METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost eight of their last 10 games, including three straight...New York has lost five straight home games and is 12-16 at Citi Field this season.

EXTRA EXTRA: Last night was the longest game by innings (14) for the Mets since they played 16 innings on April 13, 2017 at Miami in a 9-8 win...New York is now 3-4 in extra-innings this year (0-1 at home).

SERIES NOTE: The Mets have lost the first three games of this series...The last time the Cubs swept the Mets in a four-game series was May 11-14, 2015 at Wrigley Field...The last time Chicago swept the Mets in a four-game series in New York was August 2-5, 1991.

OVER .500: The Mets have played 42 games vs. teams that are currently over .500...Only one other team (Rangers-43) have played more games vs. teams over .500...The Mets are 19-23 in those 42 games...Research courtesy of Elias.

STRIKEOUTS: Mets pitching combined for 24 strikeouts last night, the most in any game in franchise history...The previous mark was 20 strikeouts on August 1, 1999 against the Cubs at Wrigley Field (13 innings).

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets have scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 41 eighth-inning runs are tied for the second-most in the majors with the Braves...Houston is first with 42.

HOME RUNS: The Mets have homered in nine of their last 10 games...New York has 14 homers during this stretch...The club has 20 homers in its last 16 games and 30 long balls in its last 24 contests.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Hit a solo homer last night and has three home runs in his last 10 games and four homers in his last 16 contests...Conforto has at least one hit in eight of his 10 starts.

NIMMO POWER: Brandon Nimmo has 11 extra-base hits and nine RBI in his last 12 games (five doubles, one triple, five homers)...Nimmo driven in a run in five out of his last six games... He has three homers in his last six games...He has a career-high seven homers this season in 125 at-bats...Nimmo had six homers combined over his first two seasons (2016-2017) in 250 at-bats... Nimmo is second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .419 OBP (min. 150 plate appearances)...He is tied for sixth in the majors with four triples.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 8-4 vs. the Cubs at Citi Field since the 2015 postseason, but 0-3 this year.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



STEVEN MATZ: Has tossed 9.0 scoreless innings over his last two starts...He allowed five in those starts...Matz left his last start after 3.0 shutout innings with a mild strain of his left middle finger... Matz has allowed three earned runs or fewer in nine of his 10 starts and one earned run or less in five of those starts... Matz is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (six earned runs/24.0 innings) in his last five starts.

deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom extended his franchise record with his eighth straight start allowing one run or less last night... That streak is tied for the third-longest in the majors since 1908... He has allowed one run or less in 55 of his 119 career starts (46 percent)...DeGrom has allowed three earned runs in his 47.1 innings (0.57 ERA)...He leads the NL and is second in the majors with a 1.49 ERA and is tied for second in the NL and tied for fifth in the majors with 98 strikeouts.

STARTERS: Over their last 15 games, New York starters have a 2.48 ERA (22 earned runs/80.0 innings).

BULLPEN: Over its last 10 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-8 with a 8.31 ERA (40 earned runs/43.1 innings).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Is hitting .300 (9-30) with five doubles, two RBI, four runs scored and a .432 on-base percentage...Bautista is one of only three players in the majors with at least 20 homers in each season since 2010, joining Nelson Cruz and Giancarlo Stanton.

TODD FRAZIER: Went 2-3 with two RBI, two walks and a run scored while playing 9.0 innings at third base last night in his third rehabilitation game for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League at Reno...Frazier is 4-9 (.444) with three RBI in three rehab games...He has been on the Disabled List since May 8 with a left hamstring strain.

ANTHONY SWARZAK: Has tossed 2.0 shutout frames in two rehab outings for Las Vegas...Swarzak has been on the Disabled List since April 2, with a strained left oblique.

MLB DRAFT: The Mets will have the sixth overall pick in Monday's First-Year Player Draft...The last time the Mets selected sixth or higher was in 2004 when they took RHP Philip Humber with the third overall selection...New York's second round selection will be pick number 48...Rounds 3-10 of the draft will take place on Tuesday and Rounds 11-40 will be on Wednesday, June 6.

LAST START: Exited his last start, May 29 at Atlanta, with a mild strain of his left middle finger...Matz pitched 3.0-shutout innings, giving up one hit while issuing two walks and striking out two before his outing was cut short in the top of the fourth inning...Matz has now thrown 9.0-straight scoreless innings dating back to his last start at Milwaukee on May 24...Did not allow an earned run for the third time this season (also, April 7 at Washington and May 24 at Milwaukee).

VS. CHICAGO: Matz today will make his third-career start against the Cubs in the regular season...In two-career regular season starts against Chicago, the lefty is 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA (seven earned runs/10.1 innings)...Also started the Mets' pennant-clinching Game Four win over the Cubs in the 2015 NLCS at Wrigley Field...Last started against the Cubs on July 18, 2016 in Chicago...The southpaw pitched 5.0 innings in the loss, giving up four runs, earned, on eight hits with one walk and five strikeouts...In his postseason start against Chicago in 2015, Matz pitched 4.2 innings, giving up one run, earned, on four hits with two walks and four strikeouts.

SUNNY DELIGHT: Matz will make his third daytime start of the season today...Has a 3.00 ERA in his previous two day starts (three earned runs/9.0 innings)...In his 14-career daytime starts, Matz owns a 7-5 overall record with a 2.84 ERA (26 earned runs/82.1 innings) with 83 strikeouts and 25 walks...The lefty owns a 9.1 K/9 ratio in 14-career day starts.

STRONG START: In 34 career starts before the All-Star break, Matz owns a 13-10 overall record with a 3.21 ERA (69 earned runs/193.2 innings pitched)...Opponents are batting .239 against Matz in starts before the All Star break and have an on-base percentage of .303...The southpaw owns a 8-4 overall record with a 2.87 ERA in the months of May and June (38 earned runs/119.2 innings pitched).

STRIKING OUT THE COMPETITION: Through his first 10 starts of the 2018 season, Matz owns a 8.08 K/9 ratio (41 strikeouts/45.2 innings)...The southpaw has struck out 21.0 percent of the batters he's faced so far this season...Has fanned at least five batters in four of his ten starts this season, tied for the second-most five-strikeout games in a season in his career (had 18 starts with at least five strikeouts in 2016).

SETTLING IN: This season, Matz has a 4.50 first-inning ERA (five earned runs/10.0 innings) and a 3.28 ERA in all subsequent innings (13 earned runs/35.2 innings)...In his career, has a 5.82 ERA (33 earned runs/51.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his career ERA is 3.49 (89 earned runs/229.1 innings).

CITI BALL: Matz will be making his 25th career start today at Citi Field...In five home starts this season, Matz is 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA (14 earned runs/23.1 innings)...Opponents are batting .226 (19-84) against Matz this season at Citi Field...In his 24-career home starts, Matz owns a 7-10 record with a 4.52 ERA (66 earned runs/131.1 innings)...The lefty owns a 8.5 K/9 ratio (124 strikeouts/131.1 innings) at home in his career.

TOP FIVE IN THE ORDER: The top five batters in opposing lineups are hitting for a combined .218 average (22-101) with three extra-base hits (all doubles) and 23 strikeouts against Matz this season...The sixth-eighth spots in the order have gone 15-49 (.306) against the lefthander.

LEFT OUT: Left-handed batters are hitting for a .179 average (5-28) against Matz so far this season, including one home run, five walks and six strikeouts...That is the second-best mark against lefthanders by a Mets pitcher this season (Seth Lugo has held opposing lefties to a .119 average).

TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP JASON VARGAS (2-3, 8.53 ERA)

LAST START: Earned the win in his last start at Atlanta on May 30...The lefty pitched 5.0-scoreless innings, giving up two hits with one walk and two punchouts...Was his second start in his last three outings pitching 5.0-shutout innings and allowing two hits (also, May 21 vs. Miami).

VS. BALTIMORE: Vargas will be making his 10th-career start against Baltimore on Tuesday...In his nine previous starts, Vargas owns a 2-4 record against the Orioles with a 2.23 ERA (15 earned runs/60.2 innings)...Vargas has thrown two of his 12-career complete games against Baltimore...Also pitched 9.0-scoreless innings against the club on May 12, 2011 (Mariners lost in extra innings, 2-1).
