied with Alex Cobb for the most in MLB this season.
- Has worked at least 6.0 IP in 20 of his last 24 starts since 4/25 ... is 4-13 with a 4.29 ERA (73 ER/153.0 IP), 1.24 WHIP, .234 opponents average and 3.59 RSA (61 RS) during the 24-start span.
- Is 14-34 with a 5.36 ERA (243 ER/407.2 IP), 316 strikeouts, 85 home runs allowed and a 1.45 WHIP over 72 appearances (71 GS/33 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
- Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in starts (2nd, 379), IP (2nd, 2,463.0), pitches thrown (2nd, 38,786), quality starts (5th, 232), opponents GIDP (5th, 197), strikeouts (7th, 2,111) and wins (11th, 137).

LAST START

- Received a no decision on 8/28 at the Yankees after surrendering two runs on four hits with four walks and three strikeouts in 5.2 IP.
- Allowed both of his runs on a two-run homer by Miguel Andujar in the sixth ... held the Yankees scoreless on two hits over the first five innings.
- Marked the 400th start of his career ... failed to make a quality start in consecutive outings for the first time since 4/20-25.
- Departed the game with two outs in the sixth and the White Sox leading, 4-2 ... threw 98 pitches (56 strikes) ... the Yankees won, 5-4, on Neil Walker's game-ending home run.

BITTEN BY THE BIG INNING

- Has allowed 30 of his 89 earned runs (33.7 percent) over the span of eight individual innings (7.0 IP) in eight starts in 2018 ... his season ERA would be 3.14 (59 ER/169.1 IP) without the below eight innings.

LOW AND SLOW

- Opponents are hitting just .234 (129-5352) since 5/1, the ninth-lowest mark in the American League (Blake Snell's .186 average is the lowest)... his .173 opponents average in May was the fourth-lowest in the AL.
- Is limiting opponents to the following averages: .216 (71-329) at night, .211 (71-337) vs. left-handers, .206 (88-428) with nobody on base and .224 average (86-384) at Guaranteed Rate Field.

A TALE OF TWO STRETCHES

- Owns an 8-19 record in 39 appearances (38 starts) since 8/5/17 despite recording a 4.49 ERA (118 ER/236.2 IP), .239 opp. average and 21 quality starts ... has allowed three earned runs or less 27 times.
- By comparison, went 6-15 with a 6.58 ERA (125 ER/171.0 IP), .290 opponents average and 46 home runs allowed in his first 33 starts with the White Sox ... made his Sox debut on 6/8/16 vs. Washington.

35TH AND SHIELDS

- His 16 starts (T2nd) and 103.0 IP (2nd) at home rank among the MLB leaders this season.
- Has allowed three earned runs or less in 11 of his last 12 home starts, going 4-5 with a 2.91 ERA (26 ER/80.1 IP), 1.03 WHIP, .205 average and 64 strikeouts (10 QS) ... worked 7.0-plus IP eight times.
- Is 12-18 with a 4.57 ERA (124 ER/244.0 IP), 228 hits allowed (46 homers), 98 walks, 192 strikeouts, a .243 opp. average and 1.34 WHIP in 41 starts (24 quality) at Guaranteed Rate Field with the White Sox.
- Prior to joining the White Sox, was 4-1 with a 3.00 mark (24 ER/72.0 IP), 1.33 WHIP, 47 strikeouts and nine home runs allowed over 11 starts (nine quality starts) as a visitor at Guaranteed Rate Field.

HELP WANTED

- Owns a 4.00 run support average as a starter in 2018, the 11th-lowest in the American League ... received two runs or less of support in 16 of his last 23 starts (one or less 10 times) and three or less in 19 of the last 26 (3.33 RSA; 61 RS/164.2 IP) since 4/11... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
- His 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support from 4/11-6/7 was his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13).
- Owns a 4.42 RSA (200 RS/407.0IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (71 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (17x), one (12x), two (13x), three (7x), four (5x), five (6x) and six-plus (11x) ... has received two runs or less of support in 59.2 percent (42-71) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 27 home runs this season, including 23 in his last 17 starts ... allowed three homers in each outing on 6/2 vs. Milwaukee and 6/7 at Minnesota after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
- Has allowed 94 homers since 2016 and 127 since 2015 ... the 127 home runs allowed since 2015 are the most in MLB, and his 1.69 homers-per-9.0 IP mark since 2015 (677.1 IP) is the fourth-highest.

VS. BOSTON RED SOX

- Is 9-14 with a 4.40 ERA, .254 opponents average, 1.30 WHIP and 151 strikeouts over 28 career starts (14 quality starts) ... the 28 starts vs. the Red Sox are tied for his third-most vs. any opponent (also Baltimore) ... his 14 losses are the second-most vs. a single opponent (16 vs. the Yankees).
- Has gone 1-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 ER/29.2 IP), .257 opponents average, 1.38 WHIP and 25 strikeouts over his last five starts (three QS) ... allowed three earned runs or less in all five outings.
- Suffered the loss in his last start on 8/5/17 at Fenway Park, allowing four runs (three earned) on five hits with two homers, one walk and six strikeouts ... today marks his first career start vs. the Red Sox in Chicago.
- Is 0-0 with a 2.52 ERA (7 ER/25.0 IP), two home runs allowed, 20 strikeouts, a .207 opponents average and 1.32 WHIP in four starts this season vs. the American League East ... has allowed two earned runs or less in all four outings.
