METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost two straight following their three-game winning streak...New York is 5-5 in its last 10 games...New York is 11-11 in July...The 11 wins this month are tied for the second-most among NL East teams with Miami, behind the Phillies, who have 14 victories in July...The Mets are 18-38 in their last 56 games.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 1-2 on their six-game road trip and 22-26 on the road this year...New York is 9-18 in its last 27 road games and 4-4 in its last eight.

ROAD OPS: New York has a .752 OPS on the road this year, the sixth-highest mark in the majors.

SHUTOUTS: The Mets were shut out for the ninth time this year last night...The nine shutouts are tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

SECOND-HALF CONFORTO: Michael Conforto is tied for seventh in the NL with nine RBI since the All-Star break...He is tied for seventh in the NL with a .367 second-half batting average, seventh with .733 slugging percentage and 13th with a .429 on-base percentage...Conforto is also tied for 10th in the NL with three homers.

MORE MIKE: Conforto is 11-for-30 (.367) with three homers, two doubles and nine RBI in eight games since the All-Star break...Over his last 12 games, Conforto is hitting .333 (14-42) with four home runs, two doubles, 12 RBI, 11 runs scored and a .431 OBP...Conforto has a 14.7 percent walk-rate, the 10th-best in the majors.

AMED ROSARIO: Has scored six runs and driven in four runs in his last seven games...Rosario is hitting .296 (16-54) with 10 runs scored, two doubles, four triples, six RBI, five stolen bases and a .333 OBP in his last 14 games...Is tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista hit 43 homers with the Pirates from 2004-2008...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

FROM THE ELIAS FILES: Austin Jackson has played for eight major-league teams in the last five seasons, which ties him with Tyler Clippard for the highest total by one player over that span.

WILMER FLORES: Is batting .280 (23-82) with five doubles, three homers, eight RBI and a .322 on-base percentage in 22 games this month...Flores is hitting .282 (37-131) with six homers and 21 RBI in 37 games since June...Flores has hit .323 (10-31) with one home run and five RBI in 10 career games at PNC Park.

KEVIN PLawecki: Is hitting .288 (15-52) with five doubles, two homers, nine RBI, nine runs scored and a .373 on-base percentage in his last 17 games dating to June 19.

METS-PIRATES NOTES: The Mets are 6-13 at PNC Park since 2013.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



WHEELZ UP: Zack Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 14 of his 19 starts this season, including 12 of his last 15 starts...Over his last eight starts, he has a 3.35 ERA (17 earned runs/45.2 innings) and is 2-0 with a 3.03 ERA (11 earned runs/32.2 innings) in his last five starts.

FASTBALL: Wheeler's average fastball velocity on the season is up to 96.3, seventh-highest among MLB qualifiers...Here is a month-by-month look at Wheeler's average fastball: 94.3 in April, 95.1 in May, 96.2 in June, and 96.9 in July.

START ME UP: Mets starting pitchers are 7-7 with a 3.80 ERA (51 earned runs/120.2 innings) with 104 strikeouts this month.

PEN: New York's bullpen is 7-16 with a 5.72 ERA since May 25...Overall, the pen's 4.77 ERA is the 25th in the majors.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo has a .467 on-base percentage in the second half, the seventh-highest mark in the NL...He has walked four times in the last three games...Nimmo has a career-high 13 homers, but has one home run in his last 32 games...Overall, he is 11th in the NL with a .382 on-base percentage, 16th with a .862 OPS and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

WELCOME TO THE BIGS: Jeff McNeil became the second player in team history to reach safely in six of his first seven career plate appearances according to Elias...He is hitting .333 with a .571 OBP after his first five games in the majors...McNeil, 26, was batting .342 (116-339) with 26 doubles, five triples, 19 home runs, 71 RBI, 72 runs scored, a .411 OBP, a .617 slugging percentage and a 1.028 OPS in 88 combined games between Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League and Las Vegas...His 1.028 OPS was fifth-highest among all full-season minor league players while his .617 slugging percentage was third-best among full-season minor leaguers...His 71 RBI were 15th-most in the minors.

TODD FRAZIER: Went 1-2 with a double, walk and two RBI last night for St. Lucie (A) vs. Charlotte in a minor league rehabilitation game...He is scheduled to play for St. Lucie today...Frazier has been on the DL since July 9 with a left rib cage muscle strain.

IN THE MINORS: Third baseman Mark Vientos, the Mets second-round pick in 2017, went 1-3 with an RBI last night for Kingsport (R) of the Appalachian League...Vientos has 11 RBI in his last five games...He has six homers and 28 RBI in 30 games this year...He is tied for fourth in the League in RBI.

LAST TIME OUT: Won his second-straight start in the Mets's 6-3 victory over the Padres on July, 24 at Citi Field..Wheeler threw 7.0 innings and allowed two runs, earned, on four hits while fanning three and walking one...Retired the final 12 men he faced...Has pitched at least 7.0 innings in five of his last six starts at Citi Field... Prior to his last six home starts, had completed 7.0 innings at Citi Field three times in his career...Over his last seven starts, Wheeler is 2-1 with a 3.35 ERA (17 earned runs/45.2 innings)...Last won consecutive outings from August 15-20, 2014...The Mets have triumphed in each of his last three starts (last occurred from July 25-August 5, 2014).

VS. PIRATES: Wheeler today faces the Pirates for the second time this season and third time in his career...Took the no-decision in the Mets' 5-3 loss on June 27 vs. Pittsburgh...In that start, Wheeler tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing five hits while walking one and fanning seven...Wheeler's scoreless outing in that start was his second of the season...It was his eighth quality start of the season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Tonight's start is Wheeler's ninth away from Citi Field this season...In eight road starts this season, he is 2-1 with a 4.30 ERA (22 earned runs/46.0 innings)...The Mets have are 4-4 in those eight starts...In 44-career road starts, Wheeler is 15-9 with a 3.33 ERA (94 earned runs/254.0 innings).

QUALITY WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 14 of his 19 starts this season, including 10 of his last 12...Six of his last 10 starts have been quality outings...Has 10 quality starts overall after posting six quality starts in 17 outings in all of 2017...However, the Mets are 4-10 (.286 win pct) in his 14 starts of 6.0 or more innings and are 3-2 (.600) in his five starts of fewer than 6.0 innings.

JULY: Wheeler will be making his 19th-career start in the month of July...In 18-career July starts, he is 8-2 with a 3.09 ERA (37 earned runs/107.2 innings)... Earned his eighth-career July win in his last outing...Those eight wins are his most in any single calendar month.

STRIKEOUTS: Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.54 K/9 ratio (461 strikeouts/486.0 innings)...In his 19 starts this season, owns a rate of 8.58 K/9 (109 strikeouts/114.1 innings)...Has fanned at least seven batters 10 times this season, including five of his last seven outings (career-high 13 such games in 2014).

DIGGING INTO THE DATA: Wheeler leads the NL and ranks third in the majors with a 25.8 percent soft contact percentage...Generates the third-lowest rate of hard contact in the majors (second-lowest in NL) with a 27.0 percent hard-hit rate...Has the 10th-highest WAR (2.1) among NL pitchers according to Fangraphs... Among qualifying NL pitchers, throws the third-fastest fastball (average velocity 96.3 mph) and the hardest slider (average velocity 91.3 mph).

BY INNING: This season, Wheeler has a 5.21 ERA (11 earned runs/19.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA is 4.15 (44 earned runs/95.1 innings)...Wheeler has a 4.87 career ERA (46 earned runs/85.0 innings) in the first inning...Owns a 3.82 career ERA (170 earned runs/401.0 innings) in all subsequent innings.

PRESENT VS. PAST: Wheeler's start today will be his 20th of the season, a mark he has reached once before in his major league career (2014)...Made 17 starts in 2013 and 2017...Through 19 starts this season, Wheeler has thrown 114.1 innings, (had 108.1 innings in his first 19 starts in 2014)...Has a 1.30 WHIP and 4.33 ERA in 114.1 innings in 19 starts this season...In his 17 starts last season, had a 1.59 WHIP and a 5.21 ERA in 86.1 innings.

TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (5-8, 3.79)

LAST START: Defeated the Pirates at PNC Park on July 26 after throwing 6.0 innings and allowing four runs, earned, on three hits with a pair of walks and a career-high-tying nine strikeouts...Matz last fanned nine batters on August 9, 2016 vs. Arizona... Has allowed three or fewer hits in seven of his starts this season, tied for the second-most such outings in the NL.

AT NATIONALS PARK: Matz has not allowed a single earned run in 20.0 innings in the Nats' ballpark, spanning three starts there...Matz is one of three active pitchers in the majors with at least 20.0 innings pitched at a single ballpark with no earned runs allowed there (others are Pat Neshek, 0 ER/26.0 IP at Citizens Bank Park and Cole Hamels, 0 ER/20.0 IP at Kauffman Stadium).
