METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 4-6 in their last 10 games... New York is 9-27 in its last 36 games and 11-32 in its last 43 contests...The Mets have now gone 15 straight series without a series victory dating to their sweep of Arizona from May 18-20 at Citi Field...New York has 12 wins in its last at-bat, tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

AT HOME: New York is 2-4 on their season-high 11-game homestand...The Mets have lost 19 of their last 23 home games... New York is 16-30 at home this year.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Mets have now won 19 of their last 25 series vs. the Phillies...New York is 42-22 vs. Philadelphia since the start of the 2015 campaign, including 4-3 this year...New York has out-homered the Phillies, 108-52 since the start of the 2015 season...According to Elias, no major league team has hit as many home runs against one opponent since 2015 season as the Mets have hit against the Phillies - 108.

ALL-STAR: Jacob deGrom was named to the NL All-Star team... He was also an All-Star in 2015 and became the first pitcher in All-Star Game history to strike out three batters (Stephen Vogt, Jason Kipnis, José Iglesias) in an inning with 10 pitches or fewer in Cincinnati...DeGrom leads the majors with a 1.79 ERA, is third in the NL and ninth in the majors with 142 strikeouts, third in the NL in WHIP (0.99) and is third in the majors with a .297 slugging percentage against mark...DeGrom is the 13th pitcher in team history to be named to multiple All-Star Games.

deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom has allowed one earned run or less in 11 of his last 14 starts...He has allowed one run or less in 57 of his 125 career starts (46 percent).

deCITI: Jacob deGrom as allowed eight earned runs in his last 47.0 innings at home (1.53 ERA)...DeGrom owns a 2.26 career ERA at Citi Field over 62 starts...That is the second-lowest home ERA among active pitchers with 300 or more innings at home... Clayton Kershaw is first (2.07 ERA).

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is hitting .286 (8-28) with three homers and seven RBI in July...He is hitting .321 (26-81) with three doubles, five homers, 15 RBI, nine runs scored and a .389 OBP in his last 21 games...Cabrera has 51 RBI, tied for his highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...He also had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half...The only other Mets second baseman with 50 or more RBI in the first half is Edgardo Alfonzo, who did it twice (58 RBI in 2000 and 55 RBI in 1999)...Cabrera has hit .429 (24-56) with seven doubles, three homers and 10 RBI in his last 15 games vs. the Phillies.

BULLPEN: New York's bullpen has allowed one earned run in 12.2 innings (0.71 ERA) during this series...Mets relievers have combined for 18 wins this year, the 12th-most in the majors.

SETH LUGO: Is 2-1 with a 2.09 ERA (10 ER/43.0 IP) in 25 relief outings...Lugo has a 1.26 ERA (4 ER/28.2 IP) in relief since May 1...He has one run in his last 10.1 relief innings (0.87 ERA).

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won double-digit games vs. the Phillies each of the last six years, the longest such streak in franchise history.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



AMED ROSARIO: Tied his career-high with three hits last night and had his first career multi-triple game...The last Met with two or more triples in a game other than Reyes was Cory Sullivan, who had a pair on August 12, 2009 at Arizona...Rosario is hitting .400 (4-10) during this series...He has a .412 OBP over his last 11 games.

FLORES FLOURISHING: Over his last 43 games, Wilmer Flores is batting .307 (42-137) with 13 doubles, six home runs, 23 RBI, 14 runs scored, 11 walks and a .353 OBP (dating back to May 4).

JARRED KELENIC: The Mets first-round draft pick from this year went 2-4 with four RBI, including a go-ahead two-run homer in the eighth-inning in his first game with Kingsport (R) of the Appalachian League last night vs. Greeneville.

EL ALL-STAR GAME: Binghamton will send five representatives to tonight's Eastern League All-Star Game in Trenton: catcher Patrick Mazeika, infielder Levi Michael, outfielder Tim Tebow, LHP David Roseboom and LHP Daniel Zamora...RHP Nabil Crismatt was named to the team but he was promoted to Las Vegas.

PCL ALL-STAR GAME: Las Vegas outfielder Zach Borenstein will represent the Mets at the Triple-A All-Star Game tonight.

FIRST PITCH: Chris Majkowski, the Mets radio producer-engineer for the last 26 years, will throw out tonight's ceremonial first pitch...Majkowski has not missed a game since August 8, 1993, a span of 4,011 consecutive games (including tonight)...He graduated from Fordham University in 1989 and has also worked for the New York Giants, New York Knicks, New York Rangers and St. John's University.

FOOD DRIVE: The Mets will host their annual Summer Food Drive presented by Hain Celestial benefiting The River Fund NY on Saturday, July 14 from 2:00 p.m.-4:30 p.m. and Sunday, July 15 from 11:00 a.m.-1:30 p.m. by the Jackie Robinson Rotunda. ...Fans donating at least 10 non-perishable items will receive a voucher redeemable for two tickets to a remaining select Mets home game...Among the items most needed are: milk (powdered, evaporated, boxed), all types of pasta (packaged), rice, canned vegetables, canned fruit, mac and cheese (packaged), oatmeal, hot and cold cereal (packaged) and tuna.

LAST START: DeGrom tonight makes his 19th start of the season...In his last start, July 6 vs. Tampa Bay, tossed a season-high-tying 8.0 innings (third time) and allowed one run, earned, on four hits while striking out eight and walking one...Took a no decision despite registering his 10th-straight quality start in the Mets' 5-1, walk-off victory at Citi Field...Was his 15th-straight start allowing three or fewer runs, the longest streak by a Mets pitcher within a single season since Dwight Gooden's 24-start streak in 1985.

ALL-STARDOM: DeGrom was named an All-Star for the second time in his career (also, 2015)...In 2015, became the first pitcher in All-Star Game history to strike out three batters in an inning with 10 pitches or fewer...Is the 13th pitcher in team history to be named to multiple All-Star Games...His 1.79 ERA is the second-lowest first-half ERA in franchise history (Dwight Gooden holds the franchise record with a 1.68 ERA in 1985).

VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Mets have lost each of his last two outings against the Phils after winning his first 10 starts vs. the club...Will be facing Philadelphia for the second time this season...Last pitched against the Phillies on May 13 at Citizens Bank Park...Pitched 1.0 inning (shortest start of his career) before exiting for precautionary reasons following a one-hour rain delay and a 45-pitch first inning (20 foul balls)...Walked the bases loaded before escaping unscathed in the abbreviated start...His six wins against Philadelphia are tied for the most wins he has against any opponent (also, Washington).

HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY: His 14 quality starts are the third-most in the NL this season while his current streak of 10 quality starts in a row is the longest-active streak in the majors (no other current streak of longer than seven QS)...Has also punched out at least six batters in each of those 10 quality starts, the second-longest such streak in franchise history (Tom Seaver made 15-straight quality starts starts with at least six strikeouts from August 6, 1971-April 26, 1972)...Is the longest streak of its kind since Clayton Kershaw pulled the feat in 12-straight starts from May 26-August 1, 2015.

IN deCITI: Owns a 1.80 ERA (12 earned runs/60.0 innings) in nine starts at Citi Field this season...That is the third-lowest home ERA in the NL this season (sixth in majors)...His .193 opponent average at home (42-218) ranks fourth in the NL...Has a 2.26 ERA (100 earned runs/399.0 innings) in 62-career starts at home, the third-lowest home ERA since 2014 behind Clayton Kershaw (1.88) and Jake Arrieta (2.24).

deGROMINANCE: Since April 21, deGrom owns a 1.39 ERA (14 earned runs/90.1 innings) in 14 starts, the best mark in the majors...During that time, he has struck out 112 and walked 23...His 0.96 WHIP and 11.16 K/9 rate each rank second in the NL in that span while his 4.87 K/BB ratio ranks third and his 0.50 HR/9 rate is fourth-best.

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the majors with a 1.79 ERA (23 earned runs/115.1 innings)...His 142 strikeouts this season are third-most in the NL...Ranks second in the league with a .560 opponent OPS and is second in the NL with a 0.55 HR/9 rate...Ranks second among all major league pitchers with a 5.4 bWAR.

deGROMETRICS: According to FanGraphs, deGrom's 30.1 percent hard-hit rate is the seventh-lowest in the NL this season...DeGrom also produces the second-most soft contact in the NL (23.7 percent), behind teammate Zack Wheeler (25.1 percent)...Leads the NL with a 2.34 FIP...Has stranded an NL-leading 85.2 percent of his baserunners allowed this season.

ESCAPE ARTIST: The Rays went 0-6 with RISP in his last start and deGrom has held opponents to a .128 (10-78) batting average with RISP this season, second-lowest in the majors and lowest in the NL...That includes a 4-42 (.095) mark with RISP and two outs...Opponents are 6-64 (.094) with 31 strikeouts with RISP in his last 14 starts overall...Opponents are hitless in 12 at-bats with one sac fly and nine strikeouts with the bases loaded vs. deGrom this year.

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in 11 of his 18 starts this season, tied with three others for the second-most such starts in the majors...In his 125-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 57 times (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 125-career games...Has 18-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, fourth-most in the majors since his debut...Only Jake Arrieta (25), Clayton Kershaw (22) and Chris Sale (22) have more.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (4-6, 3.31)

LAST START: Pitched 6.1 innings, and allowed one run, earned, on five hits while walking three and striking out five on July 7 vs. the Rays...Was his eighth start this season (second-straight) allowing one or no earned runs.

STRANDED: Rays hitters went 0-12 vs. Matz with runners on base in his last start, including 0-10 with runners in scoring position...Matz has not allowed a hit in his last two starts with runners on base (opponents are 0 for their last 26 with runners on dating to his start vs. Pittsburgh on June 26)...Since May 5, opponents are hitting .149 (17-114) with men on base and .115 (7-61) with RISP off Matz in 12 starts...Overall this season, hitters are 26-140 (.186) with runners on and 16-83 (.193) with RISP off Matz.

- Cracked his first career walk-off homer with his walk-off grand slam on July 6 vs. Tampa Bay...Was his sixth career grand slam and also his sixth career walk-off RBI (first since 2014)...The walk-off grand slam was the first by a Met since Ike Davis hit one on April 5, 2014 vs. Cincinnati.
- Bautista's walk-off grand slam was the 337th home run of his career...According to STATS, Bautista is the second player in MLB history to hit 300 or more home runs before his first career walk-off blast...Mark Teixeira's first game-ending homer was the 409th of his career.

- Is averaging a home run once every 25.21 at-bats as a Met...This season he is hitting a home run once every 21.00 at-bats, which would be the best rate of his career for a single-season (homered every 22.65 at-bats in 2016, his first season with the Mets).
- Homered in consecutive games on July 1 and July 3 for the first time since September 21-22, 2016...Was the 15th time in his career he's gone deep in back-to-back games.
