TONIGHT'S TODD FRAZIER BP PULLOVER: Upon inspecting tonight's Todd Frazier Replica BP Pullover giveaway we recognized there was a quality control issue in the production of the item...Thus, we will not be distributing the pullovers at tonight's game and they are being remade by the manufacturer... We will provide vouchers and redemption information to the first 15,000 fans through the turnstiles so that they can receive the item at a later date.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell below the .500 mark for the first time this season...New York has lost four straight games at Citi Field and seven of their last nine contests overall...The Mets are 12-15 at Citi Field this season.

RECORD NOTE: The Mets have played 41 games vs. teams that are currently over .500...Only one other team has played more games vs. teams over .500...The Rangers (42)...The Reds have also played 41 games vs. teams that are over .500...The Mets are 19-22 in those 41 games...Research courtesy of Elias.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets have scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 41 eighth-inning runs are tied for the most in the majors with the Braves and Astros.

HOME RUNS: The Mets have homered in eight of their last nine games...New York has 13 homers during this stretch...The club has 19 homers in its last 15 games and 29 long balls in its last 23 contests.

NIMMO POWER: Brandon Nimmo has 11 extra-base hits and nine RBI in his last 11 games (five doubles, one triple, five homers)... Nimmo driven in a run in a career-best five straight games...He has homered in back-to-back games and has three homers in his last five games...He has a career-high seven homers this season in 119 at-bats...Nimmo had six homers combined over his first two seasons (2016-2017) in 250 at-bats...Nimmo is tied for fifth in the majors with four triples.

NIMMO-METRICS: Brandon Nimmo leads the NL and is tied for fourth in the majors with a 1.033 OPS (min. 140 plate appearances) and leads the NL and is tied for third in the majors with a .436 on-base percentage...Nimmo has four straight multi-hit games, the longest streak of his career and the longest by a Met in a single-season since Asdrúbal Cabrera had five straight multi-hit games from September 5-12, 2017.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Cabrera is 13th in the National League with a .302 batting average...He is tied for sixth with 26 extra-base hits, tied for eighth with 15 doubles and tied for 13th in RBI (34)...Cabrera is tied for 14th in the NL with 10 home runs... Cabrera did not hit his 10th home run last year until August 27 (104 games).

KEVIN PLawecki: Made two starts at first base last year (September 25 in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Atlanta and September 27 vs. Atlanta).

STARTERS: Over their last 14 games, New York starters have a 2.59 ERA (21 earned runs/73.0 innings).

BULLPEN: Over its last nine games, the Mets bullpen is 1-7 with a 8.42 ERA (34 earned runs/36.1 innings).

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 8-3 vs. the Cubs at Citi Field since the 2015 postseason, but 0-2 this year.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



JACOB deGROM: Has allowed two runs in his last 40.1 innings (0.45 ERA) over his last seven starts...He has started a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...The last Mets starter to begin a year 5-0 was Matt Harvey in 2015.

deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom has tossed a franchise-record seven straight starts allowing one run or less...He has allowed one run or less in 54 of his 118 career starts (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 118 starts.

RANKINGS: DeGrom leads the National League and ranks second in the majors with a 1.52 ERA...Justin Verlander is first (1.11 ERA)...DeGrom is fourth in the NL with 85 strikeouts, tied for third with a .200 batting average against, fifth in WHIP (1.01) and second with a .527 OPS.

deCITI: Jacob deGrom has allowed one run in his last 18.0 innings with 27 strikeouts at home...During his career, deGrom has a 2.26 ERA (93 earned runs/370.0 innings) at home, the second-lowest home ERA among active pitchers with 300 or more innings at home...Clayton Kershaw is first (2.07 ERA).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Is hitting .320 (8-25) with four doubles, two RBI, four runs scored and a .452 on-base percentage...Bautista is one of only three players in the majors with at least 20 homers in each season since 2010, joining Nelson Cruz and Giancarlo Stanton.

TODD FRAZIER: Went 1-3 with a single and a run scored while playing 7.0 innings at third base last night in his second rehabilitation game for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League at Reno...Frazier is 2-6 (.333) with one RBI in two rehab games...He has been on the Disabled List since May 8 with a left hamstring strain.

ANTHONY SWARZAK: Worked 1.0 scoreless inning last night for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast at Reno...He allowed one hit, walked one and struck out one...He has tossed 2.0 shutout frames in two rehab outings for Las Vegas...Swarzak has been on the Disabled List since April 2, with a strained left oblique.

NASCAR COMES TO CITI FIELD: Former NASCAR Cup Series Champion and 2017 Daytona 500 winner Kurt Busch will be on the field during batting practice today...He will also participate in the Mets Ford Amazin' Race along the outfield warning track at the end of the fifth inning.

LAST START: DeGrom takes the mound for his 12th start of the season tonight against the Chicago Cubs having allowed two runs, earned, in his last 40.1 innings (0.45 ERA)... Took a no decision after leaving with a 2-1 lead vs. Atlanta in his last start, May 28 at SunTrust Park...Pitched 7.0 innings and surrendered five hits while walking three and tallying eight strikeouts.

VS. CHICAGO: DeGrom today faces the Cubs for the first time this season and sixth time in his career...Last faced Chicago on June 12, 2017 at Citi Field, when he tossed a complete-game, the second of his career...Allowed one run, earned, while walking four and striking out six...Earned the victory in the Mets 6-1 win...Is 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (13 earned runs/29.1 innings) in five-career starts against the Cubs, including a 2.33 ERA (five earned runs/19.1 innings) at Citi Field...Has won each of his last two starts vs. Chicago dating back to July 1, 2016.

deGROMINANT RUN: Since April 21, deGrom is 2-0 with a 0.45 ERA (two earned runs/40.1 innings pitched), has struck out 55 and walked 13...His 0.45 ERA is the lowest in the majors during that time and his 12.3 strikeouts per 9.0 innings rank third in the majors in that span...His 0.22 HR/9 rate during the run is the fourth-lowest in the majors.

IN deCITI: DeGrom tonight makes his sixth home start of the season...Is 2-0 with a 1.45 ERA (five earned runs/31.0 innings) in his five starts at Citi Field...That is the fourth-lowest home ERA in the NL...Has 46 strikeouts and four walks at home this season.

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the NL (second in majors) with a 1.52 ERA (11 earned runs/65.1 innings)...His 85 strikeouts this season are fourth-most in the NL and tied for 11th-most in the majors...Has begun a season 4-0 for the first time in his career and is one of two unbeaten NL starters this season (min. eight starts, also, Jeremy Hellickson)...Also ranks in the league's top 10 in opponent OPS (.527, second), strikeout rate (32.8%, third), strikeouts per nine innings (11.7, t-second) and home runs allowed per 9.0 innings (0.41 HR/9, second)...Has the second-best FIP in the majors (2.09).

ESCAPE ARTIST: Braves hitters went 0-6 with RISP in his last start and opponents are 0-28 with 15 strikeouts with RISP in his last seven starts overall...Has held opponents to a .093 (4-43) batting average against with runners in scoring position this season, third-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the NL (min. 40 batters faced with RISP)...That includes a 2-22 (.091) mark with RISP and two outs...Has twice faced a bases-loaded, no-out jam and each time retired the next three batters.

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in eight of his 11 starts this season...In his 118-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 54 times (45.8 percent)...That is also the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 118-career games...DeGrom shares the major-league lead with three scoreless starts of at least 7.0 innings this season...Has 18-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, third-most in the NL and fifth-most in the majors since 2014...Only Jake Arrieta (24), Clayton Kershaw (22), Chris Sale (20) and Max Scherzer (19) have more scoreless starts of at least 7.0 innings in the last five seasons.

NOTHING EXTRA...: Eight of the 47 hits deGrom has allowed this season have gone for extra bases (five doubles, three homers)...His .260 opponent slugging percentage leads in the NL and is second in the majors...His eight extra-base hits allowed are tied for the fewest among the 124 pitchers with at least 45.0 innings pitched this season.

...ESPECIALLY TO RIGHTIES: Has allowed only two XBH to righthanded hitters this season, the fewest among all pitchers who have faced at least 100 RHB this season... Opposing righties are 23-116 (.198), with one double, one home run, and 43 strikeouts... In his last five starts, righthanded batters have gone 5-38 (.132) with four walks and 17 strikeouts.

PUNCH 'EM OUT: Has six games with at least eight strikeouts this season, tied for third-most in the NL...His 24 double-digit strikeout outings are tied for third-most in the NL (tied for sixth-most in the majors) within a pitcher's first 118 career games...65 of his 85 strikeouts this season are of the swinging variety (76 percent), fourth-most in the NL.

FREE PASSES: deGrom has not walked more than three batters in a career-high 29 straight starts dating back to June 18 of last season...His 109 starts with three or fewer walks allowed are the most in franchise history in a pitcher's first 118-career games.

TOMMOROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (2-3, 3.55)

LAST START: Exited his last start, May 29 at Atlanta, with a mild strain of his left middle finger...Before leaving the game, had tossed 3.0-shutout innings, allowing one with two strikeouts and two walks in the Mets' 7-6 walk-off defeat...Was his shortest outing since July 26, 2017 when he also tossed 3.0 innings in a 6-3 loss in San Diego.

MATZ IN MAY: Matz finished May with a 2.25 ERA (six earned runs/24.0 innings) in five starts...In 10-career May starts, Matz is now 5-1 with a 1.70 ERA (11 earned runs/58.1 innings)...Since 2016, opponents have batted .192 (40-208) vs. Matz in May, the third-lowest average in May among the 122 pitchers with at least five May starts in that time.

- Grabbed his 150th career RBI with his solo homer on May 25 at Milwaukee...Conforto reached 150 RBI in his 312th career game...Only five other Mets began their major league career with 150 or more RBI in their first 312 games...David Wright (212 RBI), Darryl Strawberry (199), Ike Davis (170), Butch Huskey (162) and Steve Henderson (153).
- Tied his career high with four hits on May 18 vs. Arizona...Homered off Patrick Corbin on May 19, his first homer of a lefty since August 5, 2017 (Rich Hill)...Was his seventh career homer off a lefthanded pitcher overall...Corbin is the only lefty Conforto has homered off of more than once.
- Hit his third home run of the season with his go-ahead, two-run homer on May 11 at Philadelphia with the Mets trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning...It was the third home run in Mets history that gave the Mets a lead when trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning or later...The other two were hit by Lucas Duda (September 27, 2014, two-run walk off homer vs. Houston) and Daniel Murphy (April 27, 2015, a three-run homer in the top of the ninth at Miami).
- Hit his seventh career leadoff homer with his solo shot to start the game on May 7 in Cincinnati.
