INDUCTION DAY-This afternoon in Cooperstown, the National Baseball Hall of Fame will enshrine Vladimir Guerrero, Trevor Hoffman, Chipper Jones, Jack Morris, Alan Trammell and Jim Thome...Rays scout Tom Couston, who signed Thome, is attending the ceremonies as a guest of Thome... Carlos Gómez was a teammate of Hoffman for the 2010 Brewers, and Wilson Ramos was a teammate of Thome for the 2010 Twins.

Vlad's .324 avg. against the Rays is 8th-best all-time (min. 250 PA)...Hoffman's only app against them ended with a save on June 9, 2002...Chipper's .771 SLG against them was his best against any opponent, albeit in only 21 games...Thome hit 19 HR in 82 games vs. TB, including a walk-off on June 23, 2012 (with PHI).

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost consecutive games and are 4-5 since the All-Star break, and 5-8 in their last 13 games since July 12...this 13game stretch has brought the Rays from a season-high 4 games over .500 (48-44) to 53-52...the Rays would need to win today to avoid falling to 1-3 in series play since July 12 on the heels of a 5-1 stretch in series play.

- + The Rays haven't been better or worse than two games of .500 in a calendar month this year, and they are currently 12-11 in July.
- The Rays are 19-12 (.613) in 31 games since June 22 and 49-39 (.557) in 88 games since April 18 following a 4-13 start to the season.
- This season the Rays have scored 435 runs and allowed 435 runs

ROAD TRIPPIN'-This is the second and final single-series road trip of the season...the Rays went 1-3 in a 4-game road trip to Target Field from July 12-15, and they are currently 1-2 in this 4-game series in Baltimore...since May 31, the Rays have gone 7-19 (.269) on the road, 3rd-worst in the majors to the Orioles (.238) and Royals (.250)...this has dropped their season road record from 17-13 to 24-32, and they were 9-1 in the 10 road games before this stretch, from May 14-30...the Rays have allowed at least 5 runs in six of their last 7 games on the road, including double-digit runs in three of their last 4 games and four of their last 6 games on the road.

DOUBLE FLUSH—The Rays lost 15-5 on Fri at BAL and 11-2 last night at BAL...the Rays have allowed double-digit runs in consecutive games for the first time since June 30-July 1, 2016 vs. DET, and for the first time on the road since Sep 24-25, 2014 at BOS...for the record, only once in franchise history have the Rays allowed 10 runs or more in three straight games: April 4-6, 2001 vs. TOR, at BOS...the Rays have allowed 29 runs so far this series, already their 3rd-most for a single series this season behind May 11-13 at BAL (35) and July 12-15 at MIN (33).

- + The Rays have allowed at least 15 hits in consecutive games for the first time since the June 10, 2017 doubleheader vs. OAK, and for the first time on the road since April 13-14, 2012 at BOS...three times in club history they have allowed 15 hits or more in three straight games, but not since June 19-22, 2007 at ARI, vs. LAD.
- This is only the sixth time in franchise history the Rays have lost by 9 runs or more in consecutive games, first since July 21 (G2)-22, 2007 at NYY...they have never done that in three straight games.
- The Rays have lost consecutive games despite scoring first in each game, falling to 40-19 (.678) when doing so...the Rays are 0-for-14 with RISP in these games and the Orioles are 13-for-26 with RISP.
- + Last night the Orioles 7-thru-9 batters combined to go 10-for-12 with 22B, 2HR, 9RBI and 7 runs...Trey Mancini and Joey Rickard hit back-to-back homers on consecutive pitches in the 2nd inning, the fifth time this season the Rays yielded back-to-back homers.

THE BIG INNING—Rays pitching has allowed at least 4 runs in a frame three times this series and 12 times in 19 games since July 6, compared to once in 26 games from June 7-July 4 and three times in 48 games from May 14-July 4...last night the Orioles scored 4 runs in the 4th and 6th, with those 8 runs charged to Jalen Beeks, who became the third pitcher to allow at least 8 runs in his Rays debut, following Luis de los Santos (9) on July 20, 2002 at TOR and Juan Guzmán (8) on April 7, 2000 vs. CLE.

+ Beeks became the 30th pitcher used by the club this season, tying the franchise record for a single season (2017)...he became the 19th rookie used by the Rays, a club record for a single season.

NOT THE RAYS WAY-Rays pitching has a 6.11 ERA (113.1-IP, 87-R/77-ER) in the last 13 games since July 12, 2nd-highest in the majors over that stretch to the Rangers (6.61)...the 87 runs are their most allowed over a 13-game span since June 26-July 8, 2016 (88)...they have yielded 4 runs or more in 10 of these 13 games, 6 runs or more in 7 games and double-digit runs in 4 games...over this stretch, the starters have pitched to a 5.48 ERA (44.1-IP, 27-ER), 5th-highest in the majors and 2nd-highest in the AL, and the bullpen has a 6.52 ERA (69-IP, 50-ER), 7th-highest in the majors.

+ This 12-game stretch comes on the heels of a 1.51 ERA (71.1-IP, 12-ER) in the previous 18 games from June 22-July 11.

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—The Rays are 6-6 this season against the Orioles (2-1 at home, 4-5 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards), but they have been outscored, 73-46, and outhomered, 21-7 in the 9 games in Baltimore...the last 4 games here have resulted in a 19-1 loss, 4-3 win, 15-5 loss and 11-2 loss...the Rays have lost by at least 9 runs in three of their last 4 games here, while their margin of defeat has been 9 runs or more only once in their other 101 games this season (June 6 at WAS, 11-2 loss)... the 73 runs allowed are their 4th-most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue, and the 21 HR are their 2nd-most all-time...this is their last game in Baltimore this season; they host the Orioles at Tropicana Field from Aug 7-9 and Sep

7-9...they went 2-1 in the first series at home, outscoring the Orioles, 13-6, and yielded only 1 HR...last season the Rays went 11-8 against the Orioles, their first season series win over them since 2013 (13-6).

UP NEXT: ANGELS—The Rays went 3-1 in a 4-game series at Angel Stadium, May 17-20, and they are 77-98 all-time against the Angels (37-47 at home, 40-51 on the road)...14 of the club's 22 runs (63.6 pct.) this season have scored via 8 HR (4 solo, three 2-run, one grand slam)...the Rays are 45-35 against them in the Rays era, including 4-3 last season (2-2 at home, 2-1 on the road)...since the start of the 2010 season, the visiting team has dominated the matchup of these two clubs: the Angels have gone 17-11 at Tropicana Field, including 7-1-1 in series play, while the Rays are 26-11 at Angel Stadium and have gone 9-1-1 in series play.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 20-23 (.465) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 41) and 1-run losses (Orioles, 20)...they started the season 0-5 and 5-12 in 1-run games; since then, they are 20-18 and 15-11 in 1-run games, respectively, and they are 10-4 in 1-run games since June 19...41.0 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.6 pct. of games in the majors...47.8 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).

HIT BY PITCH CHAMPIONS-Daniel Robertson has been hit by pitch in consecutive games and eight times in 20 games (17 starts) since July 3, giving the Rays the top three in the AL in hit by pitch: C.J. Cron (14), Carlos Gómez (14) and Robertson (12)...Rays batters have been plunked a majors-most 63 times this season, ahead of the Rangers (59)...Rays pitchers, meanwhile, have hit 35 batters, tied for 5th-fewest in the majors.

THEN vs. NOW-This is the second straight season the Rays have held a 53-52 record through 105 games, but they are currently 19.5 GB of the first-place Red Sox in the AL East and 8.5 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card, compared to 4.5 GB in the division and 2.5 GB of the second Wild Card through 105 games last season...last season, the Rays were positioned to make the postseason as late as the end of July 22, when they were 51-47 and tied with the Yankees for the two Wild Card spots.

+ The Rays have traded six veterans over the last nine weeks: Denard Span, Alex Colomé, Brad Miller, Nathan Eovaldi, Matt Andriese and Jonny Venters...last season the Rays acquired six players over the six weeks leading up to the trade deadline, all with at least six seasons in the majors: Trevor Plouffe, Adeiny Hechavarria, Sergio Romo, Dan Jennings, Lucas Duda and Steve Cishek.

LAST START—On Tues vs. NYY, made his first app since April 28 at BOS and went 6.2 IP, the longest outing of his career, and tied a career high with 6 SO...took his second loss, both coming at home, opposite **Masahiro Tanaka**'s complete game shutout...yielded RBI groundouts in the 1st and 5th innings and a sacrifice fly in the 7th inning, his last batter faced...his only walk allowed was intentional in the 7th inning...his line: L, 6.2 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 1 BB (1 IBB), 6 SO, 1 HBP, 87 pit, 60 str.

WELCOME BACK—Was recalled from Triple-A Durham on Tuesday for his second stint in the majors this season, following Opening Day–June 3—which included a stint on the disabled list...on April 28 at BOS, yielded 3 R/ER in 2 IP plus 4 BF in the 3rd inning, and was placed on the 10-day DL (right forearm strain) on May 1, retroactive to April 29...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Durham on June 4.

+ Is seeking his first career win...excluding openers, is the first Rays pitcher to remain winless through the first 6 starts of his career since **Jason Hammel** was winless (0-10) through his first 17 starts in 2006-07.

MINOR MATTERS—Went 0-2 with a 5.28 ERA (30.2-IP, 18-ER) in 8 starts with Durham...made his first 2 starts there on a rehab assignment, then another 6 starts following his June 4 option...was on the minor league disabled list, June 22–July 7, with right shoulder inflammation, and pitched to a 2.25 ERA (12-IP, 3-ER) and .227 opp avg. (10-for-44) in 3 starts after his return...his season highs with the Bulls were 5 IP (2x-last July 19 at Buffalo) and 72 pitches on June 14 vs. Gwinnett.

+ Also made a start with Class-A Charlotte, beginning his major league rehab assignment with the Stone Crabs on May 24 vs. Fort Myers (2-IP, 0-R/ER).

THE EARLY GOING—Through the end of April, his 24 SO ranked 2nd among AL rookies behind LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (26), and his 5 starts tied CWS **Carson Fulmer** for most among AL rookies...he began his career on a scoreless streak of 14.1 IP, before allowing a sac fly in the 1st inning of his 4th app...it was the longest scoreless streak ever for a Rays pitcher to begin his career, passing **Doug Waechter** (11.1) in 2003, according to the Elias Sports Bureau...became the first Ray to begin his career without allowing a run in the first 2 starts of his career...became the first pitcher to do this in the majors since LAD **Kenta Maeda** from April 6-12, 2015 at SD, vs. ARI and the first AL pitcher since TEX **Chi Chi Gonzalez** from May 30–June 5, 2015 vs. BOS, at KC.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW.—On April 1 vs. BOS, his only hit allowed in 4 IP was a RBI single by Rafael Devers (run charged to José Alvarado)...was the third pitcher in club history with a scoreless app of at least 4 IP in his major league debut, following Enny Romero (4.2 IP, start) on Sep 22, 2013 vs. BAL and Scott Kazmir (5 IP, start) on Aug 23, 2004 at SEA...it was the longest scoreless relief outing ever for a Rays pitcher making his major league debut.

PITCHER OF THE YEAR—Named the 2017 Minor League Pitcher of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations department...spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Durham, earning a May 2 promotion from Double-A Montgomery...went 13-5 with a 2.73 ERA (168.1-IP, 51-ER) in 27 apps (26 starts) between the two levels...led Rays minor leaguers in innings, tied for 2nd in wins, ranked 3rd with 141 SO and 4th in ERA.

+ Ranked among International League leaders in ERA (2.74, 4th), wins (12, tied for 4th), innings (141, 5th) and WHIP (0.98, 2nd).

X-RAY REPORT—Yonny's favorite player growing up was Yankees closer **Mariano Rivera**...as a child, he and his friends would play a game similar to baseball that replaced the ball and bat with *chapitas*, or bottle caps, and a broomstick...his favorite meals are *arepas*—baked cornmeal patties sometimes stuffed with cheese or meat—and chicken with rice.

- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second
- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers Al Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
