FAMILIAR FOES: Today, the Dodgers host their division rivals, the Arizona Diamondbacks, in front of a sold out crowd at Camelback Ranch. This will be the first time the two clubs face each other since the 2017 NLDS, where the Dodgers swept the Diamondbacks and punched their ticket to the National League Championship Series for the second straight year. The Boys in Blue will face the Snakes once more this spring on March 16 and 19 times during the regular season (April 13-15, May 8-9 and Aug. 30-Sept. 2 in Los Angeles and April 2-4, April 30-May 3 and Sept. 24-26 in Phoenix). The Dodgers have 23 more exhibition games this spring; including 10 at Camelback Ranch on four Spring Training weekends and will head back to Los Angeles for a three-game Freeway Series against the Angels on March 25-27. Following the I-5 matchup, the Dodgers will open the 2018 season on March 29 against the San Francisco Giants at Dodger Stadium.

Today's game is officially sold out, as well as the March 10 game vs. the Cubs and the March 22 contest against the Angels of Anaheim. In addition, tickets for the March 24 matchup against the White Sox are nearly gone. Last year, the Dodgers established a team record in total attendance (165,911) for the third consecutive year.

SLAP HANDS: Yesterday, the Dodgers defeated the White Sox 7-6, earning their third win in Cactus League play. Dodger ace **Clayton Kershaw** was efficient, tossing two scoreless innings with two strikeouts. At the plate, **Jake Peter** homered for the second consecutive game with a three-run blast in the third inning, **Alex Verdugo** contributed a solo-shot of his own in the fourth, and **DJ Peters** sealed the deal with a two-run slam in the bottom of the top eighth inning.

YOU WOOD: Dodger left-hander **Alex Wood** takes the mound today for his second start of the spring after giving up two runs on one hit and two walks last Monday against the Rangers in Surprise. Wood had a breakout 2017 campaign in which he went 16-3 with a 2.72 ERA in 27 games (25 starts) and was named to the NL All-Star team. In five big league seasons, Wood has gone 43-33 with a 3.20 ERA in 139 games (102 starts) with Atlanta (2013-15) and Los Angeles (2015-17). The Georgia native finished ninth in the National League Cy Young voting last year.

Also taking the mound today for the second time will be right-hander **J.T. Chargois**, who pitched a scoreless inning with two strikeouts against San Diego on Wednesday. Also coming out of the bullpen will be non-roster invitees **Brian Schlitter, C.C. Lee and Joe Broussard**.

THE RING IS THE THING: The Dodgers will celebrate their 2017 pennant-winning team with a special pregame video tribute and National League championship ring ceremony prior to their 6:10 p.m. game on Saturday, March 31 against the San Francisco Giants. Los Angeles won a record fifth consecutive National League West title in 2017, while setting a Los Angeles record with 104 wins. In the postseason, the Dodgers swept the Arizona Diamondbacks in the National League Division Series before defeating the Chicago Cubs, 4-1, in the NLCS to advance to the World Series, where they fell to the Houston Astros in seven games.

COLLEGE BASEBALL CLASSIC: Dodger Stadium will host the annual College Baseball Classic on Sunday, March 11, as three of college baseball's top 15 ranked teams will take the field at Chavez Ravine. Seventh-ranked Texas Christian University will face 14th-ranked Vanderbilt at 10:30 a.m. followed by the annual local matchup of UCLA (#11) vs. USC at 3:00p.m. Tickets begin at just \$10 for both matchups (student tickets are \$5) and can be purchased at Dodgers.com/classic.

KIDS 4 DODGERS BASEBALL: Today, the Los Angeles Dodgers will once again extend their Kids 4 Dodgers Baseball initiative to their Spring Training home at Camelback Ranch – Glendale, and host youth from community organizations from the area including R.O.O.T.S., Wheels in Motion, Desert Mirage GRASP, Heart for the City and Partners in Action. In addition to taking in the game, students will get a behind-the-scenes look at life at CR-G and will have the opportunity to participate in a post-game baseball skills clinic led by Dodger prospects. All participants will receive an all-inclusive gameday experience, including tickets, transportation to the game, a Kids 4 Dodgers Baseball t-shirt and a boxed lunch, courtesy of Delaware North Sportservice.

A LOOK BACK: The Dodgers posted a 104-58 record in 2017, becoming the first team in NL West history to win the division in five consecutive seasons. The team earned a World Series berth after defeating the Chicago Cubs in the NLCS, 4 games to 1, and finished the season with their first NL Pennant since 1988.

The Dodgers posted the seventh 100-win season in franchise history (third in Los Angeles history) and first since 1974 (102-60). The Dodgers won 90+ games for the fifth consecutive season, a feat that had only previously been accomplished once in franchise history, 1951-56 (6).

Los Angeles finished with the best record in the Majors for the first time since 1974 and the National League's best record for the first time since 2009. The Dodgers set a Los Angeles record for victories with 104 (104-58), tying for the second most in franchise history (also: 1942, 104-50) and finishing one shy of the club record of 105 (105-49), set in 1953.

TODAY'S PITCHING PROBABLES

- L Hard-throwing right-hander **J.T. Chargois** will appear in his second outing of the spring, and made his Cactus League debut on Wednesday against the Padres, throwing a 1-2-3 inning with two strikeouts. Chargois appeared in just two games with Minnesota's Triple-A Rochester in 2017, tossing 2.2 scoreless innings of relief with one save before being placed on the disabled list for the remainder of the season.
- L Right-handed pitcher **Brian Schlitter** will make his third appearance of the spring, after tossing 2.0 perfect innings of relief in two Cactus League appearances. He last pitched on Tuesday against the Rangers, tossing a shutout inning on three pitches. The 32-year-old enters his 10th professional season and his first with the Dodgers, as he returns to the states following a stint with the Saitama Seibu Lions of the Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017. With the Lions, he went 1-5 with a 2.83 ERA (20 ER/63.2 IP) and struck out 23 batters in 64 relief appearances.
- L Taiwanese right-hander **C.C. Lee** will appear in his third Spring Training game, after allowing one run on one hit in an inning of relief on Tuesday against the Rangers. Lee enters his ninth professional season and his first year with the Dodgers, after appearing in 27 games for Triple-A Albuquerque of the Rockies organization, going 2-2 with a 5.54 ERA.
- L Right-handed pitcher **Joe Broussard**, who will make his third appearance of the spring this afternoon, has gone 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (1 ER/2.0 IP) in two relief appearances in Cactus League play. He last pitched on Tuesday against the Rangers, tossing a perfect inning of relief on three pitches. Broussard, who was drafted by the Dodgers in the 15th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University, enters his fifth professional season and his first big league camp. Last season, he went a combined 5-1 with five saves and posted a 3.27 ERA (23 ER/63.1 IP) in 48 relief appearances with Triple-A Oklahoma City and Double-A Tulsa.
