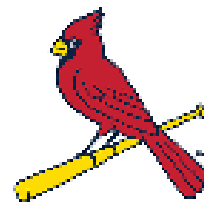

ROAD TRIPPIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals begin a nine-game/10-day road trip to Arizona, San Francisco and Chicago (AL) tonight with the first of three games against the first place Arizona Diamondbacks. This is the Cardinals longest road trip of the season thus far and tied for longest of the season (9 games, Aug. 3-13 - PIT, MIA, KC). The last time the Cardinals played a nine-game road trip was September 15-24, 2017 (CHI, CIN, PIT). St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the N.L. Central, 5.5 games behind first place Milwaukee.

OUT OF THE NEST: The Cardinals and Los Angeles Dodgers have played the fewest road games in the Majors this season with 37.

FOWLER ON PATERNITY LEAVE; O'NEILL RECALLED FROM MEMPHIS (AAA): Dexter Fowler will be leaving the team for a few days to join his wife Aliya as they expect the birth of their second child. Rookie outfielder Tyler O'Neill will be recalled from Memphis (AAA) and eligible to play tonight in Phoenix. The right-handed slugger has hit 22 home runs between Memphis (19) and St. Louis (3) this season and currently ranks 2nd in the Pacific Coast League home run race and 6th in all of Minor League Baseball. O'Neill has played in 49 games in Memphis batting .304 with 19 HR and 48 RBI and last played in St. Louis on May 30 at Milwaukee. In 16 games with the Cardinals, O'Neill is batting .237 with 3 HR and 7 RBI.

THE SNAKE CHARMER: Since Mike Matheny took the helm as the Cardinals manager in 2012, the team has won or tied 5 of the 6 series played at Chase Field including a three-game sweep in 2012 and a four-game sweep in 2015. The Cardinals are 14-6 at Chase Field under Matheny and his overall record against Arizona is 28-15. As a player, Matheny hit more home runs against the Diamondbacks than any other team, smacking seven of his 67 career vs. Arizona.

CARPENTER'S 2ND HALF OF THE 1ST HALF: Cardinals infielder Matt Carpenter started the season batting .140 through May 15, but has taken off since raising his batting average from .140 to .256 over the last 42 games. Since May 16, Carpenter leads all Major Leaguers with 29 doubles and 35 runs (T1st, Francisco Lindor, CLE), ranks T3rd in hits (55), 4th with 17 doubles, T10th in home runs (10) and 4th in slugging pct. (.663). On June 26 vs. CLE, Carpenter went 5-for-5 with five runs scored, two home runs and three RBI. The five runs in a game tied for the most by any MLB player this season (Mookie Betts, BOS & Jeimer Candelario, DET) and his 5-for-5 with two home run stat like had never been done before in Cardinals recorded history.

THE DUKE IS BACK ON THE TRAIL; BOWMAN MAKES SECOND REHAB APPEARANCE: Luke Gregerson (right shoulder impingement) and Matt Bowman (right middle finger blisters) each pitched for Memphis (AAA) in a rehab assignment June 30 at Iowa (Cubs). Bowman was making his second appearance in as many days and allowed a run on two hits with a strikeout in one inning. Gregerson, in his first appearance, struck out two in a perfect inning and earned the win in relief.

HERE COMES THE PITCHERS, 1...2...3: During this series in Arizona, the Cardinals will be wheeling out Carlos Martinez, rookie Jack Flaherty and Miles Mikolas. Each of the three would rank in the Top 12 of the National League ERA leaders with Mikolas qualifying for 7th at 2.61, while Flaherty (2.92) and Martinez (3.22) would rank 9th and 11th with qualifying innings.

BACK IN BUSINESS: Cardinals relief pitcher Greg Holland has not allowed a run in the six relief appearances he's made since returning from the disabled list (right hip impingement) on June 19. Holland has the 2nd-lowest WHIP (0.35) and ranks 10th in strikeouts/9 IP among National League relief pitchers since June 19 and has struck out eight batters in those 5.2 innings allowing two singles.

ANOTHER PHAM-TASTIC VOYAGE?: Tommy Pham broke out of a career-long 0-for-31 slide yesterday going 2-for-4 with a three-run home run (#13). The last time Pham broke out of a slump (0-for-15) which happened earlier this season, he ran off the Cardinals longest hitting streak of the season (13 games) from June 6-19. In his first 39 games this season, Pham never went more than two games without a hit.

Cardinals assistant hitting coach **Bill Mueller** played parts of two seasons (1995-96) for the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization.

Cardinals assistant coach **Willie McGee** rehabbed for four games with the Phoenix Firebirds (AAA) as a member of the San Francisco Giants organization in 1991.

Cardinals President of Operations **John Mozeliak** attended the University of Arizona before graduating from the University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the General Manager **Bob Gebhard** worked for the Diamondbacks as Vice President & Special Assistant to the GM for 12 seasons (2005-16).

Diamondbacks pitcher **Shelby Miller** pitched parts of three seasons with St. Louis (2012-14)...originally selected by the Cardinals in the first round (19th overall) in the 2009 MLB Draft...later traded by St. Louis with pitcher Tyrell Jenkins to Atlanta for outfielder Jason Heyward and pitcher Jordan Walden (November 17, 2014).

Cardinals pitcher **John Brebbia** was selected by the Cardinals from the Diamondbacks in the Triple-A phase of the 2015 Rule 5 Draft.

Diamondbacks infielder **Daniel Descalso** played parts of five seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2010-14)...appeared in 44 postseason games and was a member of the 2011 World Champion Cardinals...originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2007 MLB Draft.

Diamondbacks Outfielder **Jon Jay** played six seasons with St. Louis (2010-15)...member of 2011 World Series Champions, where he was one of six Cardinals to play in all 18 postseason games...appeared on Cardinals postseason roster for five straight seasons (2011-15)...originally selected by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB Draft...later traded by St. Louis to San Diego for infielder **Jedd Gyorko** and cash (Dec. 8, 2015).

Diamondbacks outfielder **David Peralta** was originally signed by the Cardinals as a non-drafted free agent pitcher (Sept. 26, 2004)...pitched three minor league seasons (2005-07)...underwent pair of left-shoulder surgeries...released in May 2009.

Diamondbacks Vice President, Player Development **Mike Bell** is the younger brother of former Cardinals Bench Coach **David Bell**...Mike also played in eight games for the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) in 2005.

Diamondbacks pitcher **Fernando Salas** pitched parts of four seasons with St. Louis (2010-13)...was a member of the 2011 World Series Champions...converted a team-leading 24 saves for St. Louis in 2011...originally purchased by St. Louis from Triple-A Saltillio Saraperos of the Mexican League (April 5, 2007).

Cardinals Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** served as the Diamondbacks Chief Baseball Analyst for four seasons (2014-17).

Diamondbacks First Base Coach **Dave McKay** served in the same position for the Cardinals (1996-2011) under La Russa.

Diamondbacks Pitching Strategist **Dan Haren** was drafted by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2001 MLB draft...pitched two seasons with St. Louis (2003-04)...later traded by the Cardinals with catcher **Daric Barton** and pitcher **Kiko Calero** to Oakland for pitcher **Mark Mulder** (Dec. 18, 2004).

Diamondbacks Pro Scout **Pete Vuckovich** pitched three seasons in St. Louis (1978-80)...later traded by the Cardinals with pitcher **Rollie Fingers** and catcher **Ted Simmons** to the Brewers for pitchers **Lary Sorensen** and **Dave LaPoint** and outfielders **David Green** and **Sixto Lezcano** (Dec. 12, 1980).

Diamondbacks Player & Media Relations Intern **Sydney Sloas** served as the Cardinals 2017 Spring Training Intern at Jupiter, Fla.
