TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 8, 2005: Alex Rodriguez becomes the youngest player ever to reach 400 home runs when he hits a pair of homers at Milwaukee at 29 years, 316 days old. His 400th homer is hit off Julio Santana.

June 8, 1969: "Mickey Mantle Day" is celebrated at Yankee Stadium as the Mick's No. 7 jersey is retired and a plaque is unveiled in his honor. The Yankees sweep a doubleheader from the Chicago White Sox, 3-1 and 11-2.

June 8, 1939: At Shibe Park, the Yankees rout the A's 22-3. The Yankees set a franchise record hitting eight home runs during the contest, a mark which will not be tied for 68 years.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 9, 1928: Tony Lazzeri goes 4-for-5 with 3RBI and Lou Gehrig hits a solo HR in a 7-3 win at Cleveland. The Yankees improve to 39-8, giving them a 10.5-game lead in the AL after just 47 games.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the first game of their three-game Subway Series at the Mets (through Sun.)...are 5-1 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore (postponements on 5/31 and 6/3), a split doubleheader in Detroit on Monday (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15) and a two-game sweep in Toronto from Tues.-Wed....will begin a six-game homestand on Mon., starting with 2G vs. the Nationals (6/12-13) and 4G vs. the Rays (6/14-17)...the team will then make a one-day trip to Washington on 6/18 to resume their suspended game from 5/15 and play a makeup game for their 5/16 rainout before returning to the Bronx for 3G vs. the Mariners (6/19-21).

- ▶ At 40-18 (.690), have the Majors' best winning percentage.
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 26-18, the Yankees are 31-9).
- ▶ Are a season-high 22G over .500...are 22G over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2012 season at 95-67.
- ▶ Is the 10th season in franchise history and the second season over the last 65 years (since 1954) that they have reached 22G over within their first 58 decisions of a season (first went 22G over in 1998 after 40G, starting 31-9)...made the World Series in all nine previous instances, winning seven times (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42).
- ▶ Marks the 10th time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 40 wins over their first 58 results...each of the other nine Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42)...joins the 1998 team (45-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 58G start over the last 65 seasons (since 1954).
- ▶ Over their last 14 completed series (since 4/19), are 12-1-1.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 9-3 so far.
- ▶ Are 15-9 vs. the AL East and 25-9 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 28-3 (.903) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 31-2 (.939) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season.
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-most wins (40) despite playing just 59 games (tied for fewest).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees shut out the Blue Jays, 3-0, in 13 innings at Rogers Centre on Wednesday...**RHP Sonny Gray** (8.0IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 8K) made his longest scoreless start since a complete-game shutout on 7/28/15 at Los Angeles-NL...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-5, 1BB) hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the 13th inning, his first career extra-inning HR...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4, 2BB) hit a solo HR in the 13th, his third HR in his last 5G...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-6, 1R) was the only Yankee to record a multi-hit game...**C Austin Romine** (0-for-5) had his career-long 11-game hitting streak snapped...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 2H over 5.0 scoreless innings (0BB, 7K)...**RHP David Robertson** tossed a perfect 12th inning to earn his fourth win of the season (2K)...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) recorded his 15th save.

- ▶ **Yankees batters** went 0-for-8 with RISP...marked their second win this season when going hitless w/ RISP (also 0-for-8 in 5/27 win vs. Los Angeles-AL).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** hit a two-run HR in the 13th inning on Wednesday at Toronto, his first career extra-inning HR...was the latest Yankees HR to break a 0-0 tie since Alex Rodriguez's 15th-inning two-run "walk-off" HR on 8/7/09 vs. Boston.

BLANK SPACES: **Yankees pitchers** shut out Toronto in 13 innings on Wednesday, marking only the second time in the last 42 seasons (since 1977) they recorded a shutout in a game that lasted at least 13 innings (also 15 shutout innings on 8/7/09 vs. Boston).

NATIONAL PASTIME: The Yankees begin their third Interleague series of the season tonight...split a 2G set vs. Miami from 4/16-17...had the first game of their 2G series in Washington in May suspended and the second postponed.

- ▶ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season.
- ▶ Went 7-3 in NL parks in 2017, winning six of their final 7G.
- ▶ At 227-157 (.591), have the second-best Interleague record and second-most wins all-time (Boston, 231-157, .595).



HOPE WEEK 2018 (June 11-15): This year marks the 10th annual HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of good will provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 30-12 (.714) during the event...have won 18 of their last 22 games during HOPE Week.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 15-5 in their last 20 completed road games and 18-9 (.667) away from home in 2018...are 27-15 in 42 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 6-2-2 in their first 10 road series this year and 10-3-2 in 15 road series since 8/22/17.

HOME(RS) AWAY FROM HOME: **Yankees batters** have hit 49HR in 28G on the road this season, the highest HR/G ratio (1.75) and the second-most HR on the road in the Majors (Oakland-55HR)...would be their highest single-season road HR/G ratio in franchise history (highest: 1.56 HR/G in 1961)...are on pace to hit a franchise-record 142 road homers in 2018 (128HR on the road in 1961).

MIGGY, MIGGY, MIGGY: **INF Miguel Andujar** has 32XBH (23 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR) in 55 career games, tied for the second-most in Yankees history through 55 games (Joe DiMaggio-43XBH; Gary Sanchez-32)...eight of his last 10H have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 2HR).

- ▶ Leads all Major League rookies in batting average (.306), slugging pct. (.544) and extra-base hits (30), is tied for most multi-hit games (20) and ranks second in hits (59).
- ▶ Is hitting .366 (26-for-71) with 12R, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 13RBI, 6BB and 1SB in his last 19 games (since 5/12), the AL's third-highest batting average over the span.

PEN PALS: Since 4/21, **Yankees relievers** have posted a 2.49 ERA (130.OIP, 36ER) with 165K...had posted a 4.34 (74.2IP, 36ER) in their first 18G of the season...their 2.49 in ERA in that span ranks second in the Majors behind Milwaukee (2.45).

- ▶ **Yankees relievers** lead the Majors with 276K and rank second with a .208 opponents' BA...rank third in the AL and sixth in the Majors with a 3.17 ERA.
- ▶ Three Yankees rank in the top eight in strikeouts in the AL among relievers: **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (46K, 2nd), **Dellin Betances** (45K, 3rd) and **RHP Chad Green** (38K, T-7th).

ZEROING IN: The Yankees were held scoreless through the first 12 innings of Wednesday's win at Toronto before scoring 3R in the 13th inning...are the only team in the Majors yet to be shut out this season...were shut out just three times in 2017, the second-lowest total in the Majors (Minnesota-2)...their total over the last two seasons (2017-18) is the lowest in the Majors over the stretch.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** lead the Majors in runs per game (5.59), HR (98), HR per game (1.66), OPS (.803) and walks (236)...rank second in runs (330), SLG (.467), OBP (.336), XBHs (227) and total bases (952).

- ▶ Have homered in 47 of their 59 games, tied for the most in the Majors...are on pace to hit 269HR...the MLB single-season HR record was set by the 1997 Mariners (264).

GARDY PARTY: **LF Brett Gardner** has hit safely in 13-of-14G (since 5/18)...is hitting .355 (27-for-76) with 11R, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 6RBI, 8BB and 4SB in his last 18G (since 5/4).

GOT YOUR NUMBER: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is a career .409/.480/1.000 (9-for-22) hitter with 1 double, 4HR and 3BB vs. Jacob deGrom, the most HR deGrom has allowed to any batter in his career...is tied for Stanton's most HR off any pitcher.

- ▶ Has 21HR in 52G at Citi Field, most by any visiting player...his .613 SLG is highest at the ballpark among all players (min. 100AB)...has 4HR in his last 5G at Citi Field (since 5/6/17) and 9HR over his last 15G (since 4/11/16).
- ▶ His solo HR on Wed. at Toronto had a 119.3 mph exit velocity, the hardest hit homer in the Majors this season.

YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY

WINNING FORMULA: Tonight the Yankees play their fourth Interleague game of 2018 (are 1-1 so far, their 5/15 game was suspended)...have the second-most wins and the second-highest all-time winning percentage (227-157; .591) in Interleague history (Boston: 231-157, .595)...are 45-30 in their last 75 completed Interleague games since 5/14/14.

- ✦ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season (previous was 13: 13-7 in 2014, 13-5 in 2003, '11, '12, 13-3 in 1998)...went 8-12 in 2016.
- ✦ Have posted a winning Interleague record in 17-of-21 seasons (17-3-1 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span.
- ✦ Have compiled a non-losing Interleague record in 18-of-21 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.
- ✦ All-time, are .500-or-better against all but two NL teams during the regular season (13-14 vs. the Phillies, 6-7 vs. the Dodgers).

THE SCHEDULE: The Yankees are scheduled to play 20 Interleague games in 2018, with the fourth coming tonight at Citi Field...are 1-1 in Interleague play so far...in addition to their annual Subway Series, which includes three games in Queens this weekend and three in the Bronx in July, the Yankees play the NL East this year...they played a home series vs. the Marlins in April (2G, 1-1) and will later host the Nationals (2G, 6/12-13), Braves (3G, 7/2-4) and Mets (3G, 7/20-22)...in addition to these three games at Citi Field, will play a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia (6/25-27) and a two-game set at Marlins Park in Miami (8/21-22)...began a then-two-game series at Washington on 5/15, but had the game suspended in the sixth...had the resumption of the game, along with their regularly-scheduled contest on 5/16 postponed...will play the resumption and the makeup at Nationals Park on 6/18.

UNFAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS: The Yankees went 7-3 in Interleague road games in 2017 (went 3-7 in 2016)...over the last 10 seasons (since 2008), have compiled a non-losing Interleague record on the road eight times (4-6 in 2013, 3-7 in 2016)...are 101-89 (.532) in Interleague road games all time.

- ✦ Are 62-48 all time in NL East ballparks (does not include a 2-1 mark against the Rays at Citi Field in September 2017), 21-19 in NL Central parks and 18-22 in NL West parks.

ON THE HILL: Yankees pitchers struck out a Major League-best 203 batters in Interleague play in 2017...Yankees starters posted 3.43 ERA (120.2IP, 46ER) with 113K in 20 starts.

- ✦ RHP Luis Severino set a single-season franchise Interleague record with 37K and also tallied a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in four starts in 2017.

AT THE PLATE: In the history of Interleague play (since 1997), the Yankees rank first in walks (1,524) and stolen bases (290), second in OBP (.342), third in runs scored (1,903) and sixth in home runs (453)...have scored at least 9R in six of their last 22 completed Interleague games since the start of 2017...have averaged 5.51 runs per game over their last 53 Interleague games since 6/18/15 (292R/53G).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Yankees are 126-68 (.649) all-time in Interleague play at home, including 54-34 (.614) at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 25 of their last 38 Interleague home games (since 5/17/14)... went 72-34 (.679) against NL teams at the original Yankee Stadium.

PITCHERS AS HITTERS: Yankees pitchers are 3-for-their-last-75 in Interleague play since 5/20/14...the only three hits in that span: Luis Severino singled and later scored a run on 8/17/17 at New York-NL; Michael Pineda snapped a team 0-for-29 with a single on 5/5/17 at Chicago-NL; reliever Branden Pinder snapped a team 0-for-28 with an RBI double on 8/30/15 at Atlanta...Pinder's hit is the most recent extra-base hit and hit with an RBI by a Yankees pitcher...was the second Yankees relief pitcher in the DH era (since 1973) to record a hit (also Mike Stanton on 6/6/00 at Montreal)...have batted a combined .086 (37-for-431) with 9 doubles, 13RBI and 49 sacrifice hits in Interleague play.

- ✦ Jordan Montgomery has two career walks, having 1BB in each of his two road Interleague starts in 2017...matches Jason Grimsley, Darrell Rasner and Javier Vazquez for the most career BB by a Yankees pitcher in the DH era.
- ✦ The last HR by a Yankees pitcher came in the pre-DH era (Lindy McDaniel solo HR on 9/28/72 at Detroit).
