TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (2-1) of a 4-game series vs Chris Ware's first-place Phillies and Game 10 (4-5) of a 10-game homestand coming out of the All-Star break that included a 3-0 series sweep loss to the streaking Pirates and a 2-1 series win over the Cardinals...following tomorrow's travel day, the Reds on Tue night will begin on a 9-game road trip to Det's Comerica Park (2g), Wsh's Nationals Park (4g) and NYM's Citi Field (3g).

TIGERS UP NEXT: The Reds are 13-11 all-time vs Det, including a 2-game series sweep in June at Great American Ball Park...beginning Tue night will visit Comerica Park for the first time since a 2-game series split in June 2015...Cin's Joey Votto (8 years) and Det's Miguel Cabrera (11) and Victor Martinez (8) are 3 of only 5 active players who hit at least .300 in at least 8 seasons...that list also includes LAA's Albert Pujols (10) and Sea's Robinson Cano (8)...the Reds beat the Tigers, 4 games to 3, in the 1940 World Series (see media guide Page 441)...Reds vs Tigers info is on media guide Page 333.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: The Reds are 10-3 vs the American League (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox, 2-1 at Cle), tied with the Yankees, Rockies and Brewers for third-most interleague wins this season (Pit 12, Oak 11) and including a 6-game winning streak vs the AL from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their longest interleague winning streak...the Reds have won both of this season's 3-game interleague road series (2-1 at Min, 2-1 at Cle)...prior to this season hadn't won an interleague road series of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 148-200 all-time vs the AL, at .425 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the American League since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 33-60 vs AL (.355)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 44-43 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds split their 2 completed series since the All-Star break (0-3 vs Pit, 2-1 vs StL)...in their last 8 series of the first half went 6-1-1 with 2 sweeps (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws, 1-2 at Chc, 2-1 at Cle, 2-1 at StL)...the Reds' 2-1 series loss at Cubs completed on 7/8 snapped their 5-series unbeaten streak, their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in June (15-11, .577).

REHABBING: OF Scott Schebler (sprained AC joint, right shoulder) is 3 games into a rehabilitation assignment at Class AAA Louisville (2-9, .222, 1 2b, 1rbi, 3bb, 1k, 1r)...made all 3 of his starts as the Bats' designated hitter...played Wed, Thu and Fri and took off last night...suffered the shoulder injury on 7/14 at StL, when he ran into the outfield walk while making a catch...the Bats are hosting Rochester at 6:00 p.m. tonight.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield includes 3 National League All-Stars and collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (473), batting average (.286) and on-base percentage (.369)...All-Star 1B Joey Votto leads the National League in on-base percentage and is tied for the lead in walks...All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett ranks among the leaders in hitting (3rd), RBI (9th), multi-hit games (34, T5th), hits (3rd) and total bases (10th)...All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez leads the National League in RBI and ranks among the leaders in hitting (10th), HR (T5th), total bases (9th), on-base percentage (6th), slugging percentage (3rd), hitting with RISP (.337, 10th), fewest AB per RBI (4.2, 2nd) and fewest AB per HR (13.8, 3rd)...SS José Peraza leads the National League in most at bats per strikeout (9.6) while ranking among the leaders in hits (5th), stolen bases (8th) and overall hitting (15th).

IN A PINCH: As a pinch hitter, RHP Michael Lorenzen is 3-for-8 (2hr, 5rbi) this season and 4-for-15 (3hr, 6rbi, 1bb, 4k, 1sh) in his career, with home runs on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...Lorenzen most recently hit in Thu's 9-4 loss vs Phi, entered the game in the first inning in relief of starter Tyler Mahle and finished 0-for-2.

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...this afternoon is making his 22nd start of the season and his **37th Major League** appearance and start...will be his second career appearance and start and second of the season vs the **Phillies**...in his last 2 starts posted a **2.61 ERA** (10.1ip, 3er)...has **5 quality starts**...his **3-game winning streak** from **5/8-5/24** (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career...in his 7-2 win on **5/8 vs NYM**, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the **10-4 win** on **4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

Homer Bailey on Tue at Det will make his **14th start of the season** and the **206th appearance and start of his career**...will be his second career start vs the **Tigers** and his first start vs an **American League team** since **7/26/17 at NYY** (9-5 loss)...made his **last 24 starts vs NL teams** (5-11, 5.84)...in **19 career starts vs American League teams** is **6-8, 5.92** (103.1ip, 111h, 48bb, 74k, 14hr)...**Tue vs StL** threw **6.2 innings** in his first appearance for the Reds since **5/28 at Ari**...following that **5/28 start** was scheduled to make his next appearance out of the bullpen, but before he pitched went on the 10-day disabled list with **right knee inflammation** (6/2)...on rehab at Louisville from **6/11-7/18** made 6 starts and 1 relief appearance (2-2, 4.78).

- Recorded his last stolen base on 7/9 at Cle...doesn't have a stolen base attempt in 13 apps since then, his longest streak of the season.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 265, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 79 starts batting ninth...his 79 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 68 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...since he started batting ninth regularly on 4/27 is hitting .242 overall (60-248, .309obp).

15 DILSON HERRERA, inf

Homestand: 7g as PH, 1g at 2B, 1-7 (.143), 1rbi

- Since he was promoted from Louisville on 7/6, in his Reds debut has made 14 apps, including 1 start (2B, 7/10 at Cle)...are his first apps in the Major Leagues since 10/3/15 for NYM vs Wsh...made his last 6 apps as a pinch hitter.
- Mon's 2-out, RBI-single off Bud Norris was the first walkoff hit of his career (2-1 win).
- In the 5-run seventh inning of the 9-1 win on 7/13 at StL produced a pinch-hit HR (3-run off Sam Tuivailala), his first Major League hit, HR and RBI since 9/27/15 for NYM at Cin...was his first career pinch-hit home run and tied his career high for RBI in a game (3).
- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Homestand: 10-35 (.286), 5 2b

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Beginning 4/6/17 has a 9-game hitting streak vs the Phillies (13-36, .351, 4 2b, 2rbi, .395obp).
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2)...LAA's Andrelton Simmons has 3 of the 4 longest streaks without a strikeout (90pa, 63pa, 46pa)...Det's Victor Martinez has an active streak of 50 plate apps without a strikeout.
- Has hit safely in 7 of his 9 apps since the All-Star break (10-35, .286, 5 2b).
- Beginning 5/26 has reached base safely in 47 of his last 51 apps (69-201, .343, 11 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 24rbi, 9sb, 28r, .473slg, .398obp, .871ops).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In the batting order hit first (32gs), second (36gs), seventh (22gs) and eighth (8gs).
- Produced 11 hits at StL in the series preceding the All-Star break, tying the club record for most hits over any 3-game span (Vada Pinson vs Mil/Phi, 8/12-8/14, 1959)...Peraza is the only player in Reds history with 11 hits in a 3-game series.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Homestand: 7-34 (.206), 5hr, 9rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb leads the National League in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Became only the third Reds batter since 2000 with at least 70 RBI (71) prior to the All-Star break, joining Ken Griffey Jr. in 2000 (72) and Brandon Phillips in 2013 (74).
- Last night went 0-for-4, snapping a streak in which he had homered in a career-high 5 consecutive apps to tie the club record...has produced an RBI in each of his last 6 apps (9rbi), the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and 1 shy of his season high (7g, 6/16-6/23, 9rbi)...Joe Morgan holds the club record for consecutive apps with at least 1 RBI (10, 1976).
- In his last 57 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .315, raising his season BA from .274 (69-219, 9 2b, 1 3b, 17hr, 48rbi, .598slg, .403obp, 1.001ops)...this stretch includes a pair of career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10), the longest hitting streaks by any Reds batter this season and when snapped were the longest active hitting streaks in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/5/17 is hitting .287 with 29 doubles, 2 triples, 38 HR and 120 RBI (.538slg, .383obp, .921ops).From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Homestand: 6-24 (.250), 2bb, 9bb, 3r

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and is tied with Wsh's Bryce Harper for the lead in walks.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- In the Reds' 105 games has made 104 apps and 101 starts...missed his 4 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 5/24 vs Pit and 7/20 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Homestand: 2gs in RF, 1g as PH, 2-8, 3-run HR

- Was promoted from Louisville on Thu, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- Started each of the last 2 games in RF (2-7, 3-run HR).
- Fri vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- Thu vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
