TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 10, 2015: At 6 hours and 49 minutes (not including a 16-minute delay), the Yankees lose to the Red Sox, 6-5, in 19 innings at Yankee Stadium in the longest home game in franchise history.

April 10, 1998: The Yankees draw the largest regular season crowd in remodeled original Yankee Stadium history (56,717), defeating Oakland in the home opener, 17-13.

April 10, 1946: Bob Watson is born in Los Angeles, Calif. Watson played for the Yankees from 1980-82 and served as the club's general manager from 10/23/95 - 2/2/98.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 11, 2004: The Yankees defeat the White Sox, 5-4, as Mike Mussina records his 200th career victory.

April 11, 1912: In their final home opener at Hilltop Park, the Yankees debut pinstripes for the first time in franchise history in a 5-3 loss vs. Boston. Though the Yankees would abandon the look in the following two seasons (1913-14), by 1915, pinstripes were back on their home uniforms for good.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a six-game road trip tonight at Boston (3G, tonight-Thurs.)...will also visit Detroit for 3G (Fri.-Sun.)...went 3-3 on their six-game homestand (2-0 vs. TB, 1-3 vs. BAL).

- ▶ Have not been below .500 at any point this season, going 3-0 when they begin the day with equal wins and losses.
- ▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.
- ▶ Are 3-3 thus far on a stretch of 16-of-22G at home (4/3-26).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Sunday at Yankee Stadium, the Yankees suffered an 8-7 loss to the Orioles in 12 innings...led, 5-0, after the first inning...**LHP Jordan Montgomery** (4.1IP, 10H, 4ER, 2BB, 4K, 1HR) started and took a no-decision...**C Austin Romine** (3-for-5, 1BB) had three RBI singles, in the first, fifth and seventh...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-5, 1R, 2RBI, 1BB) hit a two-run single in the first...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-5, 1R, 2BB) reached base four times but saw his club-record home RBI streak snapped at 14 games.

- ▶ **Yankees batters** collected a season-high 16 hits but were held homerless for a second consecutive home game for the first time since 5/11-12/17.
- ▶ Went 6-for-20 with RISP, marking just the second time since 1974 that they lost a game in which they had at least 20AB with RISP (also 5-for-23 on 10/5/91 vs. Cleveland).

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Yankees lost in 14 innings on Friday vs. Baltimore and in 12 innings on Sunday...marked the first time the Yankees had two games last at least 12 innings in the same home series since 1990, when they lost to Minnesota in 12 innings on 7/6/90-G1 and won in 12 innings on 7/7/90.

RELIEF HEATING: Yankees relievers lead the Majors with 63K and a 13.39 K/9.0IP ratio (63K/42.1IP).

- ▶ **RHP Chad Green** is tied for the AL lead among relievers with 11K in just 5.0IP...**RHP Dellin Betances** (10K in 6.0IP) is fourth and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (9K in 5.0IP) is tied for fifth.

ROAD RULES: Since the 2017 All-Star break, **RHP Luis Severino** has allowed 1R-or-fewer in seven consecutive road starts, tied for the AL's second-longest streak of road starts with one-or-zero runs since 1908, behind Minnesota's Johan Santana (eight starts from 7/17-9/29/04)...is tied for the eighth-longest such streak among MLB pitchers in that span...is the second Yankee with such a streak, joining Al Downing (5/14-9/14/68)...is 5-0 with a 0.78 ERA (46.1IP, 26H, 5R/4ER, 14BB, 55K, 2HR) during the streak.

- ▶ Is 11-6 with a 2.86 ERA (169.2.0IP, 54ER) in 34 career road appearances (27 starts)...among active pitchers with at least 25 road starts, his 2.86 ERA ranks fourth behind Aaron Sanchez (2.66), Clayton Kershaw (2.72) and Zach Davies (2.86).

WAR (FanGraphs): Despite not being in the starting lineup on Sun. vs. Baltimore, **SS Didi Gregorius** still went 1-for-2 with 1 double and 1BB...his .906 slugging average and 1.430 OPS both lead the AL and are second in the Majors to Bryce Harper (.966 SLG, 1.519 OPS)...also leads the AL in OBP (.524) and is tied for the AL lead with 10RBI...**leads the Majors with 1.1 WAR (FanGraphs).**

- ▶ Has 12 hits in 2018, including 10 for extra-bases (6 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR)...leads the Majors in extra-base hits...in 2017, did not pick up his 10th (and 11th) extra-base hits until his 32nd game of the season on 6/3/17.
- ▶ Is the fifth Yankee (sixth occurrence) since 1908 to tally at least 10XBH through the team's first 10G of a season...the others: Derek Jeter (12XBH in 1999), Alex Rodriguez (11 in 2007), Nick Swisher (10XBH in 2009) and Babe Ruth (10XBH in both 1921, '26).
- ▶ Is tied for the AL lead with 9BB in 42PA in 2018 (21.4%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years with the Yankees...did not draw his ninth walk last season until his 58th game of the year (7/3/17).
- ▶ In 6G on the recent homestand, hit .444/.615/1.111 (8-for-18) with 7R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI, 7BB and 2SB.

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge went 2-for-5 with 1R and 2BB on Sun. vs. Baltimore, his 13th game since the start of 2017 reaching base at least four times (fourth-most in MLB)...extended his hitting streak to 7G, the longest by a Yankee so far in 2018...is batting .346 (9-for-26) with 8BB and 9K during the streak.

- ▶ Extended his home hitting streak to 16 games (since 9/17/17), **the longest active home hitting streak in the Majors** and one shy of his career best (17G from 6/10-7/28/17).
- ▶ Is batting .305 (18-for-59) with 6HR in his last 18 road games (since 8/22/17) after hitting just .218 (58-for-266) with 14HR in his first 75 career road contests...is just 3-for-36 (.083) in his career at Fenway Park, hitting his lone HR in his first game here on his 25th birthday on 4/26/17.

- ▶ Had his RBI streak snapped on Sunday at five games (4/3-7)...was the longest RBI streak in the Majors this season.
- ▶ It also snapped his **club-record streak of home games with at least 1RBI at 14**...was tied for the fourth-longest such streak in the Majors since RBI was made an official statistic in 1920.
- ▶ His 58 career home runs are tied for the most by any player through 192 career games in Major League history...the all-time record for HRs through 200 career games is 59 by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.

GOING, GOING, GIAN: OF Giancarlo Stanton has 270 home runs in 996 career games...marks the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of their first nine starts until Jordan Montgomery permitted 4ER in 4.1IP on Sun. vs. Baltimore...were just the second Yankees rotation since at least 1908 to accomplish the feat (also 1952).

- ▶ **Yankees starters** have held opposing hitters to a .136 BA (6-for-44) with RISP in 2018.

BREAKING THE SALE: In handing Red Sox starter Chris Sale the loss in their two most recent meetings on 8/19/17 at Fenway Park and 9/3/17 at Yankee Stadium, Yankees batters hit .292/.346/.646 (14-for-48) with 2 doubles and 5HR, plating 7ER in Sale's 11.1IP...in his first 13 career games (10 starts) vs. the Yankees, Sale had been 4-2 with a 1.18 ERA (76.1IP, 10ER) and allowed just 3HR.

- ▶ The Yankees went 4-1 in games started by Sale in 2017, their most wins opposite a Red Sox starter in one season since going 4-2 against Tim Wakefield in 2005.

SEEING RED: In 2017, Yankees pitchers held Red Sox batters to a .143 BA (20-for-140) with RISP...Red Sox batters hit just .196 overall vs. the Yankees last season, their lowest mark in the last 65 years since 1953...the Yankees' 2.78 ERA (175.0IP, 54ER) vs. Boston in 2017 was their third-lowest in the rivalry over that same span (2.46 in 2001, 2.72 in 1980).

- ▶ Tossed shutouts on 4/27/17 (Tanaka three-hit CG) and 7/16/17-G1 (four-hitter by Sabathia and three relievers) at Fenway Park...had recorded just two shutouts at Fenway Park from 2003-16.

EYES ON YES: Sunday's Yankees-Orioles broadcast was the YES Network's highest-rated weekend game since 2012...the telecast averaged a 4.69 Household rating and 405,000 Total TV Viewers.

YANKEES at BOSTON RED SOX

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will play 19 games against the Red Sox in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 14-8 in 22G vs. Boston since 9/27/16... IN 2017: Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park...held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954... SEASON SERIES: Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span... AT YANKEE STADIUM: Went 6-4 against the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium in 2017...matched their highest home win total vs. Boston since going 7-2 in 2009... are 10-4 in the Bronx since 7/17/16...are 44-41 vs. the Red Sox at the current Yankee Stadium, their most losses to any team at the Stadium... AT FENWAY PARK: The Yankees went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 7-12 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 30-25 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-12 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-3-1)...are 497-476-4 (.511) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there... IN POSTSEASON: Have met in the postseason three times, going 11-8 in games and 2-1 in series (2004 ALCS, 3-4; 2003 ALCS, 4-3; 1999 ALCS, 4-1).

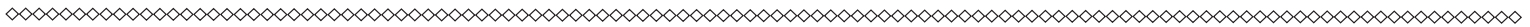

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (2-0, 1.38 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his third start of the season tonight at Boston...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to the off day on Monday...is the first Yankees starter to win his first two outings of a season since Andy Pettitte reeled off three straight wins to begin 2013...is one of ten AL pitchers to begin the season 2-0...made his first career Opening Day start, yielding 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings in a win on 3/29 at Toronto...at 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP, 5ER) in three starts this spring...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: In Wednesday's 7-2 win vs. Tampa Bay, won his second consecutive start to begin the season by yielding 2ER over 7.1IP (5H, 1BB, 7K)...gave up an RBI double to Cron in the first, and his second run scored against the bullpen in the eighth on a Span sac fly...was the deepest a Yankees starter had pitched within the team's first 6G since Andy Pettitte tossed 8.0IP on 4/4/13 vs. Boston (third team game).

OPENING DAY: Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at Toronto, yielding just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings (3BB, 7K) to earn the win...was the first scoreless Opening Day start by a Yankee since Roger Clemens (6.0IP, 3H) on 3/31/03 at Toronto...the 1H marked the fewest by a Yankees Opening Day starter since at least 1908.

- ✦ At 24 years, 37 days, was the fifth-youngest pitcher since 1908 to allow 1H-or-fewer in a scoreless Opening Day start... was the youngest since 21-year-old Bob Feller threw a no-hitter for Cleveland on 4/16/40 at Chicago-AL.
- ✦ Is the first Yankees starter to earn a win on Opening Day since Chien-Ming Wang on 4/1/08 vs. Toronto.
- ✦ Was the first Dominican-born pitcher in Yankees history to earn the nod...was the fourth foreign-born pitcher to start for the Yankees on Opening Day, joining Masahiro Tanaka (Japan) in 2015-17, Chien-Ming Wang (Taiwan) in 2008 and Orlando Hernandez (Cuba) in 2000.
- ✦ At 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/1932 at Philadelphia-AL...only three pitchers younger than Severino have started for the Yankees on Opening Day: Gomez, Ray Caldwell (23 years, 351 days) on 4/11/1912 vs. Boston) and Hippo Vaughn twice (23 years, 3 days) on 4/12/1911 at Philadelphia-AL; 22 years, 5 days) on 4/14/1910 vs. Boston).

ROAD RULES: Allowed just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings to win his first road start of the year on Opening Day in Toronto.

- ✦ Since the 2017 All-Star break, has allowed 1R-or-fewer in seven consecutive road starts, tied for the AL's second-longest streak of road starts with one-or-zero runs since 1908 (tied for eighth among MLB pitchers)...among AL pitchers, only Minnesota's Johan Santana has a longer streak (eight starts from 7/17-9/29/04)...is tied with Al Downing (5/14-9/14/68) for the longest streak by a Yankee in that span... is 5-0 with a 0.78 ERA (46.1IP, 26H, 5R/4ER, 14BB, 55K, 2HR) during the streak.
- ✦ Was 6-1 with a 2.24 ERA (96.1IP, 24ER) in 15 road starts in 2017, the lowest road ERA in the AL and the fifth-lowest in the Majors...permitted 1R-or-fewer in 11 road turns, the highest total by a Yankee since 1908.
- ✦ Is 11-6 with a 2.86 ERA (169.20IP, 54ER) in 34 career road appearances (27 starts)...among active pitchers with at least 25 road starts, his 2.86 ERA ranks fourth behind Aaron Sanchez (2.66), Clayton Kershaw (2.72) and Zach Davies (2.86)...is 9-6 with a 3.02 ERA (158.0IP, 53ER) in the 27 starts.

VS. BOSTON: Is 2-4 with a 4.32 ERA (41.2IP, 20ER) in eight career appearances (seven starts) vs. the Red Sox.

- ✦ Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA (24.1IP, 9ER) in four starts against Boston in 2017...allowed 10R/8ER in 4.1IP on 8/12/17 at Yankee Stadium; permitted just 2R/1ER and 9H in 20.0IP in his other three turns.
- ✦ Is 1-1 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2IP, 7ER) in four games (three starts) at Fenway Park...yielded just 1ER in 14.0IP in two starts there in 2017.
